OAKLAND ATHLETICS (5-8) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (5-8)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a season-high four-game losing streak and are now 5-8 for the season...that is tied with Texas for the second worst record in the American League (Toronto, 2-10)...it also matches the A's worst record after 13 games over the last 16 years...the 2009 club also started the year 5-8 (lost game 14)...the loss last night dropped the A's into a tie for fourth place in the AL West for the first time this year...have also spent one day tied for first, four days tied for second and nine days in third...were swept in a rain-shortened two-game series by Houston over the weekend and are now 1-2-1 in series play...this is the A's 50th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last 10 games after going errorless over the first three contests...it marks the 12th time in Oakland history the A's have gone at least 10 consecutive games with an error...the last time was May 3-18, 2015 when they had a 15-game streak...have committed 16 errors for the season, which is two more than any other team (Arizona, 14)...made 97 errors last year, which tied for second most in the American League...five of the 16 errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is two more than any other team...last year, A's pitchers committed nine errors the entire season...five of the errors have been by outfielders, which is two more than any other team...the 16 errors have led to eight unearned runs, which is tied with Texas for second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 12).

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the second time this year last night and are one of four teams to be blanked twice this year (LAA, LAD, STL)...have scored 46 runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League...have scored just one run in the first inning, which is tied with Arizona for the fewest in the majors...have a Major League low .051 (2-for-39) batting average the first inning...are batting .226 overall, which is third lowest in the AL...the A's one, two and three hitters are hitting a combined .150 (22-for-147)...Oakland is batting .179 (17-for-95) with runners in scoring position, which is third lowest in the AL...Yonder Alonso is 7-for-14 (.500) with RISP and the rest of the A's are 10-for-81 (.123).

PITCHING: The A's walked seven batters last night after issuing eight free passes in their previous game on Saturday...have walked 48 batters for the season, which is third most in the American League...have hit nine batters, which is tied for the most in the majors (MIN, STL)...have surrendered just 10 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...have not allowed a run in the fourth inning...A's starting pitchers have all five of the A's wins.

ON THE BASES: The A's allowed five stolen bases Saturday, which were their most allowed in a game since May 27, 2007 against Baltimore when the Orioles stole five bases...opponents are now 12-for-13 (92.3%) in stolen base attempts for the season...the stolen bases are tied with Houston for the most allowed in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have played just one one-run game (a 7-6 loss on April 4 to Los Angeles), which is tied with Cincinnati for the fewest in the majors...the time of game on Saturday against Houston was 3 hours and 55 minutes, which was the A's longest nine inning game since April 25, 2014 when they played 4 hours and 6 minutes, also against the Astros...are averaging 3 hours and 4 minutes per game over the first 13 games, which is fourth fastest in the American League...the A's lost for the second time this year Saturday when leading after seven innings...the two losses are second most in the AL to Texas (3).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on what is now a nine-game homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (0-1) and Seattle (four games)...it was originally a 10-game homestand before Sunday's rainout and it will now match the longest homestand of the season (9, Aug. 8-16)...went 2-2 on the first homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and are 2-5 at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League (Toronto, 1-5)...went 3-3 on their first road trip to Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (2-1).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch of what is now 15 consecutive games against American League West competition that began last Friday...in fact, 22 of Oakland's first 25 games of the season (the month of April) are against divisional foes...the exception was the three-game series at Kansas City last week...the A's will host all four AL West teams this month and travel to each city except Seattle...are 3-7 (.300) against the West this year...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Graveman, Gray, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski, Wendle)...Smolinski is on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL an Oakland record 27 times last year and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

ROSTER NOTES: The 25 players currently on the A's active roster were born in six different countries (Australia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Germany, United States, Virgin Islands)...five players on the Opening Day roster were signed as free agents, which marks just the third time in the last 22 years the A's had five free agents make their Opening Day roster (also 1996 and 2011)...seven had six or more years of service, which were the most on an A's Opening Day roster since the 2007 club also had seven.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 16-18 (.471), which was the fourth worst record in the Cactus League...went 12-17-3 (.422) last spring, marking the first time Oakland has finished with a losing record in back-to-back springs since 2010-11...compiled a 5.93 ERA, which was second highest in the majors to Cincinnati (6.13)...it was the second highest spring ERA by an Oakland team over the last 18 years (6.10 in 2016)...the offense ranked fourth in the CL in most strikeouts (300), which were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (previous: 248 in 2009)...turned just 23 double plays, which was the fewest in the CL and tied for third fewest in the majors.

RADIO AND TV: Due to conflicts with the Warriors and/or Sharks, the following changes have been made to the radio and television schedules...tonight's game and Thursday's game against Seattle have been moved from NBCSCA to NBCSCA Plus...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors and Sharks playoff schedules.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's are 1-3 against the Rangers this year...lost the first game in Oakland last night after dropping two of three at Texas earlier this month...have been outscored by Texas 26-12 for a run differential of -14...have a run differential of -4 in their other nine games...lost the season series last year when they went 9-10 against the Rangers...it marked the fourth consecutive year the season series finished 10-9...Oakland won two of those series and lost two and are 39-41 against Texas over the last five seasons...went 4-5 in Texas last year and 5-5 in Oakland...are 342-356 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 178-170 in Oakland and 164-186 in Texas...are 97-98 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 439-438 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is a .310 (26-for-84) career hitter against the Rangers with 12 home runs and 26 RBI in 23 games...the home runs and RBI are his most against any team...**Jed Lowrie** has a 67-game errorless streak as a second baseman, which is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history...**Trevor Plouffe** has hit safely in each of his last five games (5-for-16, .313) after going 4-for-26 (.154) over his first seven contests...**Stephen Vogt** is 6-for-19 (.316) over his last five games after going 4-for-20 (.200) over his first five contests.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1970** Don Mincher homers twice and drives in all five Oakland runs, but the A's lose 11-5 to Minnesota...in **1981** Brian Kingman tosses a six-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Seattle as the A's improve to 10-0...in **2003** Barry Zito tosses a six-hit shutout to defeat Texas, 9-0.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (2-0, 0.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season and the ninth of his career...has won each of his first two starts and is tied for second in the American League in wins...is in his second Major League season and is on his first Opening Day roster.

NO EARNED RUNS: Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his last start after allowing one unearned run in 5.2 innings in his first start...his 11.2 innings are second most in the majors among pitchers with no earned runs (Paxton, SEA 21.0)...is the third pitcher in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to toss five or more innings and allow no earned runs in their first two outings of the season...joins Brett Anderson (2010) and Mike Norris (1975)...since the earned run become an official stat, the only Athletics to have a longer such streak are Vean Gregg (1918) and Eddie Rommel (1924), who did it in each of their first three games.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) April 6 in Oakland...issued a career-high three walks and tossed a career-high 91 pitches...surrendered his only run in the third inning and it was unearned...Escobar led off with a single, went to second on a R.Davis error, third on a ground out and scored on a Pujols ground out...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the third for the win.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Kansas City last Wednesday...tossed a career-high tying 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...surrendered four hits and walked one and allowed just three base runners to advance into scoring position...was relieved by Dull to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 8-0.

TRIGGS vs. TEXAS Is 0-0 with a 1.35 ERA (6.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 so) in two career appearances, including one start, both last year...the relief appearance came on May 18 in Oakland...retired the side in order in the ninth inning (1 so) in the A's 8-1 win...then started and had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 10-inning loss at Texas Aug. 16...the A's scored a run in the second inning and he shut out the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings...hit Chrinos with one out to start the sixth and retired the next two batters with Chrinos moving to second...was relieved by Dull who allowed a RBI single to Beltran for the blown save...the A's tied the game in the ninth and scored twice in the top of the 10th before Texas scored three times in the bottom of the 10th for the win.

A's...the eight stints are believed to be the most in one season in Oakland history...the stints were April 25-26, April 29, May 7 (26th man for doubleheader), May 10-June 3, June 18, June 30-July 1, July 4-August 3 (includes stay on the DL from July 18-Aug. 1) and Aug. 5 through the end of the season...five of his eight stints began less than eight days following his previous option...had three one-day stints and two two-day stints...struck out 55 and walked just 13 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.23...compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...then went 1-1 with a 2.58 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in 14 games (six starts), over his final four stints...allowed three home runs over his first four stints (18.0 ip) and two in his last four (38.1 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .235 (28-for-119) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .277 (28-for-101) against left-handers...issued 9 of his 13 walks to lefties...held the opposition to a .144 batting average with two strikes...the three hitter in the order batted .429 but he allowed a .160 batting average against the clean-up hitter.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 1-1 with a 2.81 ERA and .191 opponents batting average in his six starts, 0-0 with a 5.58 ERA and .302 opponents average in 18 relief appearances...walked just one batter in 25.2 innings as a starter...first batters faced hit .176 with no extra base hits and one walk (.222 on-base percentage)...allowed 4-of-8 (50.0%) inherited runners to score.

HOME AND AWAY: Had an 0-1 record and a 2.81 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 1-0 with a 5.58 ERA in 12 games on the road...surrendered four of his five home runs on the road.

INNING BY INNING: Logged a 0.93 ERA and .183 opponents batting average over innings one through three compared to a 6.08 ERA and .289 opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

THIS AND THAT: Tossed at least one inning in 17 of his 18 relief appearances, including two or more 10 times...pitched fewer than five innings in three of his six starts and his longest start was six innings...the A's were 1-5 (.167) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in all but two appearances.

MORE 2016: Was recalled from Nashville April 25 and made his ML debut that day at Detroit...retired the side in order in the eighth inning (1.0 ip, 1 so) and struck out the first batter he faced (Tyler Collins)...was sent back to Nashville two days later...did not pitch during his second stint, which lasted one day (April 29)...pitched just once during his third stint when he was the 26th man for the May 7 doubleheader at Baltimore...struck out the side in the ninth inning of the night game...was recalled a fourth time May 10 and allowed at least one run in seven of his eight appearances for a 9.00 ERA and .338 opponents batting average...was optioned to Nashville June 4...returned for stint number five June 18 and made his first big league start that day against Los Angeles (AL)...allowed a run on three hits in 3.0 innings and had a no decision in a 7-1 A's loss...was sent back to Nashville the following day...did not allow a run in two games during stint number six from June 30 to July 1 (3.2 ip)...stint number seven began July 4 and he allowed at least one run in each of his three appearances before going on the 15-day disabled list July 19 retroactive to July 18 with a right shin contusion...was reinstated Aug. 2, tossed 2.1 scoreless innings Aug. 3 at Los Angeles (AL) and was optioned Aug. 4...was brought back the next day when Jesse Hahn went on the DL and went 1-1 with a 2.92 ERA and .191 opponents average in seven games (five starts) during his final stint...allowed just one home run and walked two batters in 24.2 innings before a lumbar strain ended his season in early September...pitched in relief in each of the first two outings of his eighth stint but his final five appearances of the season were starts...tossed a career-high 6.0 scoreless innings Aug. 22 against Cleveland but had a no decision in a 1-0 loss...was credited with the first win of his career in the A's 7-4 win at St. Louis Aug. 28...struck out a career-high eight batters in a career-high tying 6.0 innings...left his final start on Sept. 2 against Boston after one inning and did not pitch again due to a lumbar strain.

NASHVILLE: Went 2-1 with two saves and a 2.95 ERA in 16 appearances with Triple-A Nashville, all in relief...struck out 21 and walked five in 18.1 innings...did not surrender a home run...allowed a .225 batting average, including .130 (3-for-23) against left-handed hitters compared to .271 (13-for-48) against right-handers...had a .125 batting average and .222 on-base percentage against batters leading off an inning...did not allow a run in seven games on the road (8.0 ip) and five appearances during the day (5.2 ip)...tossed one or more innings in 15 of his 16 appearances, including a season-high 2.0 innings April 23 against New Orleans and July 28 against Colorado Springs...did not allow a run 12 times.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Jesse Hahn (0-1, 3.75 ERA): Was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...is scheduled to make his second start and third appearance of the season...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's loss at Kansas City last Thursday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...is 0-1 with a 4.84 ERA (22.1 ip, 31 h, 12 r, 12 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 2 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts, against the Rangers...including a relief appearance this year on April 7 at Texas (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 1 bb, 3 so)...had four separate stints with the A's last year and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percentage (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings)...went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA in 15 starts with Nashville...surrendered just four home runs in 68.2 innings (0.54 per nine innings).

- The A's bullpen has allowed 10 earned runs in their last two outings (7.2 ip) after allowing just 11 earned runs total in its first 11 games and 35.2 innings...bullpen ERA has risen from 2.78 to 4.36 of the last two games.
- A's relievers have 14 walks in their last seven games (21.1 ip) after walking just three batters in their first six games (22.0 ip)...the 14 walks during that span are tied for second in the majors (Detroit, 18).
- A's relievers are tied for fifth in the AL in innings pitched.
- Are one of two Major League teams without a win by a reliever (San Francisco).
- Has just two saves and four save opportunities...the saves are tied for third fewest in the AL and the opportunities are tied for second fewest...last April, converted 10-of-11 saves...last season, converted 42-of-65 (64.6%) save opportunities...had the third most blown saves in the AL (23) and the fourth lowest save percentage...tied for 10th in saves...19 of the blown saves came against AL West competition...were successful in 17-of-36 (47.2%) save opportunities against the AL West, 25-of-29 (86.2%) against everyone else.
- Had 561.1 innings pitched, which was second most in the AL (Minnesota, 567.2), second most in Oakland history (586.2 in 1997) and third most in Athletics history (588.1 in 1964)...struck out 530 batters, which was fifth most in the AL but set the Athletics record for strikeouts by the bullpen...also set a franchise record for most wild pitches (33).
- Surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)

- Began the year as the A's fifth starter but was moved to the bullpen after his first start on April 7 at Texas...made his first career relief appearance (and seventh career appearance) on Friday against Houston.
- Is 1-2 with a 9.22 ERA in three career games (all starts) against Texas (13.2 ip, 16 h, 14 r, 14 er, 3 bb, 10 so, 5 hr)...three of his six career starts have come against the Rangers.
- Went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in seven games (three starts) this spring (22.2 ip, 22 h, 12 r, 12 er, 8 bb, 11 so, 4.76 ERA)...his 22.2 innings pitched were the third most on the team (Triggs, Manaea).
