OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-23) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (21-20)

SATURDAY, MAY 20, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 1:05 P.M. PDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (1-3, 5.52) VS. LHP DREW POMERANZ (3-3, 5.29) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and three of the last four games after losing each of the previous four contests...are 8-7 over the last 15 games but are 19-23 (.452) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it matches the A's 42-game record from last year and is five games better than 2015 (14-28)...remain in fifth place in the AL West for the seventh consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 10 games...this marks just the fifth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 10 games after 42 games or fewer (1979, 2001, 2002, 2015)... have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, five days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and eight days in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their fourth walk-off win in their last seven home games last night...the last three of those walk-offs have been by home runs...the four walk-off wins are tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 5)...improved to 5-5 in one-run games with the win, including 4-1 at home...the 10 one-run games are tied for third fewest in the American League...are now 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for fourth fewest in the AL...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAA)...it also matches Oakland's season total from last year...however, have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most in the majors (DET, 4; WASH, 3).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this six-game homestand against Boston (2-0) and Miami (two games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...are 13-8 (.619) at home compared to 6-15 (.286) on the road...have the second worst road record in the majors (KC, 5-13)...have won six of the last seven home games and 11 of the last 14 but have lost eight of the last 10 road games and 13 of the last 16...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Seattle (1-2)... are 1-6-0 in road series compared to 4-1-1 in home series...have won four straight home series for the first time since May 30-July 24, 2014 when they won eight straight.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's faced a left-handed starting pitcher last night for the first time since May 7 (10 straight right-handers)...are also scheduled to faced lefties in each of the next two games...are 6-5 in games started by left-handers, including 6-1 at home...are 13-18 against right-handers... are batting .249 against left-handed pitchers, .232 against right-handers.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have homered in 12 of their last 13 games and have 25 home runs total over that span...now have 59 home runs for the season, which is one short of the American League lead (NYY, 60)...it is second most in Athletics history after 42 games (65 in 2000)...six of the A's last eight home runs have come with runners on base...86 of the A's 165 runs (52.1%) have come on home runs...are 18-15 when homering, 1-8 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-10)...the pitching staff has allowed 41 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors (SF, 39)...the A's are 14-8 when outhomering the opponent, 5-15 when they don't.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (38) and are tied with San Diego for the lead in unearned runs (28)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...seven of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors... five have been made by catchers, which is tied for the most in the AL... the A's have allowed 34 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (PIT 38)

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .257 (61-for-237) with 34 runs scored (4.9 per game), 11 doubles, one triple and 13 home runs over the last seven games...have 133 extra base hits, which is second most in the American League (TB, 136)...however, have the second most strikeouts (368), are tied for the second fewest runs (165), have the third lowest batting average (.236) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.306)...are 13-for-69 (.188) with runners in scoring position over the last 11 games and are batting .211 (59-for-280) with RISP for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (CLE, .204).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.37 ERA (5 er in 19.0 ip) over the first two games of the homestand after posting a 5.29 ERA on the last road trip... have a 3.75 ERA (80 er in 192.0 ip) at home compared to 4.88 (96 er in 177.0 ip) on the road...have a 4.29 ERA overall, which is third highest in

the American League...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.382)...are tied with Miami for the Major League lead in hit batters (22) and are tied with Seattle for the AL lead in wild pitches (22).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-11 with a 4.48 ERA (66 er in 132.2 ip) over the last 24 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 13-16 with a 4.20 ERA for the season...that includes 6-5 with a 2.55 ERA (25 er in 88.1 ip) by Andrew Triggs and Jesse Hahn and 7-11 with a 5.22 ERA (83 er in 143.0 ip) by everyone else... starters have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (23) and have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.372)...have the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.235).

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters are batting .191 (30-for-157) with three home runs and nine RBI...the RBI are the fewest in the AL, the home runs are tied for the fewest (DET, HOU) and the batting average is second lowest (KC, .180).

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting a combined .175 (30-for-171) with 18 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .257 on-base percentage)... the batting average and on-base percentage are second lowest in the majors (KC, .165/.204)...leadoff hitters are 6-for-38 (.158) with four walks (.244 on-base percentage) to start the game.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 11-7 (.611) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 8-16 (.333) in games decided by three runs or more...have the fourth best record in the American League in games decided by two runs or fewer but have the worst record in the majors in games decided by three runs or more...have a season run differential of -39, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -43).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 2-5 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 6-5 against Oakland...have used a different lineup in each of their last 37 games...have used 40 different lineups overall in 42 games... the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...the A's average time of game is 3:05, which is second fastest in the American League (KC, 3:01)...however, it is currently second slowest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Doolittle, Dull, Semien, Smolinski)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is currently on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 13 times this year...have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. RED SOX: Oakland has won the first two meetings of 2017, which matches their combined win total against Boston from the previous two seasons...went 1-5 against the Red Sox last year and in 2015...lost two of three in Oakland last year and were swept in a three-game series in Boston...were outscored 67-20...have lost 11 of the last 15 games...have a six-game losing streak at Fenway Park...are 238-291 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 144-120 in Oakland, 93-170 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 880-1072 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso and Khris Davis have combined for 24 home runs, which is the most by an American League duo and second most by a Major League duo (Harper and Zimmerman, WAS 26)...Mark Canha is batting .476 (10-for-21) with three doubles, one triple, two home runs and six RBI in seven games since he was recalled from Nashville May 9...Trevor Plouffe has a 10-game hitting streak, which is an A's season high and is tied for the longest active hitting streak in the AL...is 15-for-37 (.405) during the streak.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1977** Wayne Gross has five RBI and Earl Williams drives in four as the A's defeat Seattle 14-5...in **2005** Keith Ginter has one hit in one official at bat but drives in five runs on a three-run home run and two sacrifice flies in the A's 8-4 win at San Francisco...in **2011** Mark Ellis singles in the second inning off San Francisco's Ryan Vogelsong for his 1000th career hit to become the 12th player in Oakland history to collect 1000 hits.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (1-3, 5.52 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season, his second since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list on Monday...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he placed on the DL April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville last Tuesday against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so)... tossed 72 pitches...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed an unearned run on a Carlos Asuaje RBI single in the third...also yielded a Christian Villanueva sacrifice fly in the fourth.

BASE RUNNERS: Has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his six starts and opponents are batting .179 (19-for-106)...however, has issued 17 walks in 29.1 innings (5.22 walks per nine innings)...based on a minimum of 25 innings pitched, he has the fourth lowest opponents batting average in the American League but is averaging the fifth most walks per nine innings...has also hit four batters, which is tied for third most in the AL and matches his season total from last year (144.2 innings)...has a .315 opponents on-base percentage.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 3.18 ERA (6 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts at home compared to 0-3 with an 8.76 ERA (12 er in 12.1 ip) in three starts on the road...last year, he was 5-3 with a 3.02 ERA in 14 games (13 starts) at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.99 ERA in 11 starts on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League...is now 6-3 with a 3.05 ERA (34 er in 100.1 ip) in 17 career games in the Coliseum compared to 2-9 with a 5.62 ERA (46 er in 73.2 ip) in 14 starts on the road.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has held left-handed hitters to a .080 (2-for-25) batting average compared to .210 (17-for-81) by right-handers...last year, his opponents batting average included a .180 (18-for-100) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .263 (117-for-445) against right-handers... based on a minimum of 140 innings pitched, the mark against lefties was second lowest in the AL and the lowest in Oakland history (previous: .185, Norris, 1980)...allowed 17 of his 20 home runs and issued 33 of his 37 walks to righties for a .754 OPS...had a .526 OPS against lefties, which was second lowest in the AL and in Oakland history (.504, Norris, 1980).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .092 (6-for-65) with the bases empty compared to .317 (13-for-41) with runners on base...however, they are 5-for-25 (.200) with runners in scoring position...opponents are 3-for-56 (.054) with two strikes...they are 2-for-24 (.083) when leading of an inning but he has walked four and hit three for a .290 on-base percentage...has a .094 (6-for-64) opponents batting average with zero or one out, a .310 (13-for-42) average with both of his home runs and 14 of his 15 opponents RBI with two outs...has held the opponents two, three and four hitters to a .108 (4-for-37) batting average...has a .289 (13-for-45) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup this year, .098 (6-for-61) after that.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed 11 of his 20 runs in the second inning for a 16.50 ERA (11 er in 6.0 ip)...has a 2.70 ERA (7 er in 23.1 ip) in all other innings...opponents are batting .433 (13-for-30) in the second inning, .079 (6-for-76) in all other innings...allowed five hits or fewer while tossing at least five innings in each of his first four starts...that matched the second longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...the longest is a five-game streak by Mike Norris in 1980.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Los Angeles (AL) April 4 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed three runs in the second inning on a two-run single by Maldonado and a RBI single from Escobar...an RBI triple by Trout in the fifth inning increased the Angels lead to 4-2 and he was relieved by Hendriks to start the seventh... the A's scored four times in the bottom of the seventh to get him off the book

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss at Texas April 9...struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...allowed a three-run home run to Gallo in the second inning...loaded the bases with one out in the sixth and was relieved by Montas, who allowed all three runs to score.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-6 loss to Houston in Oakland on April 15...tossed 5.0 hitless innings but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...had a 5-0 lead when he walked the bases loaded to start the sixth inning...fielding errors by Rosales and Decker allowed two of those runs to

score...the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss.

FOURTH START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 3-1 victory over Seattle April 21 in Oakland...allowed his only run in six innings of work in the third inning when Heredia singled with two outs and scored on a Haniger triple...retired the side in order just once: the fifth...the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the fifth and then scored twice in the sixth for the win.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 26...left the game after 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed a RBI double to Espinosa, a RBI single to Maybin and a RBI double to Maldonado in the second...was relieved by Montas to start the third.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle on Monday...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings...issued bases loaded walks to Valencia and Gamel in the first inning and allowed a two-run home run to Cruz in the second...retired each of the final 10 batters he faced following the Cruz home run.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 3.91 ERA (23.0 ip, 23 h, 13 r, 10 er, 10 bb, 17 so) in seven games, including six starts, this spring... surrendered just one home run in 23.0 innings...allowed a .258 (23-for-89) opponents batting average...allowed one run or fewer in five of his seven appearances, including no runs three times...walked one batter or fewer in six of his seven outings but issued five walks in 3.0 innings in the other.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins. the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...allowed a .248 opponents batting average and walked 37 batters for a .298 on-base percentage...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest $\,$ in the AL...opponents hit .192 with runners in scoring position, which was third lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings pitched... received one run of support or fewer in 10 of his 24 starts and went 0-6 with a 3.90 ERA in those contests...tied for eighth in the AL with three pickoffs and opponents were successful in 3-of-7 (42.9%) stolen base attempts off

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Andrew Triggs (5-2, 2.12 ERA): Ranks third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.285), tied for third in wins (5), fourth in ERA (2.12) and opponents OPS (.561) and seventh in opponents on-base percentage (.277) and opponents batting average (.209)...has not allowed a hit to a left-handed hitter in either of his last two starts (0-for-17)...has a .135 opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .265 against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the AL among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his eight starts and walked one batter or fewer four times...had a no decision in his last start, a 9-6 A's win at Seattle last Tuesday (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...is 0-0 with a 4.50 ERA (4.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 2 so) in three career appearances, including one start, against Boston, all last year.

- In the month of May, the bullpen is sporting a 4-0 record with a 1.15 ERA (4 er in 31.1 ip) in eight games at home.
- Are 8-for-15 (53.3%) in save chances and have the fourth lowest save percentage in the American League...blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...the seven total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, Madson, 2 each; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each).
- Has allowed 20-of-51 (39.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the highest percentage in the AL and third highest in the majors.
- A reliever has figured in the decision in eight of the A's last 13 games (5-3 record by relievers, 7-6 overall during stretch).
- Relievers rank second in the AL in unearned runs (11), stolen bases (14), wild pitches (10) and tied for third in runs (79).
