OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-20) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (18-20)

SUNDAY, MAY 14, 2017 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 2:05 P.M. CDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (2-2, 3.67) VS. RHP A.J. GRIFFIN (4-0, 2.45) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (KFOX 98.5 FM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight at Texas after winning five of their previous seven games...had lost eight of nine prior to the 5-2 stretch... are 16-20 (.444) for the season...are in fifth place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by a season-high nine games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, five days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and two days in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 13 home runs in the last seven games and have 47 for the season, which is tied for fourth in the American League...Yonder Alonso has 12 home runs and Khris Davis 10 and Oakland is the only AL team with two players with 10 or more home runs... the A's are 15-13 when homering, 1-7 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is the second worst in the AL (Detroit, 1-8)...the pitching staff has allowed 19 home runs in the last 14 games after yielding just 16 over the first 22 contests...have allowed 35 home runs for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the AL...the A's are 12-7 when out-homering the opponent.

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 3.38 ERA on the last homestand after posting a 5.05 ERA on the previous road trip...have the fifth lowest opponents batting average (.239) and fourth lowest slugging percentage (.384) in the American League...have hit the most batters in the majors (19) and are second in the AL in wild pitches (18).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-9 with a 4.50 ERA (49 er in 98.0 ip) over the last 18 games after going 9-5 with a 3.83 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 12-14 with a 4.16 ERA for the season...that includes 6-4 with a 2.44 ERA (21 er in 77.1 ip) by Andrew Triggs and Jesse Hahn and 6-10 with a 5.28 ERA (70 er in 119.1 ip) by everyone else...starters are tied for fourth in the American League in most losses (14) and are tied for fourth in fewest innings pitched (196.2)...have allowed just 19 home runs, which is the fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.370) and second lowest batting average (.235) in the AL...have the most hit batters (12) and are tied for the third most decisions (26)...have used eight different starting pitchers, which is tied with Los Angeles and Baltimore for third most in the AL (SEA/TOR, 9).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored three runs or fewer in four of their last five games...have scored 136 runs for the season, which is the second fewest in the American League...have gone 5-for-32 (.156) with runners in scoring position over their last five games and are .210 (51-for-243) with RISP for the season, which is the third lowest mark in the AL...are third in the American League in extra base hits (110)...however, have the third most strikeouts (311) and the third lowest batting average (.234).

DESIGNATED HITTERS: Ryon Healy's game-ending home run last Sunday was the first home run of any type by an A's designated hitter since Healy homered in the second game of the season (April 4 vs. Los Angeles)...it snapped a 28-game homerless streak by A's designated hitters... A's designated hitters rank last in the American League in RBI (6), have the second lowest batting average (.180), and have the second fewest home runs (2).

LEADOFF HITTERS: The A's have started five different batters in the leadoff spot and they are hitting a combined .174 (25-for-144) with 17 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .264 on-base percentage)...the batting average is tied for the lowest and the on-base percentage is second lowest in the majors...leadoff hitters are 5-for-32 (.156) with four walks, a double and home run to start the game.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 17 errors in the last 16 games and have a Major League leading 34 errors for the season...the errors have led to 24 unearned runs, which is the second most in the majors (Chicago-NL, 25)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...seven of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors.

ON THE BASES: A's opponents have been successful in 29-of-37 (78.4%) stolen base attempts...the stolen bases are the most allowed in the American League and second most in the majors...the A's offense has five stolen bases in the last six games after stealing just nine bases over the 30 contests.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are on a six-game road trip to Texas (0-2) and Seattle (three games)...with last night's loss, are now 1-5-0 in road series and 4-1-1 in home series...are 2-10 in their last 12 road games after starting the season 3-2...went 2-7 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (0-3), Houston (1-2) and Minnesota (1-2) and are 5-12 (.294) on the road, which is tied for the worst record in the AL (Kansas City)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and are 11-8 (.579) at home for the season...have won four straight home series for the first time since May 30-July 24, 2014 when they won eight straight.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 4-4 in one-run games and the eight one-run decisions are third fewest in the American League...are 3-10 in games decided by five runs or more...the 10 losses are the most in the majors and the 13 games are tied for third most with Cincinnati (SEA, 15; TEX, 14)... have a season run differential of -41, which is lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors (San Francisco, -66; San Diego, -59).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-4 (.636) in day games, 9-16 (.360) at night...each of Oakland's last 10 games have lasted at least 2 hours and 54 minutes and the A's average time of game over that stretch is 3:16 (1960 minutes)...are averaging 3:05 for the season, which is tied for second fastest in the American League...however, it is currently the second slowest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000)...the A's had their first walk-off wins of the seasons last Saturday, Sunday and Monday...it marked the sixth time in Oakland history the A's logged three straight walk-off victories (last: June 1-3, 2004)...the three walk-off wins are tied for fourth most in the majors (LAA/TEX/WAS, 4)...the wins are also the A's first last at bat victories of the season after going 0-2 over the first 29 games...have two wins when trailing after eight innings, which is also tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Josh Phegley from the 7-day concussion disabled list Friday and now have seven players on the DL (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Manaea, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Axford, Bassitt, Manaea, and Mengden are currently on rehab assignments...have used the DL 12 times this year...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to April 15...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. RANGERS: The Rangers lead the season series, 5-3...the A's have won two of three games in Oakland but have lost four of five at Texas...lost the season series last year when they went 9-10 against the Rangers... it marked the fourth consecutive year the season series finished 10-9... Oakland won two of those series and lost two and are 41-43 against Texas over the last five seasons...are 344-358 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 180-170 in Oakland and 164-188 in Texas...are 97-100 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 441-440 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso has six home runs in his last seven games and 12 for the season, which is a new career high...his previous high of nine came in 155 games in 2012...is batting .342 (13-for-38) with eight home runs and 15 RBI in 11 games in May...leads the majors in home runs this month and is tied for second in RBI...is tied for the major league lead in home runs by a first baseman...leads AL first basemen in RBI, average (.305), and OPS (1.082)...**Khris Davis** is 10-for-72 (.139) with 31 strikeouts over his last 20 games (since April 20)...four of his 10 hits have gone for extra bases (three home runs, one double)...the **A's bullpen** has given up eight earned runs over its last two games (3.1 ip) after allowing seven earned runs over its previous eight games and 32.0 innings (1.97 ERA)...

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1941** the A's walk 19 times against St. Louis but lose 10-5...in **1988** Bob Welch tosses a five hit shutout as the A's win at Baltimore, 8-0...in **1995** Geronimo Berroa and Terry Steinbach have four RBI each in the A's 12-3 win at Minnesota...the A's hit five home runs, including two by Berroa.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (2-2, 3.67 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list April 27...is 0-2 with a 5.51 ERA (10 er in 16.1 ip) in three starts since his return...was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA in three starts when he was placed on the DL list April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder.

THE FIRST INNING: Allowed two runs in his last start, both in the first inning...has yielded six of his 14 runs this year in the first inning (9.00 ERA)...has a 2.54 ERA (8 er in 28.1 ip) from the second inning on...last year, he allowed just six runs in the first inning for the entire season for a 1.74 ERA...that tied Arrieta (CHC) for second lowest in the majors (Tanaka, NYY 1.16) among pitchers with 30 or more innings...using the same minimum, it was 10th lowest in Oakland history

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.50 ERA (5 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 4.96 ERA (9 er in 16.1 ip) in three starts on the road...last year, he went 5-6 with a 3.39 ERA in 14 starts at home compared to 5-5 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts on the road...had the ninth lowest home ERA in the American League...surrendered seven home runs in 90.1 innings at home, 15 in 95.2 innings on the road.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Is tied for second among American League pitchers in double plays (2) and tied for first in errors (2)...tied for sixth in total chances (11)...turned the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history April 27 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was by Blue Moon Odom, also against the Angels, in the second game of a July 11, 1971 doubleheader...last year, he tied for third among AL pitchers in total chances (42), tied for seventh in assists (27) and ranked eighth in putouts (15)...did not commit an error and his 42 total chances were the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors among pitchers with no errors.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed two runs or fewer in five of his six starts... opponents are 9-for-47 (.191) with runners on base, including 3-for-23 (.130) with runners in scoring position...the opponents number five hitter is 7-for-11 (.636) with six RBI but the six hitter is 0-for-14.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day April 3 in Oakland...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)... is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Trout in the third inning... those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas April 8...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings, allowing just two base runners on an Odor walk and Lucroy reach on error in the second...then retired 15 straight before Napoli homered with two outs in the bottom of the seventh...that was the only run he allowed in seven innings of work.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-2 loss to Houston on April 14 in Oakland...did not strike out a batter in 5.0 innings, his first career start without a strikeout...the A's scored once in the second inning and he kept the Astros off the board over the first four innings, despite three hits, two walks and a hit batter...then allowed a leadoff home run to Aoki in the fifth inning and left after five innings and 74 pitches with the scored tied 1-1.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 27...allowed a RBI single to Pujols and a RBI double to Cron in the first inning but retired each of the next eight batters...shutout the Angels on three hits over his final five innings...Oakland was held to a run on three hits by Nolasco and four relievers.

FIFTH START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-4 loss at Minnesota May 3...issued a career-high tying four walks...allowed a tworun single to Vargas in the first inning but the A's got one of those runs back in the third...then surrendered a three-run home run to Vargas in the bottom of the third...Oakland scored twice in the fourth to cut the lead to 5--3but he allowed a leadoff triple to Buxton in the bottom of the fourth...was relieved by Hendriks who allowed the inherited runner to score

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) last Monday in Oakland...surrendered a two-run home run to Valbuena in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow... shutout the Angels on five hits and a walk over his final six innings...the A's scored single runs in the fourth and fifth innings to tie the game and won it on a Lowrie walk-off home run in the 11th.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 2.29 ERA in five starts this spring...held the opposition to a .188 (13-for-69) batting average and walked just three batters in 19.2 innings (1.37 walks per nine innings)... allowed one run or fewer in four of his five starts...also started the exhibition game against Italy's World Baseball Classic team on March 8 and picked up the win (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 3 so)...pitched in a minor league game March 29.

2016 RECAP: Compiled a 10-11 record and a 4.11 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts in his second season with the A's...went 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts, 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA over his next 16 starts from May 30 to Aug. 24, and 0-3 with a 4.71 ERA over his final six starts...in addition to starts, he also led the A's in wins, losses (tied), innings pitched (186.0), hits (196), runs (87), earned runs (85), home runs (22) and walks (47)...all those marks are career highs as are his 108 strikeouts...the 47 walks were the fewest in Athletics history by an A's team-leader, besting the previous low of 59 by Sonny Gray in 2015...averaged 5.23 strikeouts per nine innings, which was the third lowest mark in the American League...tied for second in the AL in shutouts (1), tied for fifth in complete games (2), tied for sixth in opponents reaching on an error (8), ranked seventh in fewest pitches per game (91.4) and was ninth in hits (196)...averaged 4.16 runs of support per start, which was 10th lowest in the AL...received two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 31 starts and was 0-8 in those games...went 10-3 in 19 starts with support of three or more...is now 1-18 in 28 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 17-4 in 30 starts with three runs of support or more...left with a lead five times in 2016 only to have the bullpen blow the save...had a .271 opponents batting average, which broke down to .270 (90-for-333) against right-handed hitters compared to .272 (106-for-390) with 35 of his 47 walks against left-handers...his career splits are .269 (175-for-650) with a .738 OPS against right-handers, .270 (182-for-675) with 65 of his 95 walks and a .742 OPS against left-handers... yielded a .302 average with runners on base but 14 of the 22 home runs he allowed were solo shots...26 of his 42 career home runs have come with the bases empty.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (1-2, 5.18 ERA): Is scheduled to be reinstated from the 10-day disabled list tomorrow...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he placed on the DL April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville last Tuesday against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...tossed 72 pitches...was the losing pitcher in his last Major League start, an 8-5 loss at Los Angeles on April 26 (2.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 so)...has held left-handed hitters to a .105 batting average compared to .214 by right-handers...is 1-0 with a 3.18 ERA in three starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 9.82 ERA in two starts on the road...is 3-0 with a 3.91 ERA (23.0 ip, 20 h, 10 r, 10 er, 8 bb, 21 so, 2 hr) in four career starts against Seattle...including a win in his only start this year, a 3-1 A's win in Oakland on April 21 (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so).

- The bullpen has allowed eight earned runs over its last two games (3.1 ip) after allowing two or fewer in each of its previous eight games (7 er in 32.0 ip, 1.97 ERA).
- A reliever has figured in the decision in five of the A's last seven games (3-2 record by relievers, 4-3 overall during stretch).
- Have a combined 12 stolen bases against, which is third most in the American League.
- A's relievers have tossed at least four innings 12 times this season...they have pitched three or more innings in 25-of-36 games.
- Are 8-for-13 in save chances...have blown saves in two straight games and are 3-for-6 in save chances since April 23 after starting the season 5-for-7...five blown saves have come from four different relievers (Casilla 2; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each)
- As relievers have allowed eight unearned runs this season, which is tied for third most in the AL.
- Are tied for second in the AL in wild pitches with eight.

- Allowed a season-high four hits and four runs Friday at Texas...it was his second blown save and second loss of the season.
