OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-13) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (15-9)

SUNDAY, APRIL 30, 2017 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 1:10 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's won last night to snap a five-game losing streak overall and a 10-game losing streak against the Astros...won five in a row from April 18-22 before the recent losing streak...are 11-13 (.458) for the season, which is tied for the fourth worst record in the American League... have finished with a losing record in April just once over the previous four years (9-14 in 2015)...are in a tie for third place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by four games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, five days tied for second, 10 days in third, two days tied for third and two days tied for fourth.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed just 18 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors (.353) and the fourth lowest batting average (.233)...have the second most hit batters (14).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer 11 times over the last 17 games and are 7-6 with a 2.96 ERA (31 er in 94.1 ip) and .214 (74-for-345) opponents batting average over that stretch...went 3-3 with a 6.19 ERA and .230 opponents average over the first seven contests...are 10-9 with a 3.86 ERA (56 er in 130.2 ip) for the season...have the lowest opponents batting average (.219) and slugging percentage (.327) in the majors and the fewest home runs (9)...have the second lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.301) and are tied for second in wins...however, have the most hit batters in the majors (10).

OFFENSE: The A's have been held to two runs or fewer in four of their last six games (1-5)...have scored 14 runs total over that span and are batting .192 (39-for-203) with 67 strikeouts...now have a .231 batting average for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...have the third most strikeouts (211)...are tied for second in doubles (40), tied for third in home runs (31) and rank third in extra base hits (73)...the 31 home runs are four more than Oakland's April home run total from a year ago...this marks the first time the A's have hit more than 28 home runs in April since 2006 when they had 34...are tied for the AL lead in sacrifice flies (9) and are tied for third in sacrifice hits (4)...have started five different batters in the leadoff spot and they are batting a combined .149 (14-for-94) with 11 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .243 on-base percentage)...the batting average is last in the AL and the on-base percentage is second lowest (Kansas City, .224)...have a .213 (33-for-155) average with runners in scoring position, which is fifth lowest in the AL.

HOMERS VS. HOUSTON: The A's have hit eight home runs in just four games against the Astros this season...seven of the eight have been solo homers, and one was a three-run shot...Chris Davis has five of the eight homers...Trevor Plouffe has two and Jed Lowrie has one...10 of the A's 14 runs against Houston have come via the long ball, including all six runs during the current series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed three errors Friday but have gone errorless in eight of their last nine games overall...however, their 21 errors are tied for second most in the majors (Milwaukee, 23)...the errors have led to 15 unearned runs, which is also tied for most in the majors (Pittsburgh, Tampa Bay)...five of the A's 21 errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors, and five have been made by outfielders, which is the most in the AL.

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been successful in 20-of-25 (80.0%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are the most allowed in the American League and fourth most in the majors...the stolen base percentage is tied for third highest in the AL...had their second catcher caught stealing of the season Friday, which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's have played four one-run games over their last seven contests (2-2)...had just one one-run game over the first 17 contests...are now 2-3 in one-run games and the five games are third fewest in the American League...the two wins are tied for third fewest in the majors...10 of the A's 24 games have been decided by five runs or more, which is tied for the most in the majors (Texas)...are 3-7 in those 10 games and the seven losses by five or more are the most in the majors...have a season run differential of -21, which is third lowest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on their second road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3), Houston (1-1) and Minnesota

(three games)...it is one of two nine-game road trips this year (Sept. 12-20)...went 3-3 on their first road trip to Texas (1-2) and Kansas City (2-1) and are 4-7 (.364) on the road...went 5-4 on the last homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (3-1) and are 7-6 (.538) at home... have hit 19 home runs in 13 games at home compared to 12 in 11 games on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's played their first extra inning game of the season Tuesday night and lost 2-1 in 11 innings...fell to 0-2 in games decided in the last at bat with the loss and are one of three teams without a last at bat win (CIN, MIN)...are 10-8 in games in which they homer, 1-5 when they don't...are averaging 3 hours and 2 minutes per game, which is tied for fastest in the AL (Kansas City).

AGAINST THE WEST: The A's are in a stretch of 15 consecutive games against American League West competition that began April 14 and concludes with this three-game series against Houston...in fact, 22 of Oakland's first 25 games of the season (the month of April) are against divisional foes...the A's have hosted all four AL West teams this month and will travel to each city except Seattle...are 9-12 (.429) against the West this year...last year, the A's went 29-47 (.382) against AL West competition, which was the third worst mark against divisional foes in Oakland history and the worst since 1997 (11-25, .306).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's currently have eight players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, R.Davis, Gray, Manaea, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski) and have used the DL 10 times this year...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's were swept by Houston in a rain-shortened two-game series in Oakland earlier this month to open the season series (the rainout will be made up as part of a single-admission doubleheader on Sept. 9)...Oakland had lost 10 in a row against Houston before last night's win, which was its longest ever against the Astros...have not lost more than 10 consecutive games to any team since dropping 11 straight to the Yankees, July 5, 2010-July 22, 2011...lost the season series for the second consecutive season last year as they went 6-13...were 6-6 over the first 12 games, but lost each of the final seven...eight of the 19 games were decided in the last at bat and the A's were 2-6 in those games...had a 4-5 record in Oakland and posted a 2-8 mark in Houston...are 16-26 against Houston over the last three years...have lost 11 of the last 14 at Minute Maid Park...lead the all-time series 47-39...19 of the 39 losses have been by one run...are 25-18 in Oakland and 22-21 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Chris Davis has homered at least once in each of his four games against the Astros this season (five total)...hit just one home run in 17 games against the Astros last season...this season, is slugging 1.294 against the Astros...**Jed Lowrie** is 14-for-36 (.389) with five multi-hit games over his last nine contests...has raised his batting average from .245 to .306 over that stretch...**Yonder Alonso** leads American League first baseman in RBI (14) and is tied for second in home runs (4)...his four home runs match his most ever in a month (May, 2014)...left-handed hitters are 0-for-12 with eight strikeouts against **Sean Doolittle**.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1937** Duke All-American football star **Ace Parker** hits a pinch hit home run in his first major league at bat...he would later be elected to the Football Hall of Fame...in **1969** Rick Monday's third inning grand slam at California gives him at least one RBI in a club record 10 consecutive games...he finishes with five RBI on the day and drives in 18 runs during the streak...in **2000** Adam Piatt ties an Oakland record with two triples in the A's 8-2 win at Minnesota...he also connects for his first major league home run...in **2005** Mark Kotsay ties an Oakland record with five hits, including the game winning RBI single in the bottom of the 10th inning of the A's 6-5 win over Seattle.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-1, 2.08 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...is scheduled to make his fourth start and fifth appearance of the season.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.239), ranks fourth in batting average (.174), eighth in on-base percentage (.245) and tied for 10th in ERA (2.08)...has allowed just one home run in 26.0 innings and his average of 0.35 home runs per nine innings is fifth lowest.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents are 3-for-41 (.073) with two strikes and 3-for-29 (.103) with two outs...the clean-up hitter is 1-for-11 (.091) and the number nine hitter is 0-for-9...has received no run support in two of his three starts and is 0-1 with a 1.93 ERA (3 er in 14.0 ip) in those games...had eight runs of support in his other start.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (1 er in 6.0 ip) in one start during the day, 0-1 with a 2.25 ERA (5 er in 20.0 ip) in three games at night...last year, he went 2-1 with a 3.90 ERA and .234 opponents average in five starts during the day, 0-3 with a 9.92 ERA and .427 opponents average in four starts at night...his career splits are 9-3 with a 2.27 ERA (25 er in 99.1 ip) in 16 day games, 7-12 with a 4.59 ERA (73 er in 143.0 ip) in 27 night games.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (1 er in 6.0 ip) and .100 (2-for-20) opponents batting average in one start in Oakland, 0-1 with a 2.25 ERA (5 er in 20.0 ip) and .194 (14-for-52) opponents average in three games on the road...last year, he went 2-1 with a 3.03 ERA and .237 opponents batting average in five starts at home, 0-3 with a 13.17 ERA and .453 opponents average in four starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 6-4 with a 2.97 ERA (33 er in 100.0 ip) in 16 starts in Oakland, 3-7 with a 5.22 ERA (40 er in 69.0 ip) in 13 games on the road.

FIRST APPEARANCE: He relieved A's starting pitcher Raul Alcantara to start the third inning of the A's 10-5 loss at Texas April 7...entered the game trailing 8-3 and tossed 6.0 innings in his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...blanked the Rangers on two hits over his first three innings before allowing two runs in the sixth on a Gomez RBI double and a Mazara RBI single...those were the only runs he would allow.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Kansas City April 13...allowed two runs in the first inning on RBI singles by Cain and Perez, and another in the third on a Moss sacrifice fly...did not allow a run over his final three innings...Vargas (7.2 ip) and Soria (0.1 ip) shutout the A's on four hits and a walk over the first eight innings before Oakland scored its only run in the ninth.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 win over Texas on April 19 in Oakland, snapping a career-high tying three game losing streak dating back to last year...it was his first win since May 28, 2016...matched his career high by walking four batters...did not allow a hit until Napoli singled with one out in the fourth inning and surrendered his only run on a leadoff home run by Gallo in the fifth...left after six innings with the A's leading 8-1.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) on Tuesday...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit...became the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 and just the 36th Major Leaguer over that stretch to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings, allow one hit or fewer and not earn a win...walked Trout in the first, allowed a one-out single to Simmons in the fifth and walked Maybin in the eighth...none of the base runners advanced past first base...Ramirez (7.0 ip), Parker (1.0 ip) and Hernandez (1.0 ip) shutout the A's on two hits over the first nine innings.

HAHN vs. HOUSTON: Is 1-2 with a 6.75 ERA (13.1 ip, 14 h, 10 r, 10 er, 6 bb, 11 so, 1 hr) in three career starts...went 1-1 with a 8.59 ERA (7.1 ip, 9 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 1 so) in two starts last year...the win came on April 30 when he combined with Axford and Madson on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 victory in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed three of the hits...faced the minimum over the first five innings

as the only two base runners were erased on double plays...allowed only one base runner past first base when Correa doubled and went to third on a ground out in the seventh...then took the loss in a 12-2 decision at Houston June 3...allowed seven runs in just two-thirds of an inning...the runs were a career high and the innings pitched were a career low...became the eighth starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow seven or more runs in less than an inning, the first since Joe Blanton allowed eight runs in 0.1 innings against Tampa Bay on May 25, 2005...yielded a RBI single to Rasmus, a RBI ground out to Gattis, a RBI single to White, a two-run triple to Kemp and RBI singles to Marisnick and Springer...lost his only other start on May 20, 2015 at Houston, a 6-1 A's loss...allowed a RBI single to Marisnick in the third inning and the A's tied the game with a run in the sixth...retired the first two batters in the bottom of the sixth but Springer singled and Carter hit a two-run home run.

2016 RECAP: Had four separate stints with the A's and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percentage (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...struck out just 23 batters (4.47 per nine innings) and walked 19 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.21, which was the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .273 (27-for-99) against right-handed hitters compared to .361 (30-for-83) against left-handers...surrendered seven of his eight home runs to lefties and had a .663 slugging percentage against lefties, .333 against righties...his career splits are .207 (94-for-454) against righties, .272 (124-for-456) with 15 of his 18 home runs against lefties...has a .423 career slugging percentage against lefties, .267 against righties...had a .226 opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .358 after that...opponents hit .426 with a .449 on-base percentage and .681 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...in 2015, his marks were .215, .277 and .290 respectively...allowed a .324 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .500 with RISP and two outs...five of the eight home runs he surrendered were solo shots...yielded a .300 average with two strikes and a .440 average to the first hitter in the batting order.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents were successful in each of their seven stolen base attempts off him after going 5-for-9 (55.6%) over his first two seasons...the A's were 5-4 (.556) in his starting assignments...tossed more than six innings in just three of his nine starts...has done that in just 12 of 40 starts in his career...the bullpen blew a save in three of his nine starts.

NASHVILLE: Went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA in 15 starts with Nashville...the starts were the first of his career at the Triple-A level...had just four career losses as a minor leaguer entering the season...surrendered just four home runs in 68.2 innings, an average of 0.54 per nine innings...however, issued 34 walks (4.59 per nine innings) and struck out just 46 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.35...allowed a .276 opponents batting average, including .255 (38-for-149) against right-handed hitters compared to .304 (34-for-112) against left-handers...surrendered three of his four home runs to righties...went 0-7 with a 4.71 ERA in 10 starts at home compared to 1-0 with a 3.18 ERA in five starts on the road...allowed all four of his home runs at home...yielded a .175 batting average and .246 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents batted .222 with runners in scoring position, including .188 with RISP and two outs...they were 1-for-9 (.111) with the bases loaded...the Sounds were 6-9 (.400) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than five innings in eight of his 15 starts and more than six innings just once...had three starts without a run and four more with just one...walked three batters or more seven times...made one postseason start and had a no decision in the Sounds 10-7 win in Game 1 of the Pacific Coast League Semifinals Sept. 7 at Oklahoma City (4.1 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 7 so).

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Sonny Gray (season debut): Has yet to appear in a game this season after being placed on the 10-day disabled list March 30 with a right lat strain...spent two stints on the DL last season (strained right trapezius and strained right forearm), missing a total of 60 games...went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts...his ERA was more than 2 1/2 runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...also had career highs in losses, home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475)...still holds a career ERA of 3.42, which ranks ninth in Oakland history...was named to the American League All-Star team in 2015 and finished third in AL Cy Young Award voting that season...made two starts this spring training, tossing four innings and allowing seven earned runs on six hits...struck out seven and walked four.

- Oakland has allowed at least one run in all four games against Houston this season, making it 13 on the season in 13.2 innings of work...Oakland's bullpen has a 8.56 ERA in four games vs Houston, and a 3.48 ERA against the rest of their opponents.
- On Thursday night, the bullpen threw a season-low 22 pitches...it was just the second time this season that A's relievers have combined to throw under 30 pitches.
- The bullpen recorded a season-high seven strikeouts on Wednesday in 6.0 innings of work.
- On Tuesday, the A's bullpen suffered its fourth loss of the season and its first loss since April 15 against Houston.
- April 20's win was the first of the year for an A's reliever...were the last Major League team to record a win by a reliever...are one of two AL teams with only one bullpen win (Minnesota).
- A's relievers tied a season-high with six innings pitched on Wednesday (other: April 7 at Texas)...they have pitched three or more innings in 16-of-22 games this season.
- Are 6-for-9 in save chances...were 3-of-3 in their last six contests before blowing a save on Tuesday...three different relievers have recorded at least one save (Casilla, 4; Doolittle, 1; Madson, 1).
- Have 18 holds, which is the most in the AL.
- On Tuesday, Santiago Casilla allowed the team's first first batter home run of the season (to Mike Trout in the 10th inning)...last year, surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)
