OAKLAND ATHLETICS (8-8) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (7-10)

FRIDAY, APRIL 21, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (0-1, 5.51) VS. RHP HISASHI IWAKUMA (0-1, 5.40) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight for the first time this year after losing a season-high four consecutive games...it marks the first time the A's have won three straight home games since Aug. 8-10 of last year... have not won more than three straight home games since May 28-June 13 of last year when they won six in a row...are 8-8, which marks the sixth time this year the A's have been exactly .500...this is the fifth straight season Oakland has been .500 or better after 16 games...remain in second place in the American League West for the second consecutive day and are three games behind first place Houston for the third straight day...have spent one day tied for first this year, two days in second, four days tied for second, 10 days in third and one day tied for fourth...won two of three from Texas to start the week for their second series win of the season...have also lost two series and split one.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored a season-high nine runs in back-to-back games...that is the first time they have scored nine or more runs in consecutive contests since July 23-24, 2014...lead the American League in extra base hits (52), rank second in slugging (.425), third in doubles (30) and tied for third in home runs (20)...also lead the AL in sacrifice flies (7) and are tied for third in sacrifice hits (3)... are 10-for-24 (.417) with runners in scoring position over the last three games after hitting .179 with RISP over the first 13 contests... are batting .227 (27-for-119) with RISP overall, which includes .500 (8-for-16) by Yonder Alonso and .184 (19-for-103) by everyone else...scored four runs on four hits in the first inning Wednesday but have just five runs in the first inning for the season ... are batting .135 (7-for-52) in the first inning, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (Arizona, .130)...have used four different leadoff batters this year and they are hitting a combined .172 (11-for-64) with seven walks (1 sf, .250 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage is second lowest in the AL and the batting average is third lowest...the one, two and three hitters went 5-for-13 yesterday but are batting a combined .176 (32-for-182) for the season.

STARTING PITCHING: Yesterday, César Valdez became the seventh pitcher to start a game for the A's...that is tied with San Diego for the most in the majors...A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in six of the last nine games and are 4-2 with a 2.50 ERA (14 er in 50.1 ip) and .178 (32-for-180) opponents batting average over that span...went 3-3 with a 6.19 ERA and .230 opponents average over the first seven games...starters have seven of the A's eight wins and the seven wins are tied for second most among American League starting rotations (New York, 8).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has allowed three hits or fewer four times over the first 16 games...last year, they had just five such games for the entire season...have allowed a .214 opponents batting average, which is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have allowed the third fewest home runs in the AL (12)...however, have the second most hit batters (9) and the fourth most walks (56)...have not allowed a run in the fourth inning.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone back-to-back games without an error after making at least one in 11 consecutive games...that was Oakland's second longest streak of consecutive games with an error over the last nine years (15, May 3-18, 2015)...have committed 17 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors (Arizona, 15)...made 97 errors last year, which tied for second most in the American League...five of the 17 errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is two more than any other team...last year, A's pitchers committed nine errors the entire season...five of the errors have been by outfielders, which is also the most in the majors...the 17 errors have led to 10 unearned runs, which is second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 12).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have played just one one-run game this year, which is the fewest in the majors...it came in the second game of the season, a 7-6 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 4...the streak of 14 consecutive games without a one-run game is Oakland's longest since a 15-game streak from Aug. 25-Sept. 10, 2010...eight of the A's 16 games have been decided by five runs or more, which is tied with Texas for the most in the majors...are 3-5 in those eight games.

ON THE BASES: The A's have allowed 14 stolen bases, which is tied with Houston for second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 15)...opponents have been successful in 14-of-15 (93.3%) stolen base attempts, which is tied

for the second highest percentage in the majors...the A's are one of three American League teams without a catcher caught stealing (CWS, TB).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on what is now a nine-game homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (1-0)...it was originally a 10-game homestand before last Sunday's rainout and it will now match the longest homestand of the season (9, Aug. 8-16)...went 2-2 on the first homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and are 5-5 at home for the season... went 3-3 on their first road trip to Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (2-1)... begin a nine-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), Houston (three games) and Minnesota (three games) on Tuesday...it is one of two nine-game road trips (Sept. 12-20)...have hit 14 home runs in 10 games at home compared to five in six games on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The time of game last Saturday against Houston was 3 hours and 55 minutes, which was the A's longest nine inning game since April 25, 2014 when they played 4 hours and 6 minutes, also against the Astros...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game over the first 16 games, which is second fastest in the American League (Los Angeles, 3:00)...the A's lost for the second time this year last Saturday when leading after seven innings...the two losses are tied for second most in the AL to Texas (3)...are 3-3 in games started by a left-handed pitcher and the six games are tied for second most in the AL.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch of what is now 15 consecutive games against American League West competition that began a week ago today...in fact, 22 of Oakland's first 25 games of the season (the month of April) are against divisional foes...the A's will host all four AL West teams this month and travel to each city except Seattle...are 6-7 (.462) against the West this year...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Graveman, Gray, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski, Wendle)... Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL an Oakland record 27 times last year and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's won the first meeting of 2017 last night after losing the season series last year for the fourth consecutive season...went 7-12 against the Mariners in 2016...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...went 6-4 in Seattle but were 1-8 in Oakland, which matched the A's worst mark ever against the Mariners in the Coliseum (2007)...have lost 12 of the last 14 games in Oakland...11 of the 19 games last year were decided by one run...are 31-46 (.403) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the worst record by any American League team against Seattle...all-time, the A's are 335-270 against the Mariners...that includes 181-122 in Oakland, 153-147 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 77-83 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis leads the American League in slugging (.707) and is tied for the lead in home runs (7)...*Ryon Healy* has four hits and a walk in his last five plate appearances...is now 7-for-9 (.778) over his last four games after going 6-for-40 (.150) over his previous 10 contests...*Jed Lowrie* has a 69-game errorless streak as a second baseman, which is the fourth longest such streak in Oakland history...*Trevor Plouffe* homered for the third time in his last six games yesterday and now has 99 career home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (0-1, 5.51 ERA

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season...is on his first Opening Day roster and is beginning his second season in the majors...made both his Triple-A and Major League debut last year, his third professional season.

THIS AND THAT: Did not allow a hit in 5.0 innings in his last start and opponents are 8-for-58 (.138) off him for the season...the batting average is third lowest in the American League...however, has walked nine and hit a Major League leading four batters...opponents are 1-for-36 (.028) with the bases empty compared to 7-for-22 (.318) with runners on...has a .261 (6-for-23) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .057 (2-for-35) after that.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Los Angeles (AL) April 4 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed three runs in the second inning on a two-run single by Maldonado and a RBI single from Escobar...an RBI triple by Trout in the fifth inning increased the Angels lead to 4-2 and he was relieved by Hendriks to start the seventh... the A's scored four times in the bottom of the seventh to get him off the hook.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss at Texas April 9...struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...allowed a three-run home run to Gallo in the second inning...loaded the bases with one out in the sixth and was relieved by Montas, who allowed all three runs to score.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-6 loss to Houston last Saturday in Oakland...tossed 5.0 hitless innings but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...had a 5-0 lead when he walked the bases loaded to start the sixth inning...fielding errors by Rosales and Decker allowed two of those runs to score...the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss.

MANAEA vs. SEATTLE: Is 2-0 with a 4.76 ERA (17.0 ip, 15 h, 9 r, 9 er, 5 bb, 15 so, 2 hr) in three career starts, all last year...the no decision came in a 9-8 A's loss in Oakland on May 4... shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and

had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...the A's then scored six times in the bottom of the fifth to give him an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford)...then picked up the win in a 6-3 decision on Aug. 12 in Oakland...did not allow a hit until Seager homered with two outs in the fifth...took a 3-1 lead in the sixth but allowed an O'Malley RBI triple and a Gutierrez sacrifice fly to tie the game...the A's scored three in the bottom of the sixth for the win...earned the win in the A's final game of the season, a 3-2 victory at Seattle Oct. 2...blanked the Mariners on two hits over the first four innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a two-run double to Heredia in the fifth inning.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins... the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...allowed a .248 opponents batting average and walked 37 batters for a .298 on-base percentage...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included .180 (18-for-100) against left-handed hitters compared to .263 (117-for-445) against right-handers...based on a minimum of 140 innings pitched, the mark against lefties was second lowest in the AL and the lowest in Oakland history (previous: .185, Norris, 1980)...allowed 17 of his 20 home runs and issued 33 of his 37 walks to righties for a .754 OPS...had a .526 OPS against lefties, which was second lowest in the AL and in Oakland history (.504, Norris, 1980)...opponents hit .192 with runners in scoring position, which was third lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings pitched...had a .152 average with RISP and two outs...held the three hitter to a .197 average, which was fifth lowest in the AL ...13 of his 20 home runs came after his 60th pitch in a game...yielded a .430 batting average and .733 slugging percentage when the opponents put the first pitch in play but had a .157 opponents average with two strikes.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Went 4-4 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in 13 games after the All-Star Break after going 3-5 with a 5.24 ERA and .278 opponents average in 12 starts before the break...had the fifth lowest post-break ERA in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 5-3 with a 3.02 ERA in 14 games (13 starts) at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.99 ERA in 11 starts on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the AL.

INNING BY INNING: Had a 1.59 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 6.21 ERA and .283 opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...among pitchers with 20 or more innings, he had the lowest first inning ERA in the majors (1.13) and the fourth lowest second inning ERA (1.44)...his first inning ERA was third lowest in Oakland history using the 20 inning minimum.

RUN SUPPORT: Received one run of support or fewer in 10 of his 24 starts and went 0-6 with a 3.90 ERA in those contests...in his four no decisions with support of one run or fewer, he has scoreless outings of 8.0 innings, 7.0 and 6.0 and one outing where he allowed one run in 7.0 innings.

THIS AND THAT: Tied for eighth in the AL with three pickoffs and opponents were successful in 3-of-7 (42.9%) stolen base attempts off him...the A's were 11-13 (.458) in his starting assignments...walked two batters or fewer in 19 of his 24 starts and allowed two runs or fewer 13 times.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA in three starts in his Triple-A debut...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA at the time of his April 29 promotion...surrendered just one home run in 18.0 innings... struck out 21 while walking just four...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .077 against left-handed hitters.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jharel Cotton (1-2, 5.40 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and the ninth of his career...leads American League rookies in games started (3), innings (16.2) and strikeouts (13)...has walked nine batters in 16.2 innings this year after issuing four free passes in 29.1 innings last year...however, has not surrendered a home run this year after yielding four last year...has received no runs support in two of his three starts...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-0 A's loss to Texas on Monday here in Oakland (5.1 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 3 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against the Mariners, a start in the A's 9-8, 10-inning win at Seattle last year on Oct. 1 (4.1 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...went 3-0 with a 4.35 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in six starts this spring...made his ML debut with Oakland last September and went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents average in five starts.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

1-3, 3.98 ERA (24 er in 54.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 3-for-5 (60.0%)

- The A's bullpen allowed 11 earned runs in three outings from April 14-17 (11.2 ip, 8.49 ERA) but just 13 earned runs in its other 13 games (42.2 ip, 2.74 ERA) .
- Last night's win was the first of the year for an A's reliever...were the last Major League team to record a win by a reliever.
- A's relievers have 16 walks in their last 10 games (32.1 ip) after walking just three batters in their first six games (22.0 ip).
- A's relievers are tied for third in the AL in innings pitched...have tossed three or more innings in six straight games and 12-of-16 games this season.
- Bullpen has just three saves and five save opportunities...the saves are tied for fourth fewest in the AL and the opportunities are tied for third fewest ...last April, converted 10-of-11 saves...last season, converted 42-of-65 (64.6%) save opportunities...had the third most blown saves in the AL (23) and the fourth lowest save percentage ... tied for 10th in saves...19 of the blown saves came against AL West competition ... were successful in 17-of-36 (47.2%) save opportunities against the AL West, 25-of-29 (86.2%) against everyone else.
- Last year, had 561.1 innings pitched, which was second most in the AL (Minnesota, 567.2), second most in Oakland history (586.2 in 1997) and third most in Athletics history (588.1 in 1964)...struck out 530 batters, which was fifth most in the AL but set the Athletics record for strikeouts by the bullpen...also set a franchise record for most wild pitches (33).
- Surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)

- Began the year as the A's fifth starter but was moved to the bullpen after his first start on April 7 at Texas...made his first career relief appearance (and seventh career appearance) on Friday against Houston
- Is 0-1 with an 8.22 ERA in two games against Seattle (7.2 ip, 14 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 hr, 2 bb, 5 so).
- Went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in seven games (three starts) this spring (22.2 ip, 22 h, 12 r, 12 er, 8 bb, 11 so, 4.76 ERA)...his 22.2 innings pitched were the third most on the team (Triggs, Manaea).

Last Year: Began the season in Double-A Midland, where he went 5-6 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts before being promoted to Nashville ... went 4-0 with a 1.18 ERA in eight starts in Triple-A...went 1-3 with a 7.25 ERA in five major league starts.

Allowed his first hit of the season last night (double to Valencia)...hitters are now 1-for-20 (.050) with four walks (.200 on base percentage)

- Is 0-1 and 1-for-1 in save chances in 16 games against Seattle (15.2 ip,
- 11 h, 8 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 15 so, hr). Has a 1.79 ERA (17 er in 85.2 ip) in 86 career appearances in April, which is his lowest ERA for any month of the season.
- Earned a save in his first appearance this season on Opening Night...his save Tuesday was his first save opportunity since then.
- Begins his 14th Major League season and is in his second stint with the A's (2004-09)...signed as a free agent to a two-year contract on Jan. 20, 2017

Last Year: Went 2-5 with 31 saves and a 3.57 ERA in 62 relief appearances with San Francisco...ranked sixth in the NL in saves but had a career-high nine blown saves, which tied for the most in the majors...struck out a career-high 65 batters.
