OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-18) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (16-20)

FRIDAY, MAY 12, 2017 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. CDT RHP JESSE HAHN (1-2, 3.03) VS. RHP ANDREW CASHNER (0-3, 2.63) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last five games and five of the last seven after losing eight of their previous nine contests...are 16-18 (.471) for the season...are in third place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by a season-high tying 7½ games (third time, last: May 5)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, five days in fourth, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 11 home runs in the last five games and have 45 for the season, which is tied for fourth in the American League... Yonder Alonso has 11 home runs and Khris Davis 10 and Oakland is the only AL team with two players with 10 or more home runs...the A's are 15-11 when homering, 1-7 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is tied with Detroit for the worst in the AL and tied for second worst in the majors (MIA, 1-9)...the pitching staff has allowed 18 home runs in the last 12 games after yielding just 16 over the first 22 contests... have allowed 34 home runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...the A's are 12-6 when out-homering the opponent.

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 3.38 ERA on the last homestand after posting a 5.05 ERA on the previous road trip...have the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.236) and slugging percentage (.381) in the American League...have hit the most batters in the majors (19) and are tied for second in the AL in wild pitches (16).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-9 with a 4.87 ERA (46 er in 85.0 ip) over the last 16 games after going 9-5 with a 3.83 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 12-14 with a 4.31 ERA for the season...that includes 6-4 with a 2.56 ERA (20 er in 70.1 ip) by Andrew Triggs and Jesse Hahn and 6-10 with a 5.40 ERA (68 er in 113.1 ip) by everyone else...starters are tied for second in the American League in most losses (14) and rank fourth in highest ERA (4.31) and fewest innings pitched (183.2)...have allowed just 19 home runs, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the majors...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.378) and third lowest batting average (.237)...have the most hit batters (12) and the second most decisions (26)...have used eight different starting pitchers, which is tied with Los Angeles and Baltimore for second most in the AL (TOR, 9).

OFFENSE: The A's scored three runs in each of the three games against the Angels to start the week and won two of those contests...have scored 129 runs for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the American League...went 2-for-21 (.095) with runners in scoring position against the Angels and are batting .207 (48-for-232) with RISP for the season, which ranks second lowest in the AL (KC, .204)...are tied for third in the American League in extra base hits (105)...however, have the third most strikeouts (301) and the fourth lowest batting average (.232).

DESIGNATED HITTERS: Ryon Healy's game-ending home run last Sunday was the first home run of any type by an A's designated hitter since Healy homered in the second game of the season (April 4 vs. Los Angeles)...it snapped a 28-game homerless streak by A's designated hitters... A's designated hitters rank last in the American League in RBI (6) and have the second fewest home runs (2) and second lowest batting average

LEADOFF HITTERS: The A's have started five different batters in the lead-off spot and they are hitting a combined .169 (23-for-136) with 17 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .265 on-base percentage)...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the on-base percentage is second lowest in the American League (KC, .215)...leadoff hitters are 4-for-30 (.133) with four walks, a double and home run to start the game.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 15 errors in the last 14 games and have a Major League leading 32 errors for the season...the errors have led to a ML leading 24 earned runs...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...six of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors.

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been successful in 25-of-33 (75.8%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are the most allowed in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...the A's offense has five stolen bases in the last four games after stealing just nine bases over the 30 contests.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game road trip to Texas (three games) and Seattle (three games) tonight...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3), Houston (1-2) and Minnesota (1-2) and are 5-10 (.333) on the road...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and are 11-8 (.579) at home for the season... have won four straight home series for the first time since May 30-July 24, 2014 when they won eight straight.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 4-3 in one-run games and the seven one-run decisions are third fewest in the American League...are 3-10 in games decided by five runs or more...the 10 losses are the most in the majors and the 13 games are tied for third most (SEA AND TEX, 14)...have a season run differential of -37, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -39)

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-4 (.636) in day games, 9-14 (.391) at night...each of Oakland's last eight games have lasted at least 2 hours and 54 minutes and the A's average time of game over that stretch is 3:17 (1576 minutes)...are averaging 3:05 for the season, which is tied for third fastest in the American League...however, it is currently the second slowest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000)...the A's had their first walk-off wins of the seasons last Saturday, Sunday and Monday...it marked the sixth time in Oakland history the A's logged three straight walk-off victories (last: June 1-3, 2004)...the three walk-off wins are tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 4)...the wins are also the A's first last at bat victories of the season after going 0-2 over the first 29 games...have two wins when trailing after eight innings, which is also tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Josh Phegley from the 7-day concussion disabled list today and now have seven players on the DL (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Manaea, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt, Manaea and Mengden are currently on rehab assignments...have used the DL 12 times this year...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to April 15...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. RANGERS: The season series is even at three games each...the A's have won two of three games in Oakland but have lost two of three at Texas...lost the season series last year when they went 9-10 against the Rangers...it marked the fourth consecutive year the season series finished 10-9...Oakland won two of those series and lost two and are 41-41 against Texas over the last five seasons...are 344-356 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 180-170 in Oakland and 164-186 in Texas...are 97-98 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 441-438 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso has five home runs in his last five games and 11 for the season, which is a new career high...his previous high of nine came in 155 games in 2012...is batting .355 (11-for-31) with seven home runs and 13 RBI in nine games in May...leads the majors in home runs this month and tops the American League in RBI...his seven home runs in May are his most ever in a month, topping his four in April of this year and May of 2014...Khris Davis has set the Athletics franchise record for consecutive games with a strikeout by a non-pitcher with 21...broke the previous mark of 19 held by Jack Cust...Liam Hendriks has not allowed a run in his last nine games for an 11.0-inning scoreless streak... opponents are 4-for-38 (.105) with one walk during the streak...Trevor Plouffe has three straight multiple hit games (6-for-11, .545) to snap a career-long streak of 27 consecutive games with one hit or fewer.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1910 Chief Bender tosses a no-hitter in the A's 4-0 win over Cleveland...the future Hall of Famer walks just one and finishes the season 23-5, one of two career 20-win seasons...in 1915 catcher Wally Schang sets an American League record by throwing out six attempted base stealers...in 1978 Gary Alexander is 4 for 4 with a home run as the A's score seven times in the ninth inning to defeat the Tigers at Detroit, 10-4...in 1989 Dave Henderson hits a two-run homer in the bottom of the ninth inning as the A's defeat the Milwaukee Brewers, 5-4...in 2000 Matt Stairs hits his fifth career walk-off home run as the A's erase a fiverun deficit to defeat Seattle 9-7.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-2, 3.03 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...pitched in relief in his first outing on April 7 but has started in each of his last five appearance...is 0-1 with a 5.59 ERA (6 er in 9.2 ip) and .318 (14-for-44) opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first three starts.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed just one home run in 35.2 innings and his average of 0.25 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the American League...ranks eighth in opponents slugging percentage (.294).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no support in three of his six starts and is 0-2 with a 2.70 ERA (6 er in 20.0 ip) in those three starts...has five starts with two runs of support or fewer and eight in his other start...his season run support average of 2.78 (11 rs in 35.2 ip) is seventh lowest in the American League.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .173 (13-for-75) opponents batting average with the bases empty compared to .279 (17-for-61) with runners on base...opponents are 10-for-31 (.323) with runners in scoring position... last year, he allowed a .324 batting average with runners in scoring position...has yielded a .109 (7-for-64) batting average with two strikes after allowing a .300 mark with two strikes last year...has a .136 (8-for-59) opponents batting average against the bottom four hitters in the order, .286 (22-for-77) against the top five.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 1-1 with a 2.08 ERA (6 er in 26.0 ip) in four games against American League West competition, 0-1 with a 5.59 ERA (6 er in 9.2 ip) in two starts against everyone else.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 3.72 ERA (4 er in 9.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland, 0-2 with a 2.77 ERA (8 er in 26.0 ip) in three games on the road... last year, he went 2-1 with a 3.03 ERA and .237 opponents batting average in five starts at home, 0-3 with a 13.17 ERA and .453 opponents average in four starts on the road... in three seasons with the A's, he is 6-4 with a 3.13 ERA (36 er in 103.2 ip) in 17 starts in Oakland, 3-8 with a 5.16 ERA (43 er in 75.0 ip) in 14 games on the road.

FIRST APPEARANCE: He relieved A's starting pitcher Raul Alcantara to start the third inning of the A's 10-5 loss at Texas April 7...entered the game trailing 8-3 and tossed 6.0 innings in his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...blanked the Rangers on two hits over his first three innings before allowing two runs in the sixth on a Gomez RBI double and a Mazara RBI single...those were the only runs he would allow.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Kansas City April 13...allowed two runs in the first inning on RBI singles by Cain and Perez, and another in the third on a Moss sacrifice fly...did not allow a run over his final three innings...Vargas (7.2 ip) and Soria (0.1 ip) shutout the A's on four hits and a walk over the first eight innings before Oakland scored its only run in the ninth.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 win over Texas on April 19 in Oakland, snapping a career-high tying three game losing streak dating back to last year...it was his first win since May 28, 2016... matched his career high by walking four batters...did not allow a hit until Napoli singled with one out in the fourth inning and surrendered his only run on a leadoff home run by Gallo in the fifth...left after six innings with the A's leading 8-1.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) on April 25...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit...became the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 and just the 36th Major Leaguer over that stretch to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings, allow one hit or fewer and not earn a win...walked Trout in the first, allowed a one-out single to Simmons in the fifth and walked Maybin in the eighth... none of the base runners advanced past first base...Ramirez (7.0 ip), Parker (1.0 ip) and Hernandez (1.0 ip) shutout the A's on two hits over the first nine innings.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Houston April 30...allowed a RBI double to Correa in the first, a RBI double to Gattis in the fourth and a two-run single to McCann in the fifth...left after six innings trailing 4-0... Keuchel shut out the A's on two hits over the first seven innings before Oakland scored single runs in the eighth and ninth.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 win over Detroit last Saturday in Oakland...tossed just 3.2 innings and issued a career-high tying four walks...allowed three runs in the second inning on a two-run triple by Romine and a RBI single by Castellanos...loaded the bases with two outs in the fourth and was relieved by Coulombe after tossing 101 pitches... Coulombe allowed one of the inherited runners to score.

HAHN vs. TEXAS: Is 1-1 with a 4.13 ERA (28.1 ip, 33 h, 13 r, 13 er, 8 bb, 12 so, 3 hr) in five career appearances, including four starts...is 1-1 with a 4.43 ERA (11 er in 22.1 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (2 er in 6.0 ip) in one relief ap-

2016 RECAP: Had four separate stints with the A's and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percentage (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...struck out just 23 batters (4.47 per nine innings) and walked 19 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.21, which was the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .273 (27-for-99) against right-handed hitters compared to .361 (30-for-83) against left-handers...surrendered seven of his eight home runs to lefties and had a .663 slugging percentage against lefties, .333 against righties...his career splits are .216 (103-for-476) against righties, .270 (129-for-478) with 15 of his 18 home runs against lefties...has a .418 career slugging percentage against lefties, .277 against righties...had a .226 opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .358 after that... opponents hit .426 with a .449 on-base percentage and .681 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...in 2015, his marks were .215, .277 and .290 respectively...five of the eight home runs he surrendered were solo shots...yielded a .440 average to the first hitter in the batting order.

NIGHT AND DAY: Went 2-1 with a 3.90 ERA and .234 opponents average in five starts during the day, 0-3 with a 9.92 ERA and .427 opponents average in four starts at night...his career splits are 9-4 with a 2.39 ERA (28 er in 105.1 ip) in 17 day games, 7-12 with a 4.66 ERA (76 er in 146.2 ip) in 28 night games.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents were successful in each of their seven stolen base attempts off him after going 5-for-9 (55.6%) over his first two seasons...the A's were 5-4 (.556) in his starting assignments...tossed more than six innings in just three of his nine starts...has done that in just 12 of 42 starts in his career...the bullpen blew a save in three of his nine starts.

NASHVILLE: Went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA and .276 opponents batting average in 15 starts with Nashville...surrendered just four home runs in 68.2 innings, an average of 0.54 per nine innings...however, issued 34 walks (4.59 per nine innings) and struck out just 46 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.35...went 0-7 with a 4.71 ERA in 10 starts at home where he allowed all four of his home runs

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (0-1, 4.22 ERA): Is scheduled to make the 101st appearance and 99th start of his career...began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)...made two rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL May 1...has made two starts since his return...including a no decision in his last start, an 8-6 A's win over Detroit last Sunday in Oakland (4.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 8-3 with a 2.51 ERA (82.1 ip, 67 h, 24 r, 23 er, 26 bb, 72 so, 7 hr) in 12 career starts against Texas... the wins are his most against any team and are the most by any pitcher against Texas over the last four years...is 6-0 with a 1.45 ERA (7 er in 43.1 ip) in six starts in Texas...his ERA at Globe Life Park is the lowest by any pitcher with a minimum of 30 innings...went 0-0 with a 15.75 ERA in two spring training starts...opponents went 6-for-17 (.353) with four walks.

- The A's relievers have allowed eight unearned runs this season, which
 is tied for third-most in the AL.

Last Year: Went 2-5 with 31 saves and a 3.57 ERA in 62 relief appearances with San Francisco...ranked sixth in the NL in saves but had a career-high nine blown saves, which tied for the most in the majors...struck out a career-high 65 batters.
