OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-10) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (10-12)

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 26, 2017 — ANGEL STADIUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (1-1, 4.43) VS. RHP MATT SHOEMAKER (0-1, 4.98) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost each of their last two games after winning five straight...the losing streak has dropped the A's back to the .500 mark for the seventh time this year...are 10-10 after 20 games for the second consecutive season...it marks the fifth time in the last six years the A's have been at or above .500 after 20 games...remain in second place in the American League West for the seventh consecutive day and are a season-high tying four games behind first place Houston (also April 17)... have spent one day tied for first, seven days in second, four days tied for second, 10 days in third and one day tied for fourth...Oakland has won each of its last two series and three of its last four.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's played just their third one-run game of the season last night, which is tied for the fewest in the majors (CIN, CWS, HOU)...are 1-2 in those games and only Cincinnati has fewer one-run wins...nine of the A's 20 games have been decided by five runs or more, which is tied with Texas for the most in the majors...are 3-6 in those nine games and the six losses by five or more are also the most in the majors... have a season run differential of -13, which is fourth lowest in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: Jesse Hahn tossed 8.0 innings last night, which was the longest outing by an A's starter this year...it was just the third outing of seven or more innings, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...A's starting pitchers are 6-3 with a 2.76 ERA (23 er in 75.0 ip) and .184 (49-for-266) opponents batting average over the last 13 games... went 3-3 with a 6.19 ERA and .230 opponents average over the first seven contests...are 9-6 with a 3.88 ERA (48 er in 111.1 ip) for the season... have the lowest opponents batting average (.200) and slugging percentage (.309) in the majors and the fewest home runs (9)...have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.293) and are tied with Minnesota for the most wins...however, have hit the most batters in the majors (8) and are fourth in the AL in most walks (46)...Oakland has used seven different starting pitchers, which is tied for second most in the AL to Los Angeles (8)...used 14 different starting pitchers last year, which was second most in the AL (Los Angeles, 15) and tied for second most in Oakland history.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed a .338 opponents slugging percentage, which is .023 points lower than any other team (KC and NYY, .361)...have the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.217) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.301)...are tied for the second fewest home runs (16)...however, have hit the second most batters (11) and have the third fewest strikeouts (145)...have not allowed a run in the fourth inning...Oakland is the only team in the majors that has an inning (one through nine) in which they have not allowed a run.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone six straight games without an error after making at least one miscue in 11 consecutive games...that was Oakland's second longest streak of consecutive games with an error over the last nine years (15, May 3-18, 2015)...have committed 17 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...five of the 17 errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors, and five have been by outfielders, which is the most in the AL...the 17 errors have led to 10 unearned runs, which is tied for second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 13).

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to one run in each of the last two games and have scored nine runs over the last four contests...struck out a season-high tying 11 times last night (seventh time this year)...have 166 strikeouts for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...are tied for fourth in the AL in doubles (35) and extra base hits (62)...have nine sacrifice flies, which is tied with San Francisco and Seattle for the most in the majors...are tied for second in the AL in sacrifice hits (4)...the A's have started five different batters in the leadoff spot and they are batting a combined .171 (13-for-76) with 10 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .273 on-base percentage)...the batting average is second lowest in the majors (NYM, .133) and the on-base percentage is fourth lowest in the AL...Oakland is batting a Major League low .176 (12-for-68) in the first inning...have a .207 (28-for-135) average with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been successful in 19-of-23 (82.6%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are second most in the majors

(Pittsburgh, 21) and the stolen base percentage is fourth highest in the American League...had their first catcher caught stealing of the season Saturday, which is tied for second fewest in the AL (Tampa Bay, 0).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on their second road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-1), Houston (three games) and Minnesota (three games)...it is one of two nine-game road trips this year (Sept. 12-20)...went 3-3 on their first road trip to Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (2-1) and are 3-4 (.429) on the road...went 5-4 on the last homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (3-1) and are 7-6 (.538) at home...have hit 19 home runs in 13 games at home compared to six in seven games on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's played their first extra inning game of the season last night and lost...fell to 0-2 in games decided in the last at bat...are one of four teams without a last at bat win (CIN, LAD, MIN)...are 9-6 in games in which they homer, 1-4 when they don't...are 7-4 when out-homering the opponent and the 11 games with more homers than the opposition are the most in the American League...are averaging 3 hours and 3 minutes per game, which is tied for second fastest in the AL (KC, 3:01)...won their first replay review of the season Saturday in their fourth challenge.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch of 15 consecutive games against American League West competition that began April 14 and ends on Sunday...in fact, 22 of Oakland's first 25 games of the season (the month of April) are against divisional foes...the A's have hosted all four AL West teams this month and will travel to each city except Seattle... are 8-9 (.471) against the West this year...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Rajai Davis on the disabled list yesterday and now have nine players on the DL (Axford, Bassitt, R.Davis, Graveman, Gray, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski, Wendle)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...last year, the A's had at least nine players on the DL everyday from May 9 through the end of the season... used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 2-3 against the Angels this year...lost the first game in Anaheim last night after splitting a four-game series in Oakland to start the season...have now lost seven of the last eight games at Angel Stadium...the A's lost the season series last year after going 7-12 against the Angels...were 3-6 in Oakland and 4-6 in Anaheim...have lost each of the previous three season series and are 26-36 against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 423-357 against the Angels...that includes 220-169 in Oakland and 203-188 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 472-434 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is tied for the American League lead in home runs (7)...has drawn a walk in five consecutive games (seven walks total), which marks the first time in his career he has walked in more than three straight games...left-handed hitters are 0-for-12 with eight strikeouts against *Sean Doolittle...Ryon Healy* is 11-for-26 (.423) with four doubles, a home run and six RBI over his last eight games after going 6-for-40 (.150) over his previous 10 contests...*Jed Lowrie* has a 73-game errorless streak as a second baseman, which is the third longest such streak in Oakland history.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** Walt Weiss homers in the fourth inning of a 6-4 A's victory at Baltimore...he would not homer again as an Athletic, setting an Oakland record with an 837-at bat homerless streak...in **1997** Mark McGwire ties an Oakland record by walking five times in the A's 7-6, 11 inning win against Kansas City...three of the walks were intentional...in **2001** the A's tie an Oakland record with 11 extra base hits in a 16-6 win at Chicago...Johnny Damon and Frank Menechino have two doubles each and Eric Chavez homers twice as the A's collect seven doubles and four home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (1-1, 4.43 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season...is 1-0 with a 1.64 ERA (2 er in 11.0 ip) and .135 (5-for-37) opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 0-1 with a 7.15 ERA and .190 opponents batting average over his first two starts.

FIVE HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his first four starts...his season-opening streak of four consecutive starts of at least five innings with five hits or fewer matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a fourgame streak in 2007...the longest is a five-game streak by Mike Norris in 1980.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .165 (13-for-79) opponents batting average, which is fifth lowest in the American League...has allowed just three extra base hits (two triples, one home run) for the seventh lowest slugging percentage (.253)...however, is tied for the lead in hit batters (4) and tied for eighth in walks (12)...the four hit batters match his season total from last year (144.2 innings)...opponents are 2-for-43 (.047) with two strikes...they are 1-for-17 (.059) when leading of an inning but he has walked four and hit three for a .333 on-base percentage...opponents are batting .083 (4-for-48) when leading off an inning compared to .290 (9-for-31) with runners on base...has a .258 (8-for-31) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .104 (5-for-48) after that.

THE FIRST INNING: Has not allowed a run in the first inning...last year, he had a 1.13 ERA in the first inning, which was the lowest in the majors and third lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with 20 or more innings... now has a 0.96 ERA (3 er in 28.0 ip) in his career.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Los Angeles (AL) April 4 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed three runs in the second inning on a two-run single by Maldonado and a RBI single from Escobar...an RBI triple by Trout in the fifth inning increased the Angels lead to 4-2 and he was relieved by Hendriks to start the seventh... the A's scored four times in the bottom of the seventh to get him off the hook.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss at Texas April 9...struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...allowed a three-run home run to Gallo in the second inning...loaded the bases with one out in the sixth and was relieved by Montas, who allowed all three runs to score.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-6 loss to Houston in Oakland on April 15...tossed 5.0 hitless innings but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...had a 5-0 lead when he walked the bases loaded to start the sixth inning...fielding errors by Rosales and Decker allowed two of those runs to score...the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss.

LAST START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 3-1 victory over Seattle last Friday in Oakland...allowed his only run in six innings of work in the third inning when Heredia singled with two outs and scored on a Haniger triple...retired the side in order just once: the fifth...the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the fifth and then scored twice in the sixth for the win.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 3.91 ERA in seven games, including six starts, this spring...surrendered just one home run in 23.0 innings...allowed a .258 (23-for-89) opponents batting average...allowed one run or fewer in five of his seven appearances, including no runs three times...walked one batter or fewer in six of his seven outings but issued five walks in 3.0 innings in the other.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins... the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...allowed a .248 opponents batting average and walked 37 batters for a .298 on-base percentage...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included .180 (18-for-100) against left-handed hitters compared to .263 (117-for-445) against right-handers...based on a minimum of 140 innings pitched, the mark against lefties was second lowest in the AL and the lowest in Oakland history (previous: .185, Norris, 1980)...allowed 17 of his 20 home runs and issued 33 of his 37 walks to righties for a .754 OPS...had a .526 OPS against lefties, which was second lowest in the AL and in Oakland history (.504, Norris, 1980)...opponents hit .192 with runners in scoring position, which was third lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings pitched...had a .152 average with RISP and two outs...held the three hitter to a .197 average, which was fifth lowest in the AL ...13 of his 20 home runs came after his 60th pitch in a game...yielded a .430 batting average and .733 slugging percentage when the opponents put the first pitch in play but had a .157 opponents average with two strikes.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Went 4-4 with a 2.67 ERA and .220 opponents batting average in 13 games after the All-Star Break after going 3-5 with a 5.24 ERA and .278 opponents average in 12 starts before the break...had the fifth lowest post-break ERA in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 5-3 with a 3.02 ERA in 14 games (13 starts) at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.99 ERA in 11 starts on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the AL.

INNING BY INNING: Had a 1.59 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 6.21 ERA and .283 opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...among pitchers with 20 or more innings, he had the lowest first inning ERA in the majors (1.13) and the fourth lowest second inning ERA (1.44)...his first inning ERA was third lowest in Oakland history using the 20 inning minimum.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (2-0, 2.00 ERA): Was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA in three starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 17 retro-active April 15 with a strained right shoulder...is scheduled to be reinstated tomorrow to make his fourth start of the season...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-2 A's loss to Houston on April 14 in Oakland (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 1 hr)...is 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA (40.2 ip, 42 h, 16 r, 15 er, 9 bb, 27 so, 5 hr) in seven career starts against Los Angeles...including a win in one start this year, a 4-2 A's win on Opening Night in Oakland on April 3 (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...went 2-1 with a 2.29 ERA in five starts this spring...held the opposition to a .188 (13-for-69) batting average and walked just three batters in 19.2 innings (1.37 walks per nine innings)... compiled a 10-11 record and a 4.11 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts in his second season with the A's last year.

 Last night, the A's bullpen suffered its fourth loss of the season and its first loss since April 15 against Houston.

- Last Thursday's win was the first of the year for an A's reliever...were the last Major League team to record a win by a reliever...are one of two AL teams with only one bullpen win (Minnesota).
- A's relievers have 22 walks in their last 14 games (45.1 ip) after walking just three batters in their first six games (22.0 ip)...the bullpen allowed no walks last night for the first time since April 19 against Texas.
- A's relievers snapped a nine-game streak of throwing three or more innings last night...they have pitched three or more innings in 15-of-20 games this season.
- Āre 5-for-8 in save chances...were 3-of-3 in their last six contests before blowing a save last night...three different relievers have recorded at least one save (Casilla, 3; Doolittle, 1; Madson, 1).
- · Have 16 holds, which are tied for the most in the AL
- On Tuesday, Santiago Casilla allowed the team's first first batter home run of the season (to Mike Trout in the 10th inning)..last year, surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)


