OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-23) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (21-21)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight and four of the last five games after losing each of the previous four contests...are 8-6 over the last 14 games and are 20-23 (.465) for the season...that is one game better than the A's 43-game record from last year (19-24) and six games better than 2015 (14-29)...are in fourth place in the American League West and trail first place Houston by nine games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, six days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and eight days in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit a season-high four home runs yesterday, including three in the third inning (Canha, K.Davis, Pinder)...it marked the first time the A's hit three home runs in an inning since Sept. 27, 2012 at Texas (Cespedes, Moss, Reddick) and the first time they did it in the Coliseum since April 15, 2006 against Texas (Chavez, Thomas, Bradley)... now have 63 home runs for the season, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors...it is second most in Athletics history after 43 games (66 in 2000)...lead the AL and rank second in the majors with 38 home runs at home (Arizona, 42)...have homered in 13 of the last 14 games (29 home runs total)...eight of the A's last 12 home runs have come with runners on base...92 of the A's 173 runs (53.2%) have come on home runs...are 19-15 when homering, 1-8 when going homerless... the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-10)... the pitching staff has allowed 42 home runs, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors (SF, 39)... the A's are 15-8 when out-homering the opponent, 5-15 when they don't.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-0 on this six-game homestand against Boston (3-0) and Miami (two games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Detroit (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...are 14-8 (.636) at home compared to 6-15 (.286) on the road...have the second worst road record in the majors (KC, 5-13)...have won seven of the last eight home games and 12 of the last 15 but have lost eight of the last 10 road games and 13 of the last 16...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Seattle (1-2)...are 1-6-0 in road series compared to 5-1-1 in home series...have won five straight home series, which marks the first time the A's have won more than three straight home series since they won eight straight from May 30-July 24, 2014.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have faced a left-handed starting pitcher in each of the last two games after 10 straight games against right-handers... are 7-5 in games started by left-handers, including 7-1 at home...are 13-18 against right-handers...are batting .249 against left-handed pitchers, .234 against right-handers.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (39) and unearned runs (29)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...seven of the A's errors this year have been committed by pitchers, which is the most in the majors...the A's have allowed 34 stolen bases, which is second most in the majors (PIT, 38).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .265 (72-for-272) with 42 runs scored (5.3 per game), 11 doubles, one triple and 17 home runs over the last eight games...have 137 extra base hits, which is second most in the American League (TB, 141)...however, have the second most strikeouts (378), the third fewest runs (173), the third lowest batting average (.238) and the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.308)...are batting .216 (62-for-287) with runners in scoring position, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (CLE, .202).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.25 ERA (7 er in 28.0 ip) over the first three games of the homestand after posting a 5.29 ERA on the last road trip... have a 3.67 ERA (82 er in 201.0 ip) at home compared to 4.88 (96 er in 177.0 ip) on the road...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.381)...are tied with Miami for the Major League lead in hit batters (22) and rank second in the AL in wild pitches (22).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-11 with a 4.45 ERA (68 er in 137.2 ip) over the last 25 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 14-16 with a 4.19 ERA for the season...that includes 6-5 with a 2.55 ERA (25 er in 88.1 ip) by Andrew Triggs and Jesse Hahn and 8-11 with a 5.17 ERA (85 er in 148.0 ip) by everyone else...starters have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (24) and have the lowest opponents batting average (.235) and slugging percentage (.373).

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters are batting .194 (31-for-160) with four home runs and 11 RBI...the RBI are the fewest in the American League, the batting average is second lowest (KC, .180) and the home runs are tied with Detroit for third fewest (HOU, 3).

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting a combined .176 (31for-176) with 18 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .255 on-base percentage)... the batting average and on-base percentage are second lowest in the majors (KC, .165/.204)...leadoff hitters are 6-for-39 (.154) with four walks (.244 on-base percentage) to start the game.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 11-7 (.611) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 9-16 (.360) in games decided by three runs or more...have the fourth best record in the American League in games decided by two runs or fewer but have the worst record in games decided by three runs or more...have a season run differential of -34, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -43).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have four walk-off wins in their last eight home games...the last three of those have been by home runs...the four walk-off wins are tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 5)...are 5-5 in one-run games, including 4-1 at home...the 10 one-run games are tied for third fewest in the American League...are 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for fourth fewest in the AL...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAA)...it also matches Oakland's season total from last year...how-ever, have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third for the most in the majors (DET, 4; WASH, 3).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-4 on Sunday, which is the worst Sunday record in the American League...are 2-6 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 6-5 against Oakland...have used a different lineup in each of their last 38 games...have used 41 different lineups overall in 43 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...the A's average time of game is 3:06, which is tied for third fastest in the AL...however, it is currently second slowest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Doolittle, Dull, Semien, Smolinski)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is currently on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 13 times this year...have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. RED SOX: The A's have won the first three games of this series and will be attempting to sweep a four-game series from Boston for the second time in Oakland history (Aug. 10-12, 1971 at Fenway Park)...the last time the A's swept a four-game series from the Red Sox at home was exactly 85 years ago today at Shibe Park (May 19-21, 1932)...are 3-0 against Boston this year after going 2-10 over the previous two seasons... are 5-10 over the last three years, which includes 5-4 at home and 0-6 on the road...are 239-291 against Boston since moving to Oakland in 1968... that includes 145-120 in Oakland, 93-170 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...alltime, the A's are 881-1072 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso and **Khris Davis** have combined for 25 home runs, which is the most by an American League duo and second most by a Major League duo (Harper and Zimmerman, WAS 26)...**Mark Canha** is batting .440 (11-for-25) with three doubles, one triple, three home runs and seven RBI in eight games since he was recalled from Nashville May 9...each of his last six hits are for extra bases.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1930** Max Bishop walks five times in the first game of a doubleheader against New York and adds three more in the second game...in **1974** Reggie Jackson becomes the first Oakland Athletic to reach 200 homers when he hits a two-run homer in the seventh inning of the A's 8-1 win at Minnesota...in **1995** the A's tie a club record by turning six double plays, but still lose at Chicago, 6-4...in **1997** Jose Canseco doubles in the seventh inning of the A's 7-3 win at Texas for his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform...he becomes the ninth Oakland player to reach 1000 hits.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (5-2, 2.12 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.285), tied for third in wins (5), fourth in ERA (2.12) and opponents OPS (.561), sixth in opponents batting average (.209) and seventh in opponents on-base percentage (.277)...has surrendered just two home runs in 46.2 innings and his average of 0.39 home runs per nine innings is fourth lowest in the AL...is also tied for third in opponents reaching on an error (4) and hit batters (4), tied for fourth in stolen bases allowed (5) and tied for sixth in unearned runs (5).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has not allowed a hit to a left-handed hitter in either of his last two starts (0-for-17)...has a .135 (10-for-74) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .265 (26-for-98) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is second lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title (Keuchel, HOU .119)...also ranks fourth with a .130 (3-for-23) average against the clean-up hitter and seventh with a .167 (7-for-42) mark with runners in scoring position.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-1 with a 5.91 ERA (7 er in 10.2 ip) in two starts on four days rest, 4-1 with a 1.00 ERA (4 er in 36.0 ip) in his other six starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 0.47 ERA (1 r in 19.0 ip) in three starts on the road compared to 3-2 with a 3.25 ERA (10 er in 27.2 ip) in five starts at home...last year, he was 1-0 with a 5.58 ERA in 12 games on the road and 0-1 with a 2.81 ERA in 12 games at home.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.19 ERA (4 er in 30.1 ip) in five starts at night compared to 2-1 with a 3.86 ERA (7 er in 16.1 ip) in three starts during the day...has the second lowest night ERA in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his team-leading ninth start of the season...made six starts in his Major League debut last year...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his eight starts and walked one batter or fewer four times...has walked one batter or fewer 11 of his 14 career starts... has issued five of his 12 walks in the first inning...has allowed eight of his 16 runs in the third inning (5 er in 8.0 ip, 5.63 ERA)...has a 1.40 ERA (6 er in 38.2 ip) in all other innings...has eight runs of support in his last five starts after receiving 16 runs of support in his first three...took the loss April 23 against Seattle to snap a career-best four-game winning streak dating back to last year...won each of his first three starts this year to become the first A's pitcher to go 3-0 over his first three starts in the month of April...the four wins match the most by an Oakland pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (eighth time, last: Gray and Kazmir in 2014)...the ERA was second best by an A's pitcher over the last 10 years (Kazmir, 0.99 in 2015).

EARNED RUNS: Has allowed one earned run or fewer in six of his eight starts, including no earned runs four times...began the season with a 17.2-inning streak without allowing an earned run...that was the longest season-opening streak in Oakland history by a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster...it was third longest by any Oakland pitcher...since the earned run became an official stat in the American League in 1913, he is just the third A's pitcher to start the season with three games of five or more innings and no earned runs...joins Eddie Rommel (1924) and Vean Gregg (1918).

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) April 6 in Oakland...issued a career-high three walks...surrendered his only run in the third inning and it was unearned...Escobar led off with a single, went to second on a R.Davis error, third on a ground out and scored on a Pujols ground out...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the third for the win.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Kansas City April 12...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...surrendered four hits and walked one and allowed just three base runners to advance into scoring position...was relieved by Dull to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 8-0.

THIRD START: He improved to 3-0 in the A's 4-2 win over Texas on April 18 in Oakland...shut out the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings but Darvish blanked the A's on one hit over that Span...Triggs then allowed two unearned runs in the sixth when an Alonso error preceded an Andrus RBI single and a Mazara RBI ground out...the A's then scored four times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

FOURTH START: He was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 11-1 loss to Seattle April 23 in Oakland...yielded a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and then surrendered five runs in the third inning on a bases loaded walk to Cruz and a

Motter grand slam...was relieved by Coulombe after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0.

FIFTH START: He picked up his fourth win of the season in the A's 2-1 victory at Houston April 29...struck out a career-high nine batters and logged a career-high 7.0 scoreless innings...allowed five runners to advance into scoring position, but set down each of the final 10 batters that he faced.

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss to Detroit on May 5 in Oakland...allowed a career-high eight hits in 5.1 innings of work...was charged with two unearned runs in the third inning when Martinez had a two-run, two-out single after a Rosales error started the inning... then allowed a base loaded three-run triple to Adduci in the sixth inning and left trailing 5-0.

SEVENTH START: He picked up his fifth win of the season in the A's 3-1 victory over Los Angeles (AL) May 10 in Oakland...walked the first three batters he faced to match his career high in walks...tossed a career-high 105 pitches...those were his only three walks of the game...the first walk (Escobar) scored on a Marte fielders choice and Triggs blanked the Angels on three hits over his final five innings.

LAST START: He had his first no decision in the A's 9-6 win at Seattle on Tuesday...allowed a two-out solo home run to Cruz in the first inning but that was the only run he would allow in six innings...blanked the Mariners on two hits and three walks over his final five innings and left with a 4-1 lead...the bullpen allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-3 with an 8.10 ERA (23.1 ip, 29 h, 23 r, 21 er, 5 bb, 20 so) in seven games, including five starts...allowed a .299 (29-for-97) opponents batting average but issued just five walks in a teamleading 23.1 innings (1.93 per nine innings)...allowed five home runs... started in each of his final five outings (21 er in 19.1 ip, 9.78 ERA) after pitching in relief in his first two appearances (0 er in 4.0 ip).

2016 RECAP: Was claimed off waivers from Baltimore during the spring and went 1-1 with a 4.31 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 24 games (six starts) over eight stints in his Major League debut with the A's... the eight stints are believed to be the most in one season in Oakland history...struck out 55 and walked just 13 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.23... compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...then went 1-1 with a 2.58 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in 14 games (six starts), over his final four stints...allowed three home runs over his first four stints (18.0 ip) and two in his last four (38.1 ip)...his opponents batting average included a .235 (28-for-119) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .277 (28-for-101) against left-handers.

RHP Jesse Hahn (1-3, 3.02 ERA): Is scheduled to make his ninth appearance and eighth start of the season...is 0-2 with a 4.15 ERA and .267 opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first three starts... leads the majors in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.19)...ranks fifth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.292) and ninth in batting average (.219)...has received two runs of support or fewer in six of his seven starts and his season run support average of 2.45 is second lowest in the AL...is 1-0 with a 3.72 ERA in two starts in Oakland, 0-3 with a 2.84 ERA in five games on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-0 loss at Seattle last Wednesday (5.0 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...has never faced Miami in his career...is 3-2 with a 2.79 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in five career interleague starts
