OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-21) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (17-21)

MONDAY, MAY 15, 2017 — SAFECO FIELD — 7:10 P.M. PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (1-2, 5.18) VS. RHP YOVANI GALLARDO (1-3, 4.58) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept in a three-game series at Texas to start the road trip after winning four of the final five games on the last homestand...are a season-high tying five games under .500 for the third time this year (11-16 on May 3, 12-17 on May 5)...are 16-21 (.432), which is tied with Kansas City for the worst record in the American League and tied for seventh worst in the majors...remain in fifth place in the AL West for the second consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 9½ games...this marks just the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 9½ games after 37 games or fewer (1979, 2001, 2015)... have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, five days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and three days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on this six-game road trip to Texas (0-3) and Seattle (three games) and are 5-13 (.278) on the road, which is the worst mark in the majors...went 2-7 on the last road trip and have lost 11 of the last 13 road games after winning three of the first five...are 1-5-0 in road series compared to 4-1-1 in home series...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and are 11-8 (.579) at home...return home following the game Wednesday for a six-game homestand against Boston (four games) and Miami (two games)... have won four straight home series for the first time since May 30-July 24, 2014 when they won eight straight.

PITCHING: The A's have a 6.29 ERA (17 er in 24.1 ip) over the first three games of the road trip after posting a 3.38 ERA on the last homestand... have a 4.97 ERA (84 er in 152.0 ip) on the road this year, compared to 3.90 (75 er in 173.0 ip) at home...have a 4.40 ERA overall, which is third highest in the American League...have hit the most batters in the majors (19)...rank second in the AL in wild pitches (20) and have the fourth fewest strikeouts (271).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-9 with a 4.56 ERA (53 er in 104.2 ip) over the last 19 games after going 9-5 with a 3.83 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 12-14 with a 4.20 ERA for the season...that includes 6-4 with a 2.44 ERA (21 er in 77.1 ip) by Andrew Triggs and Jesse Hahn and 6-10 with a 5.29 ERA (74 er in 126.0 ip) by everyone else...starters have not allowed a home run in the last four games and have surrendered just 19 for the season, which is the fewest in the majors...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors (.370) and rank third in the American League in opponents batting average (.238)...have the most hit batters in the AL (12) and are tied for the third most decisions (26).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 20 runs over their last six games (3.33 per game), 14 of which have come on home runs...are 6-for-38 (.158) with runners in scoring position over that span and are batting .2088 (52-for-249) with RISP for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors (CLE, .2089)...have the second fewest runs scored in the American League (140) and the fourth lowest batting average (.236) and on-base percentage (.304)...however, are tied for third in doubles (61) and extra base hits (114) and rank fourth in slugging percentage (.414)...A's designated hitters are batting .182 (25-for-137) with two home runs and six RBI...the RBI are the fewest in the AL, the batting average is tied for last with Kansas City and the home runs are second fewest (DET, 1).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in a season-high eight consecutive games (16 home runs total) and have 50 home runs for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...it is tied with the 1996 A's for third most in franchise history after 37 games (55 in 2000, 52 in 2002)... Yonder Alonso has 12 home runs and Khris Davis 10 and Oakland is the only AL team with two players with 10 or more home runs...the A's are 15-14 when homering, 1-7 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-9)...the pitching staff has allowed 19 home runs in the last 15 games after yielding just 16 over the first 22 contests...have allowed 35 home runs for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (CLE, 33)...the A's are 12-8 when out-homering the opponent.

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting a combined .174 (26for-149) with 17 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .262 on-base percentage)... the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the on-base percentage is second lowest (KC, .216)...leadoff hitters are 5-for-33 (.152) with four walks, a double and home run to start the game. **DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 34 errors, which is the most in the majors...the errors have led to 24 unearned runs, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...seven of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...five have been made by catchers, which is tied for the most in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's allowed seven stolen bases in the three-game series at Texas and have yielded 32 for the season, which is second most in the majors (PIT, 36)...opponents have been successful in 32-of-41 (78.0%) attempts, which is fourth highest in the American League...the A's offense has five stolen bases in the last seven games after stealing just nine bases over the 30 contests.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 4-4 in one-run games and the eight onerun decisions are third fewest in the American League...are 10-6 (.625) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the third best record in the AL...are 6-15 (.286) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the worst record in the majors...have a season run differential of -43, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors (SD, -65; SF, -61).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 3-1 on Monday, which is their best mark for any day of the week...each of Oakland's last 11 games have lasted at least 2 hours and 51 minutes and the A's average time of game over that stretch is 3:13...are averaging 3:05 for the season, which is tied for second fastest in the American League...however, it is currently the second slowest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000)...the A's have three walk-off wins and two walk-off losses...the three wins are tied for third most in the AL...are 3-3 in games decided in the last at bat and the three wins are tied for third fewest in the AL...have two wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 3)...have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most in the majors (DET and WASH, 3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Sean Manaea from the disabled list today and now have six players on the DL (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Axford, Bassitt and Mengden are currently on rehab assignments...have used the DL 12 times this year...have had at least five players on the DL all year and at least seven every day dating back to April 15...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. MARINERS: The won three of four in Oakland from April 20-23 to open the season series...lost the season series last year for the fourth consecutive season as they went 7-12...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...went 6-4 in Seattle but were 1-8 in Oakland, which matched the A's worst mark ever against the Mariners in the Coliseum (2007)...11 of the 19 games last year were decided by one run...are 33-47 (.413) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the worst record by any American League team against Seattle...all-time, the A's are 337-271 against the Mariners...that includes 183-123 in Oakland, 153-147 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 77-83 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso has six home runs in his last eight games and 12 for the season, which is a new career high...his previous high of nine came in 155 games in 2012...is batting .310 (13-for-42) with eight home runs and 15 RBI in May...leads the majors in home runs this month and tops the American League in RBI...*Trevor Plouffe* has a six-game hitting streak (9-for-22, .409) after going 3-for-29 (.103) over his previous nine games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1958** Ned Garver tosses a seven-hit shutout and Vic Power hits a three-run home run to account for all the offense in a 3-0 Kansas City win over Chicago...in **1985** the A's set what was then a club record for margin of victory when they defeat the Brewers at Milwaukee 19-3... Mike Davis homers twice and drives in six runs and four Athletics collect three hits each...in **2016** Danny Valencia hits three home runs, including the game-winning two-run shot in the ninth inning of the A's 7-6 win at Tampa Bay.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (1-2, 5.18 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list today... was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he placed on the DL April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville last Tuesday against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so)... tossed 72 pitches...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed an unearned run on a Carlos Asuaje RBI single in the third...also yielded a Christian Villanueva sacrifice fly in the fourth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has held left-handed hitters to a .105 (2-for-19) batting average compared to .214 (15-for-70) by right-handers...surrendered his only home run to a lefty...last year, his opponents batting average included a .180 (18-for-100) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .263 (117-for-445) against right-handers...based on a minimum of 140 innings pitched, the mark against lefties was second lowest in the AL and the lowest in Oakland history (previous: .185, Norris, 1980)...allowed 17 of his 20 home runs and issued 33 of his 37 walks to righties for a .754 OPS... had a .526 OPS against lefties, which was second lowest in the AL and in Oakland history (.504, Norris, 1980).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 3.18 ERA (6 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 9.82 ERA (8 er in 7.1 ip) in two starts on the road...last year, he was 5-3 with a 3.02 ERA in 14 games (13 starts) at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.99 ERA in 11 starts on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League...is now 6-3 with a 3.05 ERA (34 er in 100.1 ip) in 17 career games in the Coliseum compared to 2-8 with a 5.50 ERA (42 er in 68.2 ip) in 13 starts on the road.

THE FIRST INNING: Has not allowed a run in the first inning and opponents are 1-for-15 (.067)...last year, he had a 1.13 ERA in the first inning, which was the lowest in the majors and third lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with 20 or more innings...now has a 0.93 ERA (3 er in 29.0 ip) in the first inning in his career.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 2-for-46 (.043) with two strikes... they are 1-for-19 (.053) when leading of an inning but he has walked four and hit three for a .308 on-base percentage...opponents are batting .094 (5-for-53) with the bases empty compared to .333 (12-for-36) with runners on base...however, they are 5-for-22 (.227) with runners in scoring position...the opponents number three hitter is 1-for-11 (.091)...last year, he held the three hitter to a .197 average, which was fifth lowest in the AL... has a .300 (12-for-40) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup this year, .102 (5-for-49) after that.

THIS AND THAT: Has hit four batters, which is tied for second in the American League and matches his season total from last year (144.2 innings)... allowed five hits or fewer while tossing at least five innings in each of his first four starts...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...the longest is a five-game streak by Mike Norris in 1980

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Los Angeles (AL) April 4 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed three runs in the second inning on a two-run single by Maldonado and a RBI single from Escobar...an RBI triple by Trout in the fifth inning increased the Angels lead to 4-2 and he was relieved by Hendriks to start the seventh... the A's scored four times in the bottom of the seventh to get him off the hook.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss at Texas April 9...struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...allowed a three-run home run to Gallo in the second inning...loaded the bases with one out in the sixth and was relieved by Montas, who allowed all three runs to score.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-6 loss to Houston in Oakland on April 15...tossed 5.0 hitless innings but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...had a 5-0 lead when he walked the bases loaded to start the sixth inning...fielding errors by Rosales and Decker allowed two of those runs to score...the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss.

FOURTH START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 3-1 victory over Seattle April 21 in Oakland...allowed his only run in six innings of work in the third inning when Heredia singled with two outs and scored on a Haniger triple...retired the side in order just once: the fifth...the A's

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 26...left the game after 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed a RBI double to Espinosa, a RBI single to Maybin and a RBI double to Maldonado in the second... was relieved by Montas to start the third.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins... the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...allowed a .248 opponents batting average and walked 37 batters for a .298 on-base percentage...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL...opponents hit .192 with runners in scoring position, which was third lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings pitched... received one run of support or fewer in 10 of his 24 starts and went 0-6 with a 3.90 ERA in those contests...tied for eighth in the AL with three pickoffs and opponents were successful in 3-of-7 (42.9%) stolen base attempts off him.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Andrew Triggs (5-2, 2.21 ERA): Is tied for third in the American League in wins (5), ranks fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.275), sixth in ERA (2.21) and opponents OPS (.546) and eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.271)...has surrendered just one home run and his average of 0.22 home runs per nine innings is third lowest...is 3-1 with a 1.11 ERA in four starts at night compared to 2-1 with a 3.86 ERA in three starts during the day...is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts on the road compared to 3-2 with a 3.25 ERA in five starts at home...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's win over Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...is 0-1 with a 14.85 ERA (6.2 ip, 11 h, 11 r, 11 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 3 hr) in two career appearances, including one start, against Seattle...the start came in his only outing this year, a loss in the A's 11-1 loss in Oakland April 23 (4.2 ip, 5 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 4 so).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

4-7, 4.73 ERA (64 er in 121.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 8-for-14 (57.1%)

- The bullpen has allowed 10 earned runs over its last three games (4.2 ip, 19.29 ERA) after allowing two or fewer in each of its previous eight games (7 er in 32.0 ip, 1.97 ERA).
- Are 8-for-14 in save chances...have blown saves in three straight games...have not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...have never blown a save in four straight games...the six total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, 2; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, Madson, 1 each).
- A reliever has figured in the decision in six of the A's last eight games (3-3 record by relievers, 4-4 overall during stretch).
- Have a combined 13 stolen bases against, which is tied for second most in the American League.
- A's relievers have tossed at least four innings 12 times this season...they have pitched three or more innings in 25-of-37 games.
- A's relievers have allowed eight unearned runs this season, which is tied for third most in the AL.
- Are tied for second in the AL in wild pitches with eight.

- Has an 8.44 ERA (5 er in 5.1 ip) on the road this season and a 3.00 ERA (3 er in 9.0 ip) at home.
- His four stolen bases allowed are tied for the second most in the AL among relievers.
