OAKLAND ATHLETICS (17-22) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (18-22)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 17, 2017 — SAFECO FIELD — 7:10 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their four-game losing streak last night...have now lost four of the first five games of the road trip after winning four of the final five games on the last homestand...are 17-22 (.436), which is the third worst record in the American League...remain in fifth place in the AL West for the fourth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 10½ games for the second consecutive day...this marks just the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 10½ games after 39 games or fewer (1979, 2001, 2015)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, five days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and five days in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit three home runs last night, all with runners on base...each of the A's last four home runs and five of the last six have come with runners on...the home runs last night accounted for seven of the A's nine runs...for the season, 80 of the A's 154 runs (51.9%) have come on home runs...have now homered in 10 consecutive games (21 home runs total), which matches Oakland's longest streak over the last two years (June 22-July 1, 2015)...have 55 home runs for the season, which is tied for third in the American League...it is also second most in Athletics history after 39 games (61 in 2000)...it will be at least second most after 40 games (63 in 2000)...the A's are 16-15 when homering, 1-7 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-9)...the pitching staff has allowed 23 home runs in the last 17 games after yielding just 16 over the first 22 contests...has allowed 39 home runs for the season, which is tied for the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors...the A's are 13-8 when out-homering the opponent.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-4 on this six-game road trip to Texas (0-3) and Seattle (1-1)...have lost seven of the last nine road games and 12 of the last 15...are 6-14 (.300) on the road compared to 11-8 (.579) at home...have the second worst road record in the American League...return home following the game tonight for a six-game homestand against Boston (four games) and Miami (two games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...are 1-5-0 in road series compared to 4-1-1 in home series...have won four straight home series for the first time since May 30-July 24, 2014 when they won eight straight.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed six runs in each of the last four games, marking the ninth time in Oakland history they have allowed the same number of runs in at least four straight games...did it in five straight games once (2 runs from July 16-21, 1989)...have a 5.66 ERA (26 er in 41.1 ip) over the first five games of the road trip after posting a 3.38 ERA on the last homestand...have a 4.95 ERA (93 er in 169.0 ip) on the road this year, compared to 3.90 (75 er in 173.0 ip) at home...have a 4.42 ERA overall, which is third highest in the American League...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.386)...hit three batters last night and have a Major League leading 22 hit batters for the season...have 21 wild pitches, which is second most in the AL to Seattle (22).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-10 with a 4.51 ERA (58 er in 115.2 ip) over the last 22 games after going 9-5 with a 3.83 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 12-15 with a 4.20 ERA for the season...that includes 6-4 with a 2.38 ERA (22 er in 83.1 ip) by Andrew Triggs and Jesse Hahn and 6-11 with a 5.36 ERA (78 er in 131.0 ip) by everyone else...starters have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (21) and have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.368)...have the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.235).

OFFENSE: The A's are one of three teams to collect at least one extra base hit in every game this year (WAS, MIN)...have 123 extra base hits for the season, which is tied for second in the American League...have the second fewest runs scored in the AL (154) and the third lowest batting average (.236)...are 9-for-52 (.173) with runners in scoring position over the last eight games and are batting .209 (55-for-263) with RISP for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (CLE, .208)...A's designated hitters are batting .192 (28-for-146) with two home runs and seven RBI...the RBI are the fewest in the AL, the home runs are tied with Detroit for the fewest and the batting average is second lowest (KC, .187).

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting a combined .171 (27-for-158) with 18 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .258 on-base percentage)...

the batting average is tied with Kansas City for the lowest in the majors and the on-base percentage is second lowest (KC, .216)...leadoff hitters are 5-for-35 (.143) with four walks, a double and home run to start the game.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed one error last night, which led to two unearned runs...lead the majors in errors (36) and are tied with San Diego for the lead in unearned runs (27)...seven of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...five have been made by catchers, which is tied for the most in the AL...the A's have allowed 33 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (PIT, 37).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 10-7 (.588) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 7-15 (.318) in games decided by three runs or more...have the third best record in the American League in games decided by two runs or fewer but have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by three runs or more (PIT, 6-13)...are 4-5 (.444) in one-run games...are tied for the third fewest one-run games in the AL and have the fourth worst record...have a season run differential of -41, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -42).

THIS AND THAT: Last night's win was the A's third of the season when trailing after eight innings, which ties Los Angeles (AL) for the most in the majors...it also matches Oakland's season total from last year...however, have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most in the majors (DET, 4; WASH, 3)...the A's are 2-5 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 5-4 against Oakland...the A's have used a different lineup in each of their last 34 games...have used 37 different lineups overall in 39 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...each of Oakland's last 13 games have lasted at least 2 hours and 51 minutes and the A's average time of game over that stretch is 3:15...are averaging 3:06 for the season, which is second fastest in the American League but second slowest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Axford, Bassitt and Mengden are currently on rehab assignments...have used the DL 12 times this year...have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series, 4-2...have split the first two games in Seattle after winning three of four in Oakland...lost the season series last year for the fourth consecutive season as they went 7-12...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have lost four straight season series to the Mariners...went 6-4 in Seattle but were 1-8 in Oakland, which matched the A's worst mark ever against the Mariners in the Coliseum (2007)...11 of the 19 games last year were decided by one run...are 34-48 (.415) against the Mariners dating back to the start of the 2013 season, which is the worst record by any American League team against Seattle...all-time, the A's are 338-272 against the Mariners...that includes 183-123 in Oakland, 154-148 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 78-84 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso leads the majors with eight home runs in May...has 12 home runs for the season, which is a new career high...**Matt Joyce** has three home runs and seven RBI in five games on the road trip after tallying two home runs and 10 RBI over his first 29 games...has four go-ahead RBI on the trip after collecting no go-ahead RBI over his first 29 games...**Trevor Plouffe** has a seven-game hitting streak (10-for-26, .385), which matches the A's season high.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1959** Bob Grim pitches a two-hit shutout as the A's defeat the Yankees in the second game of a doubleheader, 10-0...in **1963** Ted Bowsfield tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Boston...in **1996** Jason Giambi homers off Boston's Tim Wakefield for the 400th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2016** Khris Davis has three home runs and six RBI, including a walk-off grand slam, in the A's 8-5 win over Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-2, 2.74 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his eighth appearance and seventh start of the season...is 0-1 with a 3.78 ERA (7 er in 16.2 ip) and .269 (18-for-77) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first three starts...was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...pitched in relief in his first outing on April 7 at Texas but has started in each of his last six appearances.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.283) and 10th in batting average (.214) and ERA (2.74)...has allowed just one home run in 42.2 innings and his average of 0.21 home runs per nine innings is second lowest in the AL (Vargas, KC 0.20).

SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in five of his six starts and his season run support average of 2.74 (13 rs in 42.2 ip) is fourth lowest in the American League...has received no support three times and is 0-2 with a 2.70 ERA (6 er in 20.0 ip) in those three starts...had two runs of support or fewer in five of his nine starts last year of 16 of his 31 starts as an Athletic...the bullpen has blown the save in two of his six starts this year (April 25 and May 12)...the pen blew a save in three of his nine starts last year.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 1-1 with a 1.91 ERA (7 er in 33.0 ip) in five games against American League West competition, 0-1 with a 5.59 ERA (6 er in 9.2 ip) in two starts against everyone else.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has yielded a .127 (9-for-71) batting average with two strikes after allowing a .300 mark with two strikes last year...has a .145 (10-for-69) opponents batting average against the bottom four hitters in the order, .267 (24-for-90) against the top five.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 3.72 ERA (4 er in 9.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland, 0-2 with a 2.45 ERA (9 er in 33.0 ip) in four games on the road...last year, he went 2-1 with a 3.03 ERA and .237 opponents batting average in five starts at home, 0-3 with a 13.17 ERA and .453 opponents average in four starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 6-4 with a 3.13 ERA (36 er in 103.2 ip) in 17 starts in Oakland, 3-8 with a 4.83 ERA (44 er in 82.0 ip) in 15 games on the road.

FIRST APPEARANCE: He relieved A's starting pitcher Raul Alcantara to start the third inning of the A's 10-5 loss at Texas April 7...entered the game trailing 8-3 and tossed 6.0 innings in his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...blanked the Rangers on two hits over his first three innings before allowing two runs in the sixth on a Gomez RBI double and a Mazara RBI single...those were the only runs he would allow.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Kansas City April 13...allowed two runs in the first inning on RBI singles by Cain and Perez, and another in the third on a Moss sacrifice fly...did not allow a run over his final three innings...Vargas (7.2 ip) and Soria (0.1 ip) shutout the A's on four hits and a walk over the first eight innings before Oakland scored its only run in the ninth.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 win over Texas on April 19 in Oakland, snapping a career-high tying three game losing streak dating back to last year...it was his first win since May 28, 2016...matched his career high by walking four batters...did not allow a hit until Napoli singled with one out in the fourth inning and surrendered his only run on a leadoff home run by Gallo in the fifth...left after six innings with the A's leading 8-1.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) on April 25...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit...became the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 and just the 36th Major Leaguer over that stretch to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings, allow one hit or fewer and not earn a win...walked Trout in the first, allowed a one-out single to Simmons in the fifth and walked Maybin in the eighth...none of the base runners advanced past first base...Ramirez (7.0 ip), Parker (1.0 ip) and Hernandez (1.0 ip) shutout the A's on two hits over the first nine innings.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Houston April 30...allowed a RBI double to Correa in the first, a RBI double to Gattis in the fourth and a two-run single to McCann in the fifth...left after six innings trailing 4-0...Keuchel shut out the A's on two hits over the first seven innings before Oakland scored single runs in the eighth and ninth.

FIFTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 win over Detroit May 6 in Oakland...tossed just 3.2 innings and issued a career-high tying four walks...allowed three runs in the second inning on a two-run triple by Romine and a RBI single by Castellanos...loaded the bases with two outs

in the fourth and was relieved by Coulombe after tossing 101 pitches...Coulombe allowed one of the inherited runners to score.

LAST START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Texas Last Friday...shutout the Rangers on three hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when Gomez doubled to start the fifth, moved to third on a Hahn error on a pickoff attempt and scored on a DeShields sacrifice bunt/fielders choice...that was the only run he allowed in seven innings and he left with a 2-1 lead...Casilla allowed four runs in the ninth for the blown save.

HAHN vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-1 with a 2.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 16 h, 11 r, 5 er, 7 bb, 13 so) in three career starts...did not face the Mariners last year...went 0-1 with a 4.09 ERA (11.0 ip, 11 h, 10 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 6 so) in two starts in 2015...the no decision came in an

8-7 A's loss in 10 innings in Oakland April 12...retired each of the first 13 batters before Seager reached on a Semien error...had a 3-0 lead entering the sixth inning...allowed a leadoff double to Morrison and the Mariners ended up scoring four times, although only one run was earned...the A's tied the game in the bottom of the ninth before losing in the 10th...then took the loss in a 7-2 decision at Seattle May 9...allowed two runs in the first on a Cruz RBI double and an error, and another in the second on a Smith RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fifth inning to make the score 3-1, but he allowed two more runs in the bottom of the fifth, both scoring on a Lawrie error...was relieved by Castro with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth and Castro allowed one of the runs to score...his other start was a win on June 19, 2014, a 401 decision at San Diego...shutout the Mariners on four hits over the first four innings before allowing an unearned run in the fifth.

2016 RECAP: Had four separate stints with the A's and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percentage (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...struck out just 23 batters (4.47 per nine innings) and walked 19 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.21, which was the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .273 (27-for-99) against right-handed hitters compared to .361 (30-for-83) against left-handers...surrendered seven of his eight home runs to lefties and had a .663 slugging percentage against lefties, .333 against righties...his career splits are .216 (106-for-490) against righties, .267 (130-for-487) with 15 of his 18 home runs against lefties...has a .413 career slugging percentage against lefties, .278 against righties...allowed a .324 batting average with runners in scoring position...had a .226 opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .358 after that...opponents hit .426 with a .449 on-base percentage and .681 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...in 2015, his marks were .215, .277 and .290 respectively...five of the eight home runs he surrendered were solo shots...yielded a .440 average to the first hitter in the batting order.

NIGHT AND DAY: Went 2-1 with a 3.90 ERA and .234 opponents average in five starts during the day, 0-3 with a 9.92 ERA and .427 opponents average in four starts at night...his career splits are 9-4 with a 2.39 ERA (28 er in 105.1 ip) in 17 day games, 7-12 with a 4.51 ERA (77 er in 153.2 ip) in 29 night games.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Sonny Gray (0-1, 3.78 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and the 100th start of his career...will become the 22nd pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder...made two rehab starts before he was reinstated May 1...went 2-0 in his two rehab starts and did not allow a run in 11.0 innings...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-5 A's loss at Texas last Saturday (6.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...is 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA (16.2 ip, 17 h, 10 r, 10 er, 4 bb, 14 so, 1 hr) in three career starts against Boston...the Red Sox are the only American League team (besides the A's) that he has never defeated...went 0-0 with a 15.75 ERA in two spring training starts...opponents went 6-for-17 (.353) with four walks...went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts last year in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list.

- Are 8-for-15 in save chances...blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...the seven total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, Madson, 2 each; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each).
- A reliever has figured in the decision in seven of the A's last 10 games (4-3 record by relievers, 5-5 overall during stretch).
- Have a combined 14 stolen bases against, which is second most in the American League.
- A's relievers have tossed at least four innings 12 times this season...they have pitched three or more innings in 27-of-39 games.
- A's relievers have allowed 11 unearned runs this season, which is the second most in the AL...third in runs allowed with 79.
- Are tied for second in the AL in wild pitches with nine.
