OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-22) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (18-21)

TUESDAY, MAY 16, 2017 — SAFECO FIELD — 7:10 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of the first four games of the road trip after winning four of the final five games on the last homestand...the four-game losing streak is one short of the season high of five (April 23-28)...are a season-high six games under .500 at 16-22 (.421)...that is the worst record in the American League and tied for sixth worst in the majors...remain in fifth place in the AL West for the third consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 10½ games...this marks just the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 10½ games after 38 games or fewer (1979, 2001, 2015)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, five days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and four days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-4 on this six-game road trip to Texas (0-3) and Seattle (0-1) and the four-game road losing streak is one short of the season high of five (April 13-28)...have lost seven of the last eight road games and 12 of the last 14...are 5-14 (.263) on the road for the season, which is the worst mark in the majors...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1) and are 11-8 (.579) at home...return home following the game tomorrow for a six-game homestand against Boston (four games) and Miami (two games)...are 1-5-0 in road series compared to 4-1-1 in home series...have won four straight home series for the first time since May 30-July 24, 2014 when they won eight straight.

PITCHING: The A's have a 6.12 ERA (22 er in 32.1 ip) over the first four games of the road trip after posting a 3.38 ERA on the last homestand...have a 5.01 ERA (89 er in 160.0 ip) on the road this year, compared to 3.90 (75 er in 173.0 ip) at home...have a 4.43 ERA overall, which is third highest in the American League...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.384)...are tied with San Diego for the most hit batters in the majors (19)...have 20 wild pitches, which is second most in the AL to Seattle (22).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-10 with a 4.68 ERA (57 er in 109.2 ip) over the last 21 games after going 9-5 with a 3.83 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 12-15 with a 4.28 ERA for the season...that includes 6-4 with a 2.44 ERA (21 er in 77.1 ip) by Andrew Triggs and Jesse Hahn and 6-11 with a 5.36 ERA (78 er in 131.0 ip) by everyone else...starters have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (20) and have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.368)...have the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.235)...have the most hit batters in the AL (12) and are tied for the third most decisions (26).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 145 runs, which is second fewest in the American League...73 of those runs have scored on home runs (50.3%)...are 6-for-43 (.140) with runners in scoring position over the last seven games and are batting .205 (52-for-254) with RISP for the season, which is the lowest mark in the majors (CLE, .207)...have the third lowest batting average in the American League (.234) but rank fourth in slugging (.414) and extra base hits (118)...A's designated hitters are batting .183 (26-for-142) with two home runs and six RBI...the RBI are the fewest in the AL, the batting average is second lowest (KC, .182) and the home runs are second fewest (DET, 1).

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in a season-high nine consecutive games (18 home runs total) and have 52 home runs for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...the 52 home runs are tied with the 2002 A's for second most in franchise history after 38 games to the 2000 club (57)...with one home run tonight, the A's will have their second most home runs after 39 games (61 in 2000)...the A's are 15-15 when homering, 1-7 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-9)...the pitching staff has allowed 21 home runs in the last 16 games after yielding just 16 over the first 22 contests...has allowed 37 home runs for the season, which is tied for second fewest in the majors (CLE, 35)...the A's are 12-8 when out-homering the opponent.

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting a combined .170 (26-for-153) with 18 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .260 on-base percentage)...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the on-base percentage is second lowest (KC, .216)...leadoff hitters are 5-for-34 (.147) with four walks, a double and home run to start the game.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 35 errors, which is the most in the majors...the errors have led to 25 unearned runs, which is

the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (SD, 27)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...seven of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...five have been made by catchers, which is tied for the most in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's allowed eight stolen bases in the first four games of the road trip and have yielded 33 for the season, which is second most in the majors (PIT, 36)...opponents have been successful in 33-of-42 (78.6%) attempts, which is tied for third highest in the American League...the A's offense has five stolen bases in the last eight games after stealing just nine bases over the 30 contests.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's fell to 4-5 (.444) in one-run games with the loss last night...have the third worst record in one-run games in the American League and are tied for the third fewest games...are 10-7 (.588) in games decided by two runs or fewer, which is the third best record in the AL...are 6-15 (.286) in games decided by three runs or more, which is the worst record in the majors...have a season run differential of -44, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors (SD, -64; SF, -57).

THIS AND THAT: The A's scored five runs last night and allowed just four hits in a 6-5 loss...it marked just the third time in Oakland history the A's had more runs scored than hits allowed and lost (Sept. 5, 1980 at BAL; May 17, 2005 vs. BOS)...the A's have used a different lineup in each of their last 33 games...have used 36 different lineups overall in 38 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...each of Oakland's last 12 games have lasted at least 2 hours and 51 minutes and the A's average time of game over that stretch is 3:14...are averaging 3:05 for the season, which is tied for second fastest in the American League...however, it is currently the second slowest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000)...are 3-3 in games decided in the last at bat and the three wins are tied for third fewest in the AL...have two wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 3)...have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most in the majors (DET and WASH, 3).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Axford, Bassitt and Mengden are currently on rehab assignments...have used the DL 12 times this year...have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series, 3-2...lost the first game in Seattle last night after winning three of four in Oakland...lost the season series last year for the fourth consecutive season as they went 7-12...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...went 6-4 in Seattle but were 1-8 in Oakland, which matched the A's worst mark ever against the Mariners in the Coliseum (2007)...11 of the 19 games last year were decided by one run...are 33-48 (.407) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the worst record by any American League team against Seattle...all-time, the A's are 337-272 against the Mariners...that includes 183-123 in Oakland, 153-148 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 77-84 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso has six home runs in his last nine games and 12 for the season, which is a new career high...his previous high of nine came in 155 games in 2012...leads the majors with eight home runs in May and tops the American league with 15 RBI...**Trevor Plouffe** has a seven-game hitting streak (10-for-26, .385), which matches the A's season high.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1939** the first American League night game is played at Shibe Park but the A's lose to Cleveland 8-3 in 10 innings...in **1975** Vida Blue becomes the second Oakland Athletic to win 100 games as he fires a seven-hitter at Yankee Stadium in the A's 4-2 win...in **1986** Tony Phillips hits for the cycle in the A's 8-4 win at Baltimore...he has five hits, scores two runs and drives in four...it is the first cycle in Oakland history...in **1990** Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire and Ron Hassey hit consecutive homers in the fourth inning of the A's 7-6 win at Cleveland.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (5-2, 2.21 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for third in the American League in wins (5), ranks fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.275), fifth in ERA (2.21) and opponents OPS (.546), eighth in opponents on-base percentage (.271) and ninth in opponents batting average (.209)...has surrendered just one home run in 40.2 innings and his average of 0.22 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the AL...is also tied for third in opponents reaching on an error (4), tied for fourth in stolen bases allowed (5), tied for fifth in unearned runs (5) and tied for sixth in hit batters (4).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.11 ERA (3 er in 24.1 ip) in four starts at night compared to 2-1 with a 3.86 ERA (7 er in 16.1 ip) in three starts during the day.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 r in 13.0 ip) in two starts on the road compared to 3-2 with a 3.25 ERA (10 er in 27.2 ip) in five starts at home...last year, he was 1-0 with a 5.58 ERA in 12 games on the road and 0-1 with a 2.81 ERA in 12 games at home.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .149 (10-for-67) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .256 (22-for-86) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...opponents are 7-for-41 (.177) with runners in scoring position...the cleanup hitter is 3-for-20 (.150).

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season...made six starts in his Major League debut last year...has walked one batter or fewer four of his seven starts this year and 10 of 13 starts in his career...has issued five of his 10 walks in the first inning and just one after the third inning...has allowed eight of his 15 runs in the third inning (5 er in 7.0 ip, 6.43 ERA)...has a 1.34 ERA (5 er in 33.2 ip) in all other innings...has four runs of support in his last four starts after receiving 16 runs of support in his first three...took the loss April 23 against Seattle to snap a career-best four-game winning streak dating back to last year...won each of his first three starts this year to become the first A's pitcher to go 3-0 over his first three starts since Tommy Milone in 2013...went 4-1 with a 1.84 ERA in five starts in the month of April...the four wins match the most by an Oakland pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (eighth time, last: Gray and Kazmir in 2014)...the ERA was second best by an A's pitcher over the last 10 years (Kazmir, 0.99 in 2015).

EARNED RUNS: Has not allowed an earned run in four of his seven starts...began the season with a 17.2-inning streak without allowing an earned run...that was the longest season-opening streak in Oakland history by a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster...it was third longest by any Oakland pitcher...since the earned run became an official stat in the American League in 1913, he is just the third A's pitcher to start the season with three games of five or more innings and no earned runs...joins Eddie Rommel (1924) and Vean Gregg (1918).

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) April 6 in Oakland...issued a career-high three walks...surrendered his only run in the third inning and it was unearned...Escobar led off with a single, went to second on a R.Davis error, third on a ground out and scored on a Pujols ground out...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the third for the win.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Kansas City April 12...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...surrendered four hits and walked one and allowed just three base runners to advance into scoring position...was relieved by Dull to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 8-0.

THIRD START: He improved to 3-0 in the A's 4-2 win over Texas on April 18 in Oakland...shut out the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings but Darvish blanked the A's on one hit over that Span...Triggs then allowed two unearned runs in the sixth when an Alonso error preceded an Andrus RBI single and a Mazara RBI ground out...the A's then scored four times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

FOURTH START: He was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 11-1 loss to Seattle April 23 in Oakland...yielded a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and then surrendered five runs in the third inning on a bases loaded walk to Cruz and a Motter grand slam...was relieved by Coulombe after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0.

FIFTH START: He picked up his fourth win of the season in the A's 2-1 victory at Houston April 29...struck out a career-high nine batters and logged a career-high 7.0 scoreless innings...allowed five runners to advance into scoring position, but set down each of the final 10 batters that he faced.

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss to Detroit on May 5 in Oakland...allowed a career-high eight hits in 5.1 innings of work...was charged with two unearned runs in the third inning when Martinez had a two-run, two-out single after a Rosales error started the inning...then allowed a base loaded three-run triple to Adduci in the sixth inning and left trailing 5-0.

LAST START: He picked up his fifth win of the season in the A's 3-1 victory over Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday in Oakland...walked the first three batters he faced to match his career high in walks...tossed a career-high 105 pitches...those were his only three walks of the game...the first walk (Escobar) scored on a Marte fielders choice and Triggs blanked the Angels on three hits over his final five innings.

TRIGGS vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-1 with a 14.85 ERA (6.2 ip, 11 h, 11 r, 11 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 3 hr) in two career appearances, one start...the start came in his only outing this year (see fourth start in his first column)...his other appearance came in relief last year on May 25 at Seattle (2.0 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...pitched the final two innings of the A's 13-3 loss...allowed a two-run home run to Cruz in the Mariners four runs seventh and a solo home run to Cano in the eighth.

2016 RECAP: Was claimed off waivers from Baltimore during the spring and went 1-1 with a 4.31 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 24 games (six starts) over eight stints in his Major League debut with the A's...the eight stints are believed to be the most in one season in Oakland history...five of his eight stints began less than eight days following his previous option...had three one-day stints and two two-day stints...struck out 55 and walked just 13 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.23...compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...then went 1-1 with a 2.58 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in 14 games (six starts), over his final four stints...allowed three home runs over his first four stints (18.0 ip) and two in his last four (38.1 ip)...his opponents batting average included a .235 (28-for-119) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .277 (28-for-101) against left-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Jesse Hahn (1-2, 2.74 ERA): Is scheduled to make his eighth appearance and seventh start of the season...is 0-1 with a 3.78 ERA and .269 opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first three starts...has allowed just one home run in 42.2 innings and his average of 0.21 home runs per nine innings is second lowest in the American League...has received two runs of support or fewer in five of his six starts and his season run support average of 2.74 is third lowest in the AL...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-2 A's loss at Texas last Friday (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...is 1-1 with a 2.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 16 h, 11 r, 5 er, 7 bb, 13 so) in three career starts against Seattle...has not faced the Mariners since May 9, 2015, a loss in a 7-2 decision at Safeco Field (5.1 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 4 so).

- Are 8-for-14 in save chances...blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...the six total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, 2; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, Madson, 1 each).
- A reliever has figured in the decision in six of the A's last nine games (3-3 record by relievers, 4-5 overall during stretch).
- Have a combined 14 stolen bases against, which is second most in the American League.
- A's relievers have tossed at least four innings 12 times this season...they have pitched three or more innings in 26-of-38 games.
- A's relievers have allowed nine unearned runs this season, which is tied for second most in the AL...also tied for second in runs allowed with 74.
- Are tied for second in the AL in wild pitches with eight.
