OAKLAND ATHLETICS (18-23) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (21-19)

FRIDAY, MAY 19, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 6:35 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (2-2, 3.95) VS. LHP CHRIS SALE (4-2, 2.15) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two of the last three games after losing each of the previous four contests...are 7-7 over the last 14 games but are 18-23 (.439) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it is one game worse than last year (19-22) and four better than 2015 (14-27)...remain in fifth place in the AL West for the sixth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 11 games...that is one-half game short of the season high of 11½ on May 17...this marks just the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 11 games after 41 games or fewer (1979, 2001, 2015)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game homestand against Boston (1-0) and Miami (two games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...are 12-8 (.600) at home compared to 6-15 (.286) on the road...have the worst road record in the American League and are tied for second worst in the majors...have won five of the last six home games and 10 of the last 13 but have lost eight of the last 10 road games and 13 of the last 16...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Seattle (1-2)...are 1-6-0 in road series compared to 4-1-1 in home series...have won four straight home series for the first time since May 30-July 24, 2014 when they won eight straight.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in 11 of their last 12 games and have 24 home runs total over that span...now have 58 home runs for the season, which is one short of the American League lead (NYY and TB, 59)...it is second most in Athletics history after 41 games (63 in 2000)... six of the A's last seven home runs and seven of the last nine have come with runners on base...85 of the A's 162 runs (52.5%) have come on home runs...are 17-15 when homering, 1-8 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-9) and third worst in the majors (MIA, 1-11)...the pitching staff has allowed 40 home runs, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors (SF, 38)...the A's are 14-8 when out-homering the opponent, 4-15 when they don't.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (37) and are tied with San Diego for the lead in unearned runs (28) ...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...seven of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors... five have been made by catchers, which is tied for the most in the AL... the A's have allowed 34 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (PIT, 38).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .261 (53-for-203) with 31 runs scored (5.2 per game), nine doubles and 12 home runs over the last six games... have 129 extra base hits, which is second most in the American League (TB, 132)...however, have the second most strikeouts (355), third fewest runs (162), third lowest batting average (.236) and fourth lowest on-base percentage (.307)...are 12-for-61 (.197) with runners in scoring position over the last 10 games and are batting .213 (58-for-272) with RISP for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (CLE, .208).

PITCHING: The A's allowed three runs in the first game of the homestand last night after posting a 5.29 ERA on the last road trip...have a 3.86 ERA (78 er in 182.0 ip) at home compared to 4.88 (96 er in 177.0 ip) on the road...have a 4.36 ERA overall, which is third highest in the American League...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.381)... lead the majors in hit batters (22) and rank second in the AL in wild pitches (21).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-11 with a 4.55 ERA (64 er in 126.2 ip) over the last 23 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 13-16 with a 4.23 ERA for the season...that includes 6-5 with a 2.55 ERA (25 er in 88.1 ip) by Andrew Triggs and Jesse Hahn and 7-11 with a 5.32 ERA (81 er in 137.0 ip) by everyone else... starters have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (22) and have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.367)...have the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.234).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face left-handed starting pitchers in each of the final three games of this series after facing right-handers in each of the previous 10 games...are 5-5 in games started by

left-handers, 13-18 against right-handers...are batting .248 against left-handed pitchers, .232 against right-handers.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters are batting .195 (30-for-154) with three home runs and nine RBI...the RBI are the fewest in the AL, the home runs are tied for the fewest (DET, HOU) and the batting average is second lowest (KC, .185).

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting a combined .174 (29-for-167) with 18 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .257 on-base percentage)... the batting average and on-base percentage are second lowest in the majors (KC, .170/.210)...leadoff hitters are 6-for-37 (.162) with four walks (.244 on-base percentage) to start the game.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 10-7 (.588) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 8-16 (.333) in games decided by three runs or more...are tied for the fourth best record in the American League in games decided by two runs or fewer but have the worst record in the majors in games decided by three runs or more...are 4-5 (.444) in one-run games... are tied for the third fewest one-run games in the AL and have the fourth worst record...have a season run differential of -40, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -42).

AGAINST THE EAST: The A's played their first game against an American League East team last night...it began a stretch of 28 consecutive games against teams from the Eastern Time Zone, including 17 against the AL East, seven against the National League East and four against Cleveland...last year, the A's went 16-17 against the AL East.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-5 on Friday, which is tied with Boston and Cleveland for the worst Friday record in the majors...are 2-5 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 6-4 against Oakland...have used a different lineup in each of their last 36 games...have used 39 different lineups overall in 41 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAA)...it also matches Oakland's season total from last year...however, have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most in the majors (DET, 4; WASH, 3)...are tied for third in the American League in walk-off wins (3)...the A's average time of game is 3:05, which is second fastest in the American League (KC, 3:01)...however, it is currently second slowest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Axford, Bassitt, Doolittle, Mengden, Semien, Smolinski)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Axford, Bassitt and Mengden are currently on rehab assignments...have used the DL 12 times this year... have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. RED SOX: Oakland won the first meeting of 2017 last night after going 1-5 against Boston last year...that marked the second consecutive season the A's went 1-5 against the Red Sox...lost two of three in Oakland and were swept in a three-game series in Boston...were outscored 67-20...have lost 11 of the last 14 games...have dropped five of the last eight games in the Coliseum and each of the last six games at Fenway...are 237-291 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 143-120 in Oakland, 93-170 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 879-1072 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis hit his 12th home run last night, matching *Yonder Alonso* for the team lead...the 24 home runs are the most by an American League duo and second most by a Major League duo (Harper and Zimmerman, WAS 26)...*Trevor Plouffe* has an A's season-high nine-game hitting streak (14-for-33, .424).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** Vida Blue tosses a three-hit shutout and Rick Monday and Reggie Jackson homer in the A's 3-0 win over Milwaukee...in **2004** Bobby Kielty homers twice and drives in four runs as the A's defeat Detroit, 6-2...in **2006** Dan Haren and Huston Street combine on a two-hit shutout as the A's defeat San Francisco, 1-0.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (2-2, 3.95 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list April 27...is 0-2 with a 5.48 ERA (14 er in 23.0 ip) and .297 (27-for-91) opponents batting average in four starts since his return...was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .203 opponents average in three starts when he was placed on the DL list April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.50 ERA (5 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts at home compared to 1-2 with a 5.09 ERA (13 er in 23.0 ip) in four starts on the road...last year, he went 5-6 with a 3.39 ERA in 14 starts at home compared to 5-5 with a 4.80 ERA in 17 starts on the road...had the ninth lowest home ERA in the American League.

THE FIRST INNING: Has allowed eight of his 18 runs this year in the first inning (7.0 ip, 10.29 ERA)...has a 2.65 ERA (10 er in 34.0 ip) from the second inning on...last year, he allowed just six runs in the first inning for the entire season for a 1.74 ERA...that tied Arrieta (CHC) for second lowest in the majors (Tanaka, NYY 1.16) among pitchers with 30 or more innings... using the same minimum, it was 10th lowest in Oakland history

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 0-1 with a 6.35 ERA (12 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts in the month of May and is 2-5 with a 5.31 ERA (35 er in 59.1 ip) in 11 career starts in the month...his May ERA is his highest for any month of the season (4.76 in September)...went 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts in April...the ERA was the second lowest single month ERA of his career (1.93 in June, 2015).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Is tied for the lead among American League pitchers in errors (2), tied for second in double plays (2) and ranks seventh in total chances (12)...turned the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history April 27 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was by Blue Moon Odom, also against the Angels, in the second game of a July 11, 1971 doubleheader...last year, he tied for third among AL pitchers in total chances (42), tied for seventh in assists (27) and ranked eighth in putouts (15)...did not commit an error and his 42 total chances were the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors among pitchers with no errors.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed a .295 (28-for-95) batting average with the bases empty compared to .200 (12-for-60) with runners on base... opponents are 5-for-29 (.172) with runners in scoring position, which ranks eighth in the American League among qualifiers for the ERA title...has walked two batters or fewer in six of his seven starts...has issued 7 of his 11 walks this year and 66 of his 96 walks in his career to left-handed hitters...opponents are batting .325 (13-for-40) when leading off an inning... the opponents number five hitter is 7-for-14 (.500) with six RBI but the six hitter is 0-for-17.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-2 win over Los Angeles (AL) on Opening Day April 3 in Oakland...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill)... is just the second of those pitchers to pick up the win (Gray, 2015)...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Trout in the third inning... those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 6-1 win at Texas April 8...no hit the Rangers over the first six innings, allowing just two base runners on an Odor walk and Lucroy reach on error in the second...then retired 15 straight before Napoli homered with two outs in the bottom of the seventh...that was the only run he allowed in seven innings of work.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-2 loss to Houston on April 14 in Oakland...did not strike out a batter in 5.0 innings, his first career start without a strikeout...the A's scored once in the second inning and he kept the Astros off the board over the first four innings, despite three hits, two walks and a hit batter...then allowed a leadoff home run to Aoki in the fifth inning and left after five innings and 74 pitches with the scored tied 1-1.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 27...allowed a RBI single to Pujols and a RBI double to Cron in the first inning but retired each of the next eight batters...shutout the Angels on three hits over his final five innings...Oakland was held to a run on three hits by Nolasco and four relievers.

FIFTH START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 7-4 loss at Minnesota May 3...issued a career-high tying four walks...allowed a two-run single to Vargas in the first inning but the A's got one of those runs back in the third...then surrendered a three-run home run to Vargas in the bottom of the third...Oakland scored twice in the fourth to cut the lead to 5-3

but he allowed a leadoff triple to Buxton in the bottom of the fourth...was relieved by Hendriks who allowed the inherited runner to score.

SIXTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) May 8 in Oakland...surrendered a two-run home run to Valbuena in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow... shutout the Angels on five hits and a walk over his final six innings...the A's scored single runs in the fourth and fifth innings to tie the game and won it on a Lowrie walk-off home run in the 11th.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 loss at Texas last Sunday...allowed two runs in the first inning on an Andrus RBI single and a Lucroy grounded into double play...blanked the Rangers on four hits and a walk over the next five innings and had a 4-2 lead when DeShields had a two-out RBI single in the bottom of the seventh...was relieved by Madson who allowed a RBI double to Andrus for the blown save and a RBI single to Mazara for the loss.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 2-1 with a 2.29 ERA (19.2 ip, 13 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 16 so, 2 hr) in five starts this spring...held the opposition to a .188 (13-for-69) batting average and walked just three batters in 19.2 innings (1.37 walks per nine innings)...allowed one run or fewer in four of his five starts...also started the exhibition game against Italy's World Baseball Classic team on March 8 and picked up the win (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 3 so)... pitched in a minor league game March 29.

2016 RECAP: Compiled a 10-11 record and a 4.11 ERA in a team-leading 31 starts in his second season with the A's...went 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts, 9-2 with a 3.33 ERA over his next 16 starts from May 30 to Aug. 24, and 0-3 with a 4.71 ERA over his final six starts...in addition to starts, he also led the A's in wins, losses (tied), innings pitched (186.0), hits (196), runs (87), earned runs (85), home runs (22) and walks (47)...all those marks are career highs as are his 108 strikeouts...the 47 walks were the fewest in Athletics history by an A's team-leader, besting the previous low of 59 by Sonny Gray in 2015...averaged 5.23 strikeouts per nine innings, which was the third lowest mark in the American League...tied for sicth in opponents reaching on an error (8), ranked seventh in fewest pitches per game (91.4) and was ninth in hits (196).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (1-3, 5.52 ERA): Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season, his second since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list on Monday...took the loss that night at Seattle in a 6-5 decision (5.0 ip, 2 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 7 so)...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he placed on the DL April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his six starts and opponents are batting .179...however, has issued 17 walks in 29.1 innings (5.22 walks per nine innings)...based on a minimum of 25 innings pitched, he has the fourth lowest opponents batting average in the American league but is averaging the fifth most walks per nine innings...has also hit four batters, which is tied for third most in the AL...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against the Red Sox, a start in the A's 13-5 loss at Boston last year on May 10 (2.2 ip, 10 h, 8 r, 8 er, 0 bb, 1 so).
