OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-19) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (17-20)

SATURDAY, MAY 13, 2017 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. CDT RHP SONNY GRAY (0-1, 4.22) VS. RHP NICK MARTINEZ (0-2, 5.18) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost the series opener last night after winning five of their previous seven games...had lost eight of nine prior to the 5-2 stretch... are 16-19 (.457) for the season...are tied for fourth place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 8½ games... have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, five days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and one day in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 12 home runs in the last six games and have 46 for the season, which is tied for fourth in the American League... Yonder Alonso has 11 home runs and Khris Davis 10 and Oakland is the only AL team with two players with 10 or more home runs...the A's are 15-12 when homering, 1-7 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is the second worst in the AL (Detroit, 1-8)...the pitching staff has allowed 19 home runs in the last 13 games after yielding just 16 over the first 22 contests...have allowed 35 home runs for the season, which is tied for third fewest in the AL...the A's are 12-6 when out-homering the opponent.

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 3.38 ERA on the last homestand after posting a 5.05 ERA on the previous road trip...have the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.237) and fifth lowest slugging percentage (.384) in the American League...have hit the most batters in the majors (19) and are second in the AL in wild pitches (17).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-9 with a 4.60 ERA (47 er in 92.0 ip) over the last 17 games after going 9-5 with a 3.83 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 12-14 with a 4.20 ERA for the season...that includes 6-4 with a 2.44 ERA (21 er in 77.1 ip) by Andrew Triggs and Jesse Hahn and 6-10 with a 5.40 ERA (68 er in 113.1 ip) by everyone else...starters are tied for fourth in the American League in most losses (14) and rank fifth in highest ERA (4.20) and fourth in fewest innings pitched (190.2)...have allowed just 19 home runs, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the majors...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.373) and batting average (.235) in the AL...have the most hit batters (12) and are tied for the second most decisions (26)...have used eight different starting pitchers, which is tied with Los Angeles and Baltimore for second most in the AL (TOR, 9).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored three runs or fewer in four straight games (2-2)...have scored 131 runs for the season, which is the second fewest in the American League...have gone 2-for-25 (.080) with runners in scoring position over their last four games and are .203 (48-for-236) with RISP for the season, which is the worst mark in the majors...are fourth in the American League in extra base hits (108)...however, have the third most strikeouts (306) and the third lowest batting average (.232).

DESIGNATED HITTERS: Ryon Healy's game-ending home run last Sunday was the first home run of any type by an A's designated hitter since Healy homered in the second game of the season (April 4 vs. Los Angeles)...it snapped a 28-game homerless streak by A's designated hitters... A's designated hitters rank last in the American League in RBI (6), are tied for the lowest batting average (.171), and have the second fewest home runs (2)

LEADOFF HITTERS: The A's have started five different batters in the leadoff spot and they are hitting a combined .171 (24-for-140) with 17 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .264 on-base percentage)...the batting average and the on-base percentage are second lowest in the majors...leadoff hitters are 5-for-31 (.161) with four walks, a double and home run to start the game.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 17 errors in the last 15 games and have a Major League leading 34 errors for the season...the errors have led to 24 unearned runs, which is tied for the most in the majors (Chicago-NL)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...seven of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors.

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been successful in 26-of-34 (76.5%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are the most allowed in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...the A's offense has five

stolen bases in the last five games after stealing just nine bases over the 30 contests.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are on a six-game road trip to Texas (0-1) and Seattle (three games)...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3), Houston (1-2) and Minnesota (1-2) and are 5-11 (.313) on the road, which is the second worst record in the AL...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and are 11-8 (.579) at home for the season...have won four straight home series for the first time since May 30-July 24, 2014 when they won eight straight.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 4-3 in one-run games and the seven one-run decisions are tied for the second fewest in the American League...are 3-10 in games decided by five runs or more...the 10 losses are the most in the majors and the 13 games are tied for third most (SEA and TEX, 14)... have a season run differential of -40, which is lowest in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-4 (.636) in day games, 9-15 (.375) at night...each of Oakland's last nine games have lasted at least 2 hours and 54 minutes and the A's average time of game over that stretch is 3:15 (1754 minutes)...are averaging 3:05 for the season, which is tied for third fastest in the American League...however, it is currently the second slowest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000)...the A's had their first walk-off wins of the seasons last Saturday, Sunday and Monday...it marked the sixth time in Oakland history the A's logged three straight walk-off victories (last: June 1-3, 2004)...the three walk-off wins are tied for third most in the majors (LAA and TEX, 4)...the wins are also the A's first last at bat victories of the season after going 0-2 over the first 29 games...have two wins when trailing after eight innings, which is also tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Josh Phegley from the 7-day concussion disabled list yesterday and now have seven players on the DL (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Manaea, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski)... Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Axford, Bassitt, Manaea, and Mengden are currently on rehab assignments...have used the DL 12 times this year...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to April 15...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. RANGERS: The Rangers lead the season series, 4-3...the A's have won two of three games in Oakland but have lost three of four at Texas...lost the season series last year when they went 9-10 against the Rangers...it marked the fourth consecutive year the season series finished 10-9...Oakland won two of those series and lost two and are 41-42 against Texas over the last five seasons...are 344-357 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 180-170 in Oakland and 164-187 in Texas... are 97-99 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 441-439against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso has five home runs in his last six games and 11 for the season, which is a new career high...his previous high of nine came in 155 games in 2012...is batting .324 (11-for-34) with seven home runs and 13 RBI in 10 games in May...leads the majors in home runs this month and tops the American League in RBI...**Khris Davis** snapped his Athletics franchise record for consecutive games with a strikeout by a non-pitcher (21) yesterday...previous mark was 19 held by Jack Cust.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1981** Matt Keough improves to 6-0 as the A's defeat the Yankees at New York, 5-4...in **1986** Dave Kingman hits a three-run homer in the bottom of the 10th inning after the A's score single runs in the seventh, eighth and ninth innings in a 6-3 win over Toronto...in **2007** the A's score five times in the bottom of the ninth inning to defeat Cleveland, 10-7... Milton Bradley hits a two-run home run to tie the game and Jack Cust hits a three-run homer for the win as he homers in his fourth consecutive game.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make the 101st appearance and 99th start of his career...began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)...made two rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL May 1...has made two starts since his return.

GRAY vs. TEXAS: Is 8-3 with a 2.51 ERA (82.1 ip, 67 h, 24 r, 23 er, 26 bb, 72 so, 7 hr) in 12 career starts... the wins are his most against any team and are the most by any pitcher against Texas over the last four years...is 6-0 with a 1.45 ERA (7 er in 43.1 ip) in six starts in Texas and 2-3 with a 3.69 ERA (16 er in 39.0 ip) in six starts in Oakland...his ERA at Globe Life Park is the lowest by any pitcher with a minimum of 30 innings...was 1-0 with a 6.00 ERA (12.0 ip, 13 h, 8 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 11 so, 4 hr) in two starts

2016 RECAP: Went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than $2\frac{1}{2}$ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons...also had career highs in losses (11), home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475) and matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his average of 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings was a career low and his 3.23 walks per nine innings were a career high...had the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (.313) and the second most wild pitches...the wild pitches tied for sixth most in Oakland history and matched the most by an Athletic over the last 24 years... now has 46 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53)...the winning percentage tied for 10th lowest in Oakland history...among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched, he had the fourth highest ERA in the AL and the highest by an A's pitcher since 2000 (Olivares, 6.75)

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .286 (66-for-231) against right-handed hitters and .286 (67-for-234) against left-handers...surrendered 12 of his 18 home runs to righties...11 of the home runs were solo shots...the eight and nine hitters in the order batted a combined .467 with seven home runs and 21 RBI...however, held the five hitter to a .176 average, no home runs and four RBI...based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, his .468 average against the number eight hitter was the highest by a Major Leaguer since at least 1974...his .465 average against the nine hitter was third highest over that span and the highest since 1999 (Loaiza, TEX .500)...his mark against the five hitter tied for fourth lowest in the AL in 2016...using the 100 inning minimum, he had the fourth highest average with runners in scoring position in the AL (.330), tied for the fifth highest average when opponents put the first pitch in play (.467) and had the seventh highest average against batters leading off an inning (.321)...had a .233 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .318 after that.

THE BIG INNING: Yielded six runs in an inning once, five runs three times and four runs twice...he allowed 58 of his 80 runs in the single biggest inning of his 22 starts (25.13 ERA)...had a 1.84 ERA in all other innings.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Went 2-3 with a 7.52 ERA in six starts after the All-Star Break after going 3-8 with a 5.16 ERA in 16 starts before the break...the eight losses were two more than his combined pre-break total from the previous two seasons (20-6, 2.42 ERA in 37 starts)...is now 23-15 with a 3.16 ERA (124 er in 352.2 ip) in 56 career appearances before the All-Star Break compared to 15-17 with a 3.79 ERA (112 er in 266.0 ip) in 44 games after the break.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 2.05 ERA in the first inning, a 3.43 ERA in the second inning and a 7.42 ERA from the third inning on...went 2-8 with a 6.50 ERA in 12 starts on four days rest, 3-3 with a 4.73 ERA in 10 starts on five days rest or more...is now 19-20 with a 3.63 ERA (134 er in 332.2 ip) in 52 career starts on four days rest, 19-12 with a 3.26 ERA (102 er in 282.0 ip) in his other 46 starts...the A's were 7-15 (.318) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than five innings in five of his starts...had just three such starts over the first three years of his career.

- The bullpen snapped a three-game streak of not allowing a run last night...it was the first time the bullpen allowed four or more runs since May 2 at Minnesota (5 runs).
- Have a combined 11 stolen bases against, which is second-most in the American League.
- A's relievers have tossed at least four innings 12 times this season...they have pitched three or more innings in 25-of-35 games.
- Are 8-for-12 in save chances...have converted six of their last eight after starting the season 2-for-4...three different relievers have recorded at least one save (Casilla, 6; Doolittle, 1; Madson, 1).
- The A's relievers have allowed eight unearned runs this season, which is tied for third-most in the AL.
- Are tied for fourth in the AL in wild pitches with seven.
