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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (20-25) VS. MIAMI MARLINS (16-28)

WEDNESDAY, MAY 24, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:35 P.M. PDT RHP SONNY GRAY (1-1, 3.97) VS. RHP EDINSON VOLQUEZ (0-2, 4.87) MLB NETWORK — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight after winning three in a row to start the homestand...are 8-8 over the last 16 games and 20-25 (.444) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are five games under .500, which is one short of the season high of six (16-22 on May 15, 17-23 on May 17)...are in fourth place in the AL West for the fourth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 10½ games...that is one short of the season high of 11½ (May 17)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, nine days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and eight days in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 67 home runs, which is third most in the majors, and have allowed 44, which is tied for the fewest in the majors... the 67 home runs are second most in Athletics history after 45 games (69 in 2000)...have homered in 15 of the last 16 games (33 home runs total)... lead the majors with 36 home runs in May (ARI, 35)...that is the second best May home run total by the A's over the last 17 years (37 in 2014)... are tied with New York for the AL lead with 42 home runs at home...10 of the A's last 15 home runs have come with runners on base...98 of the A's 185 runs (53.0%) have come on home runs...are 19-17 when homering, 1-8 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-11)...are 15-9 when out-homering the opponent, 5-16 when they don't.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on this six-game homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (0-1)...went 4-2 on the last homestand and are 14-10 (.583) at home compared to 6-15 (.286) on the road...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 7-18)...have won seven of the last 10 home games and 12 of the last 17 but have lost eight of the last 10 road games and 13 of the last 16...leave following the game today for a sevengame road trip to New York-AL (three games) and Cleveland (four games) that begins on Friday...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Seattle (1-2)...are 1-6-0 in road series compared to 5-1-1 in home series.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Oakland began its 21st season of interleague play with a loss last night...the only team with fewer interleague games than the A's is the Dodgers... will also host Washington (June 2-4), Atlanta (June 30-July 2) and San Francisco (July 31-Aug. 1) and travel to Miami (June 13-14), New York (July 21-23), San Francisco (Aug. 2-3) and Philadelphia (Sept. 15-17)... went 7-13 (.350) in interleague play last

year, which was the fifth worst record in the majors and the worst mark by an American League team...it was the second worst interleague mark in Oakland history (5-13 in 2009)...finished with a losing record against the National League for the first time since 2011 and just the sixth time in 20 years of interleague play...are 198-167 (.542) all-time in interleague games, which is sixth best in Major League history.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's lead the majors in errors (43) and unearned runs (30)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...have allowed 41 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors (PIT, 38).

PITCHING: The A's allowed 11 runs on a season-high 19 hits last night after yielding a season-high 12 runs on what was then a season-high 15 hits on Sunday...now have a 5.48 ERA (58 er in 95.1 ip) over the last 11 games and a 4.55 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have the fourth lowest opponents slugging percentage (.391)...have hit 22 batters, which is tied with San Diego for second most in the majors to Miami (26)...are tied for the AL lead in wild pitches (25)...A's starting pitchers are 5-13 with a 4.84 ERA (78 er in 145.0 ip) over the last 27 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 14-18 with a 4.43 ERA for the season...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (25) and have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.382).

OFFENSE: The A's have 145 extra base hits, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the most in the American League...however, have the second fewest runs (185) and second lowest batting average (.237), are tied for the sec-

ond most strikeouts (395) and have the fourth lowest on-base percentage (.308)...are batting .139 (5-for-36) with the bases loaded, which is the second lowest mark in the majors (SD, .136)...are batting .225 (68-for-302) with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters are batting .201 (34-for-169) with five home runs and 14 RBI...the RBI are the fewest in the American League, the batting average is second lowest (KC, .199) and the home runs are third fewest (DET and HOU, 4).

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting .175 (32-for-183) with 20 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .259 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage are second lowest in the majors (KC, .167/.207)...leadoff hitters are 7-for-41 (.171) with four walks (.244 on-base percentage) to start the game.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 11-8 (.579) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 9-17 (.346) in games decided by three runs or more...have the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors in games decided by three runs or more...have a season run differential of -45, which is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have four walk-off wins in their last 10 home games...the last three of those have been by home runs...the four walk-off wins are tied for second most in the majors (LAA, 5)...are 5-5 in one-run games, including 4-1 at home...the 10 one-run games are tied for second fewest in the American League...are 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for fourth fewest in the AL...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAA)...it also matches Oakland's season total from last year... however, have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most in the majors (DET, 4; WASH, 3).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 2-6 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 6-5 against Oakland...have used a different lineup in each of their last 40 games...have used 43 different lineups overall in 45 games... the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...the A's average time of game is 3:07, which is second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Doolittle, Dull, Semien, Smolinski)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is currently on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 13 times this year...have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. MARLINS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2017 last night but still lead the all-time series 7-6...are 3-4 in Oakland and 4-2 in Miami...including 3-0 at Marlins Park...last met in 2014 when the A's swept a three-game series at Miami, June 27-29...last squared off in Oakland June 28-30, 2011...will face each other again in Miami, June 13-14.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso his ninth home run in the month of May last night, which is the most in the majors this month...prior to this year, had hit nine home runs in an entire season once (9 in 2012)...**Mark Canha** is batting .344 (11-for-32) with three doubles, one triple, three home runs and seven RBI in 10 games since he was recalled from Nashville May 9...each of his last six hits are for extra bases...**Ryon Healy** extended his hitting streak to 10 games last night and is 13-for-41 (.317) with no walks during the streak...it is his third career hitting streak of 10 or more games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1976** Bert Campaneris sets an Oakland record when he steals five bases in the A's 12-7 win against Minnesota..the A's stole seven bases in the game and an American League record 341 for the season...in **1994** Brent Gates singles in his first four at bats against Seattle after going 4 for 4 the day before to establish an Oakland record with eight consecutive hits...in **1995** Dennis Eckersley pitches the ninth inning in the A's 5-3 win over Baltimore to become the sixth reliever in major league history to reach 300 saves.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his fifth start since being reinstated from the disabled list May 1...began the season on the 10-day DL with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)...made two rehab starts before he was reinstated.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Went 0-3 with a 4.38 ERA (24.2 ip, 24 h, 13 r, 12 er, 3 bb, 17 so, 1 hr) in four interleague starts last year...is now 3-5 with a 3.61 ERA (29 er in 72.1 ip) in 12 career interleague appearances, including 11 starts

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss at Minnesota May 2...allowed a career-high tying three home runs...surrendered a solo home run to Dozier and a two-run home run to Sano in the third and a solo home run to Castro in the fourth...left after six innings trailing 4-0.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in his 100th career appearance, an 8-6 A's win over Detroit May 7 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Castellanos in the third inning but the A's scored twice in the bottom of the third and two more in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...he was then charged with three unearned runs in the fifth inning after an Alonso error...yielded RBI singles to Cabrera and Martinez and was relieved by Dull who allowed a third run to score on a wild pitch.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Texas May 13... allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the third but the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth...gave that run back in the bottom of the fourth on a Gomez RBI ground out but Oakland scored twice in the fifth and once in the seventh...was relieved by Dull to start the bottom of the seventh with the A's leading 4-2 but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh for the blown save and loss.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in his 100th career start, an 8-3 A's win over Boston last Thursday in Oakland...became the 22nd pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI single by Ramirez and a sacrifice fly by Young but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the first...allowed the tying run to score on a Moreland leadoff home run in the fourth but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the fourth for the win.

2016 RECAP: Went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than $2\frac{1}{2}$ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons...also had career highs in losses (11), home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475) and matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his average of 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings was a career low and his 3.23 walks per nine innings were a career high...had the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (.313) and the second most wild pitches...the wild pitches tied for sixth most in Oakland history and matched the most by an Athletic over the last 24 years... now has 46 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53)...the winning percentage tied for 10th lowest in Oakland history...among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched, he had the fourth highest ERA in the AL and the highest by an A's pitcher since 2000 (Olivares, 6.75)

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .286 (66-for-231) against right-handed hitters and .286 (67-for-234) against left-handers...surrendered 12 of his 18 home runs to righties...11 of the home runs were solo shots...the eight and nine hitters in the order batted a combined .467 with seven home runs and 21 RBI...however, held the five hitter to a .176 average, no home runs and four RBI...based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, his .468 average against the number eight hitter was the highest by a Major Leaguer since at least 1974...his .465 average against the nine hitter was third highest over that span and the highest since 1999 (Loaiza, TEX .500)...his mark against the five hitter tied for fourth lowest in the AL in 2016...using the 100 inning minimum, he had the fourth highest average with runners in scoring position in the AL (.330), tied for the fifth highest average when opponents put the first pitch in play (.467) and had the seventh highest average against batters leading off an inning (.321)...had a .233 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .318 after that.

THE BIG INNING: Yielded six runs in an inning once, five runs three times and four runs twice...he allowed 58 of his 80 runs in the single biggest inning of his 22 starts (25.13 ERA)...had a 1.84 ERA in all other innings.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE ALL-STAR BREAK: Went 2-3 with a 7.52 ERA in six starts after the All-Star Break after going 3-8 with a 5.16 ERA in 16 starts before the break...the eight losses were two more than his combined pre-break total from the previous two seasons (20-6, 2.42 ERA in 37 starts)...is now 24-15 with a 3.18 ERA (129 er in 364.2 ip) in 58 career appearances before the All-Star Break compared to 15-17 with a 3.79 ERA (112 er in 266.0 ip) in 44 games after the break.

THIS AND THAT: Compiled a 2.05 ERA in the first inning, a 3.43 ERA in the second inning and a 7.42 ERA from the third inning on...went 2-8 with a 6.50 ERA in 12 starts on four days rest, 3-3 with a 4.73 ERA in 10 starts on five days rest or more...is now 20-20 with a 3.64 ERA (137 er in 338.2 ip) in 53 career starts on four days rest, 19-12 with a 3.25 ERA (104 er in 288.0 ip) in his other 47 starts...the A's were 7-15 (.318) in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than five innings in five of his starts...had just three such starts over the first three years of his career.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (2-2, 3.83 ERA): Has three straight no decisions and has a 3.66 ERA over that span...is now 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA and .289 opponents batting average in five starts since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list April 27...was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .203 opponents average in three starts when he was placed on the DL list April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder...has allowed a .308 batting average with the bases empty compared to .183 with runners on base... opponents are 6-for-37 (.162) with runners in scoring position, which ranks seventh in the American League among qualifiers for the ERA title...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's win in 10 innings over Boston last Friday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...is 1-1 with a 3.06 ERA (17.2 ip, 18 h, 6 r, 6 er, 8 bb, 17 so, 2 hr) in three career appearances, all starts, against New York

- The bullpen has allowed six runs in back-to-back games (10.2 ip) after tossing four straight scoreless outings (14.0 ip).
- Tossed a season-high seven innings and allowed a season-worst 12 hits on Tuesday.
- In the month of May, the bullpen is sporting a 4-0 record with a 3.13 ERA (16 er in 46.0 ip) in ten games at home.
- Bullpen had not allowed a run at home in 26 straight innings before the streak was snapped in the eighth inning on Sunday...it was the longest home scoreless streak of the season (previous high: 7 ip, 4/5-4/6/17).
- Are 8-for-15 (53.3%) in save chances and have the fourth lowest save percentage in the American League...blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...the seven total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, Madson, 2 each; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each).
- Has allowed 21-of-56 (37.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the second highest percentage in the AL and fourth highest in the majors.
- Relievers rank third in the AL in unearned runs (11), tied for first in stolen bases (16), and second in wild pitches (12) and runs (91).
