OAKLAND ATHLETICS (5-4) VS. KANSAS CITY ROYALS (2-6)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won back-to-back games for the first time this year and are a season-high tying one game over .500 at 5-4 (also 1-0 on April 3)...A's starting pitchers have all five of Oakland wins...the five wins are the most by starters in the American League and tied for the most in the majors...this is the A's 50th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4044-3763 (.518) record over the previous 49 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 117th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8759-9235 (.487) in their previous 116 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on their first road trip of the season, a six-game trip to Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (2-0)...the A's will travel 51,146 miles this year, which is the most in baseball ahead of the Angels (47,828) and Mariners (46,547)...have a total of 13 trips this year with only two three-city trips...return home following the game today for a season-long 10-game homestand against Houston (three games), Texas (three games) and Seattle (four games)...went 2-2 on the first homestand against Los Angeles (AL).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have made at least one error in six straight games after going errorless over the first three games...their most consecutive games with an error last year was seven (July 10-20)...have nine errors for the season, which are the most in the American League and tied with Washington for second most in the majors (Arizona, 11)...pitchers have committed four of the errors, which is the most in the majors, and outfielders have two, which is tied for the most.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's will play 23 of their first 26 games (the month of April) against American League West competition...the exception is this three-game series at Kansas City...the A's will host all four AL West teams this month and travel to each city except Seattle...are 3-4 against the West this year...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Gray, Mengden, Smolinski, Wendle)...the A's used the DL an Oakland record 27 times last year and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 13 pitchers and 12 position players...it marked the first time the A's have opened the season with more than 12 pitchers on a 25-man Opening Day roster since 1994 when they had 13 (had 14 on the 1995 Opening Day roster, which was expanded to 28 following the strike)...five players on the Opening Day roster were signed as free agents (Casilla, R. Davis, Joyce, Plouffe, Rosales), which marks just the third time in the last 22 years the A's had five free agents make their Opening Day roster (also 1996 and 2011)...seven had six or more years of service: Madson (11 years, 155 days), R. Davis (9 years, 167 days), Casilla (9 years, 148 days), Lowrie (8 years, 111 days), Joyce (7 years, 123 days), Axford (6 years, 170 days) and Rosales (6 years, 163 days)...those are the most players with six or more years of service on an A's Opening Day roster since the 2007 club also had seven...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 29.24 years...that is Oakland's second oldest Opening Day roster over the last 13 years (29.28 last year)...Frankie Montas is the youngest player at the age of 24 years, 13 days...Santiago Casilla is the oldest at 36 years, 252 days.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's finished the spring with a six-game losing streak and went 16-18 (.471) overall, which was the fourth worst record

in the Cactus League...went 12-17-3 (.422) last spring, which was fifth worst in the CL...this marks the first time Oakland has finished with a losing record in back-to-back springs since 2010-11...the A's compiled a 5.93 ERA, which was second highest in the majors to Cincinnati (6.13)...it was the second highest spring ERA by an Oakland team over the last 18 years (6.10 in 2016)...surrendered 37 home runs, which tied for fifth fewest in the CL...had the second fewest strikeouts (247) and tied for the fifth fewest walks (121)...the offense ranked fourth in the CL in walks (133), tied for fourth in triples (11) and fifth in on-base percentage (.351)...also tied for the fewest stolen bases (15), ranked third in fewest hit by pitches (10) and fourth in most strikeouts (300)...the strikeouts are the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (previous: 248 in 2009)...the defense committed 28 errors, which was fourth fewest in the CL...however, turned just 23 double plays, which was the fewest in the CL and tied for third fewest in the majors...went 9-7 at Hohokam, 0-1 in Oakland and 7-10 on the road.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have four players under contract beyond the 2017 season...Santiago Casilla, Sean Doolittle, Matt Joyce and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's holding club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...Jed Lowrie has a club option for 2018.

RADIO AND TV: Due to conflicts with the Warriors and/or Sharks, the following changes have been made to the radio and television schedules...the games of tomorrow against Houston and next Thursday, April 18 against Texas have been moved from NBCSCA to NBCSCA Plus...Sunday's game against Houston can be heard in the Bay Area on KFOX 98.5 FM...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors and Sharks playoff schedules.

A's vs. ROYALS: The A's have won the first two meetings of 2017 to extend their winning streak against Kansas City to eight games...that is the second longest winning streak in Oakland history against the Royals...the record is 10 from May 31, 2003 to May 23, 2004...now have a six-game winning streak in Kansas City, which is the A's second longest at Kauffman Stadium...the record is 12 from May 31, 2003 to April 30, 2006...won the season series last year, 6-1...it was their first season series win since 2013 and it was the A's best record ever against a defending World Series Champion (5-1 vs. Toronto in 1994)...it was the A's second best record ever against the Royals (8-1 in 2002)...went 4-0 in Kansas City and 2-1 in Oakland...swept the four-game series at Kansas City Sept. 12-15, which was the A's second ever of the Royals (Sept. 26-28, 1977 in Oakland)...it was the A's first four-game sweep in Kansas City since July 27-30, 1959 when the Kansas City A's swept a four-game series from the original Washington Senators franchise...are 16-12 against Kansas City over the last five seasons...all-time, the A's are 316-260 against the Royals...that breaks down to 171-115 in Oakland and 145-145 in Kansas City.

TODAY'S TIDBITS
Major League Baseball has made a scoring change in the game against the Rangers on April 8...in the eighth inning, Jed Lowrie was originally credited with a RBI double...that has been changed to a two-base error by Mazara, making all of the runs in that inning unearned...**Khris Davis** is the only Athletic to reach base safely in all nine games and now has a career-high 18-game reaching base streak dating back to Sept. 23, 2016 (previous: 15, Sept. 1-16, 2015)...**Ryon Healy** has hit safely in each of his six career games against Kansas City...is 12-for-25 (.480) with two home runs and seven RBI in those games, all at Kauffman Stadium...**Jed Lowrie** has a 65-game errorless streak as a second baseman, which is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In 1968 the Oakland A's win their first game, a 9-6 victory at Washington...Chuck Dobson pitches six innings for the win and Sal Bando homers and drives in four runs...in 1994 the A's draw 12 walks for the second consecutive game, tying what was then a club record for walks in a game...Mark McGwire walks in his first four at bats of the A's 8-7, 12 inning win...Oakland also collects 18 hits and strands 20 base runners.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (0-0, 3.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...is scheduled to make his first start and second appearance of the season.

LAST APPEARANCE: He relieved A's starting pitcher Raul Alcantara to start the third inning of the A's 10-5 loss at Texas last Friday...entered the game trailing 8-3 and tossed 6.0 innings in his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...blanked the Rangers on two hits over his first three innings before allowing two runs in the sixth on a Gomez RBI double and a Mazara RBI single...those were the only runs he would allow.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-6, 10-inning win at Los Angeles on August 4, 2016...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Choi in the second...the A's scored a run in the third but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the third on a Simmons RBI single and a Choi three-run home run...Oakland came back with three in the fourth and he was relieved by Neal to start the fifth inning with the score tied 5-5.

HAHN vs. KANSAS CITY: Is 1-1 with a 2.38 ERA (11.1 ip, 12 h, 5 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 2 hr) in two career appearances, both starts in 2015...the win came on April 18 at Kansas City when he combined with Jesse Chavez on a seven-hit shutout in the A's 5-0...it was his first win as an Athletic...tossed 5.1 innings and allowed three of the hits...allowed only one base runner to advance into scoring position...left with one out in the sixth inning with a blister...then took the loss in a 5-2 decision in Oakland on June 26...allowed a solo home run to Morales in the second inning and three more runs in the third, although only one was earned...Cain and Hosmer had RBI singles and Cain scored on an error...also surrendered a solo home run to Gordon in the sixth inning.

2016 RECAP: Had four separate stints with the A's and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percentage (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...struck out just 23 batters (4.47 per nine innings) and walked 19 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.21, which was the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .273 (27-for-99) against right-handed hitters compared to .361 (30-for-83) against left-handers...surrendered seven of his eight home runs to lefties and had a .663 slugging percentage against lefties, .333 against righties...his career splits are .213 (88-for-414) against righties, .282 (121-for-429) with 14 of his 17 home runs against lefties...has a .436 career slugging percentage against lefties, .278 against righties...had a .226 opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .358 after that...opponents hit .426 with a .449 on-base percentage and .681 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...in 2015, his marks were .215, .277 and .290 respectively...allowed a .324 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .500 with RISP and two outs...five of the eight home runs he surrendered were solo shots...yielded a .300 average with two strikes and a .440 average to the first hitter in the batting order.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 2-1 with a 3.03 ERA and .237 opponents batting average in five starts at home, 0-3 with a 13.17 ERA and .453 opponents average in four starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 5-4 with a 3.06 ERA (32 er in 94.0 ip) in 15 starts in Oakland, 3-6 with a 6.05 ERA (37 er in 55.0 ip) in 11 games on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 2-1 with a 3.90 ERA and .234 opponents average in five starts during the day, 0-3 with a 9.92 ERA and .427 opponents average in four starts at night...his career splits are 8-3 with a 2.31 ERA (24 er in 93.1 ip) in 15 day games, 7-11 with a 4.88 ERA (70 er in 129.0 ip) in 25 night games.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents were successful in each of their seven stolen base attempts off him after going 5-for-9 (55.6%) over his first two seasons...the A's were 5-4 (.556) in his starting assignments...tossed more than six innings in just three of his nine starts...has done that in just 11 of 37 starts in his career...the bullpen blew a save in three of his nine starts.

MORE 2016: Was recalled for the first time April 30 and went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .250 opponents average in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 8...combined with Axford and Madson on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Houston on April 30 but then walked a career-high tying four batters in the night game of the May 7 day/night doubleheader at Baltimore and took the loss...blanked the Orioles over the first two innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.2 inning...made just one start at Nashville following his May 8 option and returned to Oakland May 17...went 1-3 with an 8.34 ERA and .368 opponents batting average in five starts during his second stint with the A's...left with the lead in each of his first two starts on May 17 against Texas and May 22 against New York (AL) but the bullpen blew the save in each outing...yielded a career-high tying 10 hits against the Rangers...issued a career-high tying four walks May 28 against Detroit but picked up his second win of the season...allowed a career-high seven runs in a career-low 0.2 innings in a 1-2 loss at Houston June 3...became the eighth starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow seven or more runs in less than an inning, the first since Joe Blanton allowed eight runs in 0.1 innings against Tampa Bay on May 25, 2005...was optioned to Nashville June 10...did not return to Oakland until July 24...started that day against Tampa Bay and allowed one run on four hits in 7.2 innings...left with a 2-0 lead but the bullpen blew the save and he ended up with a no decision...was optioned back to Nashville the next day...also made just one start during his fourth and final stint...was recalled Aug. 4, allowed five runs on seven hits in 4.0 innings in a start that day at Los Angeles (AL), and was placed on the disabled list the next day with a strained right shoulder...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville Sept. 2.

NASHVILLE: Went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA in 15 starts with Nashville...the starts were the first of his career at the Triple-A level...had just four career losses as a minor leaguer entering the season...surrendered just four home runs in 68.2 innings, an average of 0.54 per nine innings...however, issued 34 walks (4.59 per nine innings) and struck out just 46 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.35...allowed a .276 opponents batting average, including .255 (38-for-149) against right-handed hitters compared to .304 (34-for-112) against left-handers...surrendered three of his four home runs to righties...went 0-7 with a 4.71 ERA in 10 starts at home compared to 1-0 with a 3.18 ERA in five starts on the road...allowed all four of his home runs at home...yielded a .175 batting average and .246 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents batted .222 with runners in scoring position, including .188 with RISP and two outs...they were 1-for-9 (.111) with the bases loaded...the Sounds were 6-9 (.400) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than five innings in eight of his 15 starts and more than six innings just once...had three starts without a run and four more with just one...walked three batters or more seven times...did not allow a run in his first two starts, tossing 6.0 shutout innings on April 8 against Oklahoma City and April 13 against Colorado Springs...had a no decision in each start and struck out a season-high six batters in the latter contest...was 0-1 with a 2.04 ERA in four starts when he was recalled by Oakland for the first time on April 30...was optioned back to Nashville May 8, picked up his only Triple-A win of the season May 12 at Iowa when he allowed one run in 5.2 innings, and was sent back to Oakland May 17...returned to the Sounds June 10 and went 0-6 with a 5.60 ERA (27 er in 43.1 ip) over his final 10 starts with Nashville...walked a season-high seven batters in 4.2 innings in a 4-3 loss to Memphis June 13...had his shortest start of the season July 20 at Albuquerque when he pitched just 1.0 inning...was recalled by Oakland July 24 to start on short rest...was optioned back to Nashville the next day and tossed a season-high 7.0 innings July 29 against Colorado Springs...returned to Oakland Aug. 4 but was sent back to the Sounds on Aug. 16 on a rehab assignment...matched his season-high with six strikeouts that day against Tacoma...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season-high 11 hits in 3.2 innings in his final regular season start, a 10-1 loss to Iowa Aug. 31...was reinstated from the Oakland DL and optioned to Nashville Sept. 2...made one postseason start and had a no decision in the Sounds 10-7 win in Game 1 of the Pacific Coast League Semifinals Sept. 7 at Oklahoma City (4.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 7 so).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (2-0, 2.08 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...is one of three American League pitchers to win each of his first two starts...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's win at Texas last Saturday (7.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 3-2 with a 4.46 ERA (36.1 ip, 36 h, 19 r, 18 er, 8 bb, 14 so, 5 hr) in six career starts against Houston...went 2-1 with a 2.29 ERA in five starts this spring...held the opposition to a .188 (13-for-69) batting average and walked just three batters in 19.2 innings (1.37 walks per nine innings)...allowed one run or fewer in four of his five starts...compiled a 10-11 record and a 4.11 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts in his second season with the A's last year...went 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts, 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA over his next 16 starts from May 30 to Aug. 24, and 0-3 with a 4.71 ERA over his final six starts.

- The A's bullpen ranks fourth in the American League in strikeouts (30) and sixth in ERA...has issued eight walks, which is fifth fewest in the AL...sixth in opponents on base percentage (.293).
- Earned its second save of the season Monday after going five straight games without a save opportunity...last April, converted 10-of-11 saves... last season, converted 42-of-65 (64.6%) save opportunities...had the third most blown saves in the AL (23) and the fourth lowest save percentage...tied for 10th in saves...19 of the blown saves came against AL West competition...were successful in 17-of-36 (47.2%) save opportunities against the AL West, 25-of-29 (86.2%) against everyone else.
- Had 561.1 innings pitched, which was second most in the AL (Minnesota, 567.2), second most in Oakland history (586.2 in 1997) and third most in Athletics history (588.1 in 1964)...struck out 530 batters, which was fifth most in the AL but set the Athletics record for strikeouts by the bullpen...also set a franchise record for most wild pitches (33).
- Surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)
- Allowed 27.6% of inherited runners to score, which was the fourth lowest percentage in the AL and seventh lowest by an A's team since 1974...ranked third in the AL in inherited runners (243).

- Began the year as the A's fifth starter but was moved to the bullpen after his first start Friday at Texas.
- Is on his first Opening Day roster...made his Major League debut Sept. 5, 2016, a start vs. Los Angeles-AL...his first appearance out of the bullpen will be his first career Major League relief appearance.
- Has never faced the Royals.
- Went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in seven games (three starts) this spring (22.2 ip, 22 h, 12 r, 12 er, 8 bb, 11 so, 4.76 ERA)...his 22.2 innings pitched were the third most on the team (Triggs, Manaea).
