OAKLAND ATHLETICS (6-8) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (5-9)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their season-high four-game losing streak last night to improve to 6-8...it marks the first time the A's have been under .500 after 14 games since 2011 when they were also 6-8...are in third place in the American League West, three games behind first place Houston...have spent one day tied for first this year, four days tied for second, 10 days in third and one day tied for fourth...were swept in a rain-shortened two-game series by Houston over the weekend and are now 1-2-1 in series play...this is the A's 50th season in Oakland where they have won 16 AL West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in each of the last 11 games after going errorless over the first three contests...it marks the 12th time in Oakland history the A's have gone at least 10 consecutive games with an error...the last time was May 3-18, 2015 when they had a 15-game streak...have committed 17 errors for the season, which is three more than any other team (Arizona, 14)...made 97 errors last year, which tied for second most in the American League...five of the 17 errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is two more than any other team...last year, A's pitchers committed nine errors the entire season...five of the errors have been by outfielders, which is two more than any other team...the 17 errors have led to 10 unearned runs, which is tied with Atlanta for second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 12).

OFFENSE: Jaff Decker became the fourth Athletic to start in the leadoff spot last night...the A's leadoff hitters are a combined 7-for-54 (.130) with seven walks (1 sf, .226 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage are the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the A's have scored just one run in the first inning, which is tied with Arizona for the fewest in the majors...have a Major League low .048 (2-for-42) batting average the first inning (Arizona, .109)...the one, two and three hitters are batting a combined .146 (23-for-157)...were shutout for the second time this year Monday night and are one of five teams to be blanked twice this year (LAA, LAD, SEA, STL)...have scored 50 runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the AL...Oakland is batting .190 (19-for-100) with runners in scoring position, which is third lowest in the AL...Yonder Alonso is 7-for-15 (.467) with RISP and the rest of the A's are 12-for-85 (.141).

PITCHING: The A's have surrendered just 10 home runs, which is third fewest in the American League...have hit nine batters, which is second most...have not allowed a run in the fourth inning...A's starting pitchers have all six of the A's wins and the six wins are tied for second among AL starting rotations...starters have allowed just one home run in the last seven games and six for the season, which is third fewest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's allowed two stolen bases last night and opponents are now 14-for-15 (93.3%) in stolen base attempts for the season...the stolen bases are the most allowed in the American League and second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 5)...allowed five stolen bases Saturday against Houston, which were their most allowed in a game since May 27, 2007 against Baltimore when the Orioles stole five bases.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have played just one one-run game (a 7-6 loss on April 4 to Los Angeles), which is tied with Cincinnati for the fewest in the majors...the time of game on Saturday against Houston was 3 hours and 55 minutes, which was the A's longest nine inning game since April 25, 2014 when they played 4 hours and 6 minutes, also against the Astros...are averaging 3 hours and 3 minutes per game over the first 14 games, which is tied for third fastest in the American League...the A's lost for the second time this year Saturday when leading after seven innings...the two losses are second most in the AL to Texas (3).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on what is now a nine-game homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (1-1) and Seattle (four games)...it was originally a 10-game homestand before Sunday's rainout and it will now match the longest homestand of the season (9, Aug. 8-16)...went 2-2 on the first homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and are 3-5 at home for the season...went 3-3 on their first road trip to Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (2-1).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch of what is now 15 consecutive games against American League West competition that began last Friday...in fact, 22 of Oakland's first 25 games of the season (the month

of April) are against divisional foes...the exception was the three-game series at Kansas City last week...the A's will host all four AL West teams this month and travel to each city except Seattle...are 4-7 (.364) against the West this year...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Graveman, Gray, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski, Wendle)...Smolinski is on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL an Oakland record 27 times last year and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

ROSTER NOTES: The 25 players currently on the A's active roster were born in six different countries (Australia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Germany, United States, Virgin Islands)...five players on the Opening Day roster were signed as free agents, which marks just the third time in the last 22 years the A's had five free agents make their Opening Day roster (also 1996 and 2011)...seven had six or more years of service, which were the most on an A's Opening Day roster since the 2007 club also had seven.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 16-18 (.471), which was the fourth worst record in the Cactus League...went 12-17-3 (.422) last spring, marking the first time Oakland has finished with a losing record in back-to-back springs since 2010-11...compiled a 5.93 ERA, which was second highest in the majors to Cincinnati (6.13)...it was the second highest spring ERA by an Oakland team over the last 18 years (6.10 in 2016)...the offense ranked fourth in the CL in most strikeouts (300), which were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (previous: 248 in 2009)...turned just 23 double plays, which was the fewest in the CL and tied for third fewest in the majors.

RADIO AND TV: Due to conflicts with the Warriors and/or Sharks, the following changes have been made to the radio and television schedules...tomorrow's game against Seattle has been moved from NBCSCA to NBCSCA Plus...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors and Sharks playoff schedules.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's are 2-3 against the Rangers this year...have split the first two games in Oakland after dropping two of three at Texas earlier this month...have been outscored by Texas 28-16 for a run differential of -12...have a run differential of -4 in their other nine games this year...lost the season series last year when they went 9-10 against the Rangers...it marked the fourth consecutive year the season series finished 10-9...Oakland won two of those series and lost two and are 40-41 against Texas over the last five seasons...went 4-5 in Texas last year and 5-5 in Oakland...are 343-356 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 179-170 in Oakland and 164-186 in Texas...are 97-98 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 440-438 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Santiago Casilla has not allowed a hit over his first six appearances and opponents are 0-for-17 with three walks...**Khris Davis** had the go-ahead sacrifice fly in the sixth inning last night and five of his nine RBI have put the A's ahead...has 12 home runs and 26 RBI in 24 career games against Texas, which are his most home runs and RBI against any team...**Jed Lowrie** has a 68-game errorless streak as a second baseman, which is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1981** the A's defeat the Seattle Mariners 6-1 in the first game of a double header at the Coliseum to run their record to 11-0, a Major League record at the time...the Mariners won the second game of the twinbill to end the A's streak but Oakland won the next six to improve to 17-1...in **1986** Jose Rijo strikes out an Oakland record 16 batters in the A's 7-2 win at Seattle...Bill Mooneyham adds two in an inning of relief for a club record 18 for a nine inning game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (0-1, 3.75 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...is scheduled to make his second start and third appearance of the season.

FIRST APPEARANCE: He relieved A's starting pitcher Raul Alcantara to start the third inning of the A's 10-5 loss at Texas April 7...entered the game trailing 8-3 and tossed 6.0 innings in his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...blanked the Rangers on two hits over his first three innings before allowing two runs in the sixth on a Gomez RBI double and a Mazara RBI single...those were the only runs he would allow.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Kansas City last Thursday...allowed two runs in the first inning on RBI singles by Cain and Perez, and another in the third on a Moss sacrifice fly...did not allow a run over his final three innings...Vargas (7.2 ip) and Soria (0.1 ip) shutout the A's on four hits and a walk over the first eight innings before Oakland scored its only run in the ninth.

HAHN vs. TEXAS: Is 0-1 with a 4.84 ERA (22.1 ip, 31 h, 12 r, 12 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 2 hr) in four career appearances, including three starts...is 0-1 with a 5.51 ERA (10 er in 16.1 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (2 er in 6.0 ip) in one relief appearance in Oakland...has made one appearance this year and it came on April 7 at Texas in relief of Raul Alcantara in the A's 10-5 loss...entered the game to start the third inning trailing 8-3 and tossed 6.0 innings in his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...blanked the Rangers on two hits over his first three innings before allowing two runs in the sixth on a Gomez RBI double and a Mazara RBI single...those were the only runs he would allow.

2016 RECAP: Had four separate stints with the A's and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percentage (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...struck out just 23 batters (4.47 per nine innings) and walked 19 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.21, which was the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .273 (27-for-99) against right-handed hitters compared to .361 (30-for-83) against left-handers...surrendered seven of his eight home runs to lefties and had a .663 slugging percentage against lefties, .333 against righties...his career splits are .216 (92-for-426) against righties, .280 (123-for-440) with 14 of his 17 home runs against lefties...has a .430 career slugging percentage against lefties, .279 against righties...had a .226 opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .358 after that...opponents hit .426 with a .449 on-base percentage and .681 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...in 2015, his marks were .215, .277 and .290 respectively...allowed a .324 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .500 with RISP and two outs...five of the eight home runs he surrendered were solo shots...yielded a .300 average with two strikes and a .440 average to the first hitter in the batting order.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 2-1 with a 3.03 ERA and .237 opponents batting average in five starts at home, 0-3 with a 13.17 ERA and .453 opponents average in four starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 5-4 with a 3.06 ERA (32 er in 94.0 ip) in 15 starts in Oakland, 3-7 with a 5.90 ERA (40 er in 61.0 ip) in 12 games on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 2-1 with a 3.90 ERA and .234 opponents average in five starts during the day, 0-3 with a 9.92 ERA and .427 opponents average in four starts at night...his career splits are 8-3 with a 2.31 ERA (24 er in 93.1 ip) in 15 day games, 7-12 with a 4.87 ERA (73 er in 135.0 ip) in 26 night games.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents were successful in each of their seven stolen base attempts off him after going 5-for-9 (55.6%) over his first two seasons...the A's were 5-4 (.556) in his starting assignments...tossed more than six innings in just three of his nine starts...has done that in just 11 of 38 starts in his career...the bullpen blew a save in three of his nine starts.

MORE 2016: Was recalled for the first time April 30 and went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .250 opponents average in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 8...combined with Axford and Madson on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Houston on April 30 but then walked a career-high tying four batters in the night game of the May 7 day/night doubleheader at Baltimore and took the loss...blanked the Orioles over the first two innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.2 innings...made just one start at Nashville following his May 8 option and returned to Oakland May 17...went 1-3 with an 8.34 ERA and .368 opponents batting average in five starts during his second stint with the A's...left with the lead in each of his first two starts on May 17 against Texas and May 22 against New York (AL) but the bullpen blew the save in each outing...yielded a career-high tying 10 hits against the Rangers...issued a career-high tying four walks May 28 against Detroit but picked up his second win of the season...allowed a career-high seven runs in a career-low 0.2 innings in a 1-2 loss at Houston June 3...became the eighth starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow seven or more runs in less than an inning, the first since Joe Blanton allowed eight runs in 0.1 innings against Tampa Bay on May 25, 2005...was optioned to Nashville June 10...did not return to Oakland until July 24...started that day against Tampa Bay and allowed one run on four hits in 7.2 innings...left with a 2-0 lead but the bullpen blew the save and he ended up with a no decision...was optioned back to Nashville the next day...also made just one start during his fourth and final stint...was recalled Aug. 4, allowed five runs on seven hits in 4.0 innings in a start that day at Los Angeles (AL), and was placed on the disabled list the next day with a strained right shoulder...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville Sept. 2.

NASHVILLE: Went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA in 15 starts with Nashville...the starts were the first of his career at the Triple-A level...had just four career losses as a minor leaguer entering the season...surrendered just four home runs in 68.2 innings, an average of 0.54 per nine innings...however, issued 34 walks (4.59 per nine innings) and struck out just 46 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.35...allowed a .276 opponents batting average, including .255 (38-for-149) against right-handed hitters compared to .304 (34-for-112) against left-handers...surrendered three of his four home runs to righties...went 0-7 with a 4.71 ERA in 10 starts at home compared to 1-0 with a 3.18 ERA in five starts on the road...allowed all four of his home runs at home...yielded a .175 batting average and .246 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents batted .222 with runners in scoring position, including .188 with RISP and two outs...they were 1-for-9 (.111) with the bases loaded...the Sounds were 6-9 (.400) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than five innings in eight of his 15 starts and more than six innings just once...had three starts without a run and four more with just one...walked three batters or more seven times...did not allow a run in his first two starts, tossing 6.0 shutout innings on April 8 against Oklahoma City and April 13 against Colorado Springs...had a no decision in each start...was 0-1 with a 2.04 ERA in four starts when he was recalled by Oakland for the first time on April 30...was optioned back to Nashville May 8, picked up his only Triple-A win of the season May 12 at Iowa when he allowed one run in 5.2 innings, and was sent back to Oakland May 17...returned to the Sounds June 10 and went 0-6 with a 5.60 ERA (27 er in 43.1 ip) over his final 10 starts with Nashville...had his shortest start of the season July 20 at Albuquerque when he pitched just 1.0 inning...was recalled by Oakland July 24 to start on short rest...was optioned back to Nashville the next day and tossed a season-high 7.0 innings July 29 against Colorado Springs...returned to Oakland Aug. 4 but was sent back to the Sounds on Aug. 16 on a rehab assignment...was reinstated from the Oakland DL and optioned to Nashville Sept. 2...made one postseason start and had a no decision in the Sounds 10-7 win in Game 1 of the Pacific Coast League Semifinals Sept. 7 at Oklahoma City (4.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 7 so).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP César Valdez (0-0, — ERA): Will be selected from Nashville tomorrow to make his A's debut...it will be the third start of his career...spent part of the 2010 season in the majors with Arizona and went 1-2 with a 7.65 ERA in nine games, including two starts...last pitched in the majors June 10, 2010 vs. Atlanta (0.2 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 1 so) and last started on May 8, 2010 against Milwaukee, a loss (4.0 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...has never faced Seattle in his career...was 1-0 with a 2.70 ERA in two starts with Nashville...did not walk a batter in 10.0 innings and struck out 12...allowed a .211 opponents batting average, including .059 (1-for-17) against left-handed hitters...had a 2.00 ERA and .212 opponents batting average in five relief appearances during the spring...also made one appearance for the Dominican Republic in the first round of the World Baseball Classic on March 12 against Colombia (1.2 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb)

- The A's bullpen has allowed 10 earned runs in their last three outings (10.2 ip) after allowing just 11 earned runs total in its first 11 games and 35.2 innings...bullpen ERA has risen from 2.78 to 4.08 in the last three games.
- Are the only Major League team without a win by a reliever.
- A's relievers have 14 walks in their last eight games (24.1 ip) after walking just three batters in their first six games (22.0 ip).
- A's relievers are tied for sixth in the AL in innings pitched.
- Has just three saves and five save opportunities...the saves are tied for fifth fewest in the AL and the opportunities are tied for fourth fewest...last April, converted 10-of-11 saves...last season, converted 42-of-65 (64.6%) save opportunities...had the third most blown saves in the AL (23) and the fourth lowest save percentage...tied for 10th in saves...19 of the blown saves came against AL West competition...were successful in 17-of-36 (47.2%) save opportunities against the AL West, 25-of-29 (86.2%) against everyone else.
- Had 561.1 innings pitched, which was second most in the AL (Minnesota, 567.2), second most in Oakland history (586.2 in 1997) and third most in Athletics history (588.1 in 1964)...struck out 530 batters, which was fifth most in the AL but set the Athletics record for strikeouts by the bullpen...also set a franchise record for most wild pitches (33).
- Surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)

- Began the year as the A's fifth starter but was moved to the bullpen after his first start on April 7 at Texas...made his first career relief appearance (and seventh career appearance) on Friday against Houston.
