FISH BITES

The Marlins continue a six-game West-Coast road swing with game one of two against the Oakland Athletics at 10:05 p.m. EST. RHP **José Ureña** (1-2, 1.91), who is making his first career start and appearance against Oakland, has gone 0-2 with a 2.11 ERA in nine career Interleague appearances (two starts). Ureña is going up against RHP Jesse Hahn (1-3, 3.02), who is making his first career start and appearance against the Fish. Miami opened their current road trip by dropping three of four games against the Los Angeles Dodgers. The Fish wrapped up a nine-game homestand last Wednesday against St. Louis (0-3), Atlanta (1-2), and Houston (0-3). Once this trip concludes, the Marlins will face the Los Angeles Angels (May 26-28), Philadelphia Phillies (May 29-31), and Arizona Diamondbacks (June 1-4) at Marlins Park.

SUNDAY IN LOS ANGELES

Miami dropped the finale of a four-game set at Los Angeles, 6-3. The Dodgers struck for two runs off **Vance Worley** in the first inning and eventually worked up to a 3-0 advantage after four frames. The Marlins first run came in the fifth inning after **A.J. Ellis** drove in **Derek Dietrich**, who struck a two-out double to left field. With the score 6-1 going into the eighth, **Dee Gordon** dropped a two-out single into center and scored on an RBI single by **Marcell Ozuna**. **Justin Bour** provided the Marlins' final run in the ninth with a leadoff home run to center, his 11th of the season. Gordon and Dietrich led Miami's offense with two hits apiece. Worley, who had his contract selected from Triple-A New Orleans on Saturday, allowed three runs on six hits and a walk, while striking out two, over 4.0 innings.

AGAINST THE ATHLETICS

The Marlins and Athletics last squared off in 2014 when the A's swept the Fish in a three-game series from June 27-29 at Marlins Park. This series will mark the third time the Marlins have visited the Coliseum. The Marlins dropped two of three from June 20-22, 2008, and took two of three from June 28-30, 2011.

INTERLEAGUE NOTES

The Marlins have gone 2-8 in Interleague Play this season, facing off against Seattle (1-2), Tampa Bay (1-3) and Houston (0-3). Last year, Miami was 6-14 against the American League, playing the Central and Tampa Bay. The Fish have an overall record of 177-183 against the AL all-time. Miami leads all National League teams in hits (3,239), doubles (641), runs scored (1,631) and RBI (1,547) since the inception of Interleague Play.

MARLINS AND THE DH

Marlins designated hitters have combined for a .246 (178x725) mark, with 19 home runs in 181 Interleague games all time; the 178 hits are the second-most among NL teams, behind only St. Louis (191). This season, Miami's designated hitters are 6x21 (.286), with the most hits of any NL club, including one home run (**Giancarlo Stanton**, April 19 in Seattle). Last year, Marlins' designated hitters combined for a .298 average, fifth-best among NL teams, with one home run - by Stanton on June 28 at Detroit. The Marlins have used four different players at DH this season: Stanton (.500; 4x8), **Marlín Prado** (.200; 1x5), **J.T. Realmuto** (.250; 1x4) and **Marcell Ozuna** (.000; 0x4). In 11 career games as DH, Stanton has posted a .311 average (14x45) with three home runs and 11 RBI.

TRANSACTIONS

The Marlins today placed RHP **David Phelps** on the bereavement list and recalled RHP **Drew Steckenrider** (#71) from Triple-A New Orleans. In 16 appearances for the Baby Cakes, he has no record and 1.25 ERA (21.2/3). At the time of his recall, Steckenrider led all Pacific Coast League relievers in lowest batting average against (.125), ranked third in fewest baserunners per 9.0 (7.48), and had not allowed a run in his last six appearances (7.1 ip).

THREE DEEP

Miami's **Justin Bour** (11), **Marcell Ozuna** (11) and **Giancarlo Stanton** (11) have combined to hit 33 home runs this season. Among team trios in the Majors, that is tied for the third-highest total, with Colorado's Mark Reynolds (12), Nolan Arenado (12), and Charlie Blackmon (9). Washington's 35 from Bryce Harper (13), Ryan Zimmerman (13), and Daniel Murphy (9) lead MLB, while Cincinnati's Scott Schebler (13), Joey Votto (12), and either Adam Duvall (9) or Eugenio Suarez (9) rank second with 34. The Athletics are tied for fifth on that list, with Kris Davis (13), Yonder Alonso (12) and Ryon Healy (7) combining for 32. - Stats LLC

THE REAL DEAL

J.T. Realmuto has recorded at least one hit in each of his last 14 road games, tied with Jedd Gyorko for the longest active road hitting streak in the Majors. His current road hitting streak is the longest in Club history by a catcher, besting his own 11-game streak from July 4-26, 2015. Miami's longest road hitting streak by any player in Franchise history is 27 games by Luis Castillo from May 5-July 16, 2002. - Stats LLC

FULL BOUR

Prior to collecting a career-high four hits on April 30, **Justin Bour** was batting .184 (14x76) with two doubles, three home runs, nine RBI and a .267 on-base percentage. Since April 30, the big lefty has hit at a .348 clip (24x69) with three doubles, eight home runs, 19 RBI, and a .438 OBP. In that time, he is tied with Oakland's Yonder Alonso for the Major League lead in home runs and tied for third in the Majors in RBI. Among NL first basemen in that same span, he leads in home runs and average, and ranks second in hits (tied) and RBI.

HITTING THE ROAD

The Marlins have hit considerably better on the road than at home this season, posting a .276 road mark and .232 home average. Miami's road average leads the National League and ranks second in the Majors behind Houston (.277). **J.T. Realmuto** has led the way for Miami in that department, as his .388 average (31x80) leads the National League and ranks third in the Majors to Jose Altuve (.403) and Miguel Sano (.397). Realmuto's 31 road hits are tied for third in all of baseball with Daniel Murphy, behind Avisail Garcia (34) and Nick Markakis (32).

SERIES NOTES

- The last time the A's and Marlins met in South Florida, in 2014, Oakland came away with a three-game sweep, including one-run wins in the final two meetings. The second game was an extra-inning contest, which Oakland won 7-6 thanks to Josh Donaldson's RBI single in the top of the 14th inning. Miami loaded the bases in the bottom of the frame, but the A's held on for the win. **Giancarlo Stanton** went 3x6 with an RBI and a run scored in the game.
- Miami won the first game between the two franchises, 13-2, on June 3, 2003. Six hitters in the Marlins' starting lineup had multiple hits, including starting pitcher Brad Penny, who went 2x4 with three RBI.

THIS DAY IN MARLINS HISTORY

MAY 23

The Marlins hit five home runs against the White Sox in Chicago for a 13-0 victory in 2010. Cody Ross hit two home runs, while Ronny Paulino, Dan Uggla and Jorge Cantu contributed with one homer each. Josh Johnson picked up the win as he threw 6.0 shutout innings with six hits and two walks. In 2016, **Ichiro Suzuki** notched his second four-hit performance in the span of three games, going 4x5 vs. Tampa Bay, and became the only player in the Major Leagues since 1913 to have multiple four-hit games after the age of 42.113.
