### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-4) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (2-5)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have alternated wins and losses over the last six games and are 4-4 for the season...this is the fourth time this year the A's have been exactly .500...are 4-4 after eight games for the third consecutive season...this is the A's 50th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4044-3763 (.518) record over the previous 49 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 117th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8759-9235 (.487) in their previous 116 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-2 on their first road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (1-0)...the A's will travel 51,146 miles this year, which is the most in baseball ahead of the Angels (47,828) and Mariners (46,547)...have a total of 13 trips this year with only two three-city trips...return home following the game tomorrow for a season-long 10-game homestand against Houston (three games), Texas (three games) and Seattle (four games)...went 2-2 on the first homestand against Los Angeles (AL).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have made at least one error in five straight games after going errorless over the first three games...have eight errors for the season, which are the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Arizona, 9)...pitchers have committed three of the errors, which is the most in the majors, and outfielders have two, which is tied for the most.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's will play 23 of their first 26 games (the month of April) against American League West competition...the exception is this three-game series at Kansas City...the A's will host all four AL West teams this month and travel to each city except Seattle...are 3-4 against the West this year...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have six players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Gray, Mengden, Smolinski, Wendle)...the A's used the DL an Oakland record 27 times last year and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**ROSTER NOTES:** The A's opened the season with 13 pitchers and 12 position players...it marked the first time the A's have opened the season with more than 12 pitchers on a 25-man Opening Day roster since 1994 when they had 13 (had 14 on the 1995 Opening Day roster, which was expanded to 28 following the strike)...five players on the Opening Day roster were signed as free agents (Casilla, R. Davis, Joyce, Plouffe, Rosales), which marks just the third time in the last 22 years the A's had five free agents make their Opening Day roster (also 1996 and 2011)...seven had six or more years of service: Madson (11 years, 155 days), R. Davis (9 years, 167 days), Casilla (9 years, 148 days), Lowrie (8 years, 111 days), Joyce (7 years, 123 days), Axford (6 years, 170 days) and Rosales (6 years, 163 days)...those are the most players with six or more years of service on an A's Opening Day roster since the 2007 club also had seven...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.24 years...that is Oakland's second oldest Opening Day roster over the last 13 years (29.28 last year)...Frankie Montas is the youngest player at the age of 24 years, 13 days...Santiago Casilla is the oldest at 36 years, 252 days.

**DURING THE SPRING:** The A's finished the spring with a six-game losing streak and went 16-18 (.471) overall, which was the fourth worst record

in the Cactus League...went 12-17-3 (.422) last spring, which was fifth worst in the CL...this marks the first time Oakland has finished with a losing record in back-to-back springs since 2010-11...the A's compiled a 5.93 ERA, which was second highest in the majors to Cincinnati (6.13)...it was the second highest spring ERA by an Oakland team over the last 18 years (6.10 in 2016)...surrendered 37 home runs, which tied for fifth fewest in the CL...had the second fewest strikeouts (247) and tied for the fifth fewest walks (121)...the offense ranked fourth in the CL in walks (133), tied for fourth in triples (11) and fifth in on-base percentage (.351)...also tied for the fewest stolen bases (15), ranked third in fewest hit by pitches (10) and fourth in most strikeouts (300)...the strikeouts are the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (previous: 248 in 2009)...the defense committed 28 errors, which was fourth fewest in the CL...however, turned just 23 double plays, which was the fewest in the CL and tied for third fewest in the majors...went 9-7 at Hohokam, 0-1 in Oakland and 7-10 on the road.

**CONTRACT STATUS:** The A's have four players under contract beyond the 2017 season...Santiago Casilla, Sean Doolittle, Matt Joyce and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's holding club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...Jed Lowrie has a club option for 2018.

**RADIO AND TV:** Due to conflicts with the Warriors and/or Sharks, the following changes have been made to the radio and television schedules...today's game will now be televised on MLB Network and the games of Friday, April 14 and Thursday, April 18 have been moved from NBCSCA to NBCSCA Plus...today's game can be heard on radio in the Bay Area on KBLX 102.9 FM...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors and Sharks playoff schedules.

**A's vs. ROYALS:** The A's won the first meeting of 2017 on Monday to extend their winning streak against Kansas City to seven games...that matches the second longest winning streak in Oakland history against the Royals (July 7, 2002-May 23, 2003)...the record is 10 from May 31, 2003 to May 23, 2004...now have a five-game winning streak in Kansas City, which matches the A's second longest at Kauffman Stadium...the record is 12 from May 31, 2003 to April 30, 2006...won the season series last year, 6-1...it was their first season series win since 2013 and it was the A's best record ever against a defending World Series Champion (5-1 vs. Toronto in 1994)...it was the A's second best record ever against the Royals (8-1 in 2002)...went 4-0 in Kansas City and 2-1 in Oakland...swept the four-game series at Kansas City Sept. 12-15, which was the A's second ever of the Royals (Sept. 26-28, 1977 in Oakland)...it was the A's first four-game sweep in Kansas City since July 27-30, 1959 when the Kansas City A's swept a four-game series from the original Washington Senators franchise...are 15-12 against Kansas City over the last five seasons...all-time, the A's are 315-260 against the Royals...that breaks down to 171-115 in Oakland and 144-145 in Kansas City.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Khris Davis** is the only Athletic to reach base safely in all eight games and now has a career-high 17-game reaching base streak dating back to Sept. 23, 2016 (previous: 15, Sept. 1-16, 2015)...leads the majors in slugging percentage (.828)...**Ryon Healy** has hit safely in each of his five career games against Kansas City...is 10-for-21 (.476) with two home runs and seven RBI in those games, all at Kauffman Stadium...**Jed Lowrie** has a 64-game errorless streak as a second baseman, which is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1909** the A's play their first game at Shibe Park, defeating Boston, 8-1...a crowd of 31,160 watches Eddie Plank defeat the Red Sox and 18-year old John "Stuff" McInnis make his major league debut...in **1955** the Athletics open their first season in Kansas City with a 6-2 win over the Detroit Tigers...in **1994** Oakland collects just two hits but defeats Toronto 8-4 as the Blue Jay pitchers walk 12 A's hitters...both hits come in the first inning as Oakland draws four consecutive walks in the third inning and two consecutive bases loaded walks in the fifth...Rickey Henderson walks in each of his first four at bats.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (1-0, 0.00 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his second start of the season and the eighth of his career...is in his second Major League season and is on his first Opening Day roster.

**LAST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday in Oakland...issued a career-high three walks and tossed a career-high 91 pitches...surrendered his only run in the third inning and it was unearned...Escobar led off with a single, went to second on a R.Davis error, third on a ground out and scored on a Pujols ground out...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the third for the win.

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Went 1-3 with an 8.10 ERA in seven games, including five starts...allowed a .299 (29-for-97) opponents batting average but issued just five walks in a team-leading 23.1 innings (1.93 per nine innings)...allowed five home runs...started in each of his final five outings (21 er in 19.1 ip, 9.78 ERA) after pitching in relief in his first two appearances (0 er in 4.0 ip).

**2016 RECAP:** Was claimed off waivers from Baltimore during the spring and went 1-1 with a 4.31 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 24 games (six starts) over eight stints in his Major League debut with the A's...the eight stints are believed to be the most in one season in Oakland history...the stints were April 25-26, April 29, May 7 (26th man for doubleheader), May 10-June 3, June 18, June 30-July 1, July 4-August 3 (includes stay on the DL from July 18-Aug. 1) and Aug. 5 through the end of the season...five of his eight stints began less than eight days following his previous option...had three one-day stints and two two-day stints...struck out 55 and walked just 13 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.23...compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...then went 1-1 with a 2.58 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in 14 games (six starts), over his final four stints...allowed three home runs over his first four stints (18.0 ip) and two in his last four (38.1 ip).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average included a .235 (28-for-119) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .277 (28-for-101) against left-handers...issued 9 of his 13 walks to lefties...held the opposition to a .144 batting average with two strikes...the three hitter in the order batted .429 but he allowed a .160 batting average against the clean-up hitter.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Was 1-1 with a 2.81 ERA and .191 opponents batting average in his six starts, 0-0 with a 5.58 ERA and .302 opponents average in 18 relief appearances...walked just one batter in 25.2 innings as a starter...first batters faced hit .176 with no extra base hits and one walk (.222 on-base percentage)...allowed 4-of-8 (50.0%) inherited runners to score.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Had an 0-1 record and a 2.81 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 1-0 with a 5.58 ERA in 12 games on the road...surrendered four of his five home runs on the road.

**INNING BY INNING:** Logged a 0.93 ERA and .183 opponents batting average over innings one through three compared to a 6.08 ERA and .289 opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

**THIS AND THAT:** Tossed at least one inning in 17 of his 18 relief appearances, including two or more 10 times...pitched fewer than five innings in three of his six starts and his longest start was six innings...the A's were

1-5 (.167) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in all but two appearances.

**MORE 2016:** Was recalled from Nashville April 25 and made his ML debut that day at Detroit...retired the side in order in the eighth inning (1.0 ip, 1 so) and struck out the first batter he faced (Tyler Collins)...was sent back to Nashville two days later...did not pitch during his second stint, which lasted one day (April 29)...pitched just once during his third stint when he was the 26th man for the May 7 doubleheader at Baltimore...struck out the side in the ninth inning of the night game...was recalled a fourth time May 10 and allowed at least one run in seven of his eight appearances for a 9.00 ERA and .338 opponents batting average...including June 3 at Houston when he had career highs in hits (7) and runs (5)...was optioned to Nashville June 4...returned for stint number five June 18 and made his first big league start that day against Los Angeles (AL)...allowed a run on three hits in 3.0 innings and had a no decision in a 7-1 A's loss...was sent back to Nashville the following day...did not allow a run in two games during stint number six from June 30 to July 1 (3.2 ip)...stint number seven began July 4 and he allowed at least one run in each of his three appearances before going on the 15-day disabled list July 19 retroactive to July 18 with a right shin contusion...was reinstated Aug. 2, tossed 2.1 scoreless innings Aug. 3 at Los Angeles (AL) and was optioned Aug. 4...was brought back the next day when Jesse Hahn went on the DL and went 1-1 with a 2.92 ERA and .191 opponents average in seven games (five starts) during his final stint...allowed just one home run and walked two batters in 24.2 innings before a lumbar strain ended his season in early September...pitched in relief in each of the first two outings of his eighth stint but his final five appearances of the season were starts...was charged with his first career loss Aug. 11 against Baltimore when he allowed three runs on five hits in 4.0 innings...tossed a career-high 89 pitches in a career-high 6.0 scoreless innings Aug. 22 against Cleveland but had a no decision in a 1-0 loss...was credited with the first win of his career in the A's 7-4 win at St. Louis Aug. 28...struck out a career-high eight batters in a career-high tying 6.0 innings...left his final start on Sept. 2 against Boston after one inning and did not pitch again due to a lumbar strain.

**NASHVILLE:** Went 2-1 with two saves and a 2.95 ERA in 16 appearances with Triple-A Nashville, all in relief...struck out 21 and walked five in 18.1 innings...did not surrender a home run...allowed a .225 batting average, including .130 (3-for-23) against left-handed hitters compared to .271 (13-for-48) against right-handers...had a .125 batting average and .222 on-base percentage against batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .273 with runners in scoring position...did not allow a run in seven games on the road (8.0 ip) and five appearances during the day (5.2 ip)...allowed 1-of-2 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...tossed one or more innings in 15 of his 16 appearances, including a season-high 2.0 innings April 23 against New Orleans and July 28 against Colorado Springs...did not allow a run 12 times...including each of his first three games (3.0 ip) when he picked up his only two wins of the season (April 8 against Oklahoma City and April 13 against Colorado Springs)...surrendered a season-high four runs on a season-high four hits in a season-low 0.1 innings for his only loss April 14 against Colorado Springs...his most pitches in a game came on April 20 at Colorado Springs (40)...had a 5.14 ERA in six games before his first promotion to Oakland on April 25...compiled a 1.59 ERA in 10 games after that...recorded his first save of the season May 1 at Round Rock with a scoreless ninth inning...matched his season-high with three strikeouts in the second game of a double header on June 9 at Oklahoma City (also April 11 against Colorado Springs)...was credited with his second save June 12 at Oklahoma City.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Jesse Hahn (0-0, 3.00 ERA):** Was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...is scheduled to make his first start and second appearance of the season...pitched in relief in his first outing last Friday at Texas, a 10-5 A's loss (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...it was his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...is 1-1 with a 2.38 ERA (11.1 ip, 12 h, 5 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 2 hr) in two career appearances against Kansas City, both starts in 2015...had four separate stints with the A's last year and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percentage (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings)...went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA in 15 starts with Nashville...surrendered just four home runs in 68.2 innings, an average of 0.54 per nine innings.

# ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

## TEAM

**Saves/Opportunities:** 2-for-3 (66.7%)

- The A's bullpen ranks tied for third in the American League in strikeouts (28) and fifth in ERA...has issued seven walks, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...fourth in opponents on base percentage (.284).
- Earned its second save of the season Monday after going five straight games without a save opportunity...last April, converted 10-of-11 saves...last season, converted 42-of-65 (64.6%) save opportunities...had the third most blown saves in the AL (23) and the fourth lowest save percentage...tied for 10th in saves...19 of the blown saves came against AL West competition...were successful in 17-of-36 (47.2%) save opportunities against the AL West, 25-of-29 (86.2%) against everyone else.
- Had 561.1 innings pitched, which was second most in the AL (Minnesota, 567.2), second most in Oakland history (586.2 in 1997) and third most in Athletics history (588.1 in 1964)...struck out 530 batters, which was fifth most in the AL but set the Athletics record for strikeouts by the bullpen...also set a franchise record for most wild pitches (33).
- Surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)
- Allowed 27.6% of inherited runners to score, which was the fourth lowest percentage in the AL and seventh lowest by an A's team since 1974...ranked third in the AL in inherited runners (243).

- Began the year as the A's fifth starter but was moved to the bullpen after his first start Friday at Texas.
- Is on his first Opening Day roster...made his Major League debut Sept. 5, 2016, a start vs. Los Angeles-AL...his first appearance out of the bullpen will be his first career Major League relief appearance.
- Has never faced the Royals.
- Went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in seven games (three starts) this spring (22.2 ip, 22 h, 12 r, 12 er, 8 bb, 11 so, 4.76 ERA)...his 22.2 innings pitched were the third most on the team (Triggs, Manaea).

**Last Year:** *Began the season in Double-A Midland, where he went 5-6 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts before being promoted to Nashville...went 4-0 with a 1.18 ERA in eight starts in Triple-A...went 1-3 with a 7.25 ERA in five major league starts.*

- Begins his 14th Major League season and is in his second stint with the A's...pitched in 152 games for Oakland from 2004-09 and 414 for San Francisco from 2010-16.
- Is on his ninth Opening Day roster (2008-09 with Oakland and 2011-16 with San Francisco).
- Earned a save in his first appearance this season on Opening Night but does not have a save opportunity since then.
- Has not allowed a hit in four games and 4.0 innings this season...the only baserunner he has allowed came on Opening Night (walk to Simmons).
- Had no decisions and a 13.50 ERA in seven games, including one start, this spring...allowed a .346 (9-for-26) opponents batting average and issued five walks in 6.0 innings.
- Has no decisions in eight career games against the Royals (9.0 ip, 11 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 11 so, 1 hr, 7.00 ERA).
- Has a 1.52 ERA (14 er in 82.2 ip) in 83 career appearances in April, which is his lowest ERA for any month of the season.
- Signed as a free agent to a two-year contract on Jan. 20, 2017.
