OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-11) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (11-12)

THURSDAY, APRIL 27, 2017 — ANGEL STADIUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (2-0, 2.00) VS. RHP RICKY NOLASCO (1-2, 4.76) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost each of their last three games after winning five straight...have lost the first two games of this series to snap their two series winning streak...are now 3-3-1 in series play...are 10-11 for the season, which marks just the second time in the last six years the A's have been under .500 after 21 games (9-12 in 2015)...have been exactly .500 seven times this year...dropped into a tie for second place in the American League West with the loss last night after seven consecutive days alone in second...remain a season-high tying four games behind first place Houston for the second consecutive day...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, five days tied for second, 10 days in third and one day tied for fourth.

THE FOURTH INNING: The A's have not allowed a run in the fourth inning and opponents are batting .103 (7-for-68)...Oakland is the only team in the majors that has an inning (one through nine) in which they have not allowed a run...did not allow a run in the final three fourth innings last year and the streak of 24 consecutive games without a run matches the longest fourth-inning streak in Oakland history (April 21-May 18, 1968 and Aug. 6-31, 1982)...the longest streak in any inning is 38 consecutive games with no runs in the seventh inning from Sept. 20, 2005-May 2, 2006.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed just 16 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.343)... have the third lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.225) but have the third highest ERA (4.15)...have the second most hit batters (12) and the third fewest strikeouts (153).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-4 with a 3.04 ERA (26 er in 77.0 ip) and .192 (53-for-276) opponents batting average over the last 14 games...went 3-3 with a 6.19 ERA and .230 opponents average over the first seven contests...are 9-7 with a 4.05 ERA (51 er in 113.1 ip) for the season...have the lowest opponents batting average (.205) and slugging percentage (.318) in the majors and the fewest home runs (9)...have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.295) and are tied for the most wins (MIN, NYY)...however, have hit the most batters in the majors (8) and are tied for fourth in the AL in most walks (46)...Oakland has used seven different starting pitchers, which is tied for second most in the AL to Los Angeles (8)...used 14 different starting pitchers last year, which was second most in the AL (Los Angeles, 15) and tied for second most in Oakland history.

OFFENSE: The A's are tied for second in the American League in doubles (37), rank third in slugging (.418) and tied for third in home runs (27) and extra base hits (66)...have struck out at least 11 times in each of the last three games (35 strikeouts total) and have 179 strikeouts for the season, which is fourth most in the AL...are tied for the AL lead in sacrifice flies (9) and are tied for third in sacrifice hits (4)...have started five different batters in the leadoff spot and they are batting a combined .173 (14-for-81) with 10 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .269 on-base percentage)...the batting average is second lowest in the AL and the on-base percentage is third lowest...have a .213 (30-for-141) average with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their six-game errorless streak snapped last night when Stephen Vogt committed the A's 18th error of the season...that is the most in the American League and fifth most in the majors...the error led to two unearned runs and the A's now have 12 unearned runs for the season, which is second most in the AL (Tampa Bay, 14)...five of the A's 18 errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors, and five have been made by outfielders, which is the most in the AL...the A's have turned 17 double plays, which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been successful in 20-of-24 (83.3%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 21) and the stolen base percentage is third highest in the American League...had their only catcher caught stealing of the season Saturday, which is tied for the fewest in the AL.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's played just their third one-run game of the season Tuesday night, which is tied for the fewest in the majors (CIN, CWS, HOU)...are 1-2 in those games and only Cincinnati has fewer one-run wins...nine of the A's 21 games have been decided by five runs or more, which is tied for second most in the majors (Texas, 10)...are 3-6 in

those nine games and the six losses by five or more are the most in the majors...have a season run differential of -16, which is third lowest in the American League.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on their second road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-2), Houston (three games) and Minnesota (three games)...it is one of two nine-game road trips this year (Sept. 12-20)...went 3-3 on their first road trip to Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (2-1) and are 3-5 (.375) on the road...went 5-4 on the last homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (3-1) and are 7-6 (.538) at home...have hit 19 home runs in 13 games at home compared to eight in eight games on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's played their first extra inning game of the season Tuesday night and lost...fell to 0-2 in games decided in the last at bat and are one of four teams without a last at bat win (CIN, LAD, MIN)...are 9-7 in games in which they homer, 1-4 when they don't...are 7-5 when outhomering the opponent and the 12 games with more homers than the opposition are the most in the American League...are averaging 3 hours and 4 minutes per game, which is third fastest in the AL...won their first replay review of the season last Saturday in their fourth challenge.

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch of 15 consecutive games against American League West competition that began April 14 and ends on Sunday...in fact, 22 of Oakland's first 25 games of the season (the month of April) are against divisional foes...the A's have hosted all four AL West teams this month and will travel to each city except Seattle... are 8-10 (.444) against the West this year...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Kendall Graveman from the disabled list today and now have eight players on the DL (Axford, Bassitt, R.Davis, Gray, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski, Wendle)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 2-4 against the Angels this year...have lost the first two games in Anaheim after splitting a four-game series in Oakland to start the season...have lost eight of the last nine games and 21 of the last 30 at Angel Stadium...the A's lost the season series last year after going 7-12 against the Angels...were 3-6 in Oakland and 4-6 in Anaheim... have lost each of the previous three season series and are 26-37 against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 423-358 against the Angels...that includes 220-169 in Oakland and 203-189 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 472-435 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso leads American League first baseman in RBI (13) and is tied for the lead in home runs (4)...his four home runs match his most ever in a month (May, 2014)...**Khris Davis** is tied for the American League lead in home runs (7)...has drawn a walk in six consecutive games (nine walks total), which marks the first time in his career he has walked in more than three straight games...left-handed hitters are 0-for-12 with eight strikeouts against **Sean Doolittle**...**Jed Lowrie** has a 74-game errorless streak as a second baseman, which is the third longest such streak in Oakland history...is 9-for-25 (.360) over his last six games after going 7-for-41 (.171) over his previous 12 contests.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1968 Jim "Catfish" Hunter records his first win in an Oakland uniform in the A's 6-3 victory at California...he would go on to win an Oakland record 131 games which does not include 30 wins while pitching for the Kansas City A's...in 1981 former Athletic Don Baylor, playing for the California Angels, hits into a triple play, the fourth in Oakland history... in 2002 the A's tie a franchise record by hitting four home runs in the third inning...Scott Hatteberg, Terrence Long, Carlos Pena and Frank Menechino connect for the home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (2-0, 2.00 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA in three starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled list April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder...was reinstated today and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents are 2-for-20 (.100) with runners on base, including 0-for-8 with runners in scoring position...has a .167 (8-for-48) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .313 (5-for-16) after that...has allowed a home run in each of his first three starts, marking the second time in his career he has allowed a home run in three straight games (June 7-18, 2015)

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day April 8 in Oakland...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)... is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Trout in the third inning... those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas April 8...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings, allowing just two base runners on an Odor walk and Lucroy reach on error in the second...then retired 15 straight before Napoli homered with two outs in the bottom of the seventh...that was the only run he allowed in seven innings of work.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-2 loss to Houston on April 14 in Oakland...did not strike out a batter in 5.0 innings, his first career start without a strikeout...the A's scored once in the second inning and he kept the Astros off the board over the first four innings, despite three hits, two walks and a hit batter...then allowed a leadoff home run to Aoki in the fifth inning and left after five innings and 74 pitches with the scored tied 1-1.

3...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years...is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Trout in the third inning...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...went 1-0 with a 3.80 ERA (23.2 ip, 24 h, 10 r, 10 er, 4 bb, 11 so, 3 hr) in four starts last year...the bullpen blew the save in two of those starts.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 2.29 ERA in five starts this spring...held the opposition to a .188 (13-for-69) batting average and walked just three batters in 19.2 innings (1.37 walks per nine innings)... allowed one run or fewer in four of his five starts...also started the exhibition game against Italy's World Baseball Classic team on March 8 and picked up the win (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 3 so)...pitched in a minor league game March 29.

2016 RECAP: Compiled a 10-11 record and a 4.11 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts in his second season with the A's...went 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts, 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA over his next 16 starts from May 30 to Aug. 24, and 0-3 with a 4.71 ERA over his final six starts...in addition to starts, he also led the A's in wins, losses (tied), innings pitched (186.0), hits (196), runs (87), earned runs (85), home runs (22) and walks (47)...all those marks are career highs as are his 108 strikeouts...the 47 walks were the fewest in Athletics history by an A's team-leader, besting the previous low of 59 by Sonny Gray in 2015.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Averaged 5.23 strikeouts per nine innings, which was the third lowest mark in the American League...tied for second in the AL in shutouts (1), tied for fifth in complete games (2), tied for sixth in opponents reaching on an error (8), ranked seventh in fewest pitches per game (91.4) and was ninth in hits (196).

SUPPORT: Averaged 4.16 runs of support per start, which was 10th lowest in the AL...received two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 31 starts and was 0-8 in those games...went 10-3 in 19 starts with support of three or more...is now 1-17 in 26 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 17-3 in 29 starts with three runs of support or more...left with a lead five times in 2016 only to have the bullpen blow the save.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .271 opponents batting average, which broke down to .270 (90-for-333) against right-handed hitters compared to .272 (106-for-390) with 35 of his 47 walks against left-handers...his career splits are .269 (166-for-617) with a .739 OPS against right-handers, .269 (173-for-644) with 62 of his 90 walks and a .733 OPS against left-handers...yielded a .302 average with runners on base but 14 of the 22 home runs he allowed were solo shots...26 of his 40 career home runs have come with the bases empty.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Tied for third among AL pitchers in total chances (42), tied for seventh in assists (27) and ranked eighth in putouts (15)...did not commit an error and his 42 total chances were the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors among pitchers with no errors.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 5-6 with a 3.39 ERA in 14 starts at home compared to 5-5 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts on the road...had the ninth lowest home ERA in the AL...surrendered seven home runs in 90.1 innings at home, 15 in 95.2 innings on the road.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Was 3-5 with a 4.82 ERA in 15 starts against AL West competition compared to 7-6 with a 3.46 ERA in 16 starts against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 1.74 ERA in the first inning, which tied Arrieta (CHC) for second lowest in the majors (Tanaka, NYY 1.16) among pitchers with 30 or more innings...using the same minimum, it was 10th lowest in Oakland history...logged a 4.59 ERA from the second inning on...his ground ball to fly ball ratio of 2.40 was fourth highest in the AL... the A's were 14-17 (.452) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in 18 of his 31 starts.

MORE 2016: Allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts to become the third pitcher in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...picked up his first win of the season and struck out a career-high eight April 20 at New York (AL)...had a career-high six-game winning streak from May 30 to July 23...compiled a 3.25 ERA and .264 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 10 starts... tossed 8.0 innings July 9 at Houston, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18, 2015...that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...fired his second career complete game in the A's 4-3 win over Tampa Bay on July 23 in Oakland... finished July 4-1 with a 2.68 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in five starts...the wins tied for third in the AL and were his most ever in a month...authored his third career complete game and his first shutout, a two-hitter in the A's 9-0 win at Chicago (AL) Aug. 19...tossed just 98 pitches, which were the fewest by an Athletic in a nine-inning complete game since Dana Eveland on May 21, 2008 against Tampa Bay (95).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jharel Cotton (2-2, 4.76 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and the ninth of his career...leads American League rookies in games started (4) and innings pitched (22.2)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-3 A's win over Seattle last Saturday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against Houston, a start in the A's 4-2 loss in Oakland last year on Sept. 19 (6.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so)...went 3-0 with a 4.35 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in six starts this spring...held opponents to a .208 batting average, but issued a team-leading 11 walks in 20.2 innings...struck out a team-leading 21 batters...made his Major League debut with Oakland last September and went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents average in five starts...combined with Oklahoma City and Nashville for an 11-6 record and a 4.31 ERA in 28 games, 22 starts.

HLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

1-4, 4.30 ERA (35 er in 73.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 5-for-8 (62.5%)

- The bullpen recorded a season-high seven strikeouts last night in 6.0 innings of work.
- On Tuesday, the A's bullpen suffered its fourth loss of the season and its first loss since April 15 against Houston.
- Last Thursday's win was the first of the year for an A's reliever...were the last Major League team to record a win by a reliever... are one of two AL teams with only one bullpen win (Minnesota).
- A's relievers have 24 walks in their last 15 games (51.1 ip) after walking just three batters in their first six games (22.0 ip)...the bullpen allowed no walks last night for the first time since April 19 against Texas
- A's relievers tied a season-high with six innings pitched last night (other: April 7 at Texas)...they have pitched three or more innings in 16-of-21 games this season.
- Are 5-for-8 in save chances...were 3-of-3 in their last six contests before blowing a save on Tuesday...three different relievers have recorded at least one save (Casilla, 3; Doolittle, 1; Madson, 1).
- Have 16 holds, which are tied for the most in the AL
- On Tuesday, Santiago Casilla allowed the team's first first batter home run of the season (to Mike Trout in the 10th inning)..last year, surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)
