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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-18) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (17-18)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped last night...have won four of the last six games after losing eight of the previous nine contests...are 15-18 (.455) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by seven games...that is one-half game short of the season high of 7½ (twice, last: May 5)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 12 days in third, three days tied for third, five days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 10 home runs in the last four games and have 44 for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League and tied for fourth most in Athletics history after 33 games (50 in 2000, 49 in 2002, 46 in 1990, 44 in 2006)...Yonder Alonso hit his 11th home run of the season last night, giving the A's two players with 10 home runs (K. Davis, 10)...Oakland is the only AL team and one of three teams in the majors with two players in double figures in home runs (MIA, WASH)...the A's are 14-11 when homering, 1-7 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is the worst in the AL and third worst in the majors...the pitching staff has allowed 18 home runs in the last 11 games after yielding just 16 over the first 22 contests...the A's are 11-6 when out-homering the opponent.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.02 ERA (74 er in 132.2 ip) over the last 15 games after posting a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...now have a 4.35 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.388)...have hit the most batters in the majors (19) and rank second in the AL in wild pitches (16).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-9 with a 5.13 ERA (45 er in 79.0 ip) over the last 15 games after going 9-5 with a 3.83 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 11-14 with a 4.41 ERA for the season...have the second highest ERA in the American League (CLE, 4.68), are tied for second in most losses (CWS, 15) and have the third fewest innings pitched (177.2)...have allowed just 19 home runs, which is tied with St. Louis for second fewest in the majors (Kansas City, 17)...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.382) and third lowest batting average (.240)...have the most hit batters in the AL (12) and have the second most decisions (25)...have used eight different starting pitchers, which is tied for second most in the majors (TOR, 9).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .257 (55-for-214) with 30 runs scored over the last six games (5.00 runs per game) after hitting .204 with 28 runs scored over the previous 11 contests (2.55 runs per game)...lead the American League in extra base hits (104) and rank third in doubles (57)...however, have the third most strikeouts (293), the fourth fewest runs (126) and the fourth lowest batting average (.234)...went 1-for-12 with runners in scoring position last night and are hitting .208 (47-for-226) with RISP for the season, which is third lowest in the AL.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: Ryon Healy's game-ending home run Sunday was the first home run of any type by an A's designated hitter since Healy homered in the second game of the season (April 4 vs. Los Angeles)...it snapped a 28-game homerless streak by A's designated hitters...A's designated hitters rank last in the American League in RBI (6) and have the second fewest home runs (2) and second lowest batting average (.176).

LEADOFF HITTERS: The A's have started five different batters in the lead-off spot and they are hitting a combined .174 (23-for-132) with 17 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .272 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage are second lowest in the American League (KC, .167 and .213)...leadoff hitters are 4-for-29 (.138) with four walks, a double and home run to start the game.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's had their streak of six consecutive games with an error end last night...have 14 errors in the last 13 games and a Major League leading 31 errors for the season...the errors have led to a ML leading 24 earned runs...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...six of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors.

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been successful in 24-of-32 (75.0%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are the most allowed in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...the stolen base per-

centage is tied for fourth highest in the AL...the A's offense has four stolen bases in the last three games after stealing just nine bases over the 30 contests.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this six-game homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-1)...went 5-4 on the last homestand and are 10-8 (.556) at home for the season...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3), Houston (1-2) and Minnesota (1-2) and are 5-10 (.333) on the road...begin a six-game road trip to Texas (three games) and Seattle (three games) on Friday.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 4-3 in one-run games and the seven one-run decisions are third fewest in the American League...are 3-10 in games decided by five runs or more...the 10 losses are the most in the majors and the 13 games are tied for second most (Texas, 14)...have a season run differential of -39, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 6-4 (.600) in day games, 9-14 (.391) at night...each of Oakland's last seven games have lasted at least 2 hours and 54 minutes and the A's average time of game over that stretch is 3:20...are averaging 3:05 for the season, which is third fastest in the American League...however, it is currently the second slowest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000)...the A's had their first walk-off wins of the season on Saturday, Sunday and Monday...it marked the sixth time in Oakland history the A's logged three straight walk-off victories (last: June 1-3, 2004)...the three walk-off wins are tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 4)...the wins are also the A's first last at bat victories of the season after going 0-2 over the first 29 games...have two wins when trailing after eight innings, which is also tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's currently have eight players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Manaea, Mengden, Phegley, Semien, Smolinski)...Phegley is on the 7-day concussion DL and Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt, Manaea and Mengden are currently on rehab assignments...have used the DL 12 times this year...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to April 15...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 3-6 against the Angels this year...after today, Oakland will have played 10 of its first 34 games against Los Angeles...have yet to play seven American League teams...will not face the Angels again until Aug. 4...are 3-3 in Oakland and were swept in a three-game series in Anaheim April 25-27...have won five of the last eight games in the Coliseum but have lost six straight, nine of the last 10 and 22 of the last 31 games at Angel Stadium...have lost each of the previous three season series and are 27-39 against the Angels over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 424-360 against the Angels...that includes 221-170 in Oakland and 203-190 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 473-437 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso had his second career two-homer game last night...the first came last Saturday against Detroit...has five home runs in his last four games, seven in his last eight and 10 in his last 19...now has 11 home runs for the season, which is a new career high...his previous high of nine came in 155 games in 2012...**Khris Davis** has set the Athletics franchise record for consecutive games with a strikeout by a non-pitcher with 20...broke the previous mark of 19 held by Jack Cust...**Trevor Plouffe** has three straight multiple hit games (6-for-11, .545) to snap a career-long streak of 27 consecutive games with one hit or fewer...**Adam Rosales** extended his hitting streak to seven games last night (8-for-26, .308), which is one short of his career high of eight..

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1992** Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire and Mike Bordick all homered in the sixth inning of the A's 5-2 win at New York...in **1996** Ernie Young hits three home runs in the A's 15-5 win over Minnesota to tie an Oakland record...he adds a single and drives in six runs...Young, Geronimo Berroa and Brent Gates all homered in the fifth inning to tie an Oakland record...in **2007** Dan Johnson is a perfect 4 for 4 with two home runs, four RBI, four runs scored and two walks and Jack Cust also homers twice as the A's hit six home runs to defeat Kansas City, 17-3.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (4-2, 2.34 ERA)

LAST THREE, FIRST THREE: Is 1-2 with a 4.76 ERA (9 er in 17.0 ip) and .269 (18-for-67) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 3-0 with a 0.00 ERA and .169 opponents batting average over his first three starts...became the first A's pitcher to go 3-0 over his first three starts in a season since Tommy Milone in 2013...has two runs of support in his last three starts after receiving 16 runs of support in his first three.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.280), tied for fifth in wins (4), seventh in opponents OPS (.555) and fewest walks per nine innings (1.82), ninth in ERA (2.34) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.86) and tied for 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.275)...has surrendered just one home run in 34.2 innings and his average of 0.26 home runs per nine innings is fourth lowest...is also tied for fourth in hit batters (4) and unearned runs (5), tied for seventh in stolen bases allowed (4) and ranks eighth in fewest pitches per inning (15.1).

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season...made six starts in his Major League debut last year...has walked one batter or fewer four of his six starts this year and 10 of 12 starts in his career...has allowed eight of his 14 runs this year in the third inning (5 er in 6.0 ip, 7.50 ERA)...has a 1.26 ERA (4 er in 28.2 ip) in all other innings...took the loss April 23 against Seattle to snap a career-best four-game winning streak dating back to last year...went 4-1 with a 1.84 ERA in five starts in the month of April...the four wins match the most by an Oakland pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (eighth time, last: Gray and Kazmir in 2014)...the ERA was second best by an A's pitcher over the last 10 years (Kazmir, 0.99 in 2015).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.11 ERA (3 er in 24.1 ip) in four starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 5.23 ERA (6 er in 10.1 ip) in two starts during the day...has the second lowest night ERA in the American League

EARNED RUNS: Has not allowed an earned run in four of his six starts...began the season with a 17.2-inning streak without allowing an earned run...that was the longest season-opening streak in Oakland history by a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster...it was third longest by any Oakland pitcher...since the earned run became an official stat in the American League in 1913, he is just the third A's pitcher to start the season with three games of five or more innings and no earned runs...joins Eddie Rommel (1924) and Vean Gregg (1918).

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) April 6 in Oakland...issued a career-high three walks...surrendered his only run in the third inning and it was unearned...Escobar led off with a single, went to second on a R.Davis error, third on a ground out and scored on a Pujols ground out...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the third for the win.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Kansas City April 12...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...surrendered four hits and walked one and allowed just three base runners to advance into scoring position...was relieved by Dull to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 8-0.

THIRD START: He improved to 3-0 in the A's 4-2 win over Texas on April 18 in Oakland...shut out the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings but Darvish blanked the A's on one hit over that Span...Triggs then allowed two unearned runs in the sixth when an Alonso error preceded an Andrus RBI single and a Mazara RBI ground out...the A's then scored four times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

FOURTH START: He was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 11-1 loss to Seattle April 23 in Oakland...yielded a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and then surrendered five runs in the third inning on a bases loaded walk to Cruz and a Motter grand slam...was relieved by Coulombe after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0.

FIFTH START: He picked up his fourth win of the season in the A's 2-1 victory at Houston last Saturday...struck out a career-high nine batters and logged a career-high 7.0 scoreless innings...allowed five runners to advance into scoring position, but set down each of the final 10 batters that he faced.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss to Detroit last Friday in Oakland...allowed a career-high eight hits in 5.1 innings of work...was charged with two unearned runs in the third inning when Martinez had a two-run, two-out single after a Rosales error started the inning...then allowed a base loaded three-run triple to Adduci in the sixth inning and left trailing 5-0.

his other start came in a no decision in Oakland on June 18 in a 7-1 loss...shutout the Angels on two hits over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Trout in the fourth...was relieved by Dull after tossing 3.0 innings and 50 pitches...also pitched in relief on Aug. 3 at Los Angeles (2.1 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 1 so).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-3 with an 8.10 ERA in seven games, including five starts...allowed a .299 (29-for-97) opponents batting average but issued just five walks in a team-leading 23.1 innings (1.93 per nine innings)...allowed five home runs...started in each of his final five outings (21 er in 19.1 ip, 9.78 ERA) after pitching in relief in his first two appearances (0 er in 4.0 ip).

2016 RECAP: Was claimed off waivers from Baltimore during the spring and went 1-1 with a 4.31 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 24 games (six starts) over eight stints in his Major League debut with the A's...the eight stints are believed to be the most in one season in Oakland history...five of his eight stints began less than eight days following his previous option...had three one-day stints and two two-day stints...struck out 55 and walked just 13 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.23...compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...then went 1-1 with a 2.58 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in 14 games (six starts), over his final four stints...allowed three home runs over his first four stints (18.0 ip) and two in his last four (38.1 ip)...his opponents batting average included a .235 (28-for-119) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .277 (28-for-101) against left-handers...issued 9 of his 13 walks to lefties...held the opposition to a .144 batting average with two strikes...the three hitter in the order batted .429 but he allowed a .160 batting average against the clean-up hitter.

NASHVILLE: Went 2-1 with two saves and a 2.95 ERA in 16 appearances with Triple-A Nashville, all in relief...struck out 21 and walked five in 18.1 innings...did not surrender a home run...allowed a .225 batting average, including .130 (3-for-23) against left-handed hitters compared to .271 (13-for-48) against right-handers...had a .125 batting average and .222 on-base percentage against batters leading off an inning...did not allow a run in seven games on the road (8.0 ip) and five appearances during the day (5.2 ip).

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (1-2, 3.03 ERA): Was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...pitched in relief in his first outing on April 7 but has started in each of his last five appearances...is 0-1 with a 5.59 ERA and .318 opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first three starts...has allowed just one home run in 35.2 innings and his average of 0.25 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the American League...has the sixth lowest run support (2.78) and ranks seventh in opponents slugging percentage (.294)...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-5 A's win over Detroit on Saturday (3.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 4 so)...is 1-1 with a 4.13 ERA (28.1 ip, 33 h, 13 r, 13 er, 8 bb, 12 so, 3 hr) in five career appearances against Texas, including four starts...is 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 7 so, 1 hr) in two games, one start, this year
