# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (9-8) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (7-11)

SATURDAY, APRIL 22, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:05 P.M. PDT RHP JHAREL COTTON (1-2, 5.40) VS. LHP ARIEL MIRANDA (1-1, 3.06) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's have a season-high four-game winning streak, which comes on the heels of a season-high four-game losing streak...have not won more than four in a row since May 28-June 1, 2016 when they had a five-game winning streak...are now 9-8, which marks the third time this year Oakland has been above .500...have not been more than one game over .500 since April 22, 2016 when they were a season high three games over at 10-7...this is the fourth time in the last five years Oakland has been above .500 after 17 games...remain in second place in the American League West for the third consecutive day and are three games behind first place Houston for the fourth straight day...have spent one day tied for for the third.

**OFFENSE:** The A's lead the American League in extra base hits (56) and sacrifice flies (8), rank second in slugging (.439), third in doubles (32), tied for third in home runs (22) and tied for fourth in sacrifice hits (3)...are 10-for-30 (.333) with runners in scoring position over the last four games after hitting .179 with RISP over the first 13 contests...are batting .216 (27-for-125) with RISP overall, which includes .471 (8-for-17) by Yonder Alonso and .176 (19-for-108) by everyone else...scored four runs on four hits in the first inning Wednesday but have just five runs in the first inning for the season...are batting .130 (7-for-54) in the first inning, which is the lowest mark in the majors (Arizona, .138)...have used four different leadoff batters this year and they are hitting a combined .169 (11-for-65) with nine walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .276 on-base percentage)...the batting average is third lowest in the AL...the one, two and three hitters are 8-for-22 (.364) over the last two games but are batting a combined .183 (35-for-191) for the season.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in seven of the last 10 games and are 5-2 with a 2.40 ERA (15 er in 56.1 ip) and .184 (37-for-201) opponents batting average over that span... went 3-3 with a 6.19 ERA and .230 opponents average over the first seven games...are 8-5 with a 3.88 ERA (40 er in 92.2 ip) for the season...have the lowest opponents batting average (.203) and slugging percentage (.309) in the majors and are tied for the lead in wins (MIL, NYY, WASH)... are tied for second in the American League in fewest home runs allowed (7) and rank third in on-base percentage (.297) but are eighth in ERA...on Thursday, César Valdez became the seventh pitcher to start a game for the A's...that is tied for the most in the majors (CIN, LAA, SD).

**PITCHING:** The A's pitching staff has allowed three hits or fewer four times over the first 17 games...last year, they had just five such games for the entire season...have the lowest opponents batting average (.213) and slugging percentage (.323) in the majors and are tied for the second fewest home runs (12)...however, are tied for second in most hit batters (9) and tied for sixth in most walks (60)...have not allowed a run in the fourth inning...the only other teams in the majors that have an inning in which they have not allowed a run are the Yankees (6th), Pirates (6th) and Royals (8th).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have gone three straight games without an error after making at least one in 11 consecutive games...that was Oakland's second longest streak of consecutive games with an error over the last nine years (15, May 3-18, 2015)...have committed 17 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors (Arizona, 16)...five of the 17 errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is two more than any other team...five of the errors have been by outfielders, which is also the most in the majors...the 17 errors have led to 10 unearned runs, which is second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 12).

**SCORING MARGIN:** The A's have played just one one-run game this year, which is the fewest in the majors...it came in the second game of the season, a 7-6 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 4...the streak of 15 consecutive games without a one-run game is Oakland's longest since Aug. 25-Sept. 10, 2010 when they also had a 15-game streak...the last longer streak was a 17-game streak from June 18 to July 7, 2009...eight of the A's 17 games have been decided by five runs or more, which is tied with Texas for the most in the majors...are 3-5 in those eight games.

**ON THE BASES:** The Mariners stole two bases last night and the A's have now allowed 16 stolen bases for the season, which is second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 16)...opponents have been successful in 16-of-18 (88.9%) stolen base attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the majors...the A's are one of three teams without a catcher caught stealing (PHI, TB). **HOME AND AWAY:** The A's have won each of their last four home games, which marks the first time they have won more than three straight at home since May 28-June 13, 2016 when they won six straight...are 4-3 on what is now a nine-game homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (2-0)...it was originally a 10-game homestand before last Sunday's rainout and it will now match the longest homestand of the season (9, Aug. 8-16)...went 2-2 on the first homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and are 6-5 at home for the season...went 3-3 on their first road trip to Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (2-1)...begin a nine-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), Houston (three games) and Minnesota (three games) on Tuesday...it is one of two nine-game road trips (Sept. 12-20)...have hit 17 home runs in 11 games at home compared to five in six games on the road...lead the majors in home runs at home.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's lost their third replay challenge in as many tries last night...Oakland is one of three teams that has not won a replay challenge (CHC, COL)...will face a left-handed starting pitcher for the third time in the last four games today...are 3-3 in games started by a lefty for the season and the six games...the time of game a week ago today against Houston was 3 hours and 55 minutes, which was the A's longest nine inning game since April 25, 2014 when they played 4 hours and 6 minutes, also against the Astros...are averaging 3 hours and 1 minutes per game, which is the fastest in the AL.

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are in a stretch of what is now 15 consecutive games against American League West competition that began a week ago today...in fact, 22 of Oakland's first 25 games of the season (the month of April) are against divisional foes...the A's will host all four AL West teams this month and travel to each city except Seattle...are 7-7 (.500) against the West this year...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Graveman, Gray, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski, Wendle)... Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL an Oakland record 27 times last year and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. MARINERS:** The A's have won the first two meetings of 2017 after losing the season series last year for the fourth consecutive season... went 7-12 against the Mariners in 2016...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...went 6-4 in Seattle but were 1-8 in Oakland, which matched the A's worst mark ever against the Mariners in the Coliseum (2007)...have lost 12 of the last 15 games in Oakland...11 of the 19 games last year were decided by one run...are 32-46 (.410) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the worst record by any American League team against Seattle...all-time, the A's are 336-270 against the Mariners...that includes 182-122 in Oakland, 153-147 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 77-83 at Safeco Field.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

*Khris Davis* leads the American League in slugging (.672) and is tied for the lead in home runs (7)...*Ryon Healy* is 7-for-13 (.538) over his last five games after going 6-for-40 (.150) over his previous 10 contests... *Jed Lowrie* has a 70-game errorless streak as a second baseman, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...*Trevor Plouffe* hit his 100th career home run last night...has homered in back-to-back games for the second time over the last seven games and has four home runs total over that span.

In **1916** Jack Nabors defeats Boston 6-2 to even his season record at 1-1...he would go on to lose 19 consecutive games to set the Athletics franchise record for longest losing streak...in **1969** Rollie Fingers tosses the first of his two career shutouts, a five-hitter in the A's 7-0 win at Minnesota...in **1984** Dave Kingman homers twice but the A's lose to Dennis Eckersley at Boston, 12-8...in **2003** Miguel Tejada hits a walk-off home run in the bottom of the 11<sup>th</sup> inning as the A's defeat Detroit, 6-5.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (1-2, 5.40 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and the ninth of his career...leads American League rookies in games started (3), innings pitched (16.2) and strikeouts (13)

THIS AND THAT: Has walked nine batters in 16.2 innings this year after issuing four free passes in 29.1 innings last year...however, has not surrendered a home run this year after yielding four last year...has received no runs support in two of his three starts...had two runs of support in his other start

FIRST START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 5-0 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5 in Oakland...yielded a career-high five runs on a career-high eight hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...retired the first four batters before allowing three runs in the second inning on a RBI double by Simmons and a two-run single by Espinosa...also allowed RBI singles to Trout and Pujols in the fifth.

SECOND START: He combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits ... walked three ... allowed just three baserunners to advance into scoring position.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-0 loss to Texas on Monday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying five runs in 5.1 innings and issued a career-high four walks...allowed a RBI double to Mazara in the first inning and then retired each of the next 12 batters before walking the first two batters in the fifth inning...allowed two-run doubles to Gomez and Napoli in the fifth and left after 5.1 innings trailing 5-0.

2016 RECAP: Was one of three players acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick at the trading deadline and made his Major League debut with Oakland in September...went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's...walked just four batters in 29.1 innings, an average of 1.23 per nine innings, and had a .214 opponents on-base percentage ... struck out 23 for a strikeoutto-walk ratio of 5.75...yielded a .324 slugging percentage.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .146 (7-for-48) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .217 (13-for-60) against right-handers...issued all four of his walks to lefties...surrendered three of his four home runs to righties for a .400 slugging percentage (lefties slugged .229)...three of the four home runs were solo shots...three

came after his 60th pitch in a game...yielded a .167 average with runners in scoring position and .132 with two strikes...opponents hit .163 the first two times through the lineup, .273 after that.

THIS AND THAT: Did not allow a run in the first inning (5.0 ip) and yielded just one hit (.063 batting average)...had a 0.90 ERA over innings one through four, a 4.82 ERA from the fifth inning on...the A's were 4-1 (.800) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in four of his five starts (walked two in the other), allowed one earned run or fewer four times and three hits or fewer three times...was rated as the A's No. 4 prospect by Baseball America following the 2016 season.

MORE 2016: Was recalled from Nashville Sept. 7 and made his ML debut that day against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...allowed a run on two hits in 6.1 innings and picked up his first big league win in a 4-1 decision. became the 16th pitcher in Oakland history to win his debut...is the first Athletics pitcher with more than six innings and two hits or fewer in his debut since Porter Vaughan on June 16, 1940 (7.0 ip, 2 h)...retired the side in order in each of the first three innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to retire at least each of the first nine batters he faced in his career (12, Jay Marshall in 2007; 9, Billy Taylor in 1994; 9, Dave Beard in 1980)...struck out Kaleb Cowart to end the second inning for his first strikeout...also allowed one earned run in each of his next three starts.. since the earned run became an official stat in 1913, he is the first Athletic to start his career with four consecutive games of five innings or more and one earned run or fewer...was one of two Major Leaguers to do it in 2016 (Maeda, LAD)...left with a 2-1 lead in his third start Sept. 19 against Houston but the bullpen allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save in a game the A's would lose 4-2...yielded one run in a career-high 7.0 innings in a 7-1 win on Sept. 25 against Texas to improve to 2-0.

MINORS: Began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and went 8-5 with a 4.90 ERA in 22 games, including 16 starts...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following the trade and went 3-1 with a 2.82 ERA in six starts with the Sounds...combined with both clubs for an 11-6 record and a 4.31 ERA in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts...also led the PCL in opponents batting average (.214), tied for the league lead in shutouts (2), tied for second in complete games (2) and tied for 10th in wins (11)... surrendered 20 home runs, which tied for fourth most...had career highs in wins, games, starts, complete games, shutouts, strikeouts, inning pitched (135.2), runs (71), earned runs (65), home runs (20) and walks (39).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .214 opponents batting average, including .192 (38-for-198) against left-handed hitters compared to .229 (70for-306) against right-handers...surrendered 16 of his 20 home runs to righties for a .444 slugging percentage (lefties slugged .313)...13 of his home runs were solo shots...yielded a .198 batting average and .239 onbase percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .310 with runners in scoring position with Oklahoma City, .208 with Nashville.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 10-4 record and a 3.94 ERA in his 22 starts...was 1-2 with a 9.00 ERA in six relief appearances and allowed his only inherited runner to score...went 9-4 with a 3.27 ERA in 21 games at night, 2-2 with a 7.84 ERA in seven games during the day...hit .150 (3-for-20) with a run, triple, three RBI, a walk and eight strikeouts with Oklahoma City...his teams were 12-10 (.545) in his starting assignments, including 5-1 with Nashville ... walked two batters or fewer in 16 starts ... had more strikeouts than innings pitched 15 times.

MORE MINORS: Tossed a complete game shutout in a five-inning rainshortened 4-0 win over Memphis April 19...allowed two hits and one walk while striking out six...pitched in relief in six straight appearances from April 29 to May 15 (1-2, 9.00 ERA)...returned to the starting rotation for good on May 23 at Fresno...was named Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 23-29 after going 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA in two starts...surrendered just four hits in 10.0 innings and struck out 15... including 10 strikeouts in the game at Fresno, his first of two 10-strikeout games...went 2-for-2 with a triple and RBI in the game at Sacramento... was the winning pitcher for the World team in the Futures Game on July 10 at San Diego...entered the game in the seventh inning with two outs and the United States leading 3-2...retired the only batter he faced and the World scored twice in the eighth and seven times in the ninth for an 11-3 win...was traded to the A's with Grant Holmes and Frankie Montas for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick on Aug. 1 and was assigned to Nashville...came within one out of a perfect game in his next start on Aug. 9, a 3-0 win at Round Rock...retired each of the first 26 batters he faced before allowing a two-out triple to Doug Bernier in the bottom of the ninth...then struck out Drew Robinson for his season-high 12th strikeout of the game ... was named PCL Pitcher of the Week for the second time Aug. 14.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER RHP Andrew Triggs (3-0, 0.00 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and the 10th of his career...has won each of his first three starts and is tied for the AL lead in wins...is the first A's pitcher to win each of his first three starts in a season Tommy Milone in 2013...has not allowed an earned run over his first three starts and his season-opening streak of 17.2 innings without allowing an earned run is the longest in Oakland history by a starting pitcher...the innings are the most in the majors among pitchers with no earned runs...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 A's win over Texas on Tuesday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 5 so).. has faced the Mariners once in his career and it came in relief last year on May 25 at Seattle (2.0 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...went 1-3 with an 8.10 ERA and .299 opponents batting average in seven spring games, including five starts...issued just five walks in a team-leading 23.1 innings.

- The A's bullpen allowed 11 earned runs in three outings from April 14-17 (11.2 ip, 8.49 ERA) but just 13 earned runs in its other 14 games (45.2 ip, 2.56 ERA).
- Thursday's win was the first of the year for an A's reliever...were the last Major League team to record a win by a reliever.
- A's relievers have 17 walks in their last 11 games (35.1 ip) after walking just three batters in their first six games (22.0 ip).
- A's relievers are fifth in the AL in innings pitched...have tossed three or more innings in seven straight games and 13-of-17 games this season.
- Are 4-for-6 in save chances...the save opportunities are tied for third fewest...were 2-for-4 in save chances over their first 13 games but have converted 2-of-2 in their last four contests..
- Have 14 holds, which are the most in the AL...are fifth in opponents OPS (.643).
- Are one of five AL teams who have yet to allow a first batter home run... last year, surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)

## First Hitters: 0-1

- Began the year as the A's fifth starter but was moved to the bullpen after his first start on April 7 at Texas...made his first career relief appearance on April 14 against Houston...has just one start and one relief appearance on the season.
- Is 0-1 with an 8.22 ERA in two career games against Seattle (7.2 ip, 14 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 hr, 2 bb, 5 so).
- Went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in seven games (three starts) this spring (22.2 ip, 22 h, 12 r, 12 er, 8 bb, 11 so, 4.76 ERA)...his 22.2 innings pitched were the third most on the team (Triggs, Manaea).

Last Year: Began the season in Double-A Midland, where he went 5-6 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts before being promoted to Nashville...went 4-0 with a 1.18 ERA in eight starts in Triple-A...went 1-3 with a 7.25 ERA in five major league starts.

- Allowed his first hit of the season Thursday (double to Valencia)...hitters are now 1-for-23 (.043) with four walks (.179 opponents on base percentage).
- Is 0-1 and 2-for-2 in save chances in 17 career games against Seattle (16.2 ip, 11 h, 8 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 16 so, hr).
  Has a 1.77 ERA (17 er in 86.2 ip) in 87 career appearances in April,
- Has a 1.77 ERA (17 er in 86.2 ip) in 87 career appearances in April, which is his lowest ERA for any month of the season.
- Is 3-for-3 in save chances this season after going just 4-for-8 in save opportunities to end last season.
- Begins his 14th Major League season and is in his second stint with the A's (2004-09)...signed as a free agent to a two-year contract on Jan. 20, 2017.

Last Year: Went 2-5 with 31 saves and a 3.57 ERA in 62 relief appearances with San Francisco...ranked sixth in the NL in saves but had a career-high nine blown saves, which tied for the most in the majors...struck out a career-high 65 batters.
