2016 SUMMARY

- Made Kansas City's Opening Day roster for second-straight season and appeared in 54 games, including starts at second base (29) and third base (10).
- Had three stints with Royals: Opening Day-May 18, June 8-August 31, and September 6-end of season.
- Hit first career home run in 293rd career at-bat on Sept. 15 off Dillon Overton, a three-run shot; the three RBI set a career high.
- Hit .294 (20x68) through June 29, but just .177 (14x79) after
- Had a .379 on-base percentage when leading off an inning; from 2014 through 2016, his career .412 OBP when leading off an inning ranked second among American League players (min. 60 plate appearances).
- Hit .290 (18x62) with nine of his 13 RBI in seventh inning or later.

MAJOR LEAGUE CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Made his first Opening Day roster with Kansas City in 2015; optioned to Omaha on July 3 and didn't return to Majors until Sept. 1.
- Batted .290 with five doubles and eight runs scored in 43 games with the Royals; made starts at shortstop (14), second base (eight), and third base (six).
- Hit .333 (12x36) against left-handed pitching, and hit .318 (7x22) with a .444 OBP when leading off an inning.
- Went 11x24 (.458) during September; that included first fourhit game on Sept. 20 at Comerica Park.
- Made one appearance in the postseason, as a pinch-hitter in 12th inning of decisive Game 5 at Citi Field; drove in Jarrod Dyson with a single to break a 2-2 tie and spark a five-run rally
- Made his Major League debut on July 2, 2014 and had three separate stints with Royals; also played in 86 games at Omaha.
- Collected three hits twice, including on July 4 at Cleveland; with two doubles and a triple in that game, became second Royal to record three extra-base hits in first Major League start, joining Mark Quinn, who hit two homers and doubled vs. the Angels on Sept. 14, 1999.
- Fractured the distal tip of the middle finger on right hand on Sept. 2 vs. Texas and was placed on disabled list Sept. 17 (retroactive to Sept. 7).
- Activated from the 15-day DL on Sept. 28 and made return on Sept. 30 in American League Wild Card game vs. Oakland.
- In that game, he drove in Eric Hosmer with tying run in 12th inning with an infield single; then, after stealing second base, scored walk-off run on single by Salvador Perez.
- · Made one more appearance that postseason, as a defensive

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Finished 2014 with Kansas City, had a hit in 26 of final 28 games with Triple-A Omaha, from June 10-July 27, a span interrupted from July 1-10 by first big league call-up.
- During his final 28 games with Storm Chasers, batting .388 (44x115) with eight doubles, five home runs, and 22 RBI.
- That span included a 14-game hitting streak from June 10-26 that tied his Minor League career-long streak (also 2013); batted .404 (23x57) with four doubles, a home run, and 11 RBI during streak.
- Named Omaha Player of the Year in 2013 after ranking eighth in Pacific Coast League with a career-high 140 hits.
- Also set career highs in games (131), at-bats (512), runs scored (72), homers (12), and total bases (194).
- From July 23 until end of season, had a hit in 36 of 39 games, batting .344 (52x151) with 25 runs scored, four doubles, five



- home runs, and 18 RBI.
- During that stretch, from August 10-25, set his Minor-League career high with a 14-game hitting streak; batted .276 (16x58) with a double, two home runs, and six RBI during the streak.
- Helped Omaha win Pacific Coast League and Triple-A Championships, going 6x27 (.222) with two doubles, a homer, and four runs scored during postseason.
- In 2012, named a Texas League All-Star and Northwest Arkansas Player of the Year in just second full season of professional baseball.
- His season ended prematurely after taking a foul tip to his right eye Aug. 15 with Omaha.
- Named Puerto Rican Winter League Rookie of the Year, hitting .301 with 26 runs scored and 13 steals.
- Led Texas League with 21 sacrifices in 2011, his first full season in pro baseball; tied then-career best hitting streak with an 11-game run from April 30-May 15, batting .372 (16x43) with six RRI
- Opened professional career with Single-A Wilmington in 2010.

- Had a season-best 11-game hitting streak from Aug. 8-20, batting .370 (17x46) with three doubles and six RBI.
- Closed out season with a hit in 21 of final 25 outings, batting .327 (34x104) with 17 runs scored, five doubles, a triple, a home run, and 12 RBI.

- Appeared in career-high 35 games (four starts) for Baltimore; posted 1-1 record, 4.50 ERA (22.0 ip/11 er) as starter and 1-1 record, 3.20 ERA (64.2/23) as reliever.
- Earned lone win as starter in second start, on April 15 at Texas (6.0 ip, 4 h, 5 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 6 so).
- Shifted to bullpen after two starts and made 15 relief appearances before being placed on the 15-day Disabled List on June 13 with a right groin strain (reinstated on June 30).
- Did not surrender a run over his first 10 relief appearances (16.0 ip) of season (April 22-May 25).
- Tossed a season-high 7.0 innings final start on July 24 vs. Cleveland (ND, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 3 so).
- · Finished season in bullpen, making 13 relief appearances.
- Earned first career MLB save on Aug. 23 vs. Washington.
- Registered 1.47 ERA (30.2/5) with 18 strikeouts in seventh inning or later.
- Of his 31 relief appearances, 21 were longer than 1.0 inning.

- Made only career Opening Day start in **2013** with Minnesota, on April 1 vs. Detroit.
- Made just 10 starts for Twins, going 1-5, 7.21 (48.2/39) with just 25 strikeouts before being optioned to Triple-A Rochester for remainder of season on May 23.
- Spent entire 2012 season with Philadelphia.
- Tossed 13.0 consecutive scoreless innings from April 14-24; during that span, struck out a career-high 11 batters on April 19 at San Diego.
- Went 2-1, 1.97 (32.0/7) in five April starts.
- Was on the 15-day disabled list from May 26-June 3 with right elbow inflammation.
- Did not record a strikeout in start on Aug. 1 at Washington (7.0 ip), ending streak of 48 straight appearances (41 starts) with at least one strikeout.

- Recorded first Major League hit on April 29 vs. the Mets, a single off of Mike Pelfrey.
- Tossed first Major League complete game on July 26 vs. San Francisco.
- Won five-straight starts from June 29-July 26, becoming first Philadelphia rookie to do so since Charles Hudson in 1983.
- Won a National League-best nine straight decisions from June 29-Sept. 6, going 9-0 with a 2.87 ERA in 12 starts during that stratch
- Finished third in National League Rookie of the Year balloting with 40 points, trailing Atlanta's Craig Kimbrel and Freddie Freeman.
- Led NL rookie pitchers in ERA, ranked second in wins, third in batting average against (.237), and fourth in strikeouts.
- The Phillies went 16-5 in his 21 starts.
- Made two relief appearances against St. Louis in the NLDS (1.1 in).
- Began 2010 at Double-A and had contract selected by Phillies on July 21.
- Made Major League debut in relief on July 24 vs. Colorado (1.0 ip, 2 so), but was optioned to Triple-A Lehigh Valley following the game.
- Recalled on Sept. 6 and made first MLB start that day vs. Florida in Game 1 of a doubleheader (L, 5.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, bb, 5 so, hr).
