LEADING OFF: Tonight the Angels play the third game (1-1) of a four-game series to open the regular season against the Oakland Athletics...Halos are now 30-27 overall, 18-16 at home and 12-11 on the road all-time on Opening Day...Halos are 2-3 vs. A's on Opening Day...Angels have won nine of last 14 Opening Day contests, but have dropped the last four (2014-17)...Four game losing streak on Opening Day matches longest such streak in franchise history (also lost on Opening Day each year from 2000-03).

ESPNIOSA'S BLAST: Last night, Danny Espinosa recorded his first hit in an Angels uniform with a three-run goahead home run in the 9<sup>th</sup> inning...According to STATS LLC, the Santa Ana native became the third player to have a go-ahead HR in the 9<sup>th</sup> inning or later for his first hit in an Angels uniform, joining Billy Parker (1971) and Gary Pettis (1982), who both hit walk-off homers for their first hit...Last Major Leaguer to do so for his first hit with a team was Hank Conger for Houston in 2015.

MORE ELITE COMPANY: Last night, Mike Trout became the sixth player in A.L. history to log 500 RBI & score 600 runs before his age-26 season, joining: Ty Cobb, Joe DiMaggio, Jimmie Foxx, Mickey Mantle & Alex Rodriguez

WELCOME BACK G-RICH: Garrett Richards will take the mound tonight for his first regular season appearance since May 1, 2016...Season was cut short by right elbow UCL injury last year...In lieu of undergoing a ligament replacement surgery, received stem-cell injections from Dr. Steve Yoon.

THE MANAGER: Mike Scioscia enters 2017 as the longest tenured manager in the Majors (18<sup>th</sup> season) and the only active manager to collect over 1,000 victories with current club...His current .541 (1,491-1265) winning percentage and 1,491 wins are both tops in franchise history...With the Angels win last night, Scioscia tied Hall-of-Famer Clark Griffith for 22<sup>nd</sup> on all-time managerial win list).

<u>SALT LAKE EXTENSION</u>: The Angels announced yesterday that the Club has extended its affiliation with Triple-A Salt Lake through the 2020 season...The Bees are the longest running minor league partnership for the Angels (since 2001).

VS. OAKLAND: Angels have homered in 17 of last 18 meetings with Oakland...Halos have won 31 of last 48 overall meetings...Last season, Mike Trout batted .418 (28/67) against Oakland, including two doubles, five home runs and 12 RBI...LAA won 2016 series 12-7 and has won three consecutive season series against A's (2014-16)

REVERE IS MR. 1000: Monday night, Ben Revere became the 1,000<sup>th</sup> different player in Angels history with his pinch-hit appearance in the 9<sup>th</sup> inning...The Angels entered 2017 having used 995 different players in franchise history... Newcomers Cameron Maybin, Danny Espinosa and Martin Maldonado were all in Halos starting lineup...Bud Norris made Angels debut with relief appearance in 7<sup>th</sup> inning.

<u>START WITH A BLAST:</u> With a home run Monday, **Mike Trout** has tied **Joe Rudi** and **Tim Salmon** for the Angels franchise record with three career Opening Day home runs (also homered on Opening Day in 2014 & 2015).

<u>VETERAN SQUAD:</u> The Angels Opening Day roster did not feature any rookie players for the first time since 2012.

<u>NEW HALOS:</u> Angels Opening Day active roster featured eight players new to the organization: Jesse Chavez, Danny Espinosa, Martín Maldonado, Cameron Maybin, Bud Norris, Blake Parker, Yusmeiro Petit & Ben Revere.

<u>HOT SPRINGS</u>: The Angels concluded Spring Training with a 20-14-1 record...Halos have posted a winning record in Spring Training for the 13<sup>th</sup> time in the last 16 years and reached the 20 Spring Training win mark for fourth time in franchise history (also, 1996, 2005 & 2009).

ANOTHER RECORD FOR TROUT: With a start in center field on Monday night, Mike Trout (2013-17) became the first player in Angels history to make five Opening Day starts in CF...Gary Pettis (1984-87), Jim Edmonds (1995-98) & Darin Erstad (2001-03, '06) each had four Opening Day starts in center.

MVP, MVPI: Mike Trout enters his sixth full Major League season in 2017...Last season, the 25-year-old hit .315 (173/549) with 32 doubles, five triples, 29 home runs, 100 RBI and a Major League leading 123 runs scored, 116 walks and .441 OBP...He earned his second career American League MVP Award, becoming the first player to win the award twice in an Angels uniform...Has finished in Top Two of MVP voting each of last five seasons, joining Barry Bonds (2000-04) as only players to accomplish the feat...Trout also earned his fifth consecutive Silver Slugger Award and was selected to his fifth straight All-Star Game.

- WELCOME BACK!: Making first start of the season and first regular season appearance since May 1, 2016.
- 2017 SPRING TRAINING: In four Spring Training starts, went 0-2 with a 5.11 ERA (12.1 IP 7 ER)...Had 11 strikeouts while walking three.
- 2016 CUT SHORT: Missed Angels final 137 games of season on disabled list...Season was cut short by right elbow UCL injury suffered on May 1, 2016 at Texas...In lieu of undergoing a ligament replacement surgery, received stem-cell injections from Dr. Steve Yoon.
- 2016 SEASON: Was Angels Opening Day starter last year...Made six total regular season starts and went 1-3 with a 2.34 ERA (34.2 IP - 9 ER) prior to the season-ending injury
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Pitched four innings in last Spring Training start on March 31 vs. Dodgers at Angel Stadium...Allowed one earned run on two hits with one walk and three strikeouts and was charged with loss...Only run allowed came on solo HR by Justin Turner.
- SOLID STREAK: Has allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in each of his last 10 starts, dating back to Sept. 19, 2015...The streak ties the longest of his career (also, Aug. 4, 2014 - May 17, 2015).
- DIVISIONAL PLAY: Since 2013, owns a 19-14 record and 3.48 ERA (269 IP 104 ER) in 50 games (41 starts) vs. A.L. West opponents...The 19 wins are sixth most in the Majors in that span.
- **BRINGING THE HEAT**: According to Fangraphs, leads the American League with an average fastball velocity of 96.1 MPH since the start of the 2014 season (min. 400 IP).
- LOW AVERAGE: Leads the American League with a .222 (336/1515) batting average against since the start of 2014.
- VS. OAKLAND: In 14 career games (10 starts) against the A's, is 2-4 with a 4.53 ERA (59.2 IP 30 ER)...Tonight marks first start vs. A's since Sept. 30, 2015...Angels are 4-10 in games he has appeared in vs. A's (2-8 in starts)...As a starter, is 2-4 with a 4.91 ERA (55 IP - 30 ER) against the Athletics...In last four starts vs. A's, is 2-1 with a 1.80 ERA (25 IP - 5 ER).
- AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: Tonight marks first appearance at the Coliseum since June 21, 2015...In eight career games (six starts) at the Coliseum, is 1-3 with a 4.83 ERA (31.2 IP – 17 ER)...Earned only win in Oakland on April 30, 2015...Yielded 12 of his 17 career earned runs at the Coliseum in two games (7 ER on April 30, 2013 and 5 ER on May 30, 2014)...Has pitched to a 1.78 ERA (25.1 IP - 5 ER) in his six other starts at the ballpark.
