OAKLAND ATHLETICS (14-17) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (16-17)

MONDAY, MAY 8, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (2-2, 3.95) VS. RHP RICKY NOLASCO (2-2, 4.68) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (KFOX 98.5 FM) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the last four games after losing eight of the previous nine contests...are 14-17 (.452) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by 6½ games...that is one short of the season high of 7½ (twice, last: May 5)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, five days tied for second, 12 days in third, three days tied for third, four days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

BACK-TO-BACK WALK-OFFS: The A's won each of the final two games of the Detroit series on walk-off hits (Rosales single on Saturday, Healy home run on Sunday)...it marked the third time in Oakland history the A's recorded walk-off wins in consecutive games while trailing entering their final at bat: July 4-5, 2002 vs. KC and Aug. 28, 1986 vs. BAL (DH)...Francisco Rodriguez took the loss in each game to become the first pitcher to give up back-to-back walk-off hits to the A's since Jason Grimsley (KC) did it in games 19 and 20 of the A's 20-game winning streak in 2002 (Sept. 2, 4)...the A's two walk-off wins are tied for second most in the American League (LAA, 4)...the wins were also the A's first last at bat wins of the season after going 0-2 over the first 29 games...have two wins when trailing after eight innings, which is also tied for second most in the AL (LAA, 3).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .290 (42-for-145) with 24 runs scored over the last four games (6.00 runs per game) after hitting .204 with 28 runs scored over the previous 11 contests (2.55 runs per game)...are tied for third in the American League in doubles (53) and extra base hits (95) and tied for fourth in home runs (39)...however, have the third fewest runs (120) and third most strikeouts (271)...are hitting .218 (46-for-211) with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: Ryon Healy's game-ending home run yesterday was the first home run of any type by an A's designated hitter since Healy homered in the second game of the season (April 4 vs. Los Angeles)...it snapped a 28-game homerless streak by A's designated hitters...the two home runs are tied for second fewest among AL designated hitters...rank last in the AL in RBI by a DH (6) and have the second lowest batting average (.179).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in each of the last three games and have 13 errors in the last 11 contests...have made a Major League leading 30 errors for the season and the errors have led to a ML leading 24 earned runs...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...six of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...six have been made by outfielders, which is the most in the AL...outfielders are tied for the AL lead in double plays (3).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.19 ERA (65 er in 112.2 ip) over the last 13 games after logging a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...have a 4.37 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League... have allowed 14 home runs in the last nine games after yielding just 16 over the first 22 contests...have yielded 30 home runs for the season, which is third fewest in the AL...have hit the most batters in the majors (17) and rank second in the AL in wild pitches (16).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-8 with a 4.84 ERA (36 er in 67.0 ip) over the last 13 games after going 9-5 with a 3.83 ERA over the first 18 contests...have not allowed a home run in nine of the last 12 games and have surrendered just 15 for the season, which is the fewest in the majors...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.365) and third lowest batting average (.235)...have the most hit batters in the AL (11), the second most decisions (24) and the third fewest innings pitched (165.2)...have used eight different starting pitchers, which is tied for the most in the majors.

LEADOFF HITTERS: The A's have started five different batters in the leadoff spot and they are batting a combined .185 (23-for-124) with 15 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .277 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage are second lowest in the American League (KC, .164 and .214)...leadoff hitters are 4-for-28 (.143) with three walks, a double and home run to start the game.

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been successful in 23-of-30 (76.7%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are the most allowed in the Ameri-

can League and tied for fourth most in the majors...the stolen base percentage is second highest in the AL...the A's offense has stolen just 11 bases, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 5-4 on the last homestand against Houston (0-2), Texas (2-1) and Seattle (3-1) and are 9-7 (.563) at home for the season...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3), Houston (1-2) and Minnesota (1-2) and are 5-10 (.333) on the road...begin a six-game road trip to Texas (three games) and Seattle (three games) on Friday.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 3-3 in one-run games and the six onerun decisions are third fewest in the American League...are 3-10 in games decided by five runs or more...the 10 losses are the most in the majors and the 13 games are tied with Texas for the most...have a season run differential of -36, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -39).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have played just one extra inning game, which is tied for the fewest in the majors (ARI, CLE, DET, MIN)...lost that game and are one of five teams in the majors without an extra inning win (DET, KC, MIN, SEA)...are averaging 3 hours and 5 minutes per game, which is third fastest in the American League...however, it is currently the second slowest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000)...are 13-10 when homering, 1-7 when going homerless.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's currently have eight players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Manaea, Mengden, Phegley, Semien, Smolinski)...Phegley is on the 7-day concussion DL and Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 12 times this year... have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to April 15...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

IN APRIL: The A's went 11-14 (.440) in the month of April, which tied for the fourth worst record in the American League...it marked the second time in the last five years they finished with a losing record in the first month (9-14 in 2015)...led the majors in fewest home runs allowed (19) and tied for third in the AL in most home runs hit (31)...the offense struck out 221 times, which was third most in the AL and set an Oakland record for the month of April (previous: 211 in 2010).

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 2-5 against the Angels this year...at the conclusion of this series, Oakland will have played 10 of its first 34 games against Los Angeles...have yet to play seven American League teams... the A's split a four-game series in Oakland to start the season and were swept in a three-game series in Anaheim April 25-27...have won four of the last six games in the Coliseum but have lost six straight, nine of the last 10 and 22 of the last 31 games at Angel Stadium...three of the five losses this year have been by one run...have lost each of the previous three season series and are 26-38 against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 423-359 against the Angels...that includes 220-169 in Oakland and 203-190 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 472-436 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso was named American League Player of the Week today after going 9-for-22 (.409) with five runs, a double, five home runs and 10 RBI in six games last week...it was his first career Player of the Week Award...hit his ninth home run of the season yesterday, which matches his career high established in 155 games in 2012...**Ryon Healy** has homered in three straight games for the first time in his career...**Jed Lowrie** is batting .333 (20-for-60) over his last 16 games after hitting .171 over his previous 12 contests.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1906** pitcher Chief Bender is inserted into the game in left field in the sixth inning and hits two inside the park home runs in a game against the Boston Pilgrims...in **1968**, the A's first year in Oakland, Catfish Hunter tosses a perfect game and almost single handedly defeats Minnesota 4-0...he strikes out 11 and also collects three hits while driving in three of the A's four runs...in **1992** Dennis Eckersley records his 200th career save in the A's 8-6 win over New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (2-2, 3.95 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his third start since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list April 27...is 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA (8 er in 9.1 ip) in two starts since his return...was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA in three starts when he was placed on the DL list April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (3 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 4.96 ERA (9 er in 16.1 ip) in three starts on the road...last year, he went 5-6 with a 3.39 ERA in 14 starts at home compared to 5-5 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts on the road...had the ninth lowest home ERA in the American League...surrendered seven home runs in 90.1 innings at home, 15 in 95.2 innings on the road.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Is tied for the lead among American League pitchers in double plays (2) and errors (2) and tied for fifth in total chances (10)...turned the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history April 27 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was by Blue Moon Odom, also against the Angels, in the second game of a July 11, 1971 doubleheader...last year, he tied for third among AL pitchers in total chances (42), tied for seventh in assists (27) and ranked eighth in putouts (15)...did not commit an error and his 42 total chances were the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors among pitchers with no errors.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season tonight...all have been at night and three have come against Los Angeles. opponents are 7-for-36 (.194) with runners on base, including 3-for-19 (.158) with runners in scoring position...the opponents number five hitters in 7-for-9 (.778) with six RBI but the six hitter is 0-for-11...has allowed four runs in the first inning (7.20 ERA)...last year, he allowed just six runs in the first inning for the entire season for a 1.74 ERA...that tied Arrieta (CHC) for second lowest in the majors (Tanaka, NYY 1.16) among pitchers with 30 or more innings...using the same minimum, it was 10th lowest in Oakland history

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day April 8 in Oakland...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)... is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Trout in the third inning... those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas April 8...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings, allowing just two base runners on an Odor walk and Lucroy reach on error in the second...then retired 15 straight before Napoli homered with two outs in the bottom of the seventh...that was the only run he allowed in seven innings of work.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-2 loss to Houston on April 14 in Oakland...did not strike out a batter in 5.0 innings, his first career start without a strikeout...the A's scored once in the second inning and he kept the Astros off the board over the first four innings, despite three hits, two walks and a hit batter...then allowed a leadoff home run to Aoki in the fifth inning and left after five innings and 74 pitches with the scored tied 1-1.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 27...allowed a RBI single to Pujols and a RBI double to Cron in the first inning but retired each of the next eight batters...shutout the Angels on three hits over his final five innings...Oakland was held to a run on three hits by Nolasco and four relievers.

LAST START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-4 loss at Minnesota last Wednesday...issued a career-high tying four walks...allowed a two-run single to Vargas in the first inning but the A's got one of those runs back in the third ... then surrendered a three-run home run to Vargas in the bottom of the third...Oakland scored twice in the fourth to cut the lead to 5-3 but he allowed a leadoff triple to Buxton in the bottom of the fourth...was relieved by Hendriks who allowed the inherited runner to score.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 2.29 ERA in five starts this spring...held the opposition to a .188 (13-for-69) batting average and walked just three batters in 19.2 innings (1.37 walks per nine innings).... allowed one run or fewer in four of his five starts...also started the exhibition game against Italy's World Baseball Classic team on March 8 and picked up the win (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 3 so)...pitched in a minor league game March 29.

2016 RECAP: Compiled a 10-11 record and a 4.11 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts in his second season with the A's...went 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts, 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA over his next 16 starts from May 30 to Aug. 24, and 0-3 with a 4.71 ERA over his final six starts...in addition to starts, he also led the A's in wins, losses (tied), innings pitched (186.0), hits (196), runs (87), earned runs (85), home runs (22) and walks (47)...all those marks are career highs as are his 108 strikeouts...the 47 walks were the fewest in Athletics history by an A's team-leader, besting the previous low of 59 by Sonny Gray in 2015.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Averaged 5.23 strikeouts per nine innings, which was the third lowest mark in the American League...tied for second in the AL in shutouts (1), tied for fifth in complete games (2), tied for sixth in opponents reaching on an error (8), ranked seventh in fewest pitches per game (91.4) and was ninth in hits (196).

SUPPORT: Averaged 4.16 runs of support per start, which was 10th lowest in the AL...received two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 31 starts and was 0-8 in those games...went 10-3 in 19 starts with support of three or more...is now 1-18 in 27 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 17-4 in 30 starts with three runs of support or more...left with a lead five times in 2016 only to have the bullpen blow the save.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Had a .271 opponents batting average, which broke down to .270 (90-for-333) against right-handed hitters compared to .272 (106-for-390) with 35 of his 47 walks against left-handers...his career splits are .270 (172-for-637) with a .743 OPS against right-handers, .269 (178-for-661) with 64 of his 94 walks and a .737 OPS against left-handers...yielded a .302 average with runners on base but 14 of the 22 home runs he allowed were solo shots ... 26 of his 41 career home runs have come with the bases empty.

RHP Jharel Cotton (3-3, 4.64 ERA): Is scheduled to make his team-leading seventh start of the season...has a decision in each of his six starts and has alternated wins and losses in each start leads American League rookies in games started (6), innings pitched (33.0) and strikeouts (28) and is tied for the lead in wins (3)... is 3-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in three starts during the day, 0-3 with an 8.36 ERA and .371 opponents average in three starts at night...has allowed all three of his home runs during the day...is now 5-0 with a 1.67 ERA in five career starts during the day compared to 0-3 with a 5.40 ERA in six starts at night... was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-5 A's win at Minnesota last Thursday (6.0 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 9 so, 2 hr)...is 1-1 with a 5.06 ERA (10.2 ip, 10 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in two career starts against Los Angeles...the loss came this year on April 5 (4.1 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 4 so).
