### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-26) VS. NEW YORK YANKEES (28-18)

SUNDAY, MAY 28, 2017 — YANKEE STADIUM — 1:05 P.M. EDT RHP ANDREW TRIGGS (5-3, 2.77) VS. RHP MICHAEL PINEDA (5-2, 3.35) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won five of their last eight games after going 1-5 over their previous six contests...are 10-9 over the last 19 games and 22-26 (.458) for the season...that is two games better than the A's 48-game record from last year (20-28) and five games better than 2015 (17-31)... are in fourth place in the AL West for the eighth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 11 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 13 days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and eight days in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 70 home runs, which is tied for fifth most in the majors, and have allowed 44, which is the fewest in the majors...the 70 home runs are second most in Athletics history after 48 games (73 in 2000)...Khris Davis leads the A's with 14 home runs and Yonder Alonso has 13...the 27 combined home runs are the second most by a Major League duo to the Nationals' Harper (15) and Zimmerman (13)...the A's have homered in 18 of the last 19 games (36 home runs total)...12 of the A's last 18 home runs have come with runners on base...103 of the A's 195 runs (52.8%) have come on home runs...are 21-18 when homering, 1-8 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-11)...are 17-8 when out-homering the opponent, 5-16 when they don't.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are currently on a seven-game road trip to New York-AL (1-1) and Cleveland (four games)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Seattle (1-2) and are 7-16 (.304) on the road compared to 15-10 (.600) at home...have the second worst road record in the American League (SEA: 8-20, .286)...have lost eight of the last 12 road games and 13 of the last 18 but have won eight of the last 11 home games and 13 of the last 18...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (1-1)...are 1-6-0 in road series compared to 5-1-2 in home series.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's committed a season-high tying three errors on Wednesday (fourth time) and one Friday night...and now have 47 errors for the season, which is 10 more than any other team (CHI-NL, STL, SD)...also lead the majors in unearned runs (30)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...A's catchers have combined for nine errors, which is one more than their season total from last year...the A's are tied in the majors in errors by pitchers (7), and are first in catchers (9) errors, and are tied for the lead in errors by outfielders (9)...the A's have allowed 41 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors (CHC, 39).

**PITCHING:** The A's have allowed just five runs over their last three games after surrendering 23 runs on 34 hits over their previous two contests... have a 4.45 ERA (63 er in 121.1 ip) over the last 15 games and a 4.37 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have a .381 opponents slugging percentage, which is second lowest in the AL to New York (.374)...lead the AL in hit batters (23) and are tied for second in wild pitches (27).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 7-14 with a 4.48 ERA (82 er in 164.2 ip) over the last 30 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 16-19 with a 4.24 ERA for the season...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (25) and have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.371)...have the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.236).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .251 (180-for-716) and are averaging 4.7 runs per game (99 runs) over the last 21 games after hitting .228 and averaging 3.6 runs per game over their first 27 contests...have the second fewest runs scored in the American League (195), fourth most strikeouts (427), fourth lowest batting average (.238), and for third lowest on-base percentage (.308)...however, are third in extra base hits (157) and slugging (.428)...are batting .139 (5-for-36) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest mark in the majors...are batting .219 (72-for-329) with runners in scoring position, which is third lowest in the AL.

**DESIGNATED HITTERS:** A's designated hitters have hit four home runs in the last eight games after belting just two home runs over the first 40 contests...have 16 RBI, which is the fewest in the AL, and are batting .200 (36-for-180), which is second lowest (KC, .194).

**LEADOFF HITTERS:** A's leadoff hitters are batting .162 (32-for-197) with 20 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .242 on-base percentage)...the batting average is lowest in the majors while on-base percentage is second lowest in the majors (KC, .203)...leadoff hitters are 7-for-44 (.159) with four walks (.229 on-base percentage) to start the game.

**IN MAY:** The A's are 11-12 in the month of May and the 11 wins match their May win totals from each of the previous two seasons (11-17 last year, 11-19 in 2015)...have a 4.63 ERA (104 er in 202.1 ip), which is second highest in the American League (SEA, 4.97)...have hit 39 home runs, which are the most by an A's team in the month of May since they hit a franchise record 46 in 2000...that was the only time in franchise history the A's have hit more 40 or more home runs in May...are slugging .455, which is currently the second best slugging month of May in Oakland history (.456 in 2000)...rank third in the AL in May slugging percentage (HOU, .469) and are fourth in home runs.

**SCORING MARGIN:** The A's are 11-9 (.550) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 11-17 (.393) in games decided by three runs or more...have the second worst record in the American League in games decided by three runs or more (SEA, .370)...are 5-6 in one-run games, including 1-5 on the road...the 11 one-run games are tied for second fewest in the AL...have a season run differential of -40, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -41).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have used a different lineup in each of their last 43 games...have used 46 different lineups overall in 48 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...are 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for fourth fewest in the AL...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAA)... it also matches Oakland's season total from last year...however, have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most in the majors (DET, 4; WASH, 3)...are 2-6 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 6-6 against Oakland...the A's average time of game is 3:06, which is second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Doolittle, Dull, Hahn, Semien, Smolinski, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is currently on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 15 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. YANKEES: The A's are 1-1 in the three-game series after going 3-4 against the Yankees last year...lost the season series in 2016 for the first time since 2011 (3-6)...swept a three-game series in New York (April 19-21) but were swept in a four-game series in Oakland (May 19-22)...are 17-11 (.607) since the start of the 2013 season, which is the best record by an American League team against the Yankees over that span...are 9-5 in New York and 8-6 in Oakland over that stretch...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 243-277 against the Yankees...that includes 132-127 in Oakland and 111-150 in New York...all-time, the A's are 764-1125 against the Yankees.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Jed Lowrie** is batting .485 (16-for-33) over his last eight games...had his seven-game hitting streak snapped yesterday, and was ejected for the first time in his career...**Yonder Alonso** is tied for first in the majors with nine home runs in the month of May.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1972 George Hendrick hits his first Major League home run, a walk-off shot in the A's 5-4 win over Chicago...in 1980 Dwayne Murphy and Wayne Gross both steal home in the first inning of a 6-3 win over Kansas City at the Coliseum...the A's stole seven bases in the game...in 1996 Mark McGwire hits the 9000th home run in the history of the Athletics franchise in the A's 6-2 win over Boston.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (5-3, 2.77 ERA)

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-2 with a 3.97 ERA (10 er in 22.2 ip) and .267 (23-for-86) opponents batting average in four starts in the month of May after going 4-1 with a 1.84 ERA and .194 opponents average in five starts in April...his four wins in April match the most by an Oakland pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (eighth time, last: Gray and Kazmir in 2014)...his April ERA was second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 10 years (Kazmir, 0.99 in 2015).

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Is tied for fourth in the American League in wins (5), ranks fourth in opponents slugging percentage (.309) opponents OPS (.604), and ninth in ERA (2.77)...has surrendered just three home runs in 52.0 innings and his average of 0.52 home runs per nine innings is second lowest in the AL...opponents have stolen nine bases with him on the mound, which is tied for the most in the AL and tied for third most in the majors...is also tied for third in opponents reaching on an error (5), tied for eighth in hit batters (4) and tied for fifth in unearned runs (6).

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-0 with a 0.47 ERA (1 r in 19.0 ip) in three starts on the road compared to 3-3 with a 4.09 ERA (15 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts at home...last year, he was 1-0 with a 5.58 ERA in 12 games on the road and 0-1 with a 2.81 ERA in 12 games at home.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has a .146 (12-for-82) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .286 (32-for-112) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title (Keuchel, HOU .114)...also ranks fourth with a .160 (4-for-25) average against the clean-up hitter and fourth with a .167 (8-for-48) mark with runners in scoring position...opponents are 2-for-17 (.118) with RISP and two outs.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on six days rest today...is 4-1 with a 1.00 ERA (4 er in 36.0 ip) in six starts with five days rest or more, 1-2 with a 6.75 ERA (12 er in 16.0 ip) in two starts on four days rest.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 3-1 with a 1.19 ERA (4 er in 30.1 ip) in five starts at night compared to 2-2 with a 4.98 ERA (12 er in 21.2 ip) in four starts during the day.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his team-leading 10th start of the season...made six starts in his Major League debut last year...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his nine starts and walked one batter or fewer four times...has walked one batter or fewer 11 of his 15 career starts... has issued six of his 15 walks in the first inning...has not allowed a run in the second this year (9.0 ip) or his career (15.0 ip)...also has not allowed a run in the fourth inning this year...has 11 runs of support in his last six starts after receiving 16 runs of support in his first three...took the loss April 23 against Seattle to snap a career-best four-game winning streak dating back to last year...won each of his first three starts this year to become the first A's pitcher to go 3-0 over his first three starts since Tommy Milone in 2013.

**EARNED RUNS:** Has allowed one earned run or fewer in six of his nine starts, including no earned runs four times...began the season with a 17.2-inning streak without allowing an earned run...that was the longest season-opening streak in Oakland history by a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster...it was third longest by any Oakland pitcher...since the earned run became an official stat in the American League in 1913, he is just the third A's pitcher to start the season with three games of five or more innings and no earned runs...joins Eddie Rommel (1924) and Vean Gregg (1918)

**FIRST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) April 6 in Oakland...issued a career-high three walks...surrendered his only run in the third inning and it was unearned...Escobar led off with a single, went to second on a R.Davis error, third on a ground out and scored on a Pujols ground out...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the third for the win.

**SECOND START:** He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Kansas City April 12...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...surrendered four hits and walked one and allowed just three base runners to advance into scoring position...was relieved by Dull to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 8-0.

**THIRD START:** He improved to 3-0 in the A's 4-2 win over Texas on April 18 in Oakland...shut out the Rangers on two hits over the first five innings but Darvish blanked the A's on one hit over that Span...Triggs then allowed two unearned runs in the sixth when an Alonso error preceded an Andrus RBI single and a Mazara RBI ground out...the A's then scored four times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

**FOURTH START:** He was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 11-1 loss to Seattle April 23 in Oakland...yielded a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and then surrendered five runs in the third inning on a bases loaded walk to Cruz and a Motter grand slam...was relieved by Coulombe after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0.

**FIFTH START:** He picked up his fourth win of the season in the A's 2-1 victory at Houston April 29...struck out a career-high nine batters and logged a career-high 7.0 scoreless innings...allowed five runners to advance into scoring position, but set down each of the final 10 batters that he faced.

**SIXTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss to Detroit on May 5 in Oakland...allowed a career-high eight hits in 5.1 innings of work...was charged with two unearned runs in the third inning when Martinez had a two-run, two-out single after a Rosales error started the inning... then allowed a base loaded three-run triple to Adduci in the sixth inning and left trailing 5-0.

**SEVENTH START:** He picked up his fifth win of the season in the A's 3-1 victory over Los Angeles (AL) May 10 in Oakland...walked the first three batters he faced to match his career high in walks...tossed a career-high 105 pitches...those were his only three walks of the game...the first walk (Escobar) scored on a Marte fielders choice and Triggs blanked the Angels on three hits over his final five innings.

**EIGHTH START:** He had his first no decision in the A's 9-6 win at Seattle on May 16...allowed a two-out solo home run to Cruz in the first inning but that was the only run he would allow in six innings...blanked the Mariners on two hits and three walks over his final five innings and left with a 4-1 lead...the bullpen allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-3 loss to Boston a week ago today in Oakland...matched his career highs in hits (8), runs (6) and walks (3)...allowed two runs in the first inning on an error and a Benintendi sacrifice fly...Oakland scored once in the second and twice in the fourth to take a 3-2 lead but he allowed a pair of RBI singles to Betts and Pedroia in the fifth and a two-run home run to Moreland in the sixth.

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Went 1-3 with an 8.10 ERA (23.1 ip, 29 h, 23 r, 21 er, 5 bb, 20 so) in seven games, including five starts...allowed a .299 (29-for-97) opponents batting average but issued just five walks in a teamleading 23.1 innings (1.93 per nine innings)...allowed five home runs.

**2016 RECAP:** Was claimed off waivers from Baltimore during the spring and went 1-1 with a 4.31 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 24 games (six starts) over eight stints in his Major League debut with the A's... the eight stints are believed to be the most in one season in Oakland history...struck out 55 and walked just 13 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.23... compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...then went 1-1 with a 2.58 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in 14 games (six starts), over his final four stints...his opponents batting average included a .235 mark against right-handed hitters compared to .277 against left-handers.

- In the month of May, the bullpen is sporting a 4-0 record with a 3.06 ERA (17 er in 50.0 ip) in ten games at home.
- Bullpen had not allowed a run at home in 26 straight innings before the streak was snapped in the eighth inning on last Sunday...it was the longest home scoreless streak of the season.

- Relievers rank third in the AL in unearned runs (11), second in stolen bases (16), third in wild pitches (12) and fourth in runs (92).
