### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (10-13) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (15-8)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's dropped the series opener last night, 9-4, and now have lost a season-high five straight games...won five in a row from April 18-22 before the current losing streak...lost more than five games in a row just once last season, a seven-game spell from June 3-11...are 10-13 (.435) for the season, which is tied for the third worst record in the American League...the three games under .500 is tied for the season low (5-8 on April 17)...have finished with a losing record in April just once over the previous four years (9-14 in 2015)...are in a tie for fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high five games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, five days tied for second, 10 days in third, one day tied for third and two days tied for fourth.

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed just 17 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors (.355)...have the fourth lowest batting average (.225) in the AL but have the fourth highest ERA (4.17)...have the second most hit batters (12).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer 10 times over the last 16 games and are 6-6 with a 3.19 ERA (31 er in 87.1 ip) and .216 (69-for-320) opponents batting average over that stretch...went 3-3 with a 6.19 ERA and .230 opponents average over the first seven contests...are 9-9 with a 4.08 ERA (56 er in 123.2 ip) for the season...have the lowest opponents batting average (.221) and slugging percentage (.334) in the majors and the fewest home runs (9)...have the second lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.303) and are tied for second in wins...however, are tied for first in most hit batters in the majors (8) and have the third highest ERA in the AL (4.08).

**THE FOURTH INNING:** The A's allowed their first fourth-inning run of the season last night...Oakland was the last team in the majors that had an inning (one through nine) in which they had not allowed a run...did not allow a run in the final three fourth innings last year and the streak of 25 consecutive games without a run was the longest fourth-inning streak in Oakland history (previous: 24, April 21-May 18, 1968 and Aug. 6-31, 1982)...the longest streak in any inning is 38 consecutive games with no runs in the seventh inning from Sept. 20, 2005-May 2, 2006.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have been held to one run in three of their last five games (0-5)...have scored 12 runs over total over that span and are batting .179 (31-for-169) with 57 strikeouts...now have a .231 batting average for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the third most strikeouts (201)...are tied for second in doubles (39), tied for fourth in home runs (29) and rank third in extra base hits (70)...the 29 home runs are two more than Oakland's April home run total from a year ago...this marks the first time the A's have hit more than 28 home runs in April since 2006 when they had 34...are tied for the AL lead in sacrifice flies (9) and are tied for third in sacrifice hits (4)...have started five different batters in the leadoff spot and they are batting a combined .156 (14-for-90) with 10 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .245 on-base percentage)...the batting average is last in the AL and the on-base percentage is second lowest (Kansas City, .224)...have a .215 (32-for-149) average with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed three errors last night after going errorless in seven of their previous eight games...have made 21 for the season...that is tied for most in the majors (Milwaukee, St. Louis)...the errors have led to 15 unearned runs, which is also tied for most in the majors (Pittsburgh)...five of the A's 21 errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors, and five have been made by outfielders, which is the most in the AL.

**ON THE BASES:** A's opponents have been successful in 20-of-25 (80.0%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are the most allowed in the American League and third most in the majors...the stolen base percentage is fourth highest in the AL...had their second catcher caught stealing of the season last night, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL.

**SCORING MARGIN:** The A's have played three one-run games over their last six contests (1-2)...had just one one-run game over the first 17 contests...are now 1-3 in one-run games and the four games are tied for second fewest in the American League...the one win is tied for second fewest in the majors...10 of the A's 23 games have been decided by five runs or more, which is tied for the most in the majors (Texas)...are 3-7 in those 10

games and the seven losses by five or more are the most in the majors... have a season run differential of -22, which is third lowest in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-4 on their second road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3), Houston (0-1) and Minnesota (three games)...it is one of two nine-game road trips this year (Sept. 12-20)...went 3-3 on their first road trip to Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (2-1) and are 3-7 (.300) on the road...went 5-4 on the last homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (3-1) and are 7-6 (.538) at home... have hit 19 home runs in 13 games at home compared to 10 in 10 games on the road.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's played their first extra inning game of the season Tuesday night and lost 2-1 in 11 innings...fell to 0-2 in games decided in the last at bat with the loss and are one of three teams without a last at bat win (CIN, MIN)...are 9-8 in games in which they homer, 1-5 when they don't...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is tied for fastest in the AL (Kansas City).

**AGAINST THE WEST:** The A's are in a stretch of 15 consecutive games against American League West competition that began April 14 and concludes with this three-game series against Houston...in fact, 22 of Oakland's first 25 games of the season (the month of April) are against divisional foes...the A's have hosted all four AL West teams this month and will travel to each city except Seattle...are 8-12 (.400) against the West this year...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's currently have seven players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, R.Davis, Gray, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski) and have used the DL nine times this year...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's were swept by Houston in a rain-shortened two-game series in Oakland earlier this month to open the season series (the rainout will be made up as part of a single-admission doubleheader on Sept. 9)...Oakland now has a 10-game losing streak against the Astros, which is its longest ever against Houston...have not lost more than 10 consecutive games to any team since dropping 11 straight to the Yankees, July 5, 2010-July 22, 2011...lost the season series for the second consecutive season last year as they went 6-13...were 6-6 over the first 12 games, but lost each of the final seven...eight of the 19 games were decided in the last at bat and the A's were 2-6 in those games...had a 4-5 record in Oakland and posted a 2-8 mark in Houston...are 15-26 against Houston over the last three years...have lost 11 of the last 13 at Minute Maid Park...lead the all-time series 46-39...19 of the 39 losses have been by one run...are 25-18 in Oakland and 21-21 in Houston.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Yonder Alonso** leads American League first baseman in RBI (14) and is second in home runs (4)...his four home runs match his most ever in a month (May, 2014)...**Khris Davis** hit two home runs last night, his second multi-homer game of the season and 13th of his career...his other two-homer game this season came on Opening Day, April 3 vs. Los Angeles-AL...left-handed hitters are 0-for-12 with eight strikeouts against **Sean Doolittle**.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1998** Ben Grieve ties an Oakland record by going a perfect 5 for 5 with four runs scored in the A's 11-4 win at Cleveland...in **2000** Grieve hits his first career grand slam in the 10<sup>th</sup> inning of a 6-2 A's win at Minnesota... in **2013** the A's defeat the Angels 10-8 in a 19-inning game that lasts an Oakland record 6 hours and 32 minutes...the A's overcome a five-run deficit in the game and Brandon Moss ends it with a two-run home run in the bottom of the 19<sup>th</sup> inning.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (3-1, 2.42 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and the 11th of his career...took the loss in his last start to snap a career-best four-game winning streak dating back to last year...had won each of his first three starts to become the first A's pitcher to go 3-0 over his first three starts in a season since Tommy Milone in 2013...is tied for third in the American League lead in wins.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .079 (3-for-38) average against left-handed hitters compared to .283 (13-for-46) against right-handers...opponents are 10-for-45 (.222) with the bases empty compared to .154 (6-for-39) with runners on...has yielded a .136 (3-for-22) batting average with runners in scoring position...has not allowed a hit to the opponents clean-up hitter (0-for-11).

**NO EARNED RUNS:** Allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first inning of his last start to snap his season-opening streak of 17.2 innings without allowing an earned run...that was the longest season-opening streak in Oakland history by a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster...it was third longest by any Oakland pitcher...since the earned run became an official stat in the American League in 1913, he is just the third A's pitcher to start the season with three games of five or more innings and no earned runs...joins Eddie Rommel (1924) and Vean Gregg (1918).

**FIRST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) April 6 in Oakland...issued a career-high three walks and tossed a career-high 91 pitches...surrendered his only run in the third inning and it was unearned...Escobar led off with a single, went to second on a R.Davis error, third on a ground out and scored on a Pujols ground out...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the third for the win.

**SECOND START:** He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Kansas City April 12...tossed a career-high tying 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...surrendered four hits and walked one and allowed just three base runners to advance into scoring position...was relieved by Dull to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 8-0.

**THIRD START:** He improved to 3-0 in the A's 4-2 win over Texas on April 18 in Oakland...matched his career-high with 6.0 innings pitched...shut out the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings but Darvish blanked the A's on one hit over that Span...Triggs then allowed two unearned runs in the sixth when an Alonso error preceded an Andrus RBI single and a Mazara RBI ground out...the A's then scored four times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

**LAST START:** He was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 11-1 loss to Seattle last Sunday in Oakland...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and then surrendered five runs in the third inning on a bases loaded walk to Cruz and a Motter grand slam...was relieved by Coulombe after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0.

**TRIGGS vs. HOUSTON:** Is 0-0 with a 9.00 ERA (6.0 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 9 so, 1 hr) in two career appearances, both in relief last year at Houston...his first outing came on June 3 in the A's 12-2 loss...relieved A's starter Jesse Hahn after he allowed seven runs in 0.2 innings and tossed 4.0 innings (7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...then pitched the seventh and eighth innings of the A's 10-9 loss on July 8 (2.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 3 so).

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Jesse Hahn (1-1, 2.08 ERA):** Was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...is scheduled to make his fourth start and fifth appearance of the season...is fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.239), ranks fourth in batting average (.174), eighth in on-base percentage (.245) and tied for 10th in ERA (2.08)...had a no decision in his last start, a 2-1 A's loss in 11 innings last Tuesday at Los Angeles-AL (8.0 ip, 1 h, 2 bb, 6 so)...is 1-2 with a 6.75 ERA (13.1 ip, 14 h, 10 r, 10 er, 6 bb, 11 so, 1 hr) in three career starts against Houston...had four separate stints with the A's last year and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...also went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA in 15 starts with Nashville.

**2016 RECAP:** Was claimed off waivers from Baltimore during the spring and went 1-1 with a 4.31 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 24 games (six starts) over eight stints in his Major League debut with the A's...the eight stints are believed to be the most in one season in Oakland history...the stints were April 25-26, April 29, May 7 (26th man for doubleheader), May 10-June 3, June 18, June 30-July 1, July 4-August 3 (includes stay on the DL from July 18-Aug. 1) and Aug. 5 through the end of the season...five of his eight stints began less than eight days following his previous option...had three one-day stints and two two-day stints...struck out 55 and walked just 13 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.23...compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...then went 1-1 with a 2.58 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in 14 games (six starts), over his final four stints...allowed three home runs over his first four stints (18.0 ip) and two in his last four (38.1 ip).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average included a .235 (28-for-119) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .277 (28-for-101) against left-handers...issued 9 of his 13 walks to lefties...held the opposition to a .144 batting average with two strikes...the three hitter in the order batted .429 but he allowed a .160 batting average against the clean-up hitter.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Was 1-1 with a 2.81 ERA and .191 opponents batting average in his six starts, 0-0 with a 5.58 ERA and .302 opponents average in 18 relief appearances...walked just one batter in 25.2 innings as a starter...first batters faced hit .176 with no extra base hits and one walk (.222 on-base percentage)...allowed 4-of-8 (50.0%) inherited runners to score.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Had an 0-1 record and a 2.81 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 1-0 with a 5.58 ERA in 12 games on the road...surrendered four of his five home runs on the road.

**INNING BY INNING:** Logged a 0.93 ERA and .183 opponents batting average over innings one through three compared to a 6.08 ERA and .289 opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

**THIS AND THAT:** Tossed at least one inning in 17 of his 18 relief appearances, including two or more 10 times...pitched fewer than five innings in three of his six starts and his longest start was six innings...the A's were 1-5 (.167) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in all but two appearances.

**NASHVILLE:** Went 2-1 with two saves and a 2.95 ERA in 16 appearances with Triple-A Nashville, all in relief...struck out 21 and walked five in 18.1 innings...did not surrender a home run...allowed a .225 batting average, including .130 (3-for-23) against left-handed hitters compared to .271 (13-for-48) against right-handers...had a .125 batting average and .222 on-base percentage against batters leading off an inning...did not allow a run in seven games on the road (8.0 ip) and five appearances during the day (5.2 ip)...tossed one or more innings in 15 of his 16 appearances, including a season-high 2.0 innings April 23 against New Orleans and July 28 against Colorado Springs...did not allow a run 12 times.

- Oakland allowed three more runs to Houston on Friday night, making it 12 on the season in 11.2 innings of work...Oakland's bullpen has a 9.26 ERA in three games vs Houston, and a 3.48 ERA against the rest of their opponents.
- On Thursday night, the bullpen threw a season-low 22 pitches...it was just the second time this season that A's relievers have combined to throw under 30 pitches.
- The bullpen recorded a season-high seven strikeouts on Wednesday in 6.0 innings of work.
- On Tuesday, the A's bullpen suffered its fourth loss of the season and its first loss since April 15 against Houston.
- April 20's win was the first of the year for an A's reliever...were the last Major League team to record a win by a reliever...are one of two AL teams with only one bullpen win (Minnesota).
- A's relievers tied a season-high with six innings pitched on Wednesday (other: April 7 at Texas)...they have pitched three or more innings in 16-of-22 games this season.
- Are 5-for-8 in save chances...were 3-of-3 in their last six contests before blowing a save on Tuesday...three different relievers have recorded at least one save (Casilla, 3; Doolittle, 1; Madson, 1).
- Have 16 holds, which are tied for the most in the AL.
- On Tuesday, Santiago Casilla allowed the team's first first batter home run of the season (to Mike Trout in the 10th inning)...last year, surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)
