OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-24) VS. MIAMI MARLINS (15-28)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped on Sunday and have now won four of the last six games after losing each of the previous four contests...are 8-7 over the last 15 games and are 20-24 (.455) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the third consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 9½ games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, eight days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and eight days in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's hit nine home runs in the four-game series against Boston and have now homered in 14 of the last 15 games (30 home runs total)...have 64 home runs for the season, which is third in the American League and second most in Athletics history after 44 games (66 in 2000)...rank second in the AL with 40 home runs at home (New York, 40)...nine of the A's last 13 home runs have come with runners on base...94 of the A's 176 runs (53.4%) have come on home runs...are 19-16 when homering, 1-8 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-11)...the pitching staff has allowed 43 home runs, which is second fewest in the majors (SF, 42)...the A's are 15-8 when out-homering the opponent, 5-16 when they don't

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this six-game homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (two games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand and are 14-9 (.609) at home compared to 6-15 (.286) on the road...are tied with Kansas City for the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 7-18)...have won seven of the last nine home games and 12 of the last 16 but have lost eight of the last 10 road games and 13 of the last 16...leave following the game tomorrow for a seven-game road trip to New York-AL (three games) and Cleveland (four games) that begins on Friday...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Seattle (1-2)...are 1-6-0 in road series compared to 5-1-1 in home series...have won five straight home series, which marks the first time the A's have won more than three straight home series since they won eight straight from May 30-July 24, 2014.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Oakland begins its 21st season of interleague play with this two-game series against Miami...the A's are one of two teams that has yet to play an interleague games (Dodgers)...will also host Washington (June 2-4), Atlanta (June 30-July 2) and San Francisco (July 31-Aug. 1) and travel to Miami (June 13-14), New York (July 21-23), San Francisco (Aug. 2-3) and Philadelphia (Sept. 15-17)...went 7-13 (.350) in interleague play last year, which was the fifth worst record in the majors and the worst mark by an American League team...it was the second worst interleague mark in Oakland history (5-13 in 2009)...finished with a losing record against the National League for the first time since 2011 and just the sixth time in 20 years of interleague play...are 198-166 (.544) all-time in interleague games, which is sixth best in Major League history.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors on Sunday (also April 9 and April 28) and have a Major League leading 42 for the season...also lead the majors in most unearned runs (30)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...the A's allowed four stolen bases on Sunday and have now surrendered 39 for the season, which is the most in the majors (PIT, 38).

OFFENSE: The A's have 139 extra base hits, which is tied with Houston for second most in the American League (TB, 144)...however, have the second fewest runs (176) and second lowest batting average (.237), are tied for the second most strikeouts (387) and have the third lowest on-base percentage (.306)...are batting .219 (63-for-288) with runners in scoring position, which is third lowest in the AL.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.99 ERA (93 er in 210.0 ip) at home compared to 4.88 (96 er in 177.0 ip) on the road...have a 4.40 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.385)...have hit 22 batters, which is second most in the majors to Miami (24)...rank second in the AL in wild pitches (23).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 5-12 with a 4.59 ERA (73 er in 143.0 ip) over the last 26 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over

the first 18 contests...are 14-17 with a 4.28 ERA for the season...starters have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (25) and have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.376).

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters are batting .195 (32-for-164) with four home runs and 11 RBI...the RBI are the fewest in the American League, the batting average is the lowest and the home runs are tied with Detroit and Houston for the fewest.

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting .178 (32-for-180) with 18 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .255 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage are second lowest in the majors (KC, .169/.206)...leadoff hitters are 7-for-40 (.175) with four walks (.250 on-base percentage) to start the game.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 11-7 (.611) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 9-17 (.346) in games decided by three runs or more...have the third best record in the American League in games decided by two runs or fewer but have the second worst record in the majors in games decided by three runs or more (SF, 7-14)...have a season run differential of -43, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -47).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have four walk-off wins in their last nine home games...the last three of those have been by home runs...the four walk-off wins are tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 5)...are 5-5 in one-run games, including 4-1 at home...the 10 one-run games are third fewest in the American League...are 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for fourth fewest in the AL...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAA)...it also matches Oakland's season total from last year...however, have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most in the majors (DET, 4; WASH, 3).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 2-6 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 6-5 against Oakland...have used a different lineup in each of their last 39 games...have used 42 different lineups overall in 44 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...the A's average time of game is 3:06, which is tied for third fastest in the AL...however, it is currently second slowest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Doolittle, Dull, Semien, Smolinski)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is currently on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 13 times this year...have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. MARLINS: The A's lead the all-time series 7-5...are 3-3 in Oakland and 4-2 in Miami...including 3-0 at Marlins Park...last met in 2014 when the A's swept a three-game series at Miami, June 27-29...last squared off in Oakland June 28-30, 2011...will face each other again in Miami, June 13-14...currently have a three-game winning streak against the Marlins.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso and **Khris Davis** have combined for 25 home runs, which is the most by an American League duo and tied for second most by a Major League duo (Harper and Zimmerman, WAS 26)...**Mark Canha** is batting .379 (11-for-29) with three doubles, one triple, three home runs and seven RBI in nine games since he was recalled from Nashville May 9...each of his last six hits are for extra bases...**Chad Pinder** has homered in back-to-back games for the first time in his career... is tied for fourth among AL rookies in home runs (5).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1901** Nap Lajoie receives the American League's first ever intentional walk with the bases loaded in a game against Chicago...in **1983** it takes 17 innings and 5 hours and 17 minutes, but the A's defeat the Milwaukee Brewers 5-4 on Rickey Henderson's two out single in the 17th...Oakland leads 3-0 entering the ninth before the Brewers score four times...Davey Lopes hits his second home run of the game in the bottom of the ninth to send the game into extra innings...in **2009** Jason Giambi homers off Arizona's Dan Haren in the fourth inning to become the 44th player in major league history to hit 400 home runs.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (1-3, 3.02 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his ninth appearance and eighth start of the season...is 0-2 with a 4.15 ERA (10 er in 21.2 ip) and .267 (23-for-86) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first three starts...was recalled from Nashville April 5 before the Sounds season started...pitched in relief in his first outing on April 7 at Texas but has started in each of his last six appearances.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has allowed just one home run in 47.2 innings and his average of 0.19 home runs per nine innings is the lowest in the majors...ranks fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.292) and ninth in batting average (.219).

SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in six of his seven starts, including no runs four times, and his season run support average of 2.45 (13 rs in 47.2 ip) is third lowest in the American League...had two runs of support or fewer in five of his nine starts last year of 17 of his 32 starts as an Athletic...the bullpen has blown the save in two of his six starts this year (April 25 and May 12)...the pen blew a save in three of his nine starts last year.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-0 with a 3.72 ERA (4 er in 9.2 ip) in two starts in Oakland, 0-3 with a 2.84 ERA (12 er in 38.0 ip) in five games on the road... last year, he went 2-1 with a 3.03 ERA and .237 opponents batting average in five starts at home, 0-3 with a 13.17 ERA and .453 opponents average in four starts on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 6-4 with a 3.13 ERA (36 er in 103.2 ip) in 17 starts in Oakland, 3-9 with a 4.86 ERA (47 er in 87.0 ip) in 16 games on the road.

INTERLEAGUE: Made one interleague start last year, a loss in a 4-0 decision at Milwaukee on June 8 (3.2 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...is now 3-2 with a 2.79 ERA (29.0 ip, 24 h, 10 r, 9 er, 12 bb, 21 so, 1 hr) and .224 (24-for-107) opponents batting average in five career interleague starts.

THIS AND THAT: Has committed two errors, which is tied for the most among American League pitchers...also ranks tied for fifth in assists (9) and sixth in total chances (14)...has yielded a .136 (11-for-81) batting average with two strikes after allowing a .300 mark with two strikes last year

FIRST APPEARANCE: He relieved A's starting pitcher Raul Alcantara to start the third inning of the A's 10-5 loss at Texas April 7...entered the game trailing 8-3 and tossed 6.0 innings in his third career relief appearance, his first as an Athletic...blanked the Rangers on two hits over his first three innings before allowing two runs in the sixth on a Gomez RBI double and a Mazara RBI single...those were the only runs he would allow.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss at Kansas City April 13...allowed two runs in the first inning on RBI singles by Cain and Perez, and another in the third on a Moss sacrifice fly...did not allow a run over his final three innings...Vargas (7.2 ip) and Soria (0.1 ip) shutout the A's on four hits and a walk over the first eight innings before Oakland scored its only run in the ninth.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-1 win over Texas on April 19 in Oakland, snapping a career-high tying three game losing streak dating back to last year...it was his first win since May 28, 2016... matched his career high by walking four batters...did not allow a hit until Napoli singled with one out in the fourth inning and surrendered his only run on a leadoff home run by Gallo in the fifth...left after six innings with the A's leading 8-1.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) on April 25...tossed 8.0 shutout innings and allowed just one hit...became the first Athletics pitcher since at least 1913 and just the 36th Major Leaguer over that stretch to toss at least 8.0 scoreless innings, allow one hit or fewer and not earn a win...walked Trout in the first, allowed a one-out single to Simmons in the fifth and walked Maybin in the eighth... none of the base runners advanced past first base...Ramirez (7.0 ip), Parker (1.0 ip) and Hernandez (1.0 ip) shutout the A's on two hits over the first nine innings.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss at Houston April 30...allowed a RBI double to Correa in the first, a RBI double to Gattis in the fourth and a two-run single to McCann in the fifth...left after six innings trailing 4-0...Keuchel shut out the A's on two hits over the first seven innings before Oakland scored single runs in the eighth and ninth.

FIFTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 win over Detroit May 6 in Oakland...tossed just 3.2 innings and issued a career-high tying four walks...allowed three runs in the second inning on a two-run triple by Romine and a RBI single by Castellanos...loaded the bases with two outs in the fourth and was relieved by Coulombe after tossing 101 pitches...Coulombe allowed one of the inherited runners to score.

SIXTH START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Texas May 12...shutout the Rangers on three hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when Gomez doubled to start the fifth, moved to third on a Hahn error on a pickoff attempt and scored on a DeShields sacrifice bunt/fielders choice...that was the only run he allowed in seven innings and he left with a 2-1 lead...Casilla allowed four runs in the ninth for the blown save.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Seattle last Wednesday...allowed a run in the first inning on a Cruz sacrifice fly and then blanked the Mariners on one hit over the next three innings...yielded three runs in the fifth inning on a two-run single by Segura and a Cruz RBI ground out...the A's were shutout on two hits by Bergman and Pazos.

2016 RECAP: Had four separate stints with the A's and went 2-4 with a career-high 6.02 ERA in nine starts...also had career highs in opponents batting average (.313), on-base percentage (.376) and slugging percentage (.484)...allowed a career-high eight home runs in 46.1 innings (1.55 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...struck out just 23 batters (4.47 per nine innings) and walked 19 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.21, which was the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .273 (27-for-99) against right-handed hitters compared to .361 (30-for-83) against left-handers...surrendered seven of his eight home runs to lefties and had a .663 slugging percentage against lefties, .333 against righties... his career splits are .215 (108-for-503) against righties, .270 (133-for-493) with 15 of his 18 home runs against lefties...has a .418 career slugging percentage against lefties, .274 against righties...allowed a .324 batting average with runners in scoring position...had a .226 opponents average over his first 30 pitches in a game, .358 after that...opponents hit .426 with a .449 on-base percentage and .681 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...in 2015, his marks were .215, .277 and .290 respectively...five of the eight home runs he surrendered were solo shots...yielded a .440 average to the first hitter in the batting order.

NIGHT AND DAY: Went 2-1 with a 3.90 ERA and .234 opponents average in five starts during the day, 0-3 with a 9.92 ERA and .427 opponents average in four starts at night...his career splits are 9-4 with a 2.39 ERA (28 er in 105.1 ip) in 17 day games, 7-13 with a 4.54 ERA (80 er in 158.2 ip) in 30 night games.

THIS AND THAT: Opponents were successful in each of their seven stolen base attempts off him after going 5-for-9 (55.6%) over his first two seasons...the A's were 5-4 (.556) in his starting assignments...tossed more than six innings in just three of his nine starts...has done that in just 12 of 44 starts in his career.

NASHVILLE: Went 1-7 with a 4.32 ERA and .276 opponents batting average in 15 starts with Nashville...surrendered just four home runs in 68.2 innings, an average of 0.54 per nine innings...however, issued 34 walks (4.59 per nine innings) and struck out just 46 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.35...went 0-7 with a 4.71 ERA in 10 starts at home where he allowed all four of his home runs.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Sonny Gray (1-1, 3.97 ERA): Is scheduled to make his fifth start since being reinstated from the disabled list May 1...began the season on the 10-day DL with a strained right shoulder...went 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two rehab appearances...was the winning pitcher in his last start, an 8-3 A's win over Boston last Thursday here in Oakland...had a no decision in his only career appearance against the Marlins, a start in the A's 7-6, 14-inning win at Miami on June 28, 2014 (5.0 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 4 so)... is 3-5 with a 3.61 ERA in 12 career interleague appearances, including 11 starts...went 0-0 with a 15.75 ERA in two starts this spring...opponents went 6-for-17 (.353) with four walks...struck out seven batters in 2.0 innings...went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts last year in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than 2½ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014.

- The bullpen allowed six runs (3.2 ip) on Sunday after tossing four straight scoreless outings (14.0 ip).
- Bullpen had not allowed a run at home in 26 straight innings before the streak was snapped in the eighth inning on Sunday...it was the longest home scoreless streak of the season (previous high: 7 ip, 4/5-4/6/17)
- In the month of May, the bullpen is sporting a 4-0 record with a 2.31 ERA (10 er in 39.0 ip) in ten games at home.
- Are 8-for-15 (53.3%) in save chances and have the fourth lowest save percentage in the American League...blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...the seven total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, Madson, 2 each; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each).
- Has allowed 20-of-54 (37.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL and fourth highest in the majors.
- A reliever has figured in the decision in eight of the A's last 15 games (5-3 record by relievers, 8-7 overall during stretch).
- Relievers rank second in the AL in unearned runs (11) and stolen bases (15), third in wild pitches (10) and tied for second in runs (79).

- Allowed a season-high four hits and four runs on May 12 at Texas...it was his second blown save and second loss of the season.
- Was 3-for-3 in save chances with a 3.38 ERA over his first eight games but is 3-for-5 with a 6.48 ERA (6 er in 8.1 ip) over his last nine contests.
