OAKLAND ATHLETICS (7-8) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (7-9)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight for the second time this year (April 10-12) after losing a season-high four consecutive games...have not won more than two straight home games since Aug. 8-10 last year when they won three straight...the win yesterday moved the A's into second place in the American League West, three games behind first place Houston...have spent one day tied for first this year, one day in second, four days tied for second, 10 days in third and one day tied for fourth...won two of three from Texas to start the week for their second series win of the season...have also lost two series and split one...this is the A's 50th season in Oakland where they have won 16 AL West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's did not commit an error yesterday for the first time since April 5, snapping a streak of 11 consecutive games with an error...that was Oakland's second longest streak of consecutive games with an error over the last nine years (15, May 3-18, 2015)...have committed 17 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors (Arizona, 15)...made 97 errors last year, which tied for second most in the American League...five of the 17 errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is two more than any other team...last year, A's pitchers committed nine errors the entire season...five of the errors have been by outfielders, which is also the most in the majors...the 17 errors have led to 10 unearned runs, which is tied with Atlanta for second most in the majors (Tampa Bay, 12).

OFFENSE: The A's scored a season-high nine runs on a season-high 14 hits yesterday and matched their season bests with four doubles and three home runs...lead the American League in extra base hits (48), rank third in doubles (27), tied for third in home runs (19) and fourth in slugging (.418)... scored four runs on four hits in the first inning yesterday after tallying one run on two hits in the first inning over the first 14 games...are now batting .125 (6-for-48) with five runs scored in the first inning for the season...the batting average is second lowest in the majors (Arizona, .102)...the A's have used four different leadoff batters this year and they are hitting a combined .153 (9-for-59) with seven walks (1 sf, .239 on-base percentage)... the on-base percentage is the lowest in the AL and the batting average is third lowest...the one, two and three hitters are batting a combined .160 (27-for-169)...are batting .211 (23-for-109) with runners in scoring position...Yonder Alonso is 8-for-16 (.500) with RISP and the rest of the A's are 15-for-93 (.161)...were shutout for the second time this year Monday night and are one of six teams to be blanked twice this year.

PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in six of the last eight games and are 4-2 with a 2.14 ERA (11 er in 46.1 ip) and .165 (27-for-164) opponents batting average over that span...went 3-3 with a 6.19 ERA and .230 opponents average over the first seven games...starters have all seven of the A's wins and the seven wins are second most among American League starting rotations (New York, 8)...the A's pitching staff as a whole has surrendered just 11 home runs, which is third fewest in the AL...have hit nine batters, which is second most, and walked 52, which is tied for third...have allowed a .212 opponents batting average, which is second lowest in the AL...have not allowed a run in the fourth inning.

ON THE BASES: The A's have allowed 14 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 15)...opponents have been successful in 14-of-15 (93.3%) stolen base attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the majors...the A's are one of four American League teams without a catcher caught stealing (CWS, HOU, TB)...allowed five stolen bases last Saturday against Houston, which were their most allowed in a game since May 27, 2007 against Baltimore when the Orioles stole five bases.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on what is now a nine-game homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (four games)...it was originally a 10-game homestand before Sunday's rainout and it will now match the longest homestand of the season (9, Aug. 8-16)...went 2-2 on the first homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and are 4-5 at home for the season...went 3-3 on their first road trip to Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (2-1)...have hit 14 home run in nine games at home compared to five in six games on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have played just one one-run game (a 7-6 loss on April 4 to Los Angeles) and are tied with Cincinnati for the fewest one-run games in the majors...the time of game last Saturday against Houston

was 3 hours and 55 minutes, which was the A's longest nine inning game since April 25, 2014 when they played 4 hours and 6 minutes, also against the Astros...are averaging 3 hours and 1 minute per game over the first 15 games, which is tied for second fastest in the American League...the A's lost for the second time this year last Saturday when leading after seven innings...the two losses are tied for second most in the AL to Texas (3).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch of what is now 15 consecutive games against American League West competition that began last Friday...in fact, 22 of Oakland's first 25 games of the season (the month of April) are against divisional foes...the exception was the three-game series at Kansas City last week...the A's will host all four AL West teams this month and travel to each city except Seattle...are 5-7 (.412) against the West this year...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Graveman, Gray, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski, Wendle)... Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL an Oakland record 27 times last year and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 16-18 (.471), which was the fourth worst record in the Cactus League...went 12-17-3 (.422) last spring, marking the first time Oakland has finished with a losing record in back-to-back springs since 2010-11...compiled a 5.93 ERA, which was second highest in the majors to Cincinnati (6.13)...it was the second highest spring ERA by an Oakland team over the last 18 years (6.10 in 2016)...the offense ranked fourth in the CL in most strikeouts (300), which were the most by an A's team during the spring since at least 1990 (previous: 248 in 2009)... turned just 23 double plays, which was the fewest in the CL and tied for third fewest in the majors.

RADIO AND TV: Due to conflicts with the Warriors and/or Sharks, the following changes have been made to the radio and television schedules... tonight's game against Seattle has been moved from NBCSCA to NBCSCA Plus...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors and Sharks playoff schedules.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lost the season series last year for the fourth consecutive season as they went 7-12 against the Mariners...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...went 6-4 in Seattle but were 1-8 in Oakland, which matched the A's worst mark ever against the Mariners in the Coliseum (2007)... have lost five straight and 12 of the last 13 games in Oakland...11 of the 19 games last year were decided by one run...are 30-46 (.395) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2012 season, which is the worst record by any American League team against Seattle...all-time, the A's are 334-270 against the Mariners...that includes 180-122 in Oakland, 153-147 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 77-83 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Santiago Casilla has not allowed a hit over his first six appearances and opponents are 0-for-17 with three walks...Khris Davis is the fourth player in Oakland history with seven home runs in the A's first 15 games (Jackson, 1974; Giambi, 2000; Dye, 2004)...is tied for the Major League lead in home runs and tops the American League in slugging (.732)... Jed Lowrie has a 68-game errorless streak as a second baseman, which is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1969 Dick Green triples twice in the first game of a doubleheader at Kansas City...Green drives in three of the A's runs in a 5-1 victory in game one and combines for four hits in the doubleheader...in 1971 Jim Hunter tosses a three-hit shutout as the A's win at California, 4-0...Sal Bando homers twice and singles while driving in three runs...in 1982 Dan Meyer's two-out RBI single in the bottom of the 16th inning lifts the A's to a 4-3 victory over Minnesota.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: César Valdez (0-0, 0.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville today and will be making his A's debut...it will be the third start of his career...spent part of the 2010 season in the majors with Arizona and went 1-2 with a 7.65 ERA in nine games, including two starts...has pitched professionally for 12 seasons, including three years in the Mexican League (2012-13, 15) and nine seasons in the Arizona (2005-10), Pittsburgh (2011), Florida (2011), Houston (2016) and Oakland (2017) organizations...did not play in 2014.... is 54-42 with a 3.81 ERA (339 er in 800.0 ip) in 181 games, 124 starts, in the minors and 25-17 with a 4.08 ERA in 60 games, 59 starts, in the Mexican League.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE APPEARANCE: He pitched in relief on June 10, 2010 against Atlanta (0.2 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...relieved Dontrelle Willis to start the fifth inning with the scored tied 2-2...allowed a RBI double to David Ross, a two-run single to Tommy Hanson and a RBI single to Jason Heyward before he was relieved by Blaine Boyer with the bases loaded...Boyer allowed one of the runners to score.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher in the Diamondbacks 17-3 loss to Milwaukee on May 8, 2010...allowed a careerhigh seven runs on a career-high nine hits in 4.0 innings...also struck out a career-high seven...allowed a solo home run to Jody Gerut in the second inning and four more runs in the third, highlighted by RBI singles by Prince Fielder and Casey McGehee...was also charged with two of the Brewers six runs in the fifth inning.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Had no decisions and a 2.00 ERA in five relief appearances...allowed a .212 (7-for-33) opponents batting average... surrendered two runs in 3.0 innings (6.00 ERA over his first two outings before joining the Dominican Republic for the World Baseball Classic. made one appearance in the first round on March 12 against Colombia (1.2 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb)...returned to camp and did not allow an earned run over his final three appearances (6.0 ip).

2016 RECAP: Signed a minor league contract with the Houston Astros organization on Jan. 12 after spending three seasons in the Mexican League (2012-13, 15) and one year out of baseball (2014)...spent the entire campaign at Triple-A Fresno in his first season with a Major League organization since 2011...was 12-1 with a 3.12 ERA in 30 games (18 starts) with the Grizzlies...led the Pacific Coast League in winning percentage (.923), ranked third in ERA and tied for fourth in wins...walked just 13 batters in 138.1 innings, an average of 0.84 per nine innings...struck out 114 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 8.77...was 2-1 with a 5.40 ERA over his first 15 games (four starts) through June 5...then went 10-0 with a 2.20 ERA over his final 15 games (14 starts) beginning June 11.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .267 opponents batting average, including .257 (81-for-315) against right-handed hitters compared to .282 (62-for-220) against left-handers...yielded a .235 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .182 with RISP and two outs...five of the eight home runs he allowed were solo shots.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Of his first 12 appearances, 11 came in relief...17 of his final 18 outings were starting assignments...was 11-1 with a 3.47 ERA and .276 opponents batting average in his 18 starts, 1-0 with a

1.25 ERA and .213 opponents average in 12 relief appearances...allowed 4-of-10 (40.0%) inherited runners to score.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 7-1 record and a 2.65 ERA in 18 games at home and was 5-0 and a 3.88 ERA in 12 games on the road...the Grizzlies were 12-5 (.706) in his starting assignments (one tie)...walked two batters or fewer in each of his 18 starts and allowed one run or fewer 10 times. tossed more than one inning in eight of his 12 appearances.

MORE WITH FRESNO: Began the season in the bullpen and did not allow a run in seven of his first nine appearances through May 2 (1.13 ERA)... walked a season-high two batters in 2.2 innings April 14 at Salt Lake... it was his first of just three appearances where he walked more than one batter...his longest outing as a reliever came on April 22 against Salt Lake when he tossed 3.1 innings...made his first start May 9 at El Paso and allowed five runs on nine hits in 4.0 innings in a no decision...made two more relief appearances before moving into the rotation on May 24...allowed 11 hits in 6.0 innings May 30 against Colorado Springs...then surrendered a season-high 10 runs on a season-high 18 hits in 5.0 innings in his next start, a 10-6 loss to El Paso on June 5...it was his first and only loss of the season...vielded one run or fewer in six of his next seven appearances from June 11 to July 14...was 5-0 with a 1.21 ERA and .196 opponents batting average over that span...tossed his lone complete game of the season, a nine-inning one-hitter in a 4-0 win at Sacramento June 16... walked one and struck out 10...was named PCL Pitcher of the Week for the week of June 13 to 19...went four consecutive games without issuing a walk from June 28 to July 14 (21.2 ip)...made his final relief appearance of the season July 8 against Reno (1.2 ip, 1 h, 3 so)...combined on a two-hit, 1-0 shutout over Las Vegas July 26...tossed seven of the inning and allowed both of the hits (0 bb, 7 so)...combined a five-hit shutout in a 1-0 win over Sacramento Aug. 24...fired 8.0 innings, allowed all five of the hits and struck out a season-high 12 while walking just one...was 3-0 with a 1.85 ERA in five starts in August.

VALDEZ' CAREER HIGHS TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER LHP Sean Manaea (0-1, 5.51 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...did not allow a hit in his last start, a no decision in the A's 10-6 loss to Houston last Saturday here in Oakland (5.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 5 bb, 6 so)...opponents are now 8-for-58 (.138) off him and the batting average is third lowest in the American League...however, has walked nine and hit a Major League leading four batters...is 2-0 with a 4.76 ERA (17.0 ip, 15 h, 9 r, 9 er, 5 bb, 15 so, 2 hr) in three career starts against Seattle, all last year...went 1-1 with a 3.91 ERA in seven games, including six starts, this spring...surrendered just one home run in 23.0 innings...made his Major League debut with the A's last year following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins.

- The A's bullpen allowed 11 earned runs in three outings from April 14-17 (11.2 ip, 8.49 ERA) but just 10 earned runs in their other 12 games (37.2 ip, 2.39 ERA).
- Are the only Major League team without a win by a reliever.
- A's relievers have 14 walks in their last nine games (27.1 ip) after walking just three batters in their first six games (22.0 ip).
- A's relievers are fourth in the AL in innings pitched.
- Has just three saves and five save opportunities...the saves are tied for fourth fewest in the AL and the opportunities are tied for third fewest ...last April, converted 10-of-11 saves...last season, converted 42-of-65 (64.6%) save opportunities...had the third most blown saves in the AL (23) and the fourth lowest save percentage...tied for 10th in saves...19 of the blown saves came against AL West competition...were successful in 17-of-36 (47.2%) save opportunities against the AL West, 25-of-29 (86.2%) against everyone else.
- Had 561.1 innings pitched, which was second most in the AL (Minnesota, 567.2), second most in Oakland history (586.2 in 1997) and third most in Athletics history (588.1 in 1964)...struck out 530 batters, which was fifth most in the AL but set the Athletics record for strikeouts by the bullpen...also set a franchise record for most wild pitches (33).
- Surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)
