THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: APRIL 14

1985 - In a battle between the Major League's two all-time leaders in strikeouts, **Nolan Ryan** defeats **Steve Carlton** and the Phillies, 5-3, in the Astrodome...Ryan earns the complete game win and punches out nine to increase his career strikeout lead over Carlton to 10 (3,887 to 3,877)...**Jose Cruz** has three hits in the victory.

TODAY'S MEDIA AVAILABILITY

The Astros clubhouse will be open from 4-4:50 p.m...manager **A.J. Hinch** will be available in the Astros dugout at approximately 4:50 p.m.

TONIGHT'S MATCHUP: The Astros and Athletics will renew their AL West rivalry tonight in the first of three over the weekend at Oakland Coliseum....both teams will have their Opening Day starter on the mound as Houston will send **LHP Dallas Keuchel** (1-0) to the bump tonight opposite **RHP Kendall Graveman** (2-0) and the A's.

HISTORIC START: LHP Dallas Keuchel is just the fourth pitcher in Major League history to go at least 7.0 innings and allow two hits or less in each of his first two games of a season, joining RHP Nolan Ryan (1970), RHP Tom Phoebus (1970) and RHP Lon Warneke (1934)...no pitcher has done so in his first three outings of a season.

REDDICK AVAILABILITY: The Astros will make **OF Josh Reddick** available to the media today at 4:30 p.m. in the Astros dugout...Reddick played parts of five Major League seasons (2012-16) with Oakland before a trade to the Dodgers at the trading deadline last season...this is his first trip back to Oakland Coliseum since the trade.

TO THE LEFT: After a run of facing six left-handed starters in a seven-game span, the Astros are facing a right-handed starter for the second straight game tonight...Houston is 2-4 in games started against left-handed starters and 4-0 when matched up with a right-handed starter in 2017.

STREAKY START: The Astros, who have been traditionally slow starters, ripped off a three-game winning streak to open the season, dropped three in a row, and have won three of their last four contests...at 6-4, the Astros are off to their best 10-game start since 2006 (6-4), and with a win tonight will match their 11-game start in 2006 (7-4).

PITCHING PROWESS: The Astros pitching staff has posted a 3.47 ERA (37ER/96IP) this season...the starting rotation has been particularly strong, posting a 3.24 ERA (21ER/58.1IP), which is the best starter's ERA through the club's first 10 games of a season since the 1997 season (3.10 ERA, 24ER/69.2IP).

TEAM RANKINGS: Entering today, the Astros ranked first in the AL in innings pitched (96.0), second in strikeouts (89), third in starter's ERA (3.24) and fourth in team ERA (3.47)...offensively, Houston ranks second in the AL in hits (93), third in batting average (.266), tied for third in home runs (12) and fourth in OBP (.337).

WEDNESDAY'S WIN: The Astros took the rubber game of their three-game series in Seattle on Wednesday night by a score of 10-5...trailing 5-0 through 3.0 innings, the Astros scored 10 unanswered runs, marking their largest comeback since a six-run comefrom-behind victory on May 15, 2008 at SF.

SMALL BALL: The Astros hammered out 10 runs on 16 hits on Wednesday at SEA, but did not hit a home run, marking the first time for the club to score 10-plus runs without hitting a home run since April 19, 2012 at WSH (11-4 win)...Houston is 5-2 when hitting a home run this season and 1-2 when they don't homer.

LEADOFF SHOTS: OF George Springer became the first player in MLB history to hit four leadoff homers in his club's first nine games of a season, besting **OF Brady Anderson**, who hit four leadoff homers in the Orioles first 17 games of 1996...Anderson was also the quickest player to reach five leadoff homers in a season, doing so in the Orioles first 27 games of 1996...Springer now has 13 career leadoff homers, which ranks tied for second in Astros history with **Terry Puhl** (13), trailing only **Craig Biggio** (53).

FIVE IN 10: OF George Springer, who leads the American League in home runs, is the fourth player in Astros history to have five home runs in the club's first 10 games of a season...he joins Lance Berkman (6 in 2006), Glenn Davis (5 in 1988) and Jimmy Wynn (6 in 1973) in that group.

CLIMBING CHARTS: OF Carlos Beltrán, who has played in parts of 20 Major League season, ranks in the top 50 all-time in doubles and RBI in MLB history.

MR. APRIL: RHP Will Harris has been at his best in April since he joined the Astros, posting a 0.33 ERA (1ER/27.2IP) in 23 games in the month, spanning three seasons (2015-17)...his numbers prior to the All-Star Break since joining the Astros: 5-2 with nine saves and a 1.16 ERA (11ER/85IP) in 79 appearances.

42'S TOMORROW: The Astros will join the rest of Major League Baseball tomorrow in celebrating Jackie Robinson Day at the ballpark...in his memory, all members of the Astros and Athletics will wear Robinson's iconic jersey number 42.

RDAD TRIPPIN': The Astros are on their first road trip of the season, which has taken them to Seattle (2-1) and on to Oakland (3g)...Houston went 41-40 on the road in 2016, their first winning road record since 2004.

VS. DAKLAND: The Astros have gone 31-21 against the A's since April 26, 2014, which includes three consecutive season series victories over Oakland... Houston's 31-21 record in its last 52 games opposite Oakland represents a stark difference from the first 30 matchups, with the Astros going just 5-25 in those contests.

STRAIGHT A'S: The Astros have won their last seven games vs. the A's, which is Houston's longest winning streak against the A's in club history...a win tonight would give the Astros an eight-game streak, which would be their second-longest in franchise history against an AL opponent (LAA, 11g, 2016).

- became the 1st Astros pitcher to make 3 consecutive Opening Day starts since RHP Roy Oswalt did so in 8 consecutive seasons from 2003-10.... also became the 1st left-handed pitcher in club history to make 3 total Opening Day starts...surpassed LHP Dave Roberts, who started on Opening Day in 1973 and 1974.
- improved to 3-0 with a 0.86 ERA (2ER/21IP) in his 3 career Opening Day starts...his 3 career wins on Opening Day rank T-2nd in club history with RHP Mike Scott and RHP Shane Reynolds, behind only RHP Larry **Dierker** (4)...0.86 ERA is the best by an Astro with multiple OD starts.

- made a throwing error in his last start, his 1st error since Sept. 11, 2015... snapped a streak of 31 consecutive starts and 208.2 innings pitched without recording an error.
- VS. DAK: is in search of his 1st career win at Oakland Coliseum despite posting a 3.00 ERA (12ER/36IP) in 6 games (5 starts) at the venue.
- has thrown 9 consecutive quality starts against the A's dating back to April 26, 2014...has gone 2-1 with a 1.91 ERA (14ER/66IP) during his streak.
- HIS HOUSE: leads the AL in ERA at home since the 2014 season with a 2.35 (82ER/313.2IP) mark...has gone 24-10 in his 45 starts in that span for a .706 winning percentage, with the Astros going 30-15 in his starts (.667).
- **SPRING:** made 4 starts this spring, posting a 2.70 ERA (5ER/16.2IP) with 10 strikeouts and 3 walks.
