### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-17) VS. DETROIT TIGERS (15-14)

SUNDAY, MAY 7, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:05 P.M. PDT RHP SONNY GRAY (0-1, 6.00) VS. LHP DANIEL NORRIS (2-2, 4.00) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won two of the last three games but are 3-9 over the last 12 contests...are 13-17 (.433) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...the four games under .500 are one short of the season high of five (twice, last: 12-17 on May 5)...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 6½ games...that is one short of the season high of 7½ (twice, last: May 5)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, five days tied for second, 12 days in third, three days tied for third, three days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's defeated the Tigers last night 6-5 on a walk-off two-run single by Adam Rosales...it was the A's first walk-off win of the season and Oakland became the last team in the majors to win a game in its last at bat...are now 1-2 in games decided in the last at bat...it was just the sixth one-run game, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...are 3-3 in those games...are 3-10 in games decided by five runs or more...the 10 losses are the most in the majors and the 13 games are tied with Texas for the most...have a season run differential of -38, which is tied with Kansas City for the lowest in the AL and tied for third lowest in the majors.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed two errors in each of the last two games and have 11 errors in the last 10 contests...have made a Major League leading 28 errors for the season and the errors have led to a ML leading 21 earned runs...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...six of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...six have been made by outfielders and four by catchers, both of which are the most in the AL... outfielders are tied for the AL lead in double plays (3)

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.38 ERA (62 er in 103.2 ip) over the last 12 games after logging a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...have a 4.42 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League... have not allowed a home run in the first two games of this series after surrendering 10 in the three-game series at Minnesota...that matched their most home runs allowed in a three-game series over the last 16 years (also Aug. 23-25, 2011 at NYY)...have allowed 13 home runs in the last eight games after yielding just 16 over the first 22 contests...have yielded 29 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the AL...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.385)...have hit the most batters in the majors (17) and are tied for second in the AL in wild pitches (14).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 2-8 with a 5.05 ERA (35 er in 62.1 ip) over the last 12 games after going 9-5 with a 3.83 ERA over the first 18 contests...have a 4.30 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have surrendered six home runs in the last five games after yielding no home runs over the previous six contests...have allowed 15 home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the majors... have the lowest opponents batting average in the AL (.231) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.362)...have the most hit batters in the AL (11), the second most decisions (24) and the third fewest innings pitched (161.0)...have used eight different starting pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors (CIN, LAA, WASH).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored two runs or fewer in seven of the last 12 games and are batting .217 (89-for-410) with 37 runs scored over that span (3.1 runs per game)...have struck out at least 10 times in nine of those games (121 strikeouts total)...for the season, have the second fewest runs scored in the American League (112), the third most strikeouts (265) and the fourth lowest batting average (.233)...are hitting .218 (43-for-197) with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

**DESIGNATED HITTERS:** A's designated hitters have just one home run, which matches Detroit for the fewest in the American League...the only home run by an A's DH was by Ryon Healy in the second game of the season (April 4 vs. Los Angeles), giving A's designated hitters a 28-game homerless streak...had a 29-game streak without a homer last year from June 18 to July 23...Chad Pinder had a RBI single in the second inning Thursday to snap a 12-game streak without an RBI by the A's DH...have four RBI for the season, which is five fewer than any other team (KC, 9)... are batting .167 (19-for-114), which is second lowest in the AL (KC, .163).

**LEADOFF HITTERS:** The A's have started five different batters in the leadoff spot and they are batting a combined .183 (22-for-120) with 14

walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .272 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage are second lowest in the American League (KC, .169 and .220)...leadoff hitters are 4-for-27 (.148) with three walks, a double and home run to start the game.

**ON THE BASES:** A's opponents have been successful in 23-of-29 (79.3%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are the most allowed in the American League and fourth most in the majors...the stolen base percentage is second highest in the AL...the A's offense has stolen just nine bases, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 5-4 on the last homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (3-1) and are 8-7 (.533) at home for the season...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3), Houston (1-2) and Minnesota (1-2) and are 5-10 (.333) on the road.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 0-3 on Sunday and are the only team that has not won on Sunday...have played just one extra inning game, which is tied for the fewest in the majors (ARI, CLE, DET, MIN)...lost that game and are one of five teams in the majors without an extra inning win (DET, KC, MIN, SEA)...are averaging 3 hours and 4 minutes per game, which is tied for second fastest in the American League (Kansas City 2:59)...are 12-10 when homering, 1-7 when going homerless.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's currently have eight players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Manaea, Mengden, Phegley, Semien, Smolinski)...Phegley is on the 7-day concussion DL and Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 12 times this year... have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to April 15...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

**IN APRIL:** The A's went 11-14 (.440) in the month of April, which tied for the fourth worst record in the American League...it marked the second time in the last five years they finished with a losing record in the first month (9-14 in 2015)...led the majors in fewest home runs allowed (19) and tied for third in the AL in most home runs hit (31)...the offense struck out 221 times, which was third most in the AL and set an Oakland record for the month of April (previous: 211 in 2010).

A's vs. TIGERS: The A's have split the first two meetings of 2017 after losing the season series last year, 3-4...won two of three in Oakland but lost three of four in Detroit...over the previous 10 years, the A's have won four season series, lost four and split two...are now 41-39 against the Tigers dating back to the start of the 2007 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 253-247 against the Tigers...that includes 141-111 in Oakland, 110-134 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...all-time, the A's are 921-1000 against the Tigers...Detroit defeated the A's for the 1000th time on Friday night...the only team of the original American League franchises the A's have not lost to 1000 times are the Brewers/Browns/Orioles (941).

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Yonder Alonso** had his first career two-homer game last night and now has eight home runs in 28 games this year...his career high is nine home runs in 155 games in 2012...ranks third in the American League in slugging percentage (.651), tied for fifth in home runs (8) and eighth in batting average (.314), on-base percentage (.392) and RBI (22)...**Jed Lowrie** is batting .345 (19-for-55) over his last 15 games after hitting .171 over his previous 12 contests...is a .327 (37-for-113) career hitter against Detroit, which is his best average against any AL team.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1979 the A's turn the first triple play in Oakland history at Baltimore when Gary Roenicke hits into a Gross to Klutts to Revering triple play... it is the first of the A's major league recording tying three triple plays in 1979...in 1991 Harold Baines sets an Oakland record with 14 total bases in the A's 11-3 win against Baltimore...he has three home runs and a double and also walks...he has seven RBI on the evening...in 1997 the A's and Milwaukee set a major league record for the longest 1-0 nine inning game...the Brewers win the game in 3 hours and 20 minutes, breaking the previous record of 3:07.

### **TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (0-1, 6.00 ERA)**

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make the 100th appearance and 98th start of his career...began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)...made two rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL May 1...made his 2017 debut the next day at Minnesota.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss at Minnesota last Tuesday...allowed a career-high tying three home runs...surrendered a solo home run to Dozier and a two-run home run to Sano in the third and a solo home run to Castro in the fourth...left after six innings trailing 4-0.

**GRAY vs. DETROIT:** Is 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA (16.0 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in three career regular season starts...the loss came in his only start last year, a 9-4 decision at Detroit on April 27...tossed 65 pitches in 2.0 innings, which was his shortest

outing as a starter at the time...allowed four runs in the second inning... Castellanos tripled to lead off the inning and scored on a Gose fielders choice...J.D. Martinez hit a three-run home run later in the inning...is also 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA (13.0 ip, 10 h, 3 r, 3 er, 6 bb, 12 so, 1 hr) in two career postseason starts, both in the 2013 ALDS...combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win in Oakland in Game 2 on Oct. 5 (8.0 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 9 so) but had a no decision...then took the loss in the A's 3-0 loss in Game 5 in Oakland on Oct. 10 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 3 so)... is 1-2 with a 3.41 ERA (29.0 ip, 22 h, 11 r, 11 er, 12 bb, 26 so, 3 hr) in five starts against Detroit during the regular season and postseason.

**2016 RECAP:** Went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than 2½ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons...also had career highs in losses (11), home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475) and matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his average of 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings was a career low and his 3.23 walks per nine innings were a career high...had the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (.313) and the second most wild pitches...the wild pitches tied for sixth most in Oakland history and matched the most by an Athletic over the last 24 years...now has 45 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in

Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53)... the winning percentage tied for 10th lowest in Oakland history...among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched, he had the fourth highest ERA in the AL and the highest by an A's pitcher since 2000 (Olivares, 6.75)

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average included a mark of .286 (66-for-231) against right-handed hitters and .286 (67-for-234) against left-handers...surrendered 12 of his 18 home runs to righties...11 of the home runs were solo shots...the eight and nine hitters in the order batted a com-

bined .467 with seven home runs and 21 RBI...however, held the five hitter to a .176 average, no home runs and four RBI...based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, his .468 average against the number eight hitter was the highest by a Major Leaguer since at least 1974...his .465 average against the nine hitter was third highest over that span and the highest since 1999 (Loaiza, TEX .500)...his mark against the five hitter tied for fourth lowest in the AL in 2016...using the 100 inning minimum, he had the fourth highest average with runners in scoring position in the AL (.330), tied for the fifth highest average when opponents put the first pitch in play (.467) and had the seventh highest average against batters leading off an inning (.321)...had a .233 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .318 after that.

**THE BIG INNING:** Yielded six runs in an inning once, five runs three times and four runs twice...he allowed 58 of his 80 runs in the single biggest inning of his 22 starts (25.13 ERA)...had a 1.84 ERA in all other innings.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Went 2-3 with a 7.52 ERA in six starts after the All-Star Break after going 3-8 with a 5.16 ERA in 16 starts before the break...the eight losses were two more than his combined pre-break total from the previous two seasons (20-6, 2.42 ERA in 37 starts)...is now 23-15 with a 3.18 ERA (123 er in 348.0 ip) in 55 career appearances before the All-Star Break compared to 15-17 with a 3.79 ERA (112 er in 266.0 ip) in 44 games after the break.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 2.05 ERA in the first inning, a 3.43 ERA in the second inning and a 7.42 ERA from the third inning on...went 2-8 with a 6.50 ERA in 12 starts on four days rest, 3-3 with a 4.73 ERA in 10 starts on five days rest or more...is now 19-20 with a 3.65 ERA (133 er in 328.0 ip) in 51 career starts on four days rest, 19-12 with a 3.26 ERA (102 er in 282.0 ip) in his other 46 starts...the A's were 7-15 (.318) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than five innings in five of his starts...had just three such starts over the first three years of his career.

MORE 2016: Was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start on April 4 against Chicago (AL) due to food poisoning...started two days later against the White Sox and picked up the win in a 2-1 decision... tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career in a 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 11...was 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting over his first four starts through April 22...then went 2-10 with a 6.55 ERA and .300 opponents batting average over his final 18 starts... had a career-high seven-game losing streak from April 27 to May 6...compiled a 6.16 ERA and .293 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 12 starts...the streak of 12 consecutive starts without a win tied for second longest by an A's starter this century...went 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts in April....is now 10-3 with a 2.53 ERA (28 er in 99.2 ip) in 15 career starts in April...the wins and ERA are his best for any month... had three wild pitches May 20 against New York and is the first A's pitcher with three wild pitches in a game since Doug Johns on Sept. 6, 1995 at Boston...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...did not make a rehab start before being reinstated from the DL June 5...had a no decision that day at Houston in a 5-2 A's loss...left with a 2-1 lead but Coulombe allowed a run in the sixth for the blown save...it was the first of two times he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blown the save (Axford, June 26 at Los Angeles-AL)...fanned Jurickson Profar to start the game July 26 at Texas for the 500th strikeout of his career...took the loss in his only start in August on the 6th against Chicago (NL) and was placed on the disabled list the next day with a strained right forearm...went 2-6 with a 5.43 ERA in 12 starts in between his two stints on the DL...was reinstated Sept. 28 to make one final appearance before the end of the season...started that day at Los Angeles (AL) but tossed just 1.0 inning (1 h, 1 so) and was limited to 18 pitches as he did not have a rehab assignment...the 1.0 inning pitched marked the shortest outing of his career.

#### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (2-2, 3.95 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list April 27...is 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA in two starts since his return...was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA in three starts when he was placed on the DL list April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder...is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season tomorrow...all have been at night and three have come against Los Angeles...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-4 A's loss at Minnesota last Wednesday (3.1 ip, 5 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 3 so, 1 hr)...is 2-2 with a 3.28 ERA (46.2 ip, 48 h, 18 r, 17 er, 9 bb, 31 so, 5 hr) in eight career starts against Los Angeles, including 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 12 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 11 so, 1 hr) in two starts this year...went 2-1 with a 2.29 ERA in five starts this spring...held the opposition to a .188 (13-for-69) batting average and walked just three batters in 19.2 innings (1.37 walks per nine innings).

#### TEAM

2-4, 4.60 ERA (52 er in 101.2 ip) **Saves/Opportunities:** 7-for-10 (70.0%)

- Bullpen has allowed at least one run in 12 of the last 14 games...have given up 28 earned runs in 47.0 innings pitched during stretch (5.36 ERA)...team is 5-9 in that span.
- The 14 home runs allowed by the bullpen are tied for fourth in the AL... only Detroit, Los Angeles and Seattle have allowed more.
- Have two wins, which are tied for the fewest in the majors...their six total decisions are second fewest in the AL.
- A's relievers have tossed at least five innings eight times this season...
   they have pitched three or more innings in 21-of-30 games.
- Are 7-for-10 in save chances...have converted five of their last six after starting the season 2-for-4 ..three different relievers have recorded at least one save (Casilla, 5; Doolittle, 1; Madson, 1).
- . Have 20 holds, which is the second most in the AL.
- On April 25, Santiago Casilla allowed the team's first and only first batter home run of the season (to Mike Trout in the 10th inning).
