# THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: APRIL 15

1968 - The longest shutout in MLB history is played at the Astrodome vs. the Mets, lasting over six hours before the Astros finally score a run in the 24th inning to win it, 1-0...catchers Hal King and Jerry Grote play the entire contest...Tom Seaver (10 IP, 2 H) and Don Wilson (9 IP, 5 H) were the starters...Wade Blasingame earned the win in relief (4 IP).

## TODAY'S MEDIA AVAILABILITY

The Astros clubhouse will be open from 10:10-11 a.m...manager **A.J. Hinch** will be available in the Astros dugout at approximately 11 a.m. **TODAY'S MATCHUP:** The Astros and Athletics will play the middle game of this three-game series today in a 1:07 p.m. PT matinee at the Oakland Coliseum.... today's pitching matchup is a meeting of young starters, as 23-year-old **RHP Lance McCullers Jr.** (1-0) will start for Houston opposite 25-year-old **LHP Sean Manaea** (0-1) and the Oakland A's.

**K COUNTER:** Strikeout-artist **RHP Lance McCullers Jr.** (1-0) enters today's game having fanned 17 hitters in 13.0 innings pitched in his two starts on the season... in his career, he's recorded 252 strikeouts in 219.2 innings for a 10.32 strikeouts per 9.0 ratio, which ranks third in the AL since his debut season of 2015.

**TO THE LEFT:** Today's matchup opposite **LHP Sean Manaea** (0-1) will be the Astros seventh game of the season opposite a left-handed starter...Houston is 2-4 in games started against left-handed starters and 5-0 when matched up with a right-handed starter in 2017.

**STREAKY START:** The Astros, who have been traditionally slow starters, already have posted two three-game winning streaks and a three-game losing streak in their 11 games of 2017...at 7-4, the Astros are off to their best 11-game start since 2006 (7-4), and with a win today will keep pace with their 12-game start in 2006 (8-4).

**PITCHING PROWESS:** The Astros pitching staff has posted a 3.34 ERA (39ER/105IP) this season, which ranks fourth in the AL...the Astros also rank first in the AL in strikeouts (100) and innings pitched (105.0), and third in starter's ERA (3.03).

**THAT'S OFFENSIVE:** The Astros have recorded 10-or-more hits in four of their last five games to raise their team batting average from .227 (after game six), to .267 entering today...Houston now leads the Majors in hits (103), ranks second in the AL in batting average (.267) and third in OBP (.339)...AL rankings below:

LAST NIGHT'S WIN: LHP Dallas Keuchel (1ER/7IP) was once again dominant as he kept the game close until the Astros were able to break the contest open with five runs after the 6th en route to a 7-2 series-opening victory in Oakland...Houston tallied 10 hits on the night, including a big night from 2B Jose Altuve, who went 3x3 with two doubles, two walks and two runs scored.

HISTORIC START: LHP Dallas Keuchel has opened his season with three straight 7.0-inning starts, while allowing one-or-fewer runs in each outing...the only other player in Astros history to open a campaign like this was RHP Roger Clemens in 2005...prior to Keuchel this season, the last Major Leaguer to open a season with three straight 7.0-inning starts, while allowing one-or-fewer runs and four-or-fewer hits was RHP Matt Harvey, in his first four starts of 2013.

JACKIE ROBINSON DAY: This year marks the 70th anniversary of the legendary Hall of Famer Jackie Robinson breaking the color barrier on April 15, 1947...in honor of the legacy he leaves behind, Robinson's jersey No. 42 was retired throughout the sport of baseball in 1997, and on this date since 2004, all 30 MLB teams have annually celebrated his courage, athleticism and unstoppable spirit with a league-wide day of celebration.

**HOLY ON-BASE STREAK. BATMAN:** 2B Jose Altuve has reached base safely in 11 consecutive plate appearances entering today, going 7x7 with four walks, six runs scored and three doubles...this is the longest streak by an Astro since **Bill Spiers** set the club record with 13 from June 3-11, 1997 with nine walks, three singles and one HBP...per Elias, the last MLB player to reach safely in 11 straight plate appearances was **2B Dustin Pedroia**, who did so in 12 straight in 2016.

**THE 200 CLUB: 2B Jose Altuve** has 202 career steals, which ranks tied for sixth in Astros history.

**LEADOFF SHOTS: OF George Springer** became the first player in MLB history to hit four leadoff homers in his club's first nine games of a season, besting **OF Brady Anderson**, who hit four leadoff homers in the Orioles first 17 games of 1996...Anderson was also the quickest player to reach five leadoff homers in a season, doing so in the Orioles first 27 games of 1996...Springer now has 13 career leadoff homers, which ranks tied for second in Astros history with **Terry Puhl** (13), trailing only **Craig Biggio** (53).

FIVE IN 11: OF George Springer, who ranks tied for first in the American League in home runs, is the sixth player in Astros history to total five home runs in the club's first 11 games of a season...he joins Lance Berkman (6 in 2006), Jeff Bagwell (5 in 2003), Chris Truby (6 in 2001), Glenn Davis (5 in 1988) and Jimmy Wynn (6 in 1973) in that group.

**CLIMBING CHARTS: OF Carlos Beltrán**, who has played in parts of 20 Major League season, ranks in the top 50 all-time in doubles and RBI in MLB history.

**MR. APRIL:** RHP Will Harris has been at his best in April since he joined the Astros, posting a 0.33 ERA (1ER/27.2IP) in 23 games in the month, spanning three seasons (2015-17)...his numbers prior to the All-Star Break since joining the Astros: 5-2 with nine saves and a 1.16 ERA (11ER/85IP) in 79 appearances.

**STRAIGHT A'S:** The Astros have won their last eight games vs. the A's, which is Houston's longest winning streak against the A's in club history and the Astros second-longest winning streak in franchise history against an AL opponent (LAA, 11g, 2016).

- **LAST START 4/9 VS. KC:** took a no-decision in the Astros 5-4 win vs. KC last Sunday at Minute Maid Park...gave up 3 runs in 7.0 innings of work, while fanning 10 without a walk.
- became the 2nd AL pitcher with a 10+ strikeout game this year (Verlander)...was the 7th double-digit strikeout game of his career (last, 7/27/16 vs. NYY, 10 SO)...prior to McCullers Jr., the last Astro to open up a season with 7+ strikeouts and no more than 2 walks in each of his first 2 starts of a season was RHP Roger Clemens in 2005.
- **MAKING McCULLERS:** the 23-year-old will be making his 3rd start this season today, and 1st on the road...made his debut on an Opening Day roster in 2017, and is in his 6th season as a professional (3rd in the Majors).
- was originally selected by Houston with the 41st overall pick in the supplemental first round of the June 2012 draft out of Jesuit High School in Tampa, FL.
- has made 38 career starts over the last 3 seasons (2015-17), compiling a 13-12 record and a 3.20 ERA (78ER/219.2IP) with 252 strikeouts.
- **MkKULLERS:** Holds a career 10.32 strikeouts per 9.0 innings ratio (252K/219.2IP)...his 17 strikeouts this season rank T-5th among all American League pitchers.
- has 252 career strikeouts in his 1st 38 games in the Majors...his strikeout total ranks 12th in Major League history in a pitcher's 1st 38 games...
   RHP Dwight Gooden owns the record with 332...only 10 pitchers in ML history have more career double-digit strikeout games than McCullers Jr. (7) in their 1st 38 games.
- put up a career-high 11.78 strikeouts per 9.0 innings ratio (106SO/81IP) in 2016, which ranked 4th among all Major League pitchers with at least 80.0 innings pitched behind RHP Jose Fernandez (12.49), RHP Yu Darvish (11.84) and RHP David Phelps (11.84)...was the 4th-highest single season strikeouts per 9.0 innings ratio by an Astros pitcher all-time (min. 80IP), behind RHP Brad Lidge in 2004 (14.93), RHP Octavio Dotel in 2001 (12.43) and LHP Randy Johnson in 1998 (12.38).
- IN 2016: Posted a 3.22 ERA with 106 strikeouts in 81.0 innings across 14 starts in a season bookended by stints on the Disabled List...spent the season as one of the youngest starting pitchers in the AL...the only AL pitchers younger than McCullers to make a start were RHP Jose Berrios, RHP Luis Severino and RHP David Paulino.
- **VS. DAK:** will face the A's for the 1st time this season and 4th time in his career...last faced Oakland on 7/9/16...gave up 3 runs in 4.0 innings in the Astros 2-3 loss...today will be his 1st career start at the Oakland Coliseum.
- **HOMEBODY:** in 22 career starts at Minute Maid Park, has gone 10-4 with a 2.18 ERA (33ER/136IP) and 162 strikeouts...owns the lowest ERA in the history of the venue (min. 100IP).
- has held the opposition to no more than 3 runs in each of his last 22 starts at home...is the longest streak by an AL pitcher since RHP Pedro Martinez had a 23-game run from 1999-2001...ranks 2nd in the AL in home ERA since 2016 with a 2.47 mark (20ER/73IP, min. 60IP)...ranks 2nd behind teammate RHP Chris Devenski (1.78).
- he and RHP Larry Dierker (22 games from 1970-72) are the only pitchers in club history to have a 22-start streak of allowing three runs or less at home.
- became the 2nd pitcher in Major League history to allow 3 runs or less in each of his first 22 career starts at home, joining RHP Jose Fernandez (25 starts from 2013-15).
- in 2016 went 5-3 with a 2.40 ERA (16ER/60IP) and 80 strikeouts in 10 starts at home...his ERA led the AL (min. 60IP).

**LAST START - 4/10 AT SEA:** made his 2nd consecutive start against the Mariners at Safeco Field last Monday...gave up 3 runs in 5.0 innings with 6 strikeouts in the Astros 6-0 loss...took the loss in what was his 1st decision of 2017.

**ABOUT MORTON:** Veteran starter will be making his 3rd start of the season tomorrow at OAK, which will also be his 2nd on the road... has gone 46-71 with a 4.53 ERA (455ER/904IP) and 640 strikeouts in 164 games (163 starts) in the Major Leagues across parts of 10 seasons with the Braves (2008), Pirates (2009-15), Phillies (2016) and Houston (2017).

 was signed by the Astros as a free agent on Nov. 16, 2016 to a twoyear contract that runs through the 2018 season.

**GROUND CHUCK:** Altered his delivery at the onset of the 2011 season, which has produced a huge uptick in his ground ball to fly ball ratio... from 2011-17, Morton has led the Majors in GB/FB ratio with a 2.97 mark (min. 600IP)...in his Major League outings from 2008-10, posted a 1.64 GB/FB ratio.

**SPRING FLING:** had a dominant Spring, going 2-0 with a 1.04 ERA (2ER/17.1IP) and 17 strikeouts...his ERA ranked 2nd in the Majors this Spring among pitchers with at least 15 innings pitched...ranked behind only **RHP Masahiro Tanaka** (0.38).

- recorded his 2nd consecutive 3-hit, 2-walk game last night at OAK...has reached base safely in 11 consecutive plate appearances dating back to Tues. at SEA. the last Astros player to reach base in 11 consecutive plate appearances was Bill Spiers, who set a franchise record by reaching in 13 consecutive PA's in 1997.
- is the 7th player in club history to reach base safely 5 times in 2 consecutive games...also George Springer (2016), Carlos Lee (2008), Lance Berkman (2008), Ken Caminiti (2000), Rick Wilkins (1996) and Jeff Bagwell (1995)... no Astros player has done this in 3 straight games.
- recorded his 3rd steal of the season last night...tied Jeff Bagwell for 6th place on the club's all-time stolen base list (202)...is 15 steals shy of tying Terry Puhl (217) for 5th place.
- has gone 10x18 (.556) with 3 doubles, 7 walks, 6 runs and a .680 OBP in his last 5 games...did not record a walk and had just 4 hits in his first 6 games
- collected his 1st multi-hit game of the season on Sunday vs. KC (2x5)...last year, also did not record a multi-hit game until his 7th game of the season...went on to win the AL batting title with a .338 average, recording 216 hits.
- owns a career .342 (310x907) batting average against left-handed pitchers...is the 2nd-highest career batting average against lefties produced by a Major Leaguer since 1974 (the year splits were first tracked), trailing only Freddy Sanchez (.342).
