OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-8) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (7-12)

SUNDAY, APRIL 23, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:05 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have a season-high five-game winning streak, which comes on the heels of a season-high four-game losing streak...the winning streak is Oakland's longest since May 28-June 1 of last year when they also won five in a row...have not won more than five straight since April 16-22 of last year when they had a six-game winning streak...have won the first three games of this series and have not swept a four-game series since Sept. 12-15, 2016 at Kansas City...have not swept a four-game series in the Coliseum since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto...are a season-high two games over .500 at 10-8 (.556)...it marks the first time the A's have been two games over .500 since April 23 of last year when they were also 10-8 after 18 games...were last three games over .500 on April 22, 2016 (10-7)...have a winning record after 18 games for the fourth time in the last five years...remain in second place in the American League West for the fourth consecutive day and are two games behind first place Houston...have spent one day tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 10 days in third and one day tied for fourth.

OFFENSE: The A's are tied for the American League lead in extra base hits (59), rank second in slugging (.434) and third in doubles (33) and home runs (24)...lead the AL in sacrifice flies (8) and are tied for fourth in sacrifice hits (3)...Adam Rosales became the fifth Athletic to start in the leadoff spot yesterday and the first one to homer...A's leadoff hitters are batting a combined .174 (12-for-69) with nine walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .275 on-base percentage)...the batting average is the lowest in the AL and the on-base percentage is fourth lowest...the number eight hitters are batting a Major League leading .317 (19-for-60)...Oakland is batting .180 (11-for-61) in the first inning, which is second lowest in the AL

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in eight of the last 11 games and are 6-2 with a 2.45 ERA (17 er in 62.1 ip) and .193 (43-for-223) opponents batting average over that span...went 3-3 with a 6.19 ERA and .230 opponents average over the first seven games...are 9-5 with a 3.83 ERA (42 er in 98.2 ip) for the season...have the lowest opponents batting average in the majors (.207), are tied with Washington for the lead in wins and have the third lowest slugging percentage (.320)...are third in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.300) and fewest home runs allowed (8)...on Thursday, César Valdez became the seventh pitcher to start a game for the A's...that is tied with the Angels and Blue Jays for the most in the AL

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has a 2.20 ERA (11 er in 45.0 ip) and .184 (29-for-158) opponents batting average during the current five-game winning streak and has surrendered just three home runs...have the lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.216), rank second in slugging percentage (.332), tied for second in fewest home runs (13) and fourth in on-base percentage (.300)...however, have the second most hit batters (10) and the third most walks (63)...have not allowed a run in the fourth inning...the only other team in the majors that has an inning in which it has not allowed a run is the Royals (8th)...has allowed three hits or fewer four times over the first 18 games...last year, they had just five such games for the entire season.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone four straight games without an error after making at least one miscue in 11 consecutive games...that was Oakland's second longest streak of consecutive games with an error over the last nine years (15, May 3-18, 2015)...have committed 17 errors for the season, which is the most in the majors (Arizona and Pittsburgh, 16)...five of the 17 errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors, and five have been by outfielders, which is tied for the most (San Diego)...the 17 errors have led to 10 unearned runs, which is second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 12).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's played just their second one-run game of the season yesterday, which is the fewest in the majors...it was their first one-run win and it snapped a streak of 15 consecutive games without a one-run decision...that was Oakland's longest such streak since Aug. 25-Sept. 10, 2010 when they also had a 15-game streak...eight of the A's 18 games have been decided by five runs or more, which is tied with Texas for the most in the majors...are 3-5 in those eight games.

ON THE BASES: The A's had their first catcher caught stealing of the season yesterday, which is tied for second fewest in the American League (Tampa Bay, 0)...opponents have been successful in 17-of-20 (85.0%)

stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 19) and the stolen base percentage is fourth highest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's have won each of their last five home games, which marks the first time they have won more than three straight at home since May 28-June 13, 2016 when they won six straight...are 5-3 on what is now a nine-game homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (3-0)...it was originally a 10-game homestand before the rainout a week ago today and it will now match the longest homestand of the season (9, Aug. 8-16)...went 2-2 on the first homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and are 7-5 at home for the season...went 3-3 on their first road trip to Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (2-1)...begin a nine-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), Houston (three games) and Minnesota (three games) on Tuesday...it is one of two nine-game road trips (Sept. 12-20)...have hit 19 home runs in 12 games at home compared to five in six games on the road...lead the majors in home runs at home.

THIS AND THAT: With the win yesterday, the A's improved to 5-5 when the opponent scores first...have six come-from-behind wins, which is tied for third in the American League (Houston and Tampa Bay, 7)...won their first replay review of the season yesterday in their fourth challenge...have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in three of the previous four games and are 4-3 against left-handed starters for the season...the seven games are tied for second most in the AL...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is tied for second fastest in the AL (KC, 3:01).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch of what is now 15 consecutive games against American League West competition that began a week ago today...in fact, 22 of Oakland's first 25 games of the season (the month of April) are against divisional foes...the A's will host all four AL West teams this month and travel to each city except Seattle...are 8-7 (.533) against the West this year...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Graveman, Gray, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski, Wendle)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...the A's used the DL an Oakland record 27 times last year and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have won the first three meetings of 2017...have swept a four-game series from the Mariners four times, most recently Sept. 30-Oct. 3, 2010 at Seattle...last swept a four-game series in Oakland Sept. 10-13, 1992...lost the season series last year for the fourth consecutive season as they went 7-12...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...went 6-4 in Seattle but were 1-8 in Oakland, which matched the A's worst mark ever against the Mariners in the Coliseum (2007)...11 of the 19 games last year were decided by one run...are 33-46 (.418) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the worst record by any American League team against Seattle...all-time, the A's are 337-270 against the Mariners...that includes 183-122 in Oakland, 153-147 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 77-83 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryon Healy is 9-for-17 (.529) over his last six games after going 6-for-40 (.150) over his previous 10 contests...**Jed Lowrie** has a 71-game errorless streak as a second baseman, which is the third longest such streak in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1978** the A's record their second consecutive shutout as John Henry Johnson tosses a six-hit shutout against the Mariners at Seattle in the A's 5-0 win...in **1985** the A's and the Angels combine for 10 home runs, but the A's come out on top 14-9...Mike Davis hits his sixth home run in the first A's first 14 games...in **1988** Dave Stewart goes the distance in the A's 3-2, 10 inning win at Chicago to improve to 5-0...Stewart would go on to win his first eight decisions.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (3-0, 0.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and the 10th of his career...has won each of his first three starts and is tied for the American League lead in wins...is the first A's pitcher to win each of his first three starts in a season since Tommy Milone in 2013...the last A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster to win each of his first four starts in a season is Dave Stewart, who won his first six in 1990...now has a four-game winning streak dating back to last year.

NO EARNED RUNS: Has not allowed an earned run over his first three starts and his season-opening streak of 17.2 innings without allowing an earned run is the longest in Oakland history by a starting pitcher...the Oakland record for any pitcher is 23.0 by Ryan Cook in 2012... his 17.2 innings are the most in the majors among pitchers with no earned runs (Barnes, MIL 10.1)...since the earned run became an official stat in the American League in 1913, he is just the third A's pitcher to start the season with three games of five or more innings and no earned runs...joins Eddie Rommel (1924) and Vean Gregg (1918).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .067 (2-for-30) average against left-handed hitters compared to .257 (9-for-35) against right-handers...opponents are 8-for-36 (.222) with the bases empty compared to .103 (3-for-29) with runners on...has yielded a .056 (1-for-18) batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents are 0-for-6 with RISP and two outs.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) April 6 in Oakland...issued a career-high three walks and tossed a career-high 91 pitches...surrendered his only run in the third inning and it was unearned...Escobar led off with a single, went to second on a R.Davis error, third on a ground out and scored on a Pujols ground out...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the third for the win.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Kansas City April 12...tossed a career-high tying 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...surrendered four hits and walked one and allowed just three base runners to advance into scoring position...was relieved by Dull to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 8-0.

LAST START: He improved to 3-0 in the A's 4-2 win over Texas on Tuesday in Oakland...matched his career-high with 6.0 innings pitched...shut out the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings but Darvish blanked the A's on one hit over that Span...Triggs then allowed two unearned runs in the sixth when an Alonso error preceded an Andrus RBI single and a Mazara RBI ground out...the A's then scored four times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

2016 RECAP: Was claimed off waivers from Baltimore during the spring and went 1-1 with a 4.31 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 24 games (six starts) over eight stints in his Major League debut with the A's...the eight stints are believed to be the most in one season in Oakland history...the stints were April 25-26, April 29, May 7 (26th man for doubleheader), May 10-June 3, June 18, June 30-July 1, July 4-August 3 (includes stay on the DL from July 18-Aug. 1) and Aug. 5 through the end of the season...five of his eight stints began less than eight days following his previous option...had three one-day stints and two two-day stints...struck out 55 and walked just 13 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.23...compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...then went 1-1 with a 2.58 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in 14 games (six starts), over his final four stints...allowed three home runs over his first four stints (18.0 ip) and two in his last four (38.1 ip).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .235 (28-for-119) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .277 (28-for-101) against left-handers...issued 9 of his 13 walks to lefties...held the opposition to a .144 batting average with two strikes...the three hitter in the order batted .429 but he allowed a .160 batting average against the clean-up hitter.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 1-1 with a 2.81 ERA and .191 opponents batting average in his six starts, 0-0 with a 5.58 ERA and .302 opponents average in 18 relief appearances...walked just one batter in 25.2 innings as a starter...first batters faced hit .176 with no extra base hits and one walk (.222 on-base percentage)...allowed 4-of-8 (50.0%) inherited runners to score.

HOME AND AWAY: Had an 0-1 record and a 2.81 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 1-0 with a 5.58 ERA in 12 games on the road...surrendered four of his five home runs on the road.

INNING BY INNING: Logged a 0.93 ERA and .183 opponents batting average over innings one through three compared to a 6.08 ERA and .289 opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

THIS AND THAT: Tossed at least one inning in 17 of his 18 relief appearances, including two or more 10 times...pitched fewer than five innings in three of his six starts and his longest start was six innings...the A's were 1-5 (.167) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in all but two appearances.

MORE 2016: Was recalled from Nashville April 25 and made his ML debut that day at Detroit...retired the side in order in the eighth inning (1.0 ip, 1 so) and struck out the first batter he faced (Tyler Collins)...was sent back to Nashville two days later...returned for stint number five June 18 and made his first big league start that day against Los Angeles (AL)...allowed a run on three hits in 3.0 innings and had a no decision in a 7-1 A's loss...was sent back to Nashville the following day...stint number seven began July 4 and he allowed at least one run in each of his three appearances before going on the 15-day disabled list July 19 retroactive to July 18 with a right shin contusion...was reinstated Aug. 2, tossed 2.1 scoreless innings Aug. 3 at Los Angeles (AL) and was optioned Aug. 4...was brought back the next day when Jesse Hahn went on the DL and went 1-1 with a 2.92 ERA and .191 opponents average in seven games (five starts) during his final stint...allowed just one home run and walked two batters in 24.2 innings before a lumbar strain ended his season in early September.

NASHVILLE: Went 2-1 with two saves and a 2.95 ERA in 16 appearances with Triple-A Nashville, all in relief...struck out 21 and walked five in 18.1 innings...did not surrender a home run...allowed a .225 batting average, including .130 (3-for-23) against left-handed hitters compared to .271 (13-for-48) against right-handers...had a .125 batting average and .222 on-base percentage against batters leading off an inning...did not allow a run in seven games on the road (8.0 ip) and five appearances during the day (5.2 ip)...tossed one or more innings in 15 of his 16 appearances, including a season-high 2.0 innings April 23 against New Orleans and July 28 against Colorado Springs...did not allow a run 12 times.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (1-1, 3.00 ERA): Was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...is scheduled to make his third start and fourth appearance of the season...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 9-1 A's win over Texas last Wednesday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...is 1-0 with a 4.86 ERA (16.2 ip, 15 h, 9 r, 9 er, 8 bb, 12 so, 3 hr) in three career appearances, all starts, against Los Angeles...had four separate stints with the A's last year and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...also went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA in 15 starts with Nashville...the starts were the first of his career at the Triple-A level...surrendered just four home runs in 68.2 innings, an average of 0.54 per nine innings.

- The A's bullpen allowed 11 earned runs in three outings from April 14-17 (11.2 ip, 8.49 ERA) but just 14 earned runs in its other 15 games (48.2 ip, 2.59 ERA).
- Thursday's win was the first of the year for an A's reliever...were the last Major League team to record a win by a reliever...are one of two AL teams with only one bullpen win (Minnesota).
- A's relievers have 18 walks in their last 12 games (38.1 ip) after walking just three batters in their first six games (22.0 ip).
- A's relievers are tied for fifth in the AL in innings pitched...have tossed three or more innings in eight straight games and 14-of-18 games this season.
- Are 5-for-7 in save chances...were 2-for-4 in save chances over their first 13 games but have converted 3-of-3 in their last five contests...three different relievers have recorded at least one save (Casilla, 3; Doolittle, 1; Madson, 1).
- Have 16 holds, which are tied for the most in the AL.
- Are one of five AL teams who have yet to allow a first batter home run... last year, surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)

- Began the year as the A's fifth starter but was moved to the bullpen after his first start on April 7 at Texas...made his first career relief appearance on April 14 against Houston...has just one start and one relief appearance on the season.
- Is 0-1 with an 8.22 ERA in two career games against Seattle (7.2 ip, 14 h, 7 r, 7 er, 5 hr, 2 bb, 5 so).
- Went 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in seven games (three starts) this spring (22.2 ip, 22 h, 12 r, 12 er, 8 bb, 11 so, 4.76 ERA)...his 22.2 innings pitched were the third most on the team (Triggs, Manaea).

- Is 0-1 and 2-for-2 in save chances in 17 career games against Seattle (16.2 ip, 11 h, 8 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 16 so, hr).
- Has a 1.77 ERA (17 er in 86.2 ip) in 87 career appearances in April, which is his lowest ERA for any month of the season.
