OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-15) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (13-11)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 3, 2017 — TARGET FIELD — 7:10 P.M. CDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (2-1, 2.25) VS. LHP HECTOR SANTIAGO (2-1, 2.43) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight and seven of the last eight games after winning a season-high five straight...are a season-high four games under .500 at 11-15 (.423)...that matches the A's worst record after 26 games over the last eight years...were also 11-15 in 2015 (lost game 27)... are in third place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 6½ games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, five days tied for second, 12 days in third, three days tied for third and two days tied for fourth.

THE LAST EIGHT GAMES: The A's are 1-7 over the last eight games dating back to the final game of the last homestand (April 23)...were held to one run for the fourth time over that stretch last night and have scored two runs or fewer six times over that span...are batting .190 (51-for-269) with 17 runs (2.13 runs per game)...have struck out 10 or more times in seven of the eight games (88 strikeouts total)...the pitching staff has allowed 12 home runs after yielding 13 over the first 18 games...have been outscored 49-17

PITCHING: The A's allowed six home runs last night, which marks the eighth time in Oakland history the A's yielded six or more home runs in game (last: May 8, 2016 at Baltimore)...the home runs fell one short of the Oakland record of seven set on April 11, 1985 at Seattle...had allowed just three home runs over the previous five games and have surrendered 25 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the American League...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.378)... over the last 10 games, the A's have either allowed seven runs or more (five times) or three runs or fewer (five times)...have a 4.88 ERA (47 er in 86.2 ip) over that stretch and a 4.35 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the AL...have hit 15 batters, which is tied with Minnesota for the most in the majors...are tied for second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (184).

STARTING PITCHING: Sonny Gray allowed three home runs last night to snap a six-game, 37.0-inning homerless streak by A's starting pitchers... starters have now allowed 12 home runs for the season, which is still the fewest in the majors (13, KC and PIT)...also have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors (.343)...starters have not walked a batter in four of the last six games and have issued just three free passes in 31.1 innings over that stretch (0.86 walks per nine innings)...have also hit three batters over that span and have a Major League leading 11 for the season...have the second lowest opponents on-base percentage (.302) and batting average (.224) in the AL...have compiled a 3.22 ERA (38 er in 106.1 ip) over the last 19 games but they are just 7-8 over that stretch... have the second most decisions in the AL (21) and the third fewest innings pitched (142.2)...last night, Gray became the A's eighth different starting pitcher this year, which ties Los Angeles (AL) and Cincinnati for the most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have the second fewest runs scored in the American League (92), the second lowest on-base percentage (.295), third lowest batting average (.227) and fourth most strikeouts (232)...however, are tied for fourth in most home runs (32)...are tied for the lead in sacrifice flies (9) and tied for fourth in sacrifice hits (4)...have a .213 (35-for-164) average with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters rank last in the American League in RBI (3) and are tied with Detroit for the fewest home runs (1)... the only home run by an A's DH was by Ryon Healy in the second game of the season (April 4 vs. Los Angeles), giving A's designated hitters a 24-game homerless streak...the last RBI by an A's DH was on April 19 by Trevor Plouffe for an 11-game streak without an RBI...have a .170 (17-for-100) batting average, which is third lowest in the AL.

LEADOFF HITTERS: The A's have started five different batters in the leadoff spot and they are batting a combined .157 (16-for-102) with 12 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .250 on-base percentage)...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the on-base percentage is third lowest... leadoff hitters are 3-for-23 (.130) with three walks, a double and home run to start the game.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last six games after a six-game errorless streak...have made 22 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League (Boston, 23)...the errors have led to 16 unearned runs, which is tied with Tampa Bay for second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 18)...five of the A's errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...five have been made by outfielders and four by catchers, both of which are the most in the AL.

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been successful in 21-of-27 (77.8%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are the most allowed in the American League and fourth most in the majors...the A's offense has stolen just nine bases, which is fourth fewest in the AL.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's lost 9-1 last night and 12 of their 26 games (46.2%) have been decided by five runs or more...the 12 games decided by five runs or more are the most in the majors...are 3-9 in those games and the nine losses are also the most in the majors...have played just five one-run games, which is second fewest in the American League to Minnesota (4)...are 2-3 in one-run games and the two wins are tied for second fewest in the majors to the Twins (1)...have a season run differential of -34, which is second lowest in the AL (Kansas City, -38).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-6 on their second road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3), Houston (1-2) and Minnesota (0-1)...it is one of two nine-game road trips this year (Sept. 12-20)... went 3-3 on their first road trip and are 4-9 (.308) on the road, which is the fourth worst road record in the American League...return home following the game tomorrow for a six-game homestand against Detroit (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 5-4 on the last homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (3-1) and are 7-6 (.538) at home.

IN APRIL: The A's went 11-14 (.440) in the month of April, which tied for the fourth worst record in the American League...it marked the second time in the last five years they finished with a losing record in the first month (9-14 in 2015)...led the majors in fewest home runs allowed (19) and tied for third in the AL in most home runs hit (31)...the 31 home runs by the offense were the A's most in April since 2006 (34)...the offense struck out 221 times, which was third most in the AL and set an Oakland record for the month of April (previous: 211 in 2010)...had a .297 on-base percentage, which was third lowest in the AL and sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...batted .229, which was fourth lowest in the AL and Oakland's second lowest April batting average over the last 22 years (.211 in 2012).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's currently have seven players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Manaea, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski) and have used the DL 11 times this year...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2017 last night after winning the season series last year, 4-2...lost two of three at Minnesota in 2016 but swept a three-game series in Oakland...it was the A's fourth season series win over the Twins in the previous five years and Oakland is 24-13 (.649) against Minnesota dating back to the start of the 2012 season...have lost five of the last six games at Target Field but have won 16 of the last 19 contests in the Coliseum...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 297-298 against Minnesota...that includes 166-128 in Oakland and 131-170 in Minnesota...are 14-15 at Target Field...are 354-367 all-time against the Twins and have a 1001-1003 record against the Twins/Senators...the Twins/Senators are the only team the A's have defeated 1,000 times.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso hit his fifth home run of the season last night, which is two short of his season total from last year...is batting .333 (12-for-36) with four home runs and eight RBI over his last 12 games...leads American League first baseman in RBI (15) and ranks second in home runs (4)...Khris Davis hit 10 home runs in the month of April to become the sixth player in Oakland history to hit 10 or more home runs in April...is the first since Nick Swisher in 2006...only Mark McGwire, with 11 in 1997, had more...Jed Lowrie is 15-for-44 (.341) over his last 11 games after going 7-for-41 (.171) over his previous 12 contests...Trevor Plouffe was Minnesota's first round draft pick in 2004 and spent his entire career in the Twins organization before signing with Oakland as a free agent prior to the 2017 season...has 55 career home runs at Target Field, which are second only to Brian Dozier (60).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1980 Wayne Gross and Dwayne Murphy both steal home in the A's 5-3 win against Detroit...Murphy's comes as part of a triple steal with Gross and Mitchell Page...in 2000 the A's set an Oakland record with 10 hits and 21 total bases in the seventh inning in a 14-5 win at Kansas City.

ΓODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (2-1, 2.25 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his second start since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list last Thursday...was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA in three starts when he was placed on the DL list April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder.

UNASSISTED: Turned the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history in his last start last Thursday at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was by Blue Moon Odom, also against the Angels, in the second game of a July 11, 1971 doubleheader...is tied for the lead among American League pitchers in double plays (2) and ranks seventh in total chances (8)...last year, he tied for third among AL pitchers in total chances (42), tied for seventh in assists (27) and ranked eighth in putouts (15)...did not commit an error and his 42 total chances were the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors among pitchers with no errors.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents are 5-for-27 (.185) with runners on base, including 1-for-11 (.091) with runners in scoring position...has allowed two runs or fewer and six hits or fewer in each of his first four starts...has received just one run of support in each of his last two starts

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day April 8 in Oakland...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)... is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Trout in the third inning... those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas April 8...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings, allowing just two base runners on an Odor walk and Lucroy reach on error in the second...then retired 15 straight before Napoli homered with two outs in the bottom of the seventh...that was the only run he allowed in seven in-

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-2 loss to Houston on April 14 in Oakland...did not strike out a batter in 5.0 innings, his first career start without a strikeout...the A's scored once in the second inning and he kept the Astros off the board over the first four innings, despite three hits, two walks and a hit batter...then allowed a leadoff home run to Aoki in the fifth inning and left after five innings and 74 pitches with the scored tied 1-1.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday...allowed a RBI single to Pujols and a RBI double to Cron in the first inning but retired each of the next eight batters...shutout the Angels on three hits over his final five innings...Oakland was held to a run on three hits by Nolasco and four relievers.

run in the first but he allowed a RBI single to Centeno in the second...also allowed a Dozier sacrifice fly in the fifth inning, but the A's tied the game in the bottom of the fifth and took the lead for good in the sixth...then won 3-1 $\,$ at Minnesota on July 4...issued a career high tying four walks but allowed just one run in 6.2 innings of work...that came in the fourth inning when Kepler grounded into a fielders choice with the bases loaded to drive in Mauer...the A's were shutout on one hit and three walks over the first six innings but then scored three times in the seventh for the win.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 2.29 ERA in five starts this spring...held the opposition to a .188 (13-for-69) batting average and walked just three batters in 19.2 innings (1.37 walks per nine innings)... allowed one run or fewer in four of his five starts...also started the exhibition game against Italy's World Baseball Classic team on March 8 and picked up the win (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 3 so)...pitched in a minor league game March 29.

2016 RECAP: Compiled a 10-11 record and a 4.11 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts in his second season with the A's...went 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts, 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA over his next 16 starts from May 30 to Aug. 24, and 0-3 with a 4.71 ERA over his final six starts...in addition to starts, he also led the A's in wins, losses (tied), innings pitched (186.0), hits (196), runs (87), earned runs (85), home runs (22) and walks (47)...all those marks are career highs as are his 108 strikeouts...the 47 walks were the fewest in Athletics history by an A's team-leader, besting the previous low of 59 by Sonny Gray in 2015.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Averaged 5.23 strikeouts per nine innings, which was the third lowest mark in the American League...tied for second in the AL in shutouts (1), tied for fifth in complete games (2), tied for sixth in opponents reaching on an error (8), ranked seventh in fewest pitches per game (91.4) and was ninth in hits (196).

SUPPORT: Averaged 4.16 runs of support per start, which was 10th lowest in the AL...received two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 31 starts and was 0-8 in those games...went 10-3 in 19 starts with support of three or more...is now 1-18 in 27 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 17-3 in 29 starts with three runs of support or more...left with a lead five times in 2016 only to have the bullpen blow the save.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .271 opponents batting average, which broke down to .270 (90-for-333) against right-handed hitters compared to .272 (106-for-390) with 35 of his 47 walks against left-handers...his career splits are .269 (170-for-632) with a .737 OPS against right-handers, .269 (175-for-651) with 62 of his 90 walks and a .731 OPS against left-handers...yielded a .302 average with runners on base but 14 of the 22 home runs he allowed were solo shots...26 of his 40 career home runs have come with the bases empty.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 5-6 with a 3.39 ERA in 14 starts at home compared to 5-5 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts on the road...had the ninth lowest home ERA in the AL...surrendered seven home runs in 90.1 innings at home, 15 in 95.2 innings on the road.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Was 3-5 with a 4.82 ERA in 15 starts against AL West competition compared to 7-6 with a 3.46 ERA in 16 starts against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 1.74 ERA in the first inning, which tied Arrieta (CHC) for second lowest in the majors (Tanaka, NYY 1.16) among pitchers with 30 or more innings...using the same minimum, it was 10th $\,$ lowest in Oakland history...logged a 4.59 ERA from the second inning on...his ground ball to fly ball ratio of 2.40 was fourth highest in the AL. the A's were 14-17 (.452) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in 18 of his 31 starts.

in games started (5) and innings pitched (27.0)...is 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA and .182 opponents batting average in two starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.36 ERA and .371 opponents average in three starts at night...is now 4-0 with a 1.37 ERA in four career starts during the day compared to 0-3 with a 5.40 ERA in six starts at night...is 1-1 with a 2.38 ERA in two starts on the road compared to 1-2 with a 6.89 ERA in three starts in Oakland... was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-4 A's loss at Houston last Friday (4.1 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Twins in his career...went 3-0 with a 4.35 ERA and .208 opponents batting average in six starts this spring...held opponents to a .208 batting average, but issued a team-leading 11 walks in 20.2 innings.

- In the past two seasons, the bullpen has had a combined 10.07 ERA (22er, 19.2ip) at Target Field.
- On Saturday night, the bullpen threw a season-low 19 pitches...it was just the third time this season that A's relievers have combined to throw under 30 pitches.
- The bullpen recorded a season-high seven strikeouts on April 26 in 6.0 innings of work.
- On April 25, the A's bullpen suffered its fourth loss of the season and its first loss since April 15 against Houston.
- April 20's win was the first of the year for an A's reliever...were the last Major League team to record a win by a reliever...are the only AL team with only one bullpen win.
- A's relievers tied a season-high with six innings pitched last Wednesday (other: April 7 at Texas)...they have pitched three or more innings in 17of-26 games this season.
- Are 6-for-9 in save chances...were 3-of-3 in their last six contests before blowing a save on April 25...three different relievers have recorded at least one save (Casilla, 4; Doolittle, 1; Madson, 1).
- Have 18 holds, which is the second-most in the AL
- Last Tuesday, Santiago Casilla allowed the team's first first batter home run of the season (to Mike Trout in the 10th inning)...last year, surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors...had the second lowest first batter slugging percentage in the AL (.329)
