WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers suffered a walk-off loss to the Mariners yesterday, 8-7, as club has lost 3 in a row to match longest skid in '17...had won 2 straight and 4 of previous 6 before current 3-game drought...team has gone 2-4 entering the final series of this 9-game, 9-day road trip to LAA (2-1), SEA (0-3), and OAK (3 G)...club has opened season with a 4-8 record for the 1st time since 2006 (4-8), matching lowest 12-G win total since opening 3-9 in 2002...after 13 G, team was 7-6 in 2016 and 5-8 in 2015...have not had a 4-9 or worse record thru 13 G since 2002 (3-10).

• The Rangers are 4.0 games back in the A.L. West behind division leader HOU, dropping into 5th place with yesterday's loss...current 4.0-game deficit is largest since 8/31/15 (-4.0 GB), and this is latest point in a season that the team has been in 5th place since 5/5/15.

<u>SERIES STUFF:</u> Texas has is 2-2-0 in its 1st 4 series in 2017, winning a rubber game series finale in the 2 victories and getting swept in the 2 defeats (4/3-5 vs. CLE; Fri-Sun at SEA).

ON THE ROAD: Rangers have opened this season with a 2-4 road record, needing to win all 3 games here in Oakland to finish this initial trip with a winning record...the Rangers were 42-39 (.519) in road games in 2016, T3rd-best in the A.L...club has winning road records in 2 straight and 5 of last 6 seasons, and .518 (255-237) away win pct. since 2011 is 2nd-best in MLB (STL: .526, 259-233).

STAYING WEST: The Rangers' first 42 games - over a quarter of the way into the 2017 season - are scheduled to take place in the Central and Pacific Time Zones, as each of those contests will be played in just 3 states: Texas, California, and Washington...the Rangers' 1st game outside of those 3 states, or in the Eastern Time Zone, does not come until a 3-city road trip from May 19-28 to DET, BOS, and TOR.

VS. OAKLAND: Texas took 2 of 3 in 1st meeting from 4/7-9 in Arlington, as clubs are playing 6 times over a 13-day span...teams also play 5/12-14 at TEX, but then do not meet again until late August...Rangers have won 8 of 12 and 12 of last 18 overall...Texas won season series 10-9 last year, 4th straight season for TEX/OAK season series to be decided by 10-9 margin...Texas clinched division on 9/23/16 at OAK... club was 5-5 at the Coliseum in 2016, with loss in last game here on 9/25/16 snapping a 5-G win streak at OAK that was club's longest in this facility since 2011...all-time, Rangers lead 355-342, but A's have 178-169 edge at the Coliseum.

MORE TOUGH LUCK FOR HAMELS: Cole Hamels exited yesterday's game with a 6-4 lead, but Tony Barnette allowed single runs in the 6th and 7th innings for a blown save... Hamels has exited in position to win in each of his 3 starts in 2017, but has 3 no-decisions after blown saves by the bullpen...Hamels is the only MLB pitcher with 3 "wins lost" this season, and the 3 instances are already one more than his Texas total in 2015-16 (2) after the trade from Philadelphia.

HOLD ON: Yesterday's 2 blown saves gives the Rangers 5 in 2017, T1st in MLB (also SEA) and tied for most through 12 games in club history...only other season with 5 BS thru 12 G was 2005, when current pitching coach Doug Brocail had one of the 5...Texas did not record a 5th blown save in 2016 until 5/14/16 vs. TOR in game no. 37.

- Yesterday marked just the 2nd time in the last 8 seasons (2010-17) for Texas to suffer multiple blown saves in a single contest...the other instance was on 5/16/15 vs. CLE, when Keone Kela and Neftali Feliz could not hold leads...yesterday marked the 1st road game in which TEX has suffered multiple blown saves since 9/17/07 at MIN in the now-demolished Metrodome, a game started by Edinson Volquez in which C.J. Wilson and Joaquin Benoit had blown saves in Twins' 5-4 walkoff victory.
- Texas had a 5-R lead in yesterday's loss, matching largest lead in a loss in '17 (also Tues. at LAA).

CHOO IN CHARGE: Shin-Soo Choo had 5 RBI in yester-day's loss in Seattle, his most RBI in a game since 9/17/10 at KC while with CLE, when he had career-high matching 7 RBI...it was Choo's 5th career game with 5+ RBI, his most with Texas.

- Choo's HR yesterday was his 1st since 7/5/16 at BOS, one of his 2 XBH in the game (also a 2B)...he had one game with multiple XBH in 2016 (HR, 2B on 7/3/16 at MIN), a product of his limited action due to 4 DL stints.
- Choo also walked yesterday and his 5 BB are T3rd on the club...the only Texas regular (25+ PA's) with a higher OBP than Choo's .349 is Nomar Mazara (.377).

BIG GAMES: The Rangers now have 3 individual games of 5+ RBI over the club's last 9 contests beginning 4/7 (others by Mazara and Gallo)...in 2016, the Rangers had just 4 such games for the entire season...Texas owns a major league-best 3 of the 14 individual games of 5+ RBI in MLB this season, as only other teams with multiple instances are CLE (2) and WAS (2).

MAZARA'S CLUTCH DRIVE: Nomar Mazara hit a go-ahead HR in the top of the 9th yesterday ahead of the Rangers' walk-off loss to the M's...Texas had not lost a game when receiving a go-ahead HR in the 9th-or-later since 5/17/16 here in Oakland, when Ian Desmond's 2-R HR with 2 outs in the 9th gave TEX a 5-4 lead before Khris Davis hit a 2-out walk-off grand slam off Shawn Tolleson in the bottom half of the inning in an 8-5 Rangers defeat.

• Mazara ranks among A.L. leaders in RBI (T1st, 13), hits (T2nd, 17), multi-hit games (T2nd, 6), runs (T2nd, 11), TB (T3rd, 31), HR (T5th, 4), and batting average (8th, .340)... the only ML players with at least 4 HR, 13 RBI, and 11 R are Mazara and Bryce Harper.

GO BIG OR GO HOME: The Rangers hit 2 HR yesterday to bring club's season long ball total to an A.L.-leading 20, 3rd-most in MLB (22-MIL/NYM)...the 20 HR mark the 4th-highest total in club history through 12 G, trailing 2009 (24), 2003 (23), and 2012 (22)...yesterday's 3-R HR by Choo was the team's MLB-high 5th clout of 3+ runs this season, as CLE (4) is the only other club with more than 3...5 teams have no HR of 3+ R in '17...in '16, Texas did not hit its 5th HR of 3+ R until 5/8/16 at DET, a Bobby Wilson grand slam off Mark Lowe.

OFFENSE IN GEAR: After scoring one run in the 1st 2 games in Seattle, Texas posted 7 runs yesterday, but still remained winless when scoring less than 8 runs...Texas ranks among A.L. leaders in R (T1st, 62), HR (1st, 20), XBH (3rd, 38), and SLG (4th, .427)...club has extra-base hits in each of 1st 12 G to open the season, longest season-opening streak since 2014 (1st 18 G).

• Texas has 11 innings of 3+ R in '17, most in MLB (ARI/BOS have 9 each).

GRIFFIN AT THE COLISEUM: Texas starter A.J. Griffin makes his return to the Coliseum tonight, where he has not appeared since 9/18/13 vs. LAA in his final home start with the A's...the California native is 10-4, 3.44 (56 ER/146.1 IP) in 24 G/GS in his career at the Coliseum with 14 quality starts, and the A's went 18-6 in those starts...his .714 win pct. here is 5th-highest in Coliseum history among pitchers with 20+ starts at this facility...also made one postseason start at this park (2012 ALDS G4 vs. DET).

SHORTS: Elvis Andrus has 1281 career hits, tied with Ruben Sierra for 5th-most in Rangers history (Juan Gonzalez is 4th w/ 1595)...Rangers have turned 18 double plays, 3rd in MLB to COL (20) and SEA (19)...after playing team's shortest game of 2017 on Saturday (2:24), the Rangers played a season-long 3:39 affair yesterday, the club's longest reg. season contest since an even 4-hour loss in the 2016 regular season finale (10/2/16 vs. TB, 6-4 loss in 10 innings)...Rangers w/ multiple errors: Andurs-3, Odor-2, Hamels-2.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#64 A.J. Griffin, RHP (1-0, 6.75)

TONIGHT: The 29-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 3rd start of the season tonight in the opener of a 3-game series in Oakland...has not started in Oakland since 9/18/13, but owns the 5th-highest win percentage (.714, 10-4) at the Coliseum among pitchers with at least 20 career starts at the facility...will be working on regular 4-days' rest after he picked up his 1st win of the season in the Rangers' 8-1 win over the Angels on Wednesday in Anaheim...Texas has won both of Griffin's starts in '17 and is 18-7 in 25 starts overall with the club... the California native ranked 3rd on the staff in starts (23) and innings (119.0) as the 5th starter in 2016...went 7-4 with a 5.07 ERA (67 ER/119.0 IP) last year, the highest ERA of his 1st 3 seasons in the majors, while averaging a career-high 8.1 SO/9 IP...has a 26-0 record in 31 career starts when receiving 4+ runs of support, with his teams going 29-2 in those contests...signed with Texas in January 2016 after having spent entire pro career in Oakland organization since being drafted in 2010...was 21-11 over 47 starts with the Athletics from 2012-13.

LAST START: Picked up his 1st win of the season in the Rangers' 8-1 win over the Angels on Wednesday in Anaheim (6.0 IP, 4 H, 3 R-ER, 1 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 83 pitches/55 strikes)...allowed a pair of runs in the 2nd inning and surrendered a Mike Trout solo home run in the 3rd and trailed 3-2 after 4 innings...Texas would score 3 runs in the 5th and Griffin allowed just one of his final 7 BF to reach base following the lead change.

VS. OAKLAND: Faced the Athletics in his 1st start of the season on 4/9 in Arlington, taking a no decision despite receiving 8 runs of support (3.1 IP, 4 H, 4 R-ER, 2 BB, 4 SO, 2 HR, 75 pitches/45 strikes)...was 1st start ever vs. his former club...exited the game with mild abrasions to his knees and right palm after making diving attempt while backing up an errant throw, and bullpen followed with 5.2 IP (1 R-0 ER) to secure 1st Texas win of 17.

ON THE ROAD: Slated for his 2nd road outing of '17...posted similar home/ road figures in 2016 as opponents batted .257/.325/.490 in Arlington and .255/.338/.510 on the road...surrendered 16 of 28 home runs on the road...went 2-2 with a 5.21 ERA (38 ER/65.2 IP) in 13 road starts last season, compared to a 4.89 ERA at home.

SPRING TRAINING: Won a spot in the Texas rotation during the spring for the 2nd straight year, going 2-2 with a 5.73 ERA (14 ER/22.0 IP) over 6 games/4 starts in 'A' games...was 2-1 with a 3.14 ERA (5 ER/14.1 IP) in his last 3 spring starts

WINS/RUN SUPPORT: His .636 win pct. (7-4) last year would have ranked 13th in the league had he qualified...Rangers were 16-7 (.696) in his 23 starts in 2016, 7th-best team win percentage among A.L. starters with 20+ starts and 2nd on staff (team was 24-8, .750 in Cole Hamels starts, 2nd-best in A.L.)...his 12 no decisions were tied with Hamels/Perez for the team lead and T7th in the A.L...among starting pitchers with 70+ starts since 2012, Griffin's .651 (28-15) individual win pct. ranks 9th in MLB, 5th in A.L.

Griffin has a 26-0 record in 31 career starts when receiving 4+ of support, with his teams going 29-2 in those contests...one of 10 pitchers active in 2016 with 25+ wins and no losses with 4+ runs of support (starts only), joining Clayton Kershaw (85-0), Gio Gonzalez (71-0), Wei-Yin Chen (38-0), Collin McHugh (33-0), Masahiro Tanaka (30-0), Alex Cobb (28-0), Carlos Carrasco (26-0), Danny Salazar (26-0), and Michael Wacha (26-0).

IN THE AIR: Had a ground ball percentage of 30.0 (104 GB/152 FB) in 2016, 2nd-lowest among ML pitchers with 20+ starts (29.5% by LAA's Jered Weaver)... Griffin's career GB pct. of 32.9% is 10th-lowest among pitchers with 70+ starts since the stat was first tracked in 1987 (STATS LLC), higher than only one other active pitcher (Chris Young-27.2%)...his 28 HR allowed in '16 were T12th in the A.L. and 2.82 HR/9 rate after the All-Star break was highest in the majors (min. 65.0 IP)...surrendered a HR in 11 straight starts from 6/25-8/20...permitted multiple HR in 4 of last 5 and 7 of last 10 starts in '16, including 2 in 1st start of '17.

BY THE NUMBERS: Had 6 quality starts and 7 HBP last season, 2nd-most on club (Hamels-8)...posted highest career SO/9 (8.09), but also highest BB/9 (3.48)...his 5.52 run support avg. was 14th-highest in A.L. (20+ GS) and highest among Rangers...was in position to take the loss at the time of his last batter, but the team came back to tie or take the lead 6 times, T4th-most in the A.L... held RH batters to a .227/.311/.386 line, 7th-lowest average in A.L...LHB hit

BACK IN THE WIN COLUMN: With victory on 4/8/16 at LAA, Griffin became the 1st ML pitcher to start 15 or more games, then not pitch in the majors for at least the next 2 full seasons, and then win one of his team's 1st 5 games in his 1st season back in the majors since CAL's Rudy May on 4/12/69 vs. MIN (STATS LLC).

2016: Returned to the majors after a 2-year absence and went 7-4 with a 5.07 ERA (67 ER/119.0 IP) over 23 starts for the Rangers in his 1st season with the Texas organization...won the 5th spot in the rotation as a non-roster invitee in spring training...ranked 3rd on staff in starts and innings, T3rd in wins as a starter.

CAREER: The 29-year-old San Diego native returns for a 2nd season in the Texas organization...returned to the mound last season, ranking 3rd on the staff in starts and innings as a key piece to the rotation...saw no major league action in 2014-15 following 'Tommy John' ligament replacement surgery on his right elbow in April 2014...signed with Texas in January 2016 after having spent his entire pro career in the Oakland organization...he has a career 4.04 ERA and 1.196 WHIP over 70 major league starts, including a 7-1 in his rookie season in 2012 and a 200-inning campaign in 2013.
