OAKLAND ATHLETICS (11-16) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (14-11)

THURSDAY, MAY 4, 2017 — TARGET FIELD — 12:10 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three straight and eight of the last nine games after winning a season-high five straight...are a season-high five games under .500 at 11-16 (.423)...that matches the A's worst record after 27 games over the last eight years...were also 11-16 in 2015 (won game 28)...are in fourth place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 7½ games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, five days tied for second, 12 days in third, three days tied for third, one day in fourth, and two days tied for fourth.

THE LAST NINE GAMES: The A's are 187 over the last nine games dating back to the final game of the last homestand (April 23)...were held to one run for the fourth time over that stretch on Tuesday night and have scored two runs or fewer six times over that span...are batting .195 (59-for-302) with 21 runs (2.33 runs per game)...have struck out 10 or more times in seven of the nine games (93 strikeouts total)...the pitching staff has allowed 13 home runs after yielding 13 over the first 18 games...have been outscored 56-21.

PITCHING: The A's allowed six home runs Tuesday, which marks the eighth time in Oakland history the A's yielded six or more home runs in game (last: May 8, 2016 at Baltimore)...the home runs fell one short of the Oakland record of seven set on April 11, 1985 at Seattle...had allowed just three home runs over the previous five games and now have surrendered 26 home runs for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.382)...over the last 11 games, the A's have either allowed seven runs or more (six times) or three runs or fewer (five times)...have a 5.13 ERA (54 er in 94.2 ip) over that stretch and a 4.47 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the AL...have hit 16 batters, which is the most in the majors...are third in the AL in fewest strikeouts (192).

STARTING PITCHING: Sonny Gray allowed three home runs Tuesday to snap a six-game, 37.0-inning homerless streak by A's starting pitchers...starters have now allowed 13 home runs for the season, which is tied for the fewest in the majors (KC)...also have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors (.353)...Kendall Graveman walked four batters last night after A's starters had not walked a batter in four of the previous six games (3 bb in 31.1 ip over that stretch)...have a Major League leading 11 hit batters for the season...have the lowest opponents batting average (.227) and fourth lowest opponents on-base percentage (.307 in the AL...have compiled a 3.61 ERA (44 er in 109.2 ip) over the last 20 games but they are just 7-9 over that stretch...have the second most decisions in the AL (22) and the third fewest innings pitched (146.0)...on Tuesday, Gray became the A's eighth different starting pitcher this year, which ties Los Angeles (AL) and Cincinnati for the most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have the second fewest runs scored in the American League (96), third lowest batting average (.228), fourth lowest on-base percentage (.297), and fourth most strikeouts (237)...however, are tied for fourth in most home runs (33)...are tied for the lead in sacrifice flies (9) and tied for fourth in sacrifice hits (4)...have a .215 (37-for-172) average with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters rank last in the American League in RBI (3) and are tied with Detroit for the fewest home runs (1)...the only home run by an A's DH was by Ryon Healy in the second game of the season (April 4 vs. Los Angeles), giving A's designated hitters a 25-game homerless streak...the last RBI by an A's DH was on April 19 by Trevor Plouffe for a 12-game streak without an RBI...have a .165 (17-for-103) batting average, which is second lowest in the AL.

LEADOFF HITTERS: The A's have started five different batters in the lead-off spot and they are batting a combined .159 (17-for-107) with 12 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .248 on-base percentage)...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the on-base percentage is second lowest...leadoff hitters are 3-for-24 (.125) with three walks, a double and home run to start the game.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors in the last seven games after a six-game errorless streak...have made 23 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League (Boston, 25)...the errors have led to 16 unearned runs, which is tied with Tampa Bay for third most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 18)...six of the A's errors have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...five have been made by outfielders and four by catchers, both of which are the most in the AL.

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been successful in 22-of-28 (78.6%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are the most allowed in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...the A's offense has stolen just nine bases, which is tied for third fewest in the AL.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's lost 9-1 Tuesday and 12 of their 27 games (44.4%) have been decided by five runs or more...the 12 games decided by five runs or more are the most in the majors...are 3-9 in those games and the nine losses are also the most in the majors...have played just five one-run games, which is second fewest in the American League to Minnesota (4)...are 2-3 in one-run games and the two wins are tied for second fewest in the majors to the Twins (1)...have a season run differential of -37, which is tied for the lowest in the majors (San Francisco).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-7 on their second road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3), Houston (1-2) and Minnesota (0-2)...it is one of two nine-game road trips this year (Sept. 12-20)...went 3-3 on their first road trip and are 4-10 (.286) on the road, which is the third worst road record in the American League...return home following the game today for a six-game homestand against Detroit (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 5-4 on the last homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (3-1) and are 7-6 (.538) at home.

IN APRIL: The A's went 11-14 (.440) in the month of April, which tied for the fourth worst record in the American League...it marked the second time in the last five years they finished with a losing record in the first month (9-14 in 2015)...led the majors in fewest home runs allowed (19) and tied for third in the AL in most home runs hit (31)...the 31 home runs by the offense were the A's most in April since 2006 (34)...the offense struck out 221 times, which was third most in the AL and set an Oakland record for the month of April (previous: 211 in 2010)...had a .297 on-base percentage, which was third lowest in the AL and sixth lowest in Oakland history in the first month of the season...batted .229, which was fourth lowest in the AL and Oakland's second lowest April batting average over the last 22 years (.211 in 2012).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's currently have eight players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Manaea, Mengden, Phegley, Semien, Smolinski) and have used the DL 12 times this year...Phegley is on the 7-day concussion DL...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's have lost the first two meetings of 2017 after winning the season series last year, 4-2...lost two of three at Minnesota in 2016 but swept a three-game series in Oakland...it was the A's fourth season series win over the Twins in the previous five years and Oakland is 24-14 (.632) against Minnesota dating back to the start of the 2012 season...have lost six of the last seven games at Target Field but have won 16 of the last 19 contests in the Coliseum...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 297-299 against Minnesota...that includes 166-128 in Oakland and 131-171 in Minnesota...are 14-16 at Target Field...are 354-368 all-time against the Twins and have a 1001-1004 record against the Twins/Senators...the Twins/Senators are the only team the A's have defeated 1,000 times.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso hit his sixth home run of the season last night, which is one short of his season total from last year...his career high is nine, in 2012 with San Diego...leads American League first baseman in RBI (17) and is tied for first in home runs (6)...**Jed Lowrie** is 15-for-44 (.341) over his last 12 games after going 7-for-41 (.171) over his previous 12 contests...**Trevor Plouffe** grounded into two double plays last night...ranks second in the AL with seven GIDP this season...**Matt Joyce** has two multi-hit games in his last six games after recording just one in his first 17 contests.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1935** Jimmie Foxx scores five runs in the A's 12-1 victory over Cleveland...in **1969** John "Blue Moon" Odom is 3 for 3 with a homer and six RBI in the second game of a doubleheader vs. Seattle and picks up the win in the A's 11-7 victory.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (2-3, 5.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season and the 11th of his career...leads American League rookies in games started (5) and innings pitched (27.0) and ranks second in wins (2) and strikeouts (19).

FIVE THIS YEAR, FIVE LAST YEAR: Has made five starts this year, which matches his total from his debut season last year...is 2-3 with a 5.00 ERA and .292 opponents batting average this year after going 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents average last year...has walked 12 batters this year after issuing just four free passes last year...however, has surrendered just one home run after yielding four last year.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (2 er in 13.0 ip) and .182 (8-for-44) opponents batting average in two starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.36 ERA (13 er in 14.0 ip) and .371 (23-for-62) opponents average in three starts at night...is now 4-0 with a 1.37 ERA (4 er in 26.1 ip) in four career starts during the day compared to 0-3 with a 5.40 ERA (18 er in 30.0 ip) in six starts at night.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 2.38 ERA (3 er in 11.1 ip) in two starts on the road compared to 1-2 with a 6.89 ERA (12 er in 15.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland...last year, he had no decisions and a 3.60 ERA in two starts on the road compared to 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA in three starts at home.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents are batting .246 (14-for-57) with the bases empty, .347 (17-for-49) with runners on...has three wild pitches, which is tied for third most in the American League...has received no run support in two of his five starts.

FIRST START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 5-0 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5 in Oakland...yielded five runs on eight hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...retired the first four batters before allowing three runs in the second inning on a RBI double by Simmons and a two-run single by Espinosa...also allowed RBI singles to Trout and Pujols in the fifth.

SECOND START: He combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...walked three...allowed just three baserunners to advance into scoring position.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-0 loss to Texas on April 17 in Oakland...allowed five runs in 5.1 innings and issued a career-high four walks...allowed a RBI double to Mazara in the first inning and then retired each of the next 12 batters before walking the first two batters in the fifth inning...allowed two-run doubles to Gomez and Napoli in the fifth and left after 5.1 innings trailing 5-0.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 victory over Seattle April 22 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Cano in the first inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first...yielded a sacrifice fly to Cruz in the third but the A's got that run back in the bottom of the third...was relieved by Montas to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 4-2.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Houston last Friday...allowed a career-high six runs on a career-high 10 hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...Oakland scored three times in the first but he allowed three unearned runs in the bottom of the first on RBI singles by Beltran and Gurriel and a RBI double by Gattis...the A's scored once in the third to take a 4-3 lead but he allowed a Springer RBI single in the fourth and two more runs in the fifth, including a Gattis RBI single.

2016 RECAP: Was one of three players acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick at the trading deadline and made his Major League debut with Oakland in September...went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's...walked just four batters in 29.1 innings, an average of 1.23 per nine innings, and had a .214 opponents on-base percentage...struck out 23 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.75...yielded a .324 slugging percentage.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .146 (7-for-48) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .217 (13-for-60) against right-handers...issued all four of his walks to lefties...surrendered three of his four home runs to righties for a .400 slugging percentage (lefties slugged .229)...three of the four home runs were solo shots...three came after his 60th pitch in a game...yielded a .167 average with runners in scoring position and .132 with two strikes...opponents hit .163 the first two times through the lineup, .273 after that.

THIS AND THAT: Did not allow a run in the first inning (5.0 ip) and yielded just one hit (.063 batting average)...had a 0.90 ERA over innings one through four, a 4.82 ERA from the fifth inning on...the A's were 4-1 (.800) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in four of his five starts (walked two in the other), allowed one earned run or fewer four times and three hits or fewer three times...was rated as the A's No. 4 prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2016 season.

MORE 2016: Was recalled from Nashville Sept. 7 and made his ML debut that day against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland...allowed a run on two hits in 6.1 innings and picked up his first big league win in a 4-1 decision...became the 16th pitcher in Oakland history to win his debut...is the first Athletics pitcher with more than six innings and two hits or fewer in his debut since Porter Vaughan on June 16, 1940 (7.0 ip, 2 h)...retired the side in order in each of the first three innings to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to retire at least each of the first nine batters he faced in his career (12, Jay Marshall in 2007; 9, Billy Taylor in 1994; 9, Dave Beard in 1980)...struck out Kaleb Cowart to end the second inning for his first strikeout...also allowed one earned run in each of his next three starts...since the earned run became an official stat in 1913, he is the first Athletic to start his career with four consecutive games of five innings or more and one earned run or fewer...was one of two Major Leaguers to do it in 2016 (Maeda, LAD)...left with a 2-1 lead in his third start Sept. 19 against Houston but the bullpen allowed a run in the eighth for the blown save in a game the A's would lose 4-2...yielded one run in a career-high 7.0 innings in a 7-1 win on Sept. 25 against Texas to improve to 2-0.

MINORS: Began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and went 8-5 with a 4.90 ERA in 22 games, including 16 starts...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following the trade and went 3-1 with a 2.82 ERA in six starts with the Sounds...combined with both clubs for an 11-6 record and a 4.31 ERA in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts...also led the PCL in opponents batting average (.214), tied for the league lead in shutouts (2), tied for second in complete games (2) and tied for 10th in wins (11)...surrendered 20 home runs, which tied for fourth most...had career highs in wins, games, starts, complete games, shutouts, strikeouts, inning pitched (135.2), runs (71), earned runs (65), home runs (20) and walks (39).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .214 opponents batting average, including .192 (38-for-198) against left-handed hitters compared to .229 (70-for-306) against right-handers...surrendered 16 of his 20 home runs to righties for a .444 slugging percentage (lefties slugged .313)...13 of his home runs were solo shots...yielded a .198 batting average and .239 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents hit .310 with runners in scoring position with Oklahoma City, .208 with Nashville.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 10-4 record and a 3.94 ERA in his 22 starts...was 1-2 with a 9.00 ERA in six relief appearances and allowed his only inherited runner to score...went 9-4 with a 3.27 ERA in 21 games at night, 2-2 with a 7.84 ERA in seven games during the day.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER	
RHP Andrew Triggs (4-1, 1.84 ERA):	Picked up his fourth win of the season in his last start, a 2-1 A's win at Houston last Saturday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 9 so)...the wins are tied for third in the American League and match the most by an Oakland pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years...also ranks third in the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.241), seventh in ERA (1.84) and ninth in opponents batting average (.194) and on-base percentage (.256)...has allowed a .087 (4-for-46) average against left-handed hitters compared to .274 (17-for-62) with his lone home run against right-handers...opponents are 3-for-26 (.115) with runners in scoring position...is 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA (19.0 ip) in three starts at night...is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season and the 12th of his career...is 0-0 with a 4.50 ERA (2.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so) in two career appearances against Detroit, both in relief last year.

- Bullpen has allowed at least one run in 10 of the last 11 games...have given up 24 earned runs in 32.1 innings pitched during stretch (6.68 ERA)...team is 2-8 in that span.
- In the past two seasons, the bullpen has had a combined 8.51 ERA (23 er, 24.1 ip) at Target Field.
- Relievers have factored in just one decision over the last 11 contests, a loss by Madson on April 25...their one win is the fewest in the majors and their five total decisions are second fewest in the AL.
- A's relievers have tossed at least five innings seven times this season... they have pitched three or more innings in 18-of-27 games.
- Are 6-for-9 in save chances...have converted four of their last five after starting the season 2-for-4 ..three different relievers have recorded at least one save (Casilla, 4; Doolittle, 1; Madson, 1).
- Have 18 holds, which is the fourth most in the AL.
- On April 25, Santiago Casilla allowed the team's first first batter home run of the season (to Mike Trout in the 10th inning)...last year, A's relievers surrendered just six first batter home runs, which tied Chicago (AL) for the fewest in the majors.
