YESTERDAY'S ACTION: The Tigers defeated the A's, 7-2, at Oakland Coliseum. Starter Michael Fulmer (W, 3-1) threw 8.0 dominant innings, allowing just one earned run on eight hits with two walks and nine strikeouts. Victor Martinez gave Detroit an early lead with a two-out, two-run single in the 3rd inning. Jim Adduci broke the game open in the 6th inning with a bases-clearing three-run triple. The Tigers added two more runs in the 8th on an RBI triple by Jose Iglesias and a sac fly by Nicholas Castellanos. Shane Greene tossed a scoreless 9th inning to preserve the victory.

TIGERS GET STRAIGHT A'S: Last night, the Tigers registered their 1,000th win against the A's in franchise history (1,000-920, .521). Their first win came way back on June 4, 1901 at Bennett Park in Detroit over the Philadelphia Athletics. With another win today, the Tigers will earn their first series victory in Oakland since May 25-26, 2015 (2-1). The two clubs have alternated wins in each of their last four series (A's won the last series, 2-1, from May 27-29, 2016). All-time, the Tigers have posted a 111-140 (.442) record in Oakland since the A's began playing here in 1968.

DUC BIGALOW: Since having his contract purchased from triple-A Toledo on April 23rd, Tigers outfielder Jim Adduci leads all American League players in triples (2) and is tied for third in doubles (4), T-11th in extra-base hits (6), 13th in batting average (.343, 12x35), and 17th in slugging % (.571) & OPS (.950). The 31-year-old spent the last two seasons (2015-16) playing for the Lotte Giants in the Korean Baseball Organization. He was originally selected by the Marlins in the 42nd round of the 2003 First-Year Player Draft.

TAKE THE UNDER: Last night, Detroit and Oakland finished their game in two hours and 54 minutes. It marked the Tigers' first game under the three hour mark since April 21st (2:59 at MIN). They had played 11 consecutive games over three hours during that stretch, two shy of their club record (13 straight from June 28 to July 11, 2015). Overall, the Tigers average time of game is five minutes longer than any other Major League team this season (see chart below). 23 of Detroit's first 28 games have lasted three hours or longer (82%), 10 have been over three and a half hours (36%), and two have lasted exactly four hours (4/14 at CLE, 4/22 at MIN). Only five have come in under the three hour threshold (18%).

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: Detroit relievers have not allowed a single run in their last five games combined (Tigers are 4-1 in those games). They've given up just seven hits and three walks in 11.1 innings over that stretch with a .088 WHIP, .171 opp. AVG and 15 strikeouts. The Tigers pen allowed at least one earned run in each of their previous 11 games (6.95 ERA, 33.2IP/26ER) from April 18-29.

REHAB RECAP: Yesterday, Tigers rightfielder J.D. Martinez (right midfoot sprain) began his rehab assignment with single-A Lakewood and went 2-for-4, 2B, R as their DH. JaCoby Jones (lip laceration) also continued his rehab assignment with triple-A Toledo and went 1-for-4 in centerfield.

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Brad Ausmus is in his fourth season at the helm for the Tigers after being named the 37th manager in Tigers history on November 3, 2013.

- Enters tonight's game with a 265-247 (.518) record as the Tigers manager.
- Spent 18 seasons as a catcher at the major league level with the Padres (1993-96), Tigers (1996, 1999-2000), Astros (1997-98, 2001-07) and Dodgers (2009-10)...made eight postseason appearances as a player, including two trips to the National League Championship Series and one to the World Series.
- Ranks third all-time among catchers with 12,839 putouts, while he is 10th with 15,840.2 innings played and 1,766 games started.

ABOUT JORDAN: In his second season with the Tigers and his ninth season in the majors, Zimmermann will make his sixth start of 2017 tonight at Oakland.

LAST TIME OUT: Zimmermann notched his third win of the season on Sunday vs. Chicago (AL), allowing three runs on seven hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 5.0 innings.

VS. OAKLAND: Zimmermann's only career start against the Athletics came at Comerica Park on April 25, 2016, when he earned the win after allowing three runs, one earned, on seven hits with one walk and one strikeout in 6.2 innings.

ON THE ROAD: Zimmermann has started 93 career games on the road and has posted a 35-30 record with a 3.51 ERA (571.1IP/223ER) and 497 strikeouts. Zimmermann's only road start this season was on April 19 at Tampa Bay when he received a no decision after allowing five runs on 10 hits with one walk and four strikeouts.

AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: Tonight's start will mark Zimmermann's first career appearance at Oakland Coliseum.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Zimmermann has made six starts in his career against teams from the American League West and has a 4-2 record with a 2.41 ERA (41.0IP/11ER) and 23 strikeouts. In two starts vs. the AL West last season, Zimmermann went 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA (14.2IP/4ER) and three strikeouts.

RECORD IN MAY: Zimmermann has started 37 games in his career during the month of May and has a 12-13 record with a 4.04 ERA (233.2IP/105ER) and 182 strikeouts. In four May starts last season, Zimmermann went 2-2 with a 4.88 ERA (27.2IP/15ER) and 17 strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Zimmermann has limited righthanded hitters to a .251 (585x2327) batting average during his career, while lefties are hitting .261 (616x2361) against him. In five starts this season, righties are hitting .370 (20x54) vs. Zimmermann, while lefties have a .286 (16x56) batting average.

REACHING A PAIR OF MILESTONES: Zimmermann reached a pair of career milestones in recent starts. He pitched in his 200th career game on April 19 at Tampa Bay, while he made his 200th career start in his start on April 25 vs. Seattle.

STREAK SNAPPED: Zimmermann had his streak of not walking consecutive batters snapped in his start on April 13 vs. Minnesota. Zimmermann walked Miguel Sanó and Max Kepler in the fourth inning, marking the first time he had walked consecutive batters in 885.1 innings. Prior to that start, the last time Zimmermann walked consecutive batters was the seventh inning on May 6, 2012 vs. Philadelphia, when he walked Cole Hamels and Jimmy Rollins. Zimmermann leads all active pitchers (min. 1,000.0 innings pitched) with 1.88 walks per nine innings.

SCORELESS STREAK TO START 2016: Zimmermann began the 2016 season by not allowing a run in his first 24.1 innings pitched. The streak was snapped on April 25 when he allowed a run in the top of the sixth inning vs. Oakland. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Zimmermann became the first starting pitcher to begin his tenure with a team with a scoreless streak of 20.0-or-more innings since Fred Norman began his time with the Cincinnati Reds in 1973 with 26.0 consecutive innings without allowing a run. Zimmermann's streak ranked as the longest by a Tigers pitcher to begin a season and was tied for the eighth longest by any MLB pitcher to start a season in the Expansion Era (since 1961).

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Zimmermann has been selected to the National League All-Star Team twice in his career, earning the honor in 2013 and 2014.

TOSSING A NO-HITTER: Zimmermann threw the first no-hitter in Washington Nationals history on September 28, 2014 vs. Miami. Zimmermann allowed just one walk and struck out 10 in his no-hit performance.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Zimmermann was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on November 30, 2015. He was originally drafted by the Washington Nationals in the second round (67th overall) of the June 2007 draft.

ABOUT DANIEL: Norris will make his sixth start of the season tomorrow afternoon at Oakland.

LAST TIME OUT: Norris earned his second win of the season on Monday vs. Cleveland, tossing 6.0 innings and allowing one run on five hits with four walks and eight strikeouts.

VS. OAKLAND/AT OAKLAND COLISEUM: Norris will be making his first career appearance against the Athletics tomorrow afternoon.

ON THE ROAD: Norris has compiled a 7-1 record with a 3.03 ERA (89.0IP/30ER) and 76 strikeouts in 21 career appearances, including 17 starts, on the road. In two road starts this season, Norris is 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA (10.2IP/4ER) and nine strikeouts. Norris had his road unbeaten streak to start his career snapped at 16 starts on April 20 at Tampa Bay. His streak of 16 road starts without a loss to start his career is tied with Todd Wellemeier and Larry Jensen for the second longest streak since 1913.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Norris has made five career starts against teams from the American League West and has a 0-1 record with a 5.68 ERA (19.0IP/12ER) and 13 strikeouts. In two starts vs. AL West opponents last season, Norris had a 0-0 record with a 3.60 ERA (10.0IP/4ER) and eight strikeouts.
