LEADING OFF: Tonight the Angels play the second game (0-1) of a four-game series to open the regular season against the Oakland Athletics...Halos are now 30-27 overall, 18-16 at home and 12-11 on the road all-time on Opening Day...Halos are now 2-3 vs. A's on Opening Day...Angels have won nine of last 14 Opening Day contests, but have dropped the last four (2014-17)...Four game losing streak on Opening Day matches longest such streak in franchise history (also lost on Opening Day each year from 2000-03).

SHOEMAKER IS BACK: Matt Shoemaker will take the mound tonight for his first regular season appearance since exiting start on Sept. 4, 2016 at Seattle after being struck on right side of head by a line drive off bat of Kyle Seager...He underwent successful surgery (performed by Dr. Manuel Ferreira) at Seattle's Harborview Medical Center after CT scan showed a small skull fracture and small hematoma.

SALT LAKE EXTENSION: The Angels announced today that the Club has extended its affiliation with Triple-A Salt Lake through the 2020 season...The Bees are the longest running minor league partnership for the Angels (since 2001).

VS. OAKLAND: Angels have homered in 16 of last 17 meetings with Oakland...Halos have won 30 of last 47 overall meetings...Last season, Mike Trout batted .418 (28/67) against Oakland, including two doubles, five home runs and 12 RBI...LAA won 2016 series 12-7 and has won three consecutive season series against A's (2014-16).

REVERE IS MR. 1000: Last night, Ben Revere became the 1,000th different player in Angels history with his pinch-hit appearance in the 9th inning...The Angels entered 2017 having used 995 different players in franchise history...Newcomers Cameron Maybin, Danny Espinosa and Martin Maldonado were all in Halos starting lineup...Bud Norris made Angels debut with relief appearance in 7th inning.

START WITH A BLAST: With a home run last night, Mike Trout has tied Joe Rudi and Tim Salmon for the Angels franchise record with three career Opening Day home runs (also homered on Opening Day in 2014 & 2015).

THE MANAGER: Mike Scioscia enters 2017 as the longest tenured manager in the Majors (18th season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with current club...His current .541 (1,490-1265) winning percentage and 1,490 wins are both tops in franchise history...Scioscia ranks 23rd on the all-time win list (one victory behind Clark Griffith for 22nd).

VETERAN SQUAD: The Angels Opening Day roster did not feature any rookie players for the first time since 2012.

NEW HALOS: Angels Opening Day active roster featured eight players new to the organization: Jesse Chavez, Danny Espinosa, Martín Maldonado, Cameron Maybin, Bud Norris, Blake Parker, Yusmeiro Petit & Ben Revere.

HOT SPRINGS: The Angels concluded Spring Training with a 20-14-1 record...Halos have posted a winning record in Spring Training for the 13th time in the last 16 years and reached the 20 Spring Training win mark for fourth time in franchise history (also, 1996, 2005 & 2009).

LEFT FIELD TURNOVER: The 2017 season marks the sixth consecutive year that the Angels have had a new Opening Day starting left fielder...The last player to start consecutive Opening Days in left for the Halos was Vernon Wells in 2011-12.

ANOTHER RECORD FOR TROUT: With a start in center field last night, Mike Trout (2013-17) became the first player in Angels history to make five Opening Day starts in CF...Gary Pettis (1984-87), Jim Edmonds (1995-98) & Darin Erstad (2001-03, '06) each had four Opening Day starts in center.

MVP, MVP!: Mike Trout enters his sixth full Major League season in 2017...Last season, the 25-year-old hit .315 (173/549) with 32 doubles, five triples, 29 home runs, 100 RBI and a Major League leading 123 runs scored, 116 walks and .441 OBP...He earned his second career American League MVP Award, becoming the first player to win the award twice in an Angels uniform...Has finished in Top Two of MVP voting each of last five seasons, joining Barry Bonds (2000-04) as only players to accomplish the feat...Trout also earned his fifth consecutive Silver Slugger Award and was selected to his fifth straight All-Star Game.

- **WELCOME BACK:** Making first start of the season and first regular season appearance since exiting final start of 2016 on Sept. 4 at Seattle after being struck on right side of head by a line drive off bat of Kyle Seager...CT scan showed a small skull fracture and small hematoma...Underwent successful surgery (performed by Dr. Manuel Ferreira) at Seattle's Harborview Medical Center.
- **MAKING THE TEAM:** Made Angels Opening Day roster for fourth consecutive season.
- **SPRING TRAINING 2017:** In five Cactus League starts, went 0-1 with a 5.29 ERA (17 IP – 10 ER)...Recorded 21 strikeouts while walking five.
- **CAREER HIGHS IN 2016:** Last season, set new single-season career-highs in innings pitched (160), starts (27) and strikeouts (143).
- **2016 RECAP:** Finished the 2016 season with a 9-13 record, 3.88 ERA (160 IP – 69 ER) and 143 strikeouts...Pitched to a 2.83 ERA (130.1 IP – 41 ER) from May 21 through the end of the season...Tossed first career complete game and shutout on July 16 vs. White Sox and was named A.L. Player of the Week on July 18...Set Angels franchise record with streak of 49 straight strikeouts without a walk.
- **TALE OF TWO HALVES:** Owns a 4.58 career ERA (251.2 IP – 128 ER) in the first half of the season, compared with a 2.63 ERA (184.2 IP – 54 ER) after the All-Star Break...His 7.08 ERA (48.1 IP – 38 ER) in March/April is also his highest for any month...Last year opened season going 1-5 with a 9.12 ERA (24.2 IP – 25 ER) in first six starts before closing year with 8-8 record and 2.93 ERA (135.1 IP – 44 ER) in last 21 starts.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Pitched four innings in final Spring Training start on March 29 at Milwaukee (Maryvale) and allowed three earned runs on nine hits with one walk and three strikeouts.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** In 10 career games (nine starts) against the A's, is 4-2 with a 3.48 ERA (51.2 IP – 20 ER)...In three starts against Oakland last season, was 2-0 with a 1.42 ERA (19 IP – 3 ER).
- **AT OAKLAND COLISEUM:** In five career starts at the Coliseum, is 2-0 with a 3.14 ERA (28.2 IP – 10 ER)...In two starts in Oakland last season, went 1-0 with a 0.75 ERA (12 IP – 1 ER)...Has allowed just two earned runs in his last 19 innings pitched at the ballpark (0.95 ERA in that span – dating back to Sept. 1, 2015).
- **CAREER NOTES:** Owns a 32-27 record and 3.75 ERA (436.1 IP – 182 ER) in 80 games (72 starts) for Angels...Went 16-4 with a 3.04 ERA (136 IP – 46 ER) in 2014 and established a Club record for most wins by a rookie.
