OAKLAND ATHLETICS (17-23) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (21-18)

THURSDAY, MAY 18, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost five of six games on the last road trip after winning four of six games on the previous homestand...are a season-high tying six games under .500 for the second time this year (16-22 on May 15)...are 17-23 (.425), which is the third worst record in the American League...it is one game worse than last year (18-22) and three better than 2015 (14-26)...remain in fifth place in the AL West for the fifth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 11½ games...this marks just the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 11½ games after 40 games or fewer (1979, 2001, 2015)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, five days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and six days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game homestand tonight against Boston (four games) and Miami (two games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...are 11-8 (.579) at home compared to 6-15 (.286) on the road...are tied for the worst road record in the majors (PHI, SF)...have won four of the last five home games and nine of the last 12 but have lost eight of the last 10 road games and 13 of the last 16...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Seattle (1-2)...are 1-6-0 in road series compared to 4-1-1 in home series...have won four straight home series for the first time since May 30-July 24, 2014 when they won eight straight.

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's will play an American League East team for the first time this year tonight...will play each of their next 28 games against teams from the Eastern Time Zone, including 17 against the AL East, seven against the National League East and four against Cleveland...last year, the A's went 16-17 against the AL East.

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the third time this year last night, which is tied for third in the American League...did not have an extra base hit for the first time and had been just one of three teams with an extra base hit in each game (WAS, MIN)...are tied for third in the American League in extra base hits (123)...however, rank second in fewest runs (154) and lowest batting average (.232), tied for second in most strikeouts (345) and third in lowest on-base percentage (.304)...are 9-for-52 (.173) with runners in scoring position over the last nine games and are batting .209 (55-for-263) with RISP for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (CLE, .208)...A's designated hitters are batting .193 (29-for-150) with two home runs and seven RBI...the RBI are the fewest in the AL, the home runs are tied with Detroit for the fewest and the batting average is second lowest (KC, .189).

THE LONG BALL: The A's had their streak of 10 consecutive games with a home run come to an end last night...have hit 21 home runs in the last 11 games and 55 for the season, which is tied for fourth in the American League...it is second most in Oakland history after 40 games (63 in 2000)...each of the A's last four home runs and five of the last six have come with runners on base...80 of the A's 154 runs (51.9%) have come on home runs...are 16-15 when homering, 1-8 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-9) and third worst in the majors (MIA, 1-11)...the pitching staff has allowed 39 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors...the A's are 13-8 when out-homer the opponent.

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting a combined .167 (27-for-162) with 18 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .253 on-base percentage)...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the on-base percentage is second lowest (KC, .209)...leadoff hitters are 5-for-36 (.139) with four walks (.225)...the batting average is tied for the lowest in the majors (CLE) and the on-base percentage is fifth lowest.

PITCHING: The A's compiled a 5.29 ERA on the road trip after posting a 3.38 ERA on the last homestand...have a 4.88 ERA (96 er in 177.0 ip) on the road this year, compared to 3.90 (75 er in 173.0 ip) at home...have a 4.40 ERA overall, which is third highest in the American League...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.383)...lead the majors in hit batters (22) and rank second in the AL in wild pitches (21).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-11 with a 4.55 ERA (61 er in 120.2 ip) over the last 22 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 12-16 with a 4.23 ERA for the season...that includes 6-5 with a 2.55 ERA (25 er in 88.1 ip) by Andrew Triggs and Jesse

Hahn and 6-11 with a 5.36 ERA (78 er in 131.0 ip) by everyone else...starters have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (21) and have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.368)...have the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.236).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (37) and unearned runs (28)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...seven of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...five have been made by catchers, which is tied for the most in the AL...the A's have allowed 33 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (PIT, 38).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 10-7 (.588) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 7-16 (.304) in games decided by three runs or more...are tied for the third best record in the American League in games decided by two runs or fewer but have the worst record in the majors in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-5 (.444) in one-run games...are tied for the third fewest one-run games in the AL and have the fourth worst record...have a season run differential of -45, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -46).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have used a different lineup in each of their last 35 games...have used 38 different lineups overall in 40 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAA)...it also matches Oakland's season total from last year...however, have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most in the majors (DET, 4; WASH, 3)...the A's are 2-5 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 5-4 against Oakland...the A's average time of game is 3:05, which is second fastest in the American League (KC, 3:01)...however, it is currently second slowest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Axford, Bassitt and Mengden are currently on rehab assignments...have used the DL 12 times this year...have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. RED SOX: Oakland went 1-5 against Boston last year, which marked the second consecutive season the A's went 1-5 against the Red Sox...lost two of three in Oakland and were swept in a three-game series in Boston...were outscored 67-20 and allowed an average of 11.2 runs per game...became the first team in modern Major League history (since 1900) to allow an average of 10 or more runs per game against one team in a non-interleague season series...have lost 11 of the last 13 games...have dropped five of the last seven games in the Coliseum and each of the last six games at Fenway...are 236-291 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 142-120 in Oakland, 93-170 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 878-1072 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso leads the majors with eight home runs in the month of May and is tied for second in the American League with 15 RBI...leads AL first baseman in home runs (12), RBI (29) and slugging (.624) and ranks second in on-base percentage (.370)...**Matt Joyce** had three home runs and seven RBI in six games on the road trip after tallying two home runs and 10 RBI over his first 29 games...had four go-ahead RBI on the trip after collecting no go-ahead RBI over his first 29 games...**Trevor Plouffe** has an A's season-high eight-game hitting streak (11-for-29, .379).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1952** Bobby Shantz tosses a three-hit shutout to defeat Bob Feller 2-0 in the first game of a doubleheader at Cleveland...in **1998** Mike Blowers becomes the second player in Oakland history to hit for the cycle in the A's 14-0 win at Chicago...in **2003** the A's score three runs in the eighth inning and five in the ninth to come from behind and defeat Cleveland, 8-5...in **2014** Josh Donaldson and Brandon Moss score four runs each as the A's win at Cleveland, 13-3.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (0-1, 3.78 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and the 100th start of his career...will become the 22nd pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...began the season on the 10-day disabled list with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)...made two rehab starts before he was reinstated May 1.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss at Minnesota May 2...allowed a career-high tying three home runs...surrendered a solo home run to Dozier and a two-run home run to Sano in the third and a solo home run to Castro in the fourth...left after six innings trailing 4-0.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in his 100th career appearance, an 8-6 A's win over Detroit May 7 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Castellanos in the third inning but the A's scored twice in the bottom of the third and two more in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...he was then charged with three unearned runs in the fifth inning after an Alonso error...yielded RBI singles to Cabrera and Martinez and was relieved by Dull who allowed a third run to score on a wild pitch.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Texas last Saturday...allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the third but the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth...gave that run back in the bottom of the fourth on a Gomez RBI ground out but Oakland scored twice in the fifth and once in the seventh...was relieved by Dull to start the bottom of the seventh with the A's leading 4-2 but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh for the blown save and loss.

2016 RECAP: Went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than 2½ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons...also had career highs in losses (11), home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475) and matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his average of 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings was a career low and his 3.23 walks per nine innings were a career high...had the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (.313) and the second most wild pitches...the wild pitches tied for sixth most in Oakland history and matched the most by an Athletic over the last 24 years...now has 46 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53)...the winning percentage tied for 10th lowest in Oakland history...among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched, he had the fourth highest ERA in the AL and the highest by an A's pitcher since 2000 (Oliveros, 6.75)

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .286 (66-for-231) against right-handed hitters and .286 (67-for-234) against left-handers...surrendered 12 of his 18 home runs to righties...11 of the home runs were solo shots...the eight and nine hitters in the order batted a combined .467 with seven home runs and 21 RBI...however, held the five hitter to a .176 average, no home runs and four RBI...based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, his .468 average against the number eight hitter was the highest by a Major Leaguer since at least 1974...his .465 average against the nine hitter was third highest over that span and the highest since 1999 (Loaiza, TEX .500)...his mark against the five hitter tied for fourth lowest in the AL in 2016...using the 100 inning minimum, he had the fourth highest average with runners in scoring position in the AL (.330), tied for the fifth highest average when opponents put the first pitch in play (.467) and had the seventh highest average against batters leading off an inning (.321)...had a .233 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .318 after that.

THE BIG INNING: Yielded six runs in an inning once, five runs three times and four runs twice...he allowed 58 of his 80 runs in the single biggest inning of his 22 starts (25.13 ERA)...had a 1.84 ERA in all other innings.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Went 2-3 with a 7.52 ERA in six starts after the All-Star Break after going 3-8 with a 5.16 ERA in 16 starts before the break...the eight losses were two more than his combined pre-break total from the previous two seasons (20-6, 2.42 ERA in 37 starts)...is now 23-15 with a 3.16 ERA (126 er in 358.2 ip) in 57 career appearances before the All-Star Break compared to 15-17 with a 3.79 ERA (112 er in 266.0 ip) in 44 games after the break.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 2.05 ERA in the first inning, a 3.43 ERA in the second inning and a 7.42 ERA from the third inning on...went 2-8 with a 6.50 ERA in 12 starts on four days rest, 3-3 with a 4.73 ERA in 10 starts on five days rest or more...is now 19-20 with a 3.63 ERA (134 er in 332.2 ip) in 52 career starts on four days rest, 19-12 with a 3.25 ERA (104 er in 288.0 ip) in his other 47 starts...the A's were 7-15 (.318) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than five innings in five of his starts...had just three such starts over the first three years of his career.

GRAY vs. BOSTON: Is 0-2 with a 5.40 ERA (16.2 ip, 17 h, 10 r, 10 er, 4 bb, 14 so, 1 hr) in three career starts...the Red Sox are the only American League team (besides the A's) that he has never defeated...is 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (8 er in 10.2 ip) in two starts at Fenway Park and 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA (2 er in 6.0 ip) in one start in the Coliseum...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, a 14-7 A's loss at Boston May 9...allowed a career-high tying seven runs...had a 3-0 lead when he allowed a run to score in the second inning on wild pitch...the A's increased the lead to 4-1 before he yielded six runs in the fourth inning...allowed a RBI double to Shaw, a two-run single to Bradley Jr., a RBI double to Betts and a RBI single to Pedroia...was relieved with two outs and two runners on by Rodriguez, who allowed one of the runs to score.

RHP Kendall Graveman (2-2, 3.95 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list April 27...is 0-2 with a 5.48 ERA and .297 opponents batting average in four starts since his return...was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .203 opponents average in three starts when he was placed on the DL list April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder...is 1-0 with a 2.50 ERA in three starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 5.09 ERA in four starts on the road...has allowed eight of his 18 runs this year in the first inning (10.29 ERA)...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-4 A's loss at Texas last Sunday (6.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...is 0-0 with a 1.35 ERA (13.1 ip, 13 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 13 so, 1 hr) in three career appearances, including two starts, against Boston...had a no decision in his only start against Boston last year, a 1-0 A's win in Oakland on Sept. 4 (6.1 ip, 6 h, 2 bb, 7 so)

- Are 8-for-15 in save chances...blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...the seven total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, Madson, 2 each; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each).

- A's relievers have tossed at least four innings 12 times this season...they have pitched three or more innings in 28-of-40 games.

- Are tied for second in the AL in wild pitches with nine.
