# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-9) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (9-12)

TUESDAY, APRIL 25, 2017 — ANGEL STADIUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP JESSE HAHN (1-1, 3.00) VS. RHP JC RAMIREZ (2-2, 6.46) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's had their season-high five-game winning streak snapped on Sunday...the streak came on the heels of a season-high fourgame losing streak but the A's have now won each of their last two series and three of the last four...are 10-9 after 19 games for the second consecutive season and are above .500 after 19 games for the fourth time in the last five years...remain in second place in the American League West for the sixth consecutive day and are three games behind first place Houston...have spent one day tied for first, six days in second, four days tied for second, 10 days in third and one day tied for fourth.

**SCORING MARGIN:** The A's lost to Seattle on Sunday 11-1, their largest margin of defeat this season...nine of the A's 19 games have been decided by five runs or more, which is the most in the majors...are 3-6 in those nine games and the six losses by five or more are also the most in the majors...the A's played just their second one-run game of the season Saturday, which is the fewest in the majors...it was their first one-run win and it snapped a streak of 15 consecutive games without a one-run decision... that was Oakland's longest such streak since Aug. 25-Sept. 10, 2010 when they also had a 15-game streak.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are tied for second in the American League in doubles (35) and extra base hits (61) and rank fourth in slugging (.423)...have nine sacrifice flies, which is tied with San Francisco for the most in the majors... have 60 walks, which is fourth fewest in the AL...the A's have started five different batters in the leadoff spot and they are batting a combined .164 (12-for-73) with nine walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .262 on-base percentage)...the batting average is second lowest in the AL and the on-base percentage is third lowest...Oakland is batting a Major League low .185 (12-for-65) in the first inning...have a .211 (28-for-133) average with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 6-3 with a 3.09 ERA (23 er in 67.0 ip) and .199 (48-for-241) opponents batting average over the last 12 games...went 3-3 with a 6.19 ERA and .230 opponents average over the first seven games...are 9-6 with a 4.18 ERA (48 er in 103.1 ip) for the season...have the lowest opponents batting average in the majors (.210) and the most wins in the American League...have the second fewest home runs in the AL (9), the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.325) and the third lowest on-base percentage (.303)...however, have hit the most batters (8) and are tied for the third most walks (44)... Oakland has used seven different starting pitchers, which is tied for second most in the American League to Los Angeles (8)...used 14 different starting pitchers last year, which was second most in the AL (Los Angeles, 15) and tied for second most in Oakland history.

PITCHING: The A's allowed a season-high 11 runs on Sunday after surrendering just 13 runs (11 earned) over the previous five games (2.20 ERA)... have allowed 15 home runs this year, which is tied with Baltimore for the fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.344)...rank second in the American League in lowest opponents batting average (.221)...however, have the second most hit batters (11), are tied for the second fewest strikeouts (137) and rank fourth in most walks (69)... have not allowed a run in the fourth inning...Oakland is the only team in the majors that has an inning (one through nine) in which they have not allowed a run...have allowed three hits or fewer four times over the first 19 games...last year, they had just five such games for the entire season.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have gone five straight games without an error after making at least one miscue in 11 consecutive games...that was Oakland's second longest streak of consecutive games with an error over the last nine years (15, May 3-18, 2015)...have committed 17 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors...last year, the A's made 97 errors, which tied for second most in the AL...five of the 17 errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors, and five have been by outfielders, which is tied for the most (San Diego)...the 17 errors have led to 10 unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 13).

**ON THE BASES:** A's opponents have been successful in 18-of-21 (85.7%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 20) and the stolen base percentage is fourth highest in the American League...had their first catcher caught stealing of the season Saturday, which is tied for second fewest in the AL (Tampa Bay, 0).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin their second road trip of the season tonight, a nine-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (three games), Houston (three games) and Minnesota (three games)...it is one of two nine-game road trips this year (Sept. 12-20)...went 3-3 on their first road trip to Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (2-1)...went 5-4 on the last homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (3-1) and are 7-6 at home for the season... had their five-game home winning streak snapped on Sunday...have hit 19 home runs in 13 games at home compared to five in six games on the road...lead the majors in home runs at home.

**THIS AND THAT:** Oakland is one of three American League teams (Detroit, New York) without an extra inning game...the A's are 9-5 in games in which they homer, 1-4 when they don't...are 7-4 when out-homering the opponent and the 11 games with more homers than the opposition are the most in the AL...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is tied for second fastest in the AL (KC, 3:00)...won their first replay review of the season Saturday in their fourth challenge.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch of 15 consecutive games against American League West competition that began April 14 and ends on Sunday...in fact, 22 of Oakland's first 25 games of the season (the month of April) are against divisional foes...the A's have hosted all four AL West teams this month and will travel to each city except Seattle... are 8-8 (.500) against the West this year...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's placed Rajai Davis on the disabled list today and now have nine players on the DL (Axford, Bassitt, R.Davis, Graveman, Gray, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski, Wendle)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...last year, the A's had at least nine players on the DL everyday from May 9 through the end of the season...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**CONTRACT STATUS:** The A's have four players under contract beyond the 2017 season...Santiago Casilla, Sean Doolittle, Matt Joyce and Ryan Madson are signed through 2018 with the A's holding club options on Doolittle for 2019 and 2020...Jed Lowrie has a club option for 2018.

A's vs. ANGELS: The season series is even at two games each as the two clubs split a four-game series in Oakland to start the season...the A's lost the season series last year after going 7-12 against the Angels...were 3-6 in Oakland and 4-6 in Anaheim...have lost six of the last seven games at Anaheim...have lost each of the previous three season series and are 26-35 against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 423-356 against the Angels...that includes 220-169 in Oakland and 203-187 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 472-433 against the Angels.

# TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso is 5-for-12 (.417) with two doubles and two home runs over his last three games after going 2-for-18 (.111) over his previous seven contests...Khris Davis is tied for the American League lead in home runs (7)...has drawn a walk in four consecutive games for the first time in his career (five walks total)...Ryon Healy has back-to-back multiple hit games and is 11-for-21 (.524) with four doubles, a home run and six RBI over his last seven games after going 6-for-40 (.150) over his previous 10 contests...Jed Lowrie has a 72-game errorless streak as a second baseman, which is the third longest such streak in Oakland history.

# THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1901** Nap Lajoie has three hits in the first game in Athletics history... he would go on to set a franchise record with a .426 batting average...in **1987** Dennis Eckersley pitches the final 2 1/3 innings of the A's 7-3 win over Seattle for his first save in an Oakland uniform...he would go on to save an Oakland record 320 games...in **2002** Miguel Tejada hits his 100<sup>th</sup> career home run in the A's 6-2 win over New York.

# **TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-1, 3.00 ERA)**

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...is scheduled to make his third start and fourth appearance of the season.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (1 er in 6.0 ip) and .100 (2-for-20) opponents batting average in one start in Oakland, 0-1 with a 3.75 ERA (5 er in 12.0 ip) and .271 opponents average in two starts on the road...last year, he went 2-1 with a 3.03 ERA and .237 opponents batting average in five starts at home, 0-3 with a 13.17 ERA and .453 opponents average in four starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 6-4 with a 2.97 ERA (33 er in 100.0 ip) in 16 starts in Oakland, 3-7 with a 5.90 ERA (40 er in 61.0 ip) in 12 games on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (1 er in 6.0 ip) in one start during the day, 0-1 with a 3.75 ERA (5 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts at night... last year, he went 2-1 with a 3.90 ERA and .234 opponents average in five starts during the day, 0-3 with a 9.92 ERA and .427 opponents average in four starts at night...his career splits are 9-3 with a 2.27 ERA (25 er in 99.1 ip) in 16 day games, 7-12 with a 4.87 ERA (73 er in 135.0 ip) in 26 night games.

FIRST APPEARANCE: He relieved A's starting pitcher Raul Alcantara to start the third inning of the A's 10-5 loss at Texas April 7...entered the game trailing 8-3 and tossed 6.0 innings in his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...blanked the Rangers on two hits over his first three innings before allowing two runs in the sixth on a Gomez RBI double and a Mazara RBI single...those were the only runs he would allow.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Kansas City April 13...allowed two runs in the first inning on RBI singles by Cain and Perez, and another in the third on a Moss sacrifice fly...did not allow a run over his final three innings...Vargas (7.2 ip) and Soria (0.1 ip) shutout the A's on four hits and a walk over the first eight innings before Oakland scored its only run in the ninth.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 win over Texas last Wednesday in Oakland, snapping a career-high tying three game losing streak dating back to last year...it was his first win since May 28, 2016... matched his career high by walking four batters...did not allow a hit until Napoli singled with one out in the fourth inning and surrendered his only run on a leadoff home run by Gallo in the fifth...left after six innings with the A's leading 8-1.

HAHN vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 1-0 with a 4.86 ERA (16.2 ip, 15 h, 9 r, 9 er, 8 bb, 12 so, 3 hr) in three career appearances, all starts...is 1-0 with a 2.84 ERA (4 er in 12.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland...made his only start at Anaheim last year in his only 2016

appearance against the Angels...had a no decision in the A's 8-6, 10-inning win on Aug. 4 (5 er in 4.0 ip, 11.25 ERA)...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Choi in the second...the A's scored a run in the third but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the third on a Simmons RBI single and a Choi three-run home run...Oakland came back with three in the fourth and he was relieved by Neal to start the fifth inning with the score tied 5-5.

**2016 RECAP:** Had four separate stints with the A's and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percent-

age (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...struck out just 23 batters (4.47 per nine innings) and walked 19 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.21, which was the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .273 (27-for-99) against right-handed hitters compared to .361 (30-for-83) against left-handers...surrendered seven of his eight home runs to lefties and had a .663 slugging percentage against lefties, .333 against righties...his career splits are .213 (93-for-436) against righties, .276 (124-for-450) with 15 of his 18 home runs against lefties...has a .429 career slugging percentage against lefties, .275 against righties...had a .226 opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .358 after that..opponents hit .426 with a .449 on-base percentage and .681 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...in 2015, his marks were .215, .277 and .290 respectively...allowed a .324 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .500 with RISP and two outs...five of the eight home runs he surrendered were solo shots...yielded a .300 average with two strikes and a .440 average to the first hitter in the batting order.

**THIS AND THAT:** Opponents were successful in each of their seven stolen base attempts off him after going 5-for-9 (55.6%) over his first two seasons...the A's were 5-4 (.556) in his starting assignments...tossed more than six innings in just three of his nine starts...has done that in just 11 of 39 starts in his career...the bullpen blew a save in three of his nine starts.

MORE 2016: Was recalled for the first time April 30 and went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .250 opponents average in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 8...combined with Axford and Madson on a fourhit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Houston on April 30 but then walked a career-high tying four batters in the night game of the May 7 day/night doubleheader at Baltimore and took the loss...blanked the Orioles over the first two innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.2 innings...made just one start at Nashville following his May 8 option and returned to Oakland May 17...went 1-3 with an 8.34 ERA and .368 opponents batting average in five starts during his second stint with the A's... left with the lead in each of his first two starts on May 17 against Texas and May 22 against New York (AL) but the bullpen blew the save in each outing...yielded a career-high tying 10 hits against the Rangers...issued a career-high tying four walks May 28 against Detroit but picked up his second win of the season...allowed a career-high seven runs in a career-low 0.2 innings in a 1-2 loss at Houston June 3...became the eighth starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow seven or more runs in less than an inning, the first since Joe Blanton allowed eight runs in 0.1 innings against Tampa Bay on May 25, 2005...was optioned to Nashville June 10...did not return to Oakland until July 24...started that day against Tampa Bay and allowed one run on four hits in 7.2 innings...left with a 2-0 lead but the bullpen blew the save and he ended up with a no decision...was optioned  $% \left( x\right) =\left( x\right) +\left( x\right) +\left($ back to Nashville the next day...also made just one start during his fourth and final stint...was recalled Aug. 4, allowed five runs on seven hits in 4.0 innings in a start that day at Los Angeles (AL), and was placed on the disabled list the next day with a strained right shoulder...was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville Sept. 2.

NASHVILLE: Went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA in 15 starts with Nashville...the starts were the first of his career at the Triple-A level...had just four career losses as a minor leaguer entering the season...surrendered just four home runs in 68.2 innings, an average of 0.54 per nine innings...however, issued 34 walks (4.59 per nine innings) and struck out just 46 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.35...allowed a .276 opponents batting average, including .255 (38-for-149) against right-handed hitters compared to .304 (34-for-112) against left-handers...surrendered three of his four home runs to righties...went 0-7 with a 4.71 ERA in 10 starts at home compared to 1-0 with a 3.18 ERA in five starts on the road...allowed all four of his home runs at home...yielded a .175 batting average and .246 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents batted .222 with runners in scoring position, including .188 with RISP and two outs...they were 1-for-9 (.111) with the bases loaded...the Sounds were 6-9 (.400) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than five innings in eight of his 15 starts and more than six innings just once...had three starts without a run and four more with just one...walked three batters or more seven times...made one postseason start and had a no decision in the Sounds 10-7 win in Game 1 of the Pacific Coast League Semifinals Sept. 7 at Oklahoma City (4.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 7 so).

# TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (1-1, 4.43 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...is 1-0 with a 1.64 ERA (2 er in 11.0 ip) and .135 (5-for-37) opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 0-1 with a 7.15 ERA and .190 opponents batting average over his first two starts... has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his first four starts...his season-opening streak of four consecutive starts of at least five innings with five hits or fewer matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history... was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's win over Seattle last Friday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...is 0-1 with a 4.34 ERA (18.2 ip, 15 h, 10 r, 9 er, 6 bb, 11 so, 3 hr) in three career starts against Los Angeles...including a no decision in his only start this year, a 7-6 A's loss in Oakland on April 4 (6.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...went 1-1 with a 3.91 ERA in seven games, including six starts, this spring.

# HLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

1-3, 4.18 ERA (30 er in 64.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 5-for-7 (71.4%)

- The A's bullpen allowed five earned runs on Sunday after giving up just four earned runs over the previous five games.
- Last Thursday's win was the first of the year for an A's reliever...were the last Major League team to record a win by a reliever...are one of two AL teams with only one bullpen win (Minnesota).
- A's relievers have 22 walks in their last 13 games (42.2 ip) after walking just three batters in their first six games (22.0 ip).
- A's relievers are fifth in the AL in innings pitched (64.2)...have tossed three or more innings in nine straight games and 15-of-19 games this
- Are 5-for-7 in save chances...were 2-for-4 in save chances over their first 13 games but have converted 3-of-3 in their last six contests...three different relievers have recorded at least one save (Casilla, 3: Doolittle, 1; Madson, 1).
- Have 16 holds, which are tied for the most in the AL
- Are one of five AL teams who have yet to allow a first batter home run... last year, surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)
