OAKLAND ATHLETICS (21-25) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (27-17)

FRIDAY, MAY 26, 2017 — YANKEE STADIUM — 7:05 P.M. EDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (2-3, 5.24) VS. RHP MASAHIRO TANAKA (5-3, 6.56) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won four of six games on the last homestand after losing five of six on the previous road trip...are 9-8 over the last 17 games and 21-25 (.457) for the season...that is one game better than the A's 46-game record from last year (20-26) and five games better than 2015 (16-30)... are in fourth place in the AL West for the sixth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 10 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 11 days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and eight days in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 68 home runs, which is tied for fourth most in the majors, and have allowed 44, which is the fewest in the majors...the 68 home runs are second most in Athletics history after 46 games (70 in 2000)...Khris Davis leads the A's with 14 home runs and Yonder Alonso has 13...the 27 combined home runs are tied for the most by a Major League duo with the Nationals Harper (14) and Zimmerman (13)...the A's have homered in 16 of the last 17 games (34 home runs total)...11 of the A's last 16 home runs have come with runners on base...100 of the A's 189 runs (52.9%) have come on home runs...are 20-17 when homering, 1-8 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-11)...are 16-9 when out-homering the opponent, 5-16 when they don't.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a seven-game road trip to New York-AL (three games) and Cleveland (four games) tonight...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Seattle (1-2) and are 6-15 (.286) on the road compared to 15-10 (.600) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 7-18)...have lost eight of the last 10 road games and 13 of the last 16 but have won eight of the last 11 home games and 13 of the last 18...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (1-1)...are 1-6-0 in road series compared to 5-1-2 in home series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors on Wednesday (fourth time, second time in last three games) and now have 46 errors for the season, which is 10 more than any other team (CHI-NL, STL)...also lead the majors in unearned runs (30)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...A's catchers have combined for eight errors, which matches their season total from last year... the A's lead the majors in errors by pitchers (7) and are tied for the lead in errors by catchers and outfielders (9)...the A's have allowed 41 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors (PIT, 38).

PITCHING: The A's allowed a run on four hits on Wednesday after surrendering 23 runs on 34 hits over their previous two contests...have a 5.09 ERA (59 er in 104.1 ip) over the last 12 games and a 4.47 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have a .386 opponents slugging percentage, which is second lowest in the AL to New York (.374)...lead the AL in hit batters (22) and rank second in wild pitches (26).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-13 with a 4.68 ERA (79 er in 152.0 ip) over the last 28 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 15-18 with a 4.34 ERA for the season... have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (25) and have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.376)...have the third lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.240).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .253 (164-for-647) and are averaging 4.9 runs per game (93 runs) over the last 19 games after hitting .228 and averaging 3.6 runs per game over their first 27 contests...have the second fewest runs scored in the American League (189), the fourth most strikeouts (400) and the fourth lowest batting average (.239) and on-base percentage (.309)...however, are tied for second in extra base hits (150) and rank third in slugging (.429)...are batting .139 (5-for-36) with the bases loaded, which is the second lowest mark in the majors to the Yankees (7-for-41, ...171)...are batting .224 (70-for-312) with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters have hit four home runs in the last six games after belting just two home runs over the first 40 contests...the six home runs are tied for third fewest in the American League... have 16 RBI, which is the fewest in the AL, and are batting .202 (35-for-173), which is second lowest (KC, .195).

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting .171 (32-for-187) with 20 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .254 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage are second lowest in the majors (KC, .168/.208)...leadoff hitters are 7-for-42 (.167) with four walks (.239 on-base percentage) to start the game.

IN MAY: The A's are 10-11 (.476) in the month of May and the 10 wins are one short of their May win totals from each of the previous two seasons (11-17 last year, 11-19 in 2015)...have a 4.86 ERA (100 er in 185.1 ip), which is second highest in the American League (SEA, 4.96)...have hit 37 home runs, which match the most by an A's team in the month of May over the last 17 years (2014)...have hit at least 40 home runs in May once in Oakland history (46 in 2000)...are slugging .461, which is currently the best May slugging percentage in Oakland history (.456 in 2000)...rank second in the AL in May slugging percentage (HOU, .465) and are tied for second in home runs (HOU, 38).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 11-8 (.579) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 10-17 (.370) in games decided by three runs or more...have the worst record in the American League and are tied for the fourth worst in the majors in games decided by three runs or more...are 5-5 in one-run games, including 1-4 on the road...the 10 one-run games are tied for second fewest in the AL...have a season run differential of -42, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -46).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 2-5 on Friday, which is tied for the second worst record in the majors (BOS, 1-6)...have used a different lineup in each of their last 41 games...have used 44 different lineups overall in 46 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...are 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for fourth fewest in the AL...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAA)...it also matches Oakland's season total from last year... however, have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most in the majors (DET, 4; WASH, 3)...are 2-6 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 6-5 against Oakland ...the A's average time of game is 3:06, which is second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have six players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Doolittle, Dull, Semien, Smolinski, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is currently on a rehab assignment... have used the DL 14 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's went 3-4 against the Yankees last year and lost the season series for the first time since 2011 (3-6)...swept a three-game series in New York (April 19-21) but were swept in a four-game series in Oakland (May 19-22)...are 16-10 (.615) since the start of the 2013 season, which is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span...are 8-4 in New York and 8-6 in Oakland over that stretch...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 242-276 against the Yankees...that includes 132-127 in Oakland and 110-149 in New York... all-time, the A's are 783-1142 against the Yankees/Orioles.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso leads the majors with nine home runs in the month of May...prior to this year, had hit nine home runs in an entire season once (9 in 2012)...*Khris Davis* hit his 14th home run of the season Wednesday, which is tied for third in the American League...it gave the A's the lead and eight of his 14 home runs have put Oakland ahead...ranks third in the AL in go-ahead RBI (11)...*Ryon Healy* has an 11-game hitting streak (14-for-45, .311), which is the longest active hitting streak in the AL...*Jed Lowrie* was a perfect 4-for-4 on Wednesday and matched his career high in hits (seventh time)...is batting .520 (13-for-25) over his last six games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1954** Gus Zernial hits the last grand slam in Philadelphia A's history in a 6-5 win over Boston...in **1975** Gene Tenace has five RBI including the game winning RBI single in the bottom of the 11th inning of the A's 6-5 win over Baltimore...in **1989** Todd Burns, Rick Honeycutt and Eric Plunk combine to shutout the Yankees on one hit in a 4-0 victory at New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (2-3, 5.24 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (2 er in 5.0 ip) in two starts since he was reinstated from the 10-day disabled list May 15...was 1-2 with a 5.18 ERA in five starts when he placed on the DL April 30 retroactive to April 27 with a strained left shoulder...made one start on a rehab assignment with Triple-A Nashville May 9 against El Paso and had a no decision in the Sounds 8-6 loss (4.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 5 so, 72 pitches).

FIVE HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his seven starts this year...also surrendered five hits or fewer in each of his final six starts last year...has a streak of 13 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more, which is the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1911 (previous: 11 by Jarrod Parker in 2013, Rich Harden in 2006-07 and Todd Van Poppel in 1993).

BASE RUNNERS: Has allowed a .189 (24-for-127) opponents batting average...however, has issued 17 walks in 34.1 innings (4.46 walks per nine innings)...based on a minimum of 30 innings pitched, he has the fourth lowest opponents batting average in the American League but is averaging the sixth most walks per nine innings...has also hit four batters, which is tied for fourth most in the AL and matches his season total from last year (144.2 innings)...has a .304 opponents on-base percentage.

LEFT AND RIGHT: Has held left-handed hitters to a .074 (2-for-27) batting average compared to .220 (22-for-100) by right-handers...his career splits are .157 (20-for-127) against lefties. .255 (139-for-545) against righties... has a .495 career OPS against lefties, .743 against righties...held lefties to a .180 batting average last year, which was second lowest in the AL and the lowest in Oakland history among pitchers with 140 or more innings pitched...had a .526 OPS against lefties last year, which was second lowest in the AL and in Oakland history (.504, Norris, 1980).

THE SECOND INNING: Has allowed 13 of his 23 runs in the second inning for a 16.71 ERA (13 er in 7.0 ip)...has a 2.30 ERA (7 er in 27.1 ip) in all other innings...opponents are batting .444 (16-for-36) with a .487 on-base percentage (3 bb) in the second inning, .088 (8-for-91) with a .239 on-base percentage (14 bb, 4 hbp, 0 sf) in all other innings

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are batting .128 (10-for-78) with the bases empty compared to .286 (14-for-49) with runners on base...however, they are 6-for-30 (.200) with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .192 with runners in scoring position, which was third lowest in the AL among pitchers with 140 or more innings pitched...opponents are 4-for-68 (.059) with two strikes...they are 3-for-29 (.103) when leading of an inning but he has walked four and hit three for a .278 on-base percentage...has held the opponents two, three and four hitters to a .133 (6-for-45) batting average...however, has issued nine walks and hit two for a .304 on-base percentage...has a .296 (16-for-54) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .110 (8-for-73) after that...has a .115 (9-for-78) opponents batting average with zero or one out, a .306 (15-for-49) average with 15 of his 18 opponents RBI with two outs

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 3.27 ERA (8 er in 22.0 ip) in four starts at home compared to 0-3 with an 8.76 ERA (12 er in 12.1 ip) in three starts on the road...last year, he was 5-3 with a 3.02 ERA in 14 games (13 starts) at home compared to 2-6 with a 4.99 ERA in 11 starts on the road...had the fifth lowest home ERA in the American League...is now 7-3 with a 3.08 ERA (36 er in 105.1 ip) in 18 career games in the Coliseum compared to 2-9 with a 5.62 ERA (46 er in 73.2 ip) in 14 starts on the road.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss to Los Angeles (AL) April 4 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed three runs in the second inning on a two-run single by Maldonado and a RBI single from Escobar...an RBI triple by Trout in the fifth inning increased the Angels lead to 4-2 and he was relieved by Hendriks to start the seventh... the A's scored four times in the bottom of the seventh to get him off the hook.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-1 loss at Texas April 9...struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1 innings...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...allowed a three-run home run to Gallo in the second inning...loaded the bases with one out in the sixth and was relieved by Montas, who allowed all three runs to score.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-6 loss to Houston in Oakland on April 15...tossed 5.0 hitless innings but walked a career-high five batters and yielded two runs...is just the second A's pitcher since at least 1913 to toss five or more hitless innings and allow a run (Chris Codiroli, June 27, 1986 against Chicago)...became the first MLB pitcher since at least 1913 with the following pitching line: 5.0 ip, 0 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 6 so...had a 5-0 lead when he walked the bases loaded to start the sixth in-

ning...fielding errors by Rosales and Decker allowed two of those runs to score...the bullpen allowed eight runs over the final three innings for the blown save and loss.

FOURTH START: He picked up his first win of the season in the A's 3-1 victory over Seattle April 21 in Oakland...allowed five hits in 6.0 innings to extend his season-opening streak of consecutive starts with five innings or more and five hits or fewer to four...that matches the second longest such streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since Chad Gaudin also had a four-game streak in 2007...the longest is a five-game streak by Mike Norris in 1980...allowed his only run in six innings of work in the third inning when Heredia singled with two outs and scored on a Haniger triple... retired the side in order just once: the fifth...the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the fifth and then scored twice in the sixth for the win.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-5 loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 26...left the game after 2.0 innings with tightness in his left shoulder...it was the shortest outing of his career...retired the side in order in the first inning but then allowed a RBI double to Espinosa, a RBI single to Maybin and a RBI double to Maldonado in the second...was relieved by Montas to start the third.

SIXTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle on May 15...walked a career-high tying five batters but yielded just two hits in 5.0 innings...issued bases loaded walks to Valencia and Gamel in the first inning and allowed a two-run home run to Cruz in the second...retired each of the final 10 batters he faced following the Cruz home run.

LAST START: He picked up his second win of the season in the A's 8-3 victory over Boston last Saturday in Oakland...allowed two runs in the second inning on a Ramirez home run and a Rutledge RBI ground out, but Oakland came back to tie the game in the bottom of the second...allowed an unearned run in the fifth on a Pedroia RBI single but the A's scored five times in the bottom of the fifth for the win.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 1-1 with a 3.91 ERA (23.0 ip, 23 h, 13 r, 10 er, 10 bb, 17 so) in seven games, including six starts, this spring... surrendered just one home run in 23.0 innings...allowed a .258 (23-for-89) opponents batting average.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with the A's following an April 29 promotion and went 7-9 with a 3.86 ERA in 25 games, including 24 starts...ranked second among American League rookies in strikeouts (124), innings pitched (144.2) and games started and tied for fifth in wins... the strikeouts tied for sixth most in Oakland history by a rookie...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day disabled list June 14 with a left pronator strain...was reinstated June 29 and went 5-5 with a 2.74 ERA and .229 opponents batting average in 16 games, 15 starts, following his return...his ERA following his return from the DL was fifth lowest in the AL.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jharel Cotton (3-4, 5.68 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his second stint with Oakland this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...is 3-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in three starts during the day compared to 0-4 with a 9.47 ERA and .369 opponents average in four starts at night...was the losing pitcher in his last Major League start on May 9, a 7-3 decision against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland (5.0 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...has never faced the Yankees in his career...went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA and .200 opponents batting average in two starts with Nashville...walked just one batter in 12.0 innings while striking out 13... combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in his last start, a 4-0 Sounds win at Sacramento last Sunday (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches).

- Bullpen had not allowed a run at home in 26 straight innings before the streak was snapped in the eighth inning on Sunday...it was the longest home scoreless streak of the season (previous high: 7 ip, 4/5-4/6/17).
- Are 9-for-16 (56.3%) in save chances and is tied for the third lowest save percentage in the American League...blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)... the seven total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, Madson, 2 each; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each).
- Has allowed 21-of-56 (37.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the
