OAKLAND ATHLETICS (1-0) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (0-1)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's opened their 50th season in Oakland last night with a win and have now won two of their last three openers (also 2015)... have not won each of their first two games since 2004...have started the season at least 2-0 a total of 12 times in Oakland history...the Oakland A's have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4044-3763 (.518) record over the previous 49 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)... this is the Athletics franchise 117th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8759-9235 (.487) in their previous 116 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's will play 23 of their first 26 games (the month of April) against American League West competition...the exception is a three-game series at Kansas City next week...the A's will host all four AL West teams this month and travel to each city except Seattle...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

DURING THE SPRING: The A's finished the spring with a six-game losing streak and went 16-18 (.471) overall, which was the fourth worst record in the Cactus League...went 12-17-3 (.422) last spring, which was fifth worst in the CL...this marks the first time Oakland has finished with a losing record in back-to-back springs since 2010-11...the A's compiled a 5.93 ERA, which was second highest in the majors to Cincinnati (6.13)...it was the second highest spring ERA by an Oakland team over the last 18 years (6.10 in 2016)...surrendered 37 home runs, which tied for fifth fewest in the CL...had the second fewest strikeouts (247) and tied for the fifth fewest walks (121)...the offense ranked fourth in the CL in walks (133), tied for fourth in triples (11) and fifth in on-base percentage (.351)...also tied for the fewest stolen bases (15), ranked third in fewest hit by pitches (10) and fourth in most strikeouts (300)...the strikeouts are the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (previous: 248 in 2009)...the defense committed 28 errors, which was fourth fewest in the CL...however, turned just 23 double plays, which was the fewest in the CL and tied for third fewest in the majors...went 9-7 at Hohokam, 0-1 in Oakland and 7-10 on the road.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 13 pitchers and 12 position players...it marked the first time the A's have opened the season with more than 12 pitchers on a 25-man Opening Day roster since 1994 when they had 13 (had 14 on the 1995 Opening Day roster, which was expanded to 28 following the strike)...13 players returned from last year's Opening Day roster (Alonso, Axford, Canha, K. Davis, Doolittle, Dull, Graveman, Hendriks, Lowrie, Madson, Phegley, Semien, Vogt)...six other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Alcantara, Cotton, Coulombe, Healy, Manaea, Triggs) and one was in the A's farm system (Montas)...five were signed as free agents (Casilla, R. Davis, Joyce, Plouffe, Rosales), which marks just the third time in the last 22 years the A's had five free agents make their Opening Day roster (also 1996 and 2011).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only two played for Oakland prior to 2014 without playing for another team (Doolittle since 2012, Vogt since 2013)...four other players played for Oakland prior to 2014 but have played for other teams in between: Santiago Casilla (2004-09), Rajai Davis (2008-10), Adam Rosales (2010-13) and Jed Lowrie (2013-14, 16)...Sean Doolittle has the longest uninterrupted tenure with the A's organization as he was selected in the 2007 First-Year Player Draft...he is followed by Raul Alcantara, who was acquired from Boston on December 28, 2011, and Ryan Dull, who was drafted in 2012.

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: The A's have three rookies on the Opening Day roster (Alcantara, Cotton, Montas)...had one last year and five in 2015...seven players have six or more years of service: Madson (11 years, 155 days), R. Davis (9 years, 167 days), Casilla (9 years, 148 days),

Lowrie (8 years, 111 days), Joyce (7 years, 123 days), Axford (6 years, 170 days) and Rosales (6 years, 163 days)...those are the most players with six or more years of service on an A's Opening Day roster since the 2007 club also had seven.

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 29.24 years...that is Oakland's second oldest Opening Day roster over the last 13 years (29.28 last year)...Frankie Montas is the youngest player at the age of 24 years, 13 days...he is followed by Raul Alcantara (24 years, 120 days), Sean Manaea (25 years, 61 days), Jharel Cotton (25 years, 74 days) and Ryon Healy (25 years, 83 days)...there are 10 players that are at least 30 years old...Santiago Casilla is the oldest at 36 years, 252 days and two other players are also 36: Ryan Madson (36 years, 218 days) and Rajai Davis (36 years, 166 days).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's begin the season with five players on the disabled list for the second consecutive season (Bassitt, Gray, Mengden, Smolinski, Wendle)...the A's used the DL an Oakland record 27 times last year and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

FOR OPENERS: The A's have won two of their last three openers after a Major League record 10-game Opening Day losing streak from 2005-14...are now 6-18 on Opening Day dating back to 1994...opened in Oakland for the fifth consecutive season and were the home team for the eighth straight year (2012 in Tokyo)...last night marked the fifth time in Oakland history the A's faced the Angels on Opening Day...are now 3-2, including a 3-2 win in the only other game in Oakland on April 6, 1982...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 22-28 on Opening Day, including 18-14 in Oakland, 4-11 on the road, 0-2 in Tokyo and 0-1 in Las Vegas...all-time, the Athletics are 54-63 in openers.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have four players under contract beyond the 2017 season...Santiago Casilla, Sean Doolittle, Matt Joyce and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's holding club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...Jed Lowrie has a club option for 2018.

RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its seventh season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors and/or the Sharks, the following games will air in the Bay Area on different stations: Today vs. Los Angeles (KBLX 102.9 FM), Tomorrow vs. Los Angeles (KFOX 98.5 FM), Saturday at Texas (KBLX 102.9 FM) and next Wednesday, April 12 at Kansas City (KFOX 98.5 FM)...additional updates will be announced once the Warriors and Sharks playoff schedules are determined.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's won the first meeting of 2017 last night...lost the season series last year after going 7-12 against the Angels...were 3-6 in Oakland and 4-6 in Anaheim...have now lost each of the last three season series and are 25-33 against the Angels over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 422-354 against the Angels...that includes 219-167 in Oakland and 203-187 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 471-431 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis became the second player in Oakland history with two Opening Day home runs last night (Jason Giambi, 2000)...last year, he hit six home runs against Los Angeles, matching the most by an Athletic against the Angels over the last 47 years...also tied an Oakland Opening Day record with nine total bases last night (Reggie Jackson, 1974)...**Rajai Davis** is on his 10th consecutive Opening Day roster...has 199 career doubles and needs one more for 200 career...**Jed Lowrie** went 2-for-4 last night...hit .314 in April last year and is a .311 (164-for-527) career hitter in the month, which is his best mark for any month.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1974** Reggie Jackson has four hits and a homer as the two-time defending World Champion Oakland A's open their season with a 7-2 victory at Texas...the A's would go on to win their third consecutive World Championship...in **2006** Marco Scutaro has a walk-off RBI single in the ninth inning to lead the A's to a 4-3 win over the Yankees.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (7-9, 3.86 ERA in 2016)

FOR STARTERS: Is on his first Opening Day roster and is beginning his second season in the majors...made both his Triple-A and Major League debut last year, his third professional season...was originally drafted by Kansas City as a Competitive Balance pick following the first round of the 2013 draft and was dealt to the A's just prior to the 2015 trading deadline in the Ben Zobrist deal.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 3.91 ERA in seven games, including six starts, this spring...surrendered just one home run in 23.0 innings...allowed a .258 (23-for-89) opponents batting average...allowed one run or fewer in five of his seven appearances, including no runs three times...walked one batter or fewer in six of his seven outings but issued five walks in 3.0 innings in the other.

MANAEA vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 0-1 with a 3.55 ERA (12.2 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 7 so, 3 hr) in two career starts, both last year at Anaheim...the loss came in a 5-4 decision at Los Angeles Aug. 2...shutout the Angels on

two hits over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Bandy in the bottom of the fifth...surrendered a three-run home run to Marte in the sixth for the loss...then had a no decision in the A's 2-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on Sept. 26...did not allow a run over the first three innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 15.1 innings...surrendered a leadoff home run to Trout in the fourth, but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings of work...the A's were held to a run on four hits by Weaver and four Angels relievers.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins...the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...allowed a .248 opponents batting average and walked 37 batters for a .298 on-base percentage...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included .180 (18-for-100) against left-handed hitters compared to .263 (117-for-445) against right-handers...based on a minimum of 140 innings pitched, the mark against lefties was second lowest in the AL and the lowest in Oakland history (previous: .185, Norris, 1980)...allowed 17 of his 20 home runs and issued 33 of his 37 walks to righties for a .754 OPS...had a .526 OPS against lefties, which was second lowest in the AL and in Oakland history (.504, Norris, 1980)...opponents hit .192 with runners in scoring position, which was third lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings pitched...had a .152 average with RISP and two outs...held the three hitter to a .197 average, which was fifth lowest in the AL...13 of his 20 home runs came after his 60th pitch in a game...yielded a .430 batting average and .733 slugging percentage when the opponents put the first pitch in play but had a .157 opponents average with two strikes.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Went 4-4 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in 13 games after the All-Star Break after going 3-5 with a 5.24 ERA and .278 opponents average in 12 starts before the break...had the fifth lowest post-break ERA in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 5-3 with a 3.02 ERA in 14 games (13 starts) at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.99 ERA in 11 starts on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the AL.

INNING BY INNING: Had a 1.59 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 6.21 ERA and .283 opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...among pitchers with 20 or more innings, he had the lowest first inning ERA in the majors (1.13) and the fourth lowest second inning ERA (1.44)...his first inning ERA was third lowest in Oakland history using the 20 inning minimum.

RUN SUPPORT: Received one run of support or fewer in 10 of his 24 starts and went 0-6 with a 3.90 ERA in those contests...in his four no decisions with support of one run or fewer, he has scoreless outings of 8.0 innings, 7.0 and 6.0 and one outing where he allowed one run in 7.0 innings.

THIS AND THAT: Tied for eighth in the AL with three pickoffs and opponents were successful in 3-of-7 (42.9%) stolen base attempts off him...the A's were 11-13 (.458) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer in 19 of his 24 starts and allowed two runs or fewer 13 times.

MORE FROM 2016: Was selected from Nashville April 29 and made his ML debut that day against Houston after just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...had a no decision in the A's 7-4 win, allowing four runs on four hits and four walks in 5.0 innings...struck out Carlos Correa to end the first inning for his first big league strikeout...allowed four runs in his second start and then yielded a career-high eight runs on 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings for the first decision of his career, a loss in a 13-5 decision at Boston May 10...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three ML appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...was credited with his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas May 16 in Oakland when he allowed a run on four hits in 6.2 innings...went 1-3 with a 4.80 ERA over his next five starts before leaving his outing on June 13 against Texas after 4.1 innings with a left pronator muscle strain...was placed on the 15-day disabled the next day...made one start with Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment June 24 against San Jose (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr) and was reinstated from the DL June 29...fired 5.2 shutout innings for the win that day against San Francisco...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter on July 10 at Houston...ended up with a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss...made his first career relief appearance July 17 against Toronto...entered the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion...Triggs relieved Rich Hill who left after five pitches with a blister...Manaea had been scheduled to start two days later...tossed 5.0 innings, which matched the season-high for an A's reliever...had a no decision in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win over Tampa Bay July 22 in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just five hits and no walks, but Odorizzi did the same for the Rays...struck out a career-high nine batters in 6.2 innings in a no decision at Texas July 27...walked Escobar with two outs in the fifth inning on August 2 at Los Angeles to snap a streak of four games, 30.2 innings and 126 batters faced without a walk from July 10 to Aug. 2...the streak of 30.2 innings without a walk was the longest single season streak in Oakland history, topping the previous mark of 29.0 by Lary Sorensen (July 8-31, 1984)...it was fifth longest overall in Oakland history...left his start on Aug. 29 at Houston after 3.1 innings with a strained left rhomboid...ended up going 2-4 with a 3.97 ERA in six August starts...tied for second in the AL in losses in the month...did not go on the disabled list following the rhomboid injury, but would not pitch again until Sept. 14 at Kansas City...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings that day for the win, his first on the road...began his career 0-6 on the road and his career-opening six-game road losing streak matched the longest such streak in Oakland history (fourth time, last: Joe Blanton, April 19-July 6, 2005)...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his next start and had a career-high 15.1 inning scoreless streak from Aug. 29 to Sept. 26...went 2-0 with a 1.13 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in his final four starts following his injury...it was the first winning streak of his career.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA in three starts in his Triple-A debut...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA, fifth in strikeouts per nine innings (10.50) and tied for fifth in wins at the time of his April 29 promotion...allowed just one run in each of his starts...surrendered just one home run in 18.0 innings...struck out 21 while walking just four...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .077 (1-for-13) against left-handed hitters compared to .268 (15-for-56) against right-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER	
RHP Jharel Cotton (2-0, 2.15 ERA in 2016):	Is scheduled to make his first start of the season and the sixth of his career...went 3-0 with a 4.35 ERA in six starts this spring...held opponents to a .208 batting average, but issued 11 walks in 20.2 innings...was the winning pitcher in his only career start against Los Angeles, a 4-1 A's win last year on Sept. 7 in Oakland (6.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...it was his Major League debut...was one of three players acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers at the 2016 trading deadline and made his ML debut with Oakland in September...went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's...walked just four batters in 29.1 innings (1.23 per nine innings)...combined with Triple-A Oklahoma City and Triple-A Nashville for an 11-6 record and a 4.31 ERA in 28 games, 22 starts...led the PCL, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of the minors with a career-high 155 strikeouts

- The A's bullpen compiled a 3.99 ERA last year, which ranked 10th in the American League...were fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.308) and seventh in batting average (.245) and slugging percentage (.385).
- Converted 42-of-65 (64.6%) save opportunities...had the third most blown saves in the AL (23) and the fourth lowest save percentage...tied for 10th in saves...19 of the blown saves came against AL West competition...were successful in 17-of-36 (47.2%) save opportunities against the AL West, 25-of-29 (86.2%) against everyone else
- Had 561.1 innings pitched, which was second most in the AL (Minnesota, 567.2), second most in Oakland history (586.2 in 1997) and third most in Athletics history (588.1 in 1964)...struck out 530 batters, which was fifth most in the AL but set the Athletics record for strikeouts by the bullpen...also set a franchise record for most wild pitches (33).
- Surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)
- Allowed 27.6% of inherited runners to score, which was the fourth lowest percentage in the AL and seventh lowest by an A's team since 1974...ranked third in the AL in inherited runners (243).

- Begins his ninth season in the majors and is on his seventh consecutive Opening Day roster (2011-13 with Milwaukee, 2014 with Cleveland, 2015 with Colorado, 2016 with Oakland).
- Had no decisions and a 3.52 ERA in eight appearances this spring...allowed a .345 batting average and issued five walks in 7.2 innings.
