WINS AND LOSSES: The Rangers beat the A's last night, 7-0, to snap a 3-game losing streak that matched longest in 2017...club has dropped 3 of 4, but is 3-3 in last 6, 4-4 in last 8, and 5-5 in last 10 after opening the campaign at 0-3...team has gone 3-4 entering the final 2 contests of this 9-game, 9-day road trip to LAA (2-1), SEA (0-3), and OAK (1-0)...last night was just the Rangers' 2nd win in a series opener (2-3), and both have come against the A's (also 4/7 in Arlington)... club has opened season with a 5-8 record this season after going 7-6 in 2016 and 5-8 in 2015...after 14 G, team was 8-6 in 2016 and 6-8 in 2015...have not had a 5-9 or worse record thru 14 G since 2010 (5-9).

• The Rangers are 4.0 games back in the A.L. West behind division leader HOU for a 2nd straight day, T4th place with OAK...current 4.0-game deficit matches largest since 8/31/15 (-4.0 GB).

SERIES STUFF: Texas is 2-2-0 in its 1st 4 series in 2017, winning a rubber game series finale in the 2 victories and getting swept in the 2 defeats...team has 2 chances to seal a series win here at the Coliseum...club has yet to win the 1st 2 G in any series in '17, and has a 1-3 record in the 2nd game

ON THE ROAD: Rangers have opened this season with a 3-4 road record, needing to win the final 2 G here in Oakland to finish this initial trip with a winning record...the Rangers were 42-39 (.519) in road games in 2016, T3rd-best in the A.L...club has winning road records in 2 straight and 5 of last 6 seasons, and .519 (256-237) away win pct. since 2011 is 2nd-best in MLB (STL: .526, 259-233).

STAYING WEST: The Rangers' first 42 games - over a quarter of the way into the 2017 season - are scheduled to take place in the Central and Pacific Time Zones, as each of those contests will be played in just 3 states: Texas, California, and Washington...the Rangers' 1st game outside of those 3 states, or in the Eastern Time Zone, does not come until a 3-city road trip from May 19-28 to DET, BOS, and TOR.

VS. OAKLAND: Texas is 3-1 vs. A's in 2017, playing OAK in 2 of 1st 5 series this season...teams also play 5/12-14 at TEX, but then do not meet again until late August...Rangers have won 9 of 13 and 13 of last 19 overall...Texas won season series 10-9 last year, 4th straight season for TEX/OAK season series to be decided by 10-9 margin...Texas clinched division on 9/23/16 at OAK...club is 6-5 at the Coliseum since the start of 2016, but has won 6 of last 7 in this facility...alltime, Rangers lead 356-342, but A's have 178-169 edge at the Coliseum.

"CHOO REACHES" IS FAMILIAR PHRASE IN '17: Shin-Soo Choo drew 3 BB last night, most by a Ranger since 9/27/16 vs. MIL (Profar-3) and most for Choo since 7/10/16vs. MIN (3)...his team-high 8 BB are T11th in the A.L...Choo has 18 times on base in '17, T2nd-most among Rangers (23-Mazara) despite not starting twice...his .383 OBP is 2nd among Texas regulars to only Mazara (.397).

• Last night was the 15th game in Choo's career to reach safely 3+ times without the benefit of a hit...11 of those instances have come since the start of 2013, T4th-most in MLB...the list: 14-Joey Votto, 12-Paul Goldschmidt/Bryce Harper, 11-Choo/Carlos Santana.

BULLPEN FINISHES: Texas relievers posted 3.0 scoreless innings to finish last night's shutout, just the bullpen's 2nd game in '17 without allowing a run (also 4/12 vs. LAA)...Texas relievers have a 1.17 ERA (2 ER/15.1 IP) in 4 G vs. OAK this season, and an 8.64 figure (24 ER/25.0 IP) against all other clubs...bullpen's current 5.80 ERA is 4th-highest in the A.L., but it is the team's 3rd-lowest relief mark at any point this year.

A SHUTOUT: The Rangers posted the club's 1st shutout of the year last night in a 7-0 win...Texas had entered the day as one of 7 A.L. clubs without a shutout...each of the Rangers' last 3 SHO have all come against Oakland here at the Coliseum (also Sept. 23-24, 2016)...it was the team's largest shutout win since a 7-0 victory on 8/27/16 vs. CLE, and last night's 3 hits allowed were the fewest in a shutout since 8/25/16 vs. CLE (2 H allowed in 9-0 win)...the 8/25/16 game was also the last time Rangers allowed 3-or-fewer hits in any contest...team had not permitted 3-hits-or-less in a road game since 6/17/16 at STL (3 H in 1-0 victory).

FELT LIKE HOME FOR A.J.: A.J. Griffin posted 6.0 shutout innings in last night's win (1 H, 1 BB, 8 SO)...Elias Sports Bureau notes that Griffin is just the 4th different pitcher in Rangers history (1972-2017) with 8+ SO in a game while permitting one-or-zero hits and one-or-zero walks...the others: Hall of Famer Fergie Jenkins on 4/6/74 vs. OAK, Kenny Rogers in his perfect game on 7/28/94 vs. CAL, and Yu Darvish on 3 occasions against the Astros: 4/2/13 at HOU, 8/12/13 at HOU, 4/11/14 vs. HOU...Darvish and Griffin are the only Rangers to do it on the road.

STARTERS KEEP IT GOING: With A.J. Griffin's performance last night, the Texas rotation now has a 2.05 ERA (12 ER/52.2 IP) over its last 9 G beginning 4/8, the 2nd-lowest starters ERA in MLB in that span (KC-1.90)...the rotation's 3.15 ERA for the year ranks 4th in the A.L.

· Texas is one of 4 ML clubs that has yet to have a start allowing 5+ runs...the others: CHC, KC, LAD.

MAZARA AGAIN: Nomar Mazara had 3 more RBI last night and now has 16 RBI in '17, T2nd-most through 13 team games in Rangers history...the list: 17-Juan Gonzalez in '98, 16-Lee Stevens in '98/lan Kinsler in '09/N. Cruz in '10/N. Mazara in '17...Mazara's 16 RBI lead the A.L., 2nd-most in MLB to MIA's Marcell Ozuna (18)...Mazara is the only player in MLB with 3 different games of 3+ RBI in 2017...he is also tied for the A.L. lead in runs (12) and is 5th in BA (.352).

CARLOS FROM THE LEADOFF SPOT: Carlos Gomez reached safely 3 times last night (2B, 1B, BB), scoring on all 3 occasions...it was his 2nd game with 3 R this season (also 4/7 vs. OAK in series opener), joining MIL's Eric Thames as the only ML players with multiple games of 3+ R in '17.

SAVE ME: The Rangers enter tonight with one save (by Jose Leclerc on Wed. at LAA - 1st career save), tied with STL and TOR for fewest in MLB...with the placement of Sam Dyson on the disabled list yesterday, the club has several pitchers with save potential...those pitchers and their career save total: Jeremy Jeffress (28), Matt Bush (1), Keone Kela (1), Tony Barnette (0).

BIG WAVE: Last night was the MLB-high 6th time this season for the Rangers to score at least 7 runs...club leads majors w/ 69 R and 5.31 R/G, also among A.L. leaders in HR (1st, 20), XBH (T1st, 41), TB (3rd, 183), and SLG (4th, .418)...club is 5-1 when scoring 7+ runs, 0-7 with less than 7 runs.

SHORTS: With his infield single in the 1st inning last night, Elvis Andrus recorded career hit no. 1282, passing Ruben Sierra (1281) to move into 5th place all-time in Rangers history...club has gone homerless in 3 of 4 after season-opening 9-G HR streak, and last night was 1st win without a HR in '17...the 10-minute delay last night before 1st pitch was Rangers' 1st delay since 9/19/16 vs. LAA (0:38), and just 2nd delayed road game since start of '16 (also 6/27/16 at NYY)... club has used 2 new players in last 3 G (Cashner/Kela), and now have 27 players used in '17...TEX totaled 121 pitches last night, 2nd-fewest in 9 innings this year (116 on Wed. at

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER

#11 Yu Darvish, RHP (1-1, 2.33)

TONIGHT: The 30-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 4th start of the season tonight in the middle game of this 3-game series in Oakland, his 2nd outing on this current 9-game road trip and 2nd road start this season...picked up his 1st win of the season in his last start on Thurs. against the Angels in Anaheim, striking out 10 in 7.0 shutout innings...needed 3 starts to win his 1st game in a season for the 1st time in his major league career, having never previously gone winless in his 1st 2 outings of a season...will face Oakland for the 2nd time this season after losing an outing on 4/8 vs. OAK in Arlington...did not factor into the decision in his 1st Opening Day starting assignment on 4/3 vs. CLE... is seeking his 1st full season since 2013...ranked among the A.L.'s top 10 in strikeouts, opponents average, and WHIP in the 2nd 'half' of the 2016 campaign after returning from 3/17/15 'Tommy John' surgery on right elbow...a 3-time All-Star (2012-13-14), he has twice been the Rangers Pitcher of the Year (2013-14) and ranked among A.L. Cy Young Award vote-getters in both 2013 (2nd) and 2012 (9th)...has piled up strikeouts at a historic pace, as his 812 SO over his first 100 career starts set a major league record, 46 more than Chris Sale (766) over his first 100 starts (credit Elias Sports Bureau)...has retired at least the 1st 15 batters in a game 5 different times in his career, twice taking a no-hitter into the 8th inning...already ranks among all-time club leaders in ERA (T1st, 3.26), win pct. (2nd, .603), WHIP (4th, 1.185) and strikeouts (7th, 831)...with 47 wins, he is 4 shy of Tomo Ohka for 5th place in all-time wins by ML pitchers born in Japan.

LAST START: Earned his 1st victory of the season on Thurs. at LAA (7.0 IP, 5 H, 0 R-ER, 2 BB, 10 SO, 103 pitches/68 strikes) in the rubber match of a 3-game series...Texas scored 5 runs in the 1st 3 innings and Darvish left with an 8-0 lead, as the Rangers won 8-3 for its 1st win in his 3 outings...received 8+ runs of support for 1st time since 8/12/16 vs. DET, a span of 12 starts...is 29-0 in 32 career starts when receiving 5+ runs of support...marked the 29th 10+ SO game of his career and 1st since 9/30/16 vs. TB, his last regular-season start of 2016.

VS. OAKLAND: Will face the A's for the 2nd time this season...has gone 3-10 with a 4.43 ERA (44 ER/89.1 IP) in 15 G/GS in career vs. OAK...took the loss on 4/8 vs. OAK in Arlington, a 6-1 Texas defeat, despite giving up one run (6.0 IP, 4 H, 1 R-ER, 3 BB, 5 SO, 97 pitches/61 strikes)...in that game, a walk followed by a double set up an RBI groundout by Stephen Vogt in the 6th, the only run charged to Darvish...that game marked the 7th time in the last 5 seasons (2013-17) for a Texas starting pitcher to lose when allowing just one run in 6.0+ IP, and Darvish owns 5 of those 7 losses...has 6 more losses vs. OAK than any other opponent... has more starts vs. OAK than any other opponent, 2nd-highest ERA (4.45 vs. SEA) and highest WHIP (1.399) of any team with 3+ GS against...has 9 quality starts in 15 outings vs. OAK, and Texas is 4-11 in those games...has received 2.92 runs of support in career vs. OAK, well below career average of 4.87...is 2-2 with a 3.48 ERA (12 ER/31.0 IP) in 5 GS vs. OAK since start of 2016, with quality starts in 4 of those 5 outings to lower career ERA vs. OAK from 4.94 to 4.43.

AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: Is 1-3 with a 5.72 ERA (18 ER/28.1 IP) in 5 G/GS here in Oakland, with quality starts in 2 of the 5 games...has received 3 runs of support or less in 4 of 5 games...Texas is 2-3 in his 5 starts in Oakland...last faced A's in Oakland on 9/24/16 (7.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R-ER, 1 BB, 9 SO)...prior to that game, last pitched at OAK on 6/17/14...has 2nd-highest ERA at Oakland Coliseum than at any ballpark he has pitched in 3+ times (Safeco Field - 7.71).

QN THE ROAD AGAIN: Slated for his 2nd road outing of 2017...is 19-17 with a 3.28 ERA (112 ER/307.0 IP) in 48 G/GS in career on the road...his .528 road win percentage is well below his win clip at home (28-14, .667) despite having similar WHIP (1.159 home/1.212 road) and SO/9 (11.0 home/11.5 road) figures...primary difference is an average of 5.15 runs of support per 9 in his home starts vs. a 4.54 RSA in road outings...has gone 2-0 in his last 2 road starts after a stretch in which he went 0-5 over 9 road starts spanning 2014 and 2016...Rangers have won each of his last 5 away outings, the best stretch since Texas won 6 straight Darvish road starts from 9/19/13 - 6/1/14 (Darvish was 5-0 in that span).

STARTING FAST: Is 11-3 with a 2.35 ERA (32 ER/122.1 IP) in 19 career April starts, his lowest ERA and most wins of any month...made 1st start on 5/28/16 last season...had won 1st start of season in each of previous 4 seasons (2012-14, 2016) before taking no decision vs. CLE in opener...got off to strong starts in 2012 (4-0), 2013 (7-1), 2014 (3-1), and 2016 (2-0)...needed 3 starts to win his 1st game in a season for the 1st time in his major league career, having never previously gone winless in his 1st 2 outings of a season.

<u>DOUBLE DIGITS K'S:</u> Struck out 10 batters in his last start on 4/13 at LAA, the 29th 10+ strikeout game of his career and 1st since 9/30/16 vs. TB, his last regular-season start of 2016...since the start of 2012, Darvish is 4th in MLB with 29 10+ SO outings, trailing only Clayton Kershaw (36), Chris Sale (37) and Max Scherzer (44)...he ranks 4th despite missing the entirety of the 2015 season... his 28 10+ SO games were the 2nd-most in ML history over a pitcher's 1st 100 games (Dwight Gooden - 31)...his 29 10+ SO games rank 2nd in franchise history (Nolan Ryan - 34)...Darvish fanned a career-high 15 on 8/12/13 at HOU, one shy of the club record (16, twice by Ryan)...of 44 10+ SO games by Texas starters since 2012, Darvish has thrown 29.

SPRING TRAINING: Was 2-0 with a 2.84 ERA (4 ER/12.2 IP) over 4 starts in 'A' games this spring...last started in an 'A' game on 3/18 at CIN (4.2 IP, 2 H, 2 R-1
