OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-25) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (27-18)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five of their last seven games after going 1-5 over their previous six contests...are 10-8 over the last 18 games and 22-25 (.468) for the season...that is two games better than the A's 47-game record from last year (20-27) and five games better than 2015 (17-30)...are in fourth place in the AL West for the seventh consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 10 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 12 days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and eight days in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 69 home runs, which is tied for fifth most in the majors, and have allowed 44, which is the fewest in the majors...the 69 home runs are second most in Athletics history after 47 games (72 in 2000)...*Khristian Davis* leads the A's with 14 home runs and *Yonder Alonso* has 13...the 27 combined home runs are the second most by a Major League duo to the Nationals' *Harper* (15) and *Zimmerman* (13)...the A's have homered in 17 of the last 18 games (35 home runs total)...12 of the A's last 17 home runs have come with runners on base...102 of the A's 193 runs (52.8%) have come on home runs...are 21-17 when homering, 1-8 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-11)...are 17-9 when out-homering the opponent, 5-16 when they don't.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are currently on a seven-game road trip to New York-AL (1-0) and Cleveland (four games)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Seattle (1-2) and are 7-15 (.318) on the road compared to 15-10 (.600) at home...have the second worst road record in the American League (SEA: 8-19, .296)...have lost eight of the last 11 road games and 13 of the last 17 but have won eight of the last 11 home games and 13 of the last 18...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (1-1)...are 1-6-0 in road series compared to 5-1-2 in home series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors on Wednesday (fourth time) and one last night...and now have 47 errors for the season, which is 11 more than any other team (CHI-NL, STL, SD)...also lead the majors in unearned runs (30)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...A's catchers have combined for nine errors, which is one more than their season total from last year...the A's lead the majors in errors by pitchers (7) and catchers (9), and are tied for the lead in errors by outfielders (9)...the A's have allowed 41 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors (CHC, PIT, 38).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed just two runs over their last two games after surrendering 23 runs on 34 hits over their previous two contests...have a 4.76 ERA (60 er in 113.1 ip) over the last 13 games and a 4.39 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have a .383 opponents slugging percentage, which is second lowest in the AL to New York (.374)...lead the AL in hit batters (22) and are tied for second in wild pitches (26).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-13 with a 4.47 ERA (79 er in 159.0 ip) over the last 29 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 16-18 with a 4.23 ERA for the season...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (25) and have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.373)...have the third lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.238).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .253 (173-for-683) and are averaging 4.9 runs per game (97 runs) over the last 20 games after hitting .228 and averaging 3.6 runs per game over their first 27 contests...have the second fewest runs scored in the American League (193), tied for the third most strikeouts (413), fourth lowest batting average (.239), and for third lowest on-base percentage (.308)...however, are third in extra base hits (153) and slugging (.428)...are batting .139 (5-for-36) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest mark in the majors...are batting .224 (72-for-321) with runners in scoring position, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters have hit four home runs in the last seven games after belting just two home runs over the first 40 contests...the six home runs are tied for third fewest in the American League...have 16 RBI, which is the fewest in the AL, and are batting .203 (36-for-177), which is second lowest (KC, .197).

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting .167 (32-for-192) with 20 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .248 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage are second lowest in the majors (KC, .164/.203)...leadoff hitters are 7-for-43 (.163) with four walks (.234 on-base percentage) to start the game.

IN MAY: The A's are 11-11 in the month of May and the 11 wins match their May win totals from each of the previous two seasons (11-17 last year, 11-19 in 2015)...have a 4.68 ERA (101 er in 194.1 ip), which is second highest in the American League (SEA, 4.90)...have hit 38 home runs, which are the most by an A's team in the month of May since they hit a franchise record 46 in 2000...that was the only time in franchise history the A's have hit more 40 or more home runs in May...are slugging .458, which is currently the best May slugging percentage in Oakland history (.456 in 2000)...rank third in the AL in May slugging percentage (HOU, .467) and are fourth in home runs.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 11-8 (.579) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 11-17 (.393) in games decided by three runs or more...have the third worst record in the American League in games decided by three runs or more (KC, .375; SEA, .385)...are 5-5 in one-run games, including 1-4 on the road...the 10 one-run games are tied for second fewest in the AL...have a season run differential of -39, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -44).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have used a different lineup in each of their last 42 games...have used 45 different lineups overall in 47 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...are 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for fourth fewest in the AL...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAA)...it also matches Oakland's season total from last year...however, have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most in the majors (DET, 4; WASH, 3)...are 2-6 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 6-6 against Oakland...the A's average time of game is 3:06, which is second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (*Bassitt*, *Doolittle*, *Dull*, *Hahn*, *Semien*, *Smolinski*, *Wahl*)...*Bassitt*, *Semien* and *Smolinski* are on the 60-day DL...*Bassitt* is currently on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 15 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's took the season series opener last night after going 3-4 against the Yankees last year...lost the season series in 2016 for the first time since 2011 (3-6)...swept a three-game series in New York (April 19-21) but were swept in a four-game series in Oakland (May 19-22)...are 17-10 (.630) since the start of the 2013 season, which is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span...are 9-4 in New York and 8-6 in Oakland over that stretch...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 243-276 against the Yankees...that includes 132-127 in Oakland and 111-149 in New York...all-time, the A's are 764-1124 against the Yankees.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Jed Lowrie is batting .552 (16-for-29) over his last seven games...grounded out in the sixth inning last night to snap a 7-for-7 stretch, which was one short of the Oakland A's record (three times)...*Yonder Alonso* is tied for first in the majors with nine home runs in the month of May...prior to this year, had hit nine home runs in an entire season once (9 in 2012)...*Khristian Davis* hit his 14th home run of the season Wednesday, which is tied for third in the American League...it gave the A's the lead and eight of his 14 home runs have put Oakland ahead...ranks third in the AL in go-ahead RBI (11).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1956 Art Ditmar scatters 10 hits and shuts out the Tigers 5-0 in the second game of a doubleheader...in 1984 Rickey Henderson is 3 for 3 with three stolen bases in the A's 7-1 win over New York...in 1985 Dwayne Murphy leads off the bottom of the 10th inning with a home run to lift the A's to a 2-1 win over the New York Yankees.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (3-4, 5.68 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his second stint with Oakland this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11...had a decision in each start and alternated wins and losses in each starts.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.89 ERA (4 er in 19.0 ip) and .169 (11-for-65) opponents batting average in three starts during the day compared to 0-4 with an 9.47 ERA (20 er in 19.0 ip) and .369 (31-for-84) opponents average in four starts at night...is now 5-0 with a 1.67 ERA (6 er in 32.1 ip) in five career starts during the day compared to 0-4 with a 6.43 ERA (25 er in 35.0 ip) in seven starts at night.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for the lead among American League rookies in wins (3), ranks second in innings pitched (38.0) and strikeouts (35) and third in games started (7).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 2.60 ERA (5 er in 17.1 ip) in three starts on the road compared to 1-3 with an 8.27 ERA (19 er in 20.2 ip) in four starts in Oakland...last year, he had no decisions and a 3.60 ERA in two starts on the road compared to 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA in three starts at home.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .194 (7-for-36) batting average to hitters leading off an inning but has issued four walks (.275 on-base percentage)...opponents are batting .235 (20-for-85) with the bases empty, .344 (22-for-64) with runners on base...however, five of his six home runs allowed have been solo shots as have eight of his 10 career home runs...has a .345 (20-for-58) opponents batting average and five home runs allowed the first time through the lineup, .242 (22-for-91) with one home run after that.

BY INNING: Has a 9.00 ERA (14 er in 14.0 ip), .355 (22-for-62) opponents batting average and all six of his home runs allowed in the first and second inning...has a 3.75 ERA (10 er in 24.0 ip), .230 (20-for-87) opponents average and no home runs from the third inning on...has allowed six runs in the first inning and nine in the second...last year he did not allow a run in the first inning and yielded just three in the second.

THIS AND THAT: Has received six runs of support in his four losses (19.0 ip, 2.84 RSA) and 12 runs of support in his three wins (19.0 ip, 5.68 RSA)...has allowed five home runs in his last two starts (11.0 ip) after surrendering just one over his first five starts (27.0 ip)...has walked 16 batters in 38.0 innings this year (3.79 per nine innings) after issuing just four free passes in 29.1 innings last year (1.23 per nine innings).

FIRST START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 5-0 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5 in Oakland...yielded five runs on eight hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...retired the first four batters before allowing three runs in the second inning on a RBI double by Simmons and a two-run single by Espinosa...also allowed RBI singles to Trout and Pujols in the fifth.

SECOND START: He combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...walked three...allowed just three baserunners to advance into scoring position.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-0 loss to Texas on April 17 in Oakland...allowed five runs in 5.1 innings and issued a career-high four walks...allowed a RBI double to Mazaara in the first inning and then retired each of the next 12 batters before walking the first two batters in the fifth inning...allowed two-run doubles to Gomez and Napoli in the fifth and left after 5.1 innings trailing 5-0.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 victory over Seattle April 22 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Cano in the first inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first...yielded a sacrifice fly to Cruz in the third but the A's got that run back in the bottom of the third...was relieved by Montas to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 4-2.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Houston April 28...allowed six runs on a career-high 10 hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...Oakland scored three times in the first but he allowed three unearned runs in the bottom of the first on RBI singles by Beltran and Guriel and a RBI double by Gattis...the A's scored once in the third to take a 4-3 lead but he allowed a Springer RBI single in the fourth and two more runs in the fifth, including a Gattis RBI single.

SIXTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-5 win at Minnesota May 4...struck out a career-high nine batters and yielded two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a pair of solo home runs in the bottom of the second to Rosario and

Santana...also yielded an unearned run in the fourth inning when Rosario scored on a Gimenez single and Jaff Decker error...left after six innings with a 6-3 lead.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 9 in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven runs in 5.0 innings...allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the first and the A's scored twice in the bottom of the first to take a 2-1 lead...then allowed a two-out solo home run to Revere and a three-run home run to Escobar in the second...yielded two more runs in the fourth inning on a Pennington RBI single and a Escobar RBI ground out.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA and .200 opponents batting average in two starts with Nashville...walked just one batter in 12.0 innings while striking out 13...surrendered two home runs...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win in his last start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win at Sacramento last Sunday...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches).

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 3-0 with a 4.35 ERA (20.2 ip, 16 h, 10 r, 10 er, 11 bb, 21 so, 2 hr) in six starts...held opponents to a .208 batting average...led the team in walks and strikeouts...tied for second in the Cactus League in wins...allowed one run in five of his six starts (surrendered five in the other)...also pitched in a Triple-A game March 15.

2016 RECAP: Was one of three players acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick at the trading deadline and made his Major League debut with Oakland in September...went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's...walked just four batters in 29.1 innings, an average of 1.23 per nine innings, and had a .214 opponents on-base percentage...struck out 23 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.75...yielded a .324 slugging percentage...his opponents batting average included a .146 (7-for-48) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .217 (13-for-60) against right-handers...yielded a .167 average with runners in scoring position and .132 with two strikes...opponents hit .163 the first two times through the lineup, .273 after that...the A's were 4-1 (.800) in his starting assignments...walked one batter or fewer in four of his five starts (walked two in the other), allowed one earned run or fewer four times and three hits or fewer three times...was rated as the A's No. 4 prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2016 season...began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and went 8-5 with a 4.90 ERA in 22 games, including 16 starts...was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following the trade and went 3-1 with a 2.82 ERA in six starts with the Sounds...combined with both clubs for an 11-6 record, a 4.31 ERA and .214 opponents batting average in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts...also led the PCL in opponents batting average (.214), tied for the league lead in shutouts (2), tied for second in complete games (2) and tied for 10th in wins (11)...had career highs in wins, games, starts, complete games, shutouts, strikeouts and inning pitched (135.2).

RHP Andrew Triggs (5-3, 2.77 ERA): Is 1-2 with a 3.97 ERA and .267 opponents batting average in four starts in the month of May after going 4-1 with a 1.84 ERA and .194 opponents average in five starts in April...is tied for third in the American League in wins (5), ranks fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.309), sixth in opponents OPS (.604) and 10th in ERA (2.77)...has surrendered just three home runs in 52.0 innings and his average of 0.52 home runs per nine innings is second lowest in the AL...is 2-0 with a 0.47 ERA in three starts on the road compared to 3-3 with a 4.09 ERA in six starts at home...has not allowed a run in the second inning this year (9.0 ip) or his career (15.0 ip)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 12-3 A's loss to Boston last Sunday in Oakland (5.1 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 7 so)...has faced the Yankees once his career and it came in relief last year on May 20 in Oakland in an 8-3 A's loss (3.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so).
