OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-27) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (25-23)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 5-4 in their last nine games after going 1-5 over their previous six contests...are 10-10 over the last 20 games and 22-27 (.449) for the season...that is two games better than the A's 49-game record from last year (20-29) and five games better than 2015 (17-32)...are in fourth place in the AL West for the ninth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by 12 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, three days tied for fourth and eight days in fifth.

THE LONG BALL: The A's have hit 71 home runs, which is tied for fourth most in the majors, and have allowed 46, which is the fewest in the majors...the 71 home runs are second most in Athletics history after 48 games (74 in 2000)...Khris Davis leads the A's with 15 home runs and Yonder Alonso has 13...the 28 combined home runs are tied for the most by a Major League duo (WAS: Harper/Zimmerman; CIN: Schebler/Duvall)...the A's have homered in 19 of the last 20 games (37 home runs total)...13 of the A's last 19 home runs have come with runners on base...105 of the A's 200 runs (52.5%) have come on home runs...are 21-19 when homering, 1-8 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-12)...are 17-9 when out-homer the opponent, 5-18 when they don't.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are currently on a seven-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2) and Cleveland (four games)...went 1-5 on the last road trip to Texas (0-3) and Seattle (1-2) and are 7-17 (.292) on the road compared to 15-10 (.600) at home...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI: 7-18, .280)...have lost 16 of the last 20 road games but have won eight of the last 11 home games and 13 of the last 18...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (1-1)...are 1-7-0 in road series compared to 5-1-2 in home series.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors on Wednesday (fourth time) and at least one error in 10 of their last 12 games...now have 49 errors for the season, which is 11 more than any other team (Tampa Bay)...also lead the majors in unearned runs (35), which is six more than any other team (Atlanta)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...A's catchers have combined for 10 errors, which is two more than their season total from last year...the A's lead the majors in errors by catchers (10) and outfielders (10)...are tied for the major league lead in errors by pitchers (7)...the A's have allowed 42 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors (CHC, 40).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed just nine earned runs over their last four games (34.0 ip, 2.38 ERA) after surrendering 23 runs on 34 hits over their previous two contests...have a 4.37 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have a .382 opponents slugging percentage, which is second lowest in the AL to New York (.372)...lead the AL in hit batters (23) and are tied for second in wild pitches (27).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 7-15 with a 4.38 ERA (83 er in 170.2 ip) over the last 31 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 16-20 with a 4.18 ERA for the season...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (27) and have the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.372)...have the second lowest opponents batting average in the American League (.237).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .247 (184-for-746) and are averaging 4.7 runs per game (104 runs) over the last 22 games after hitting .228 and averaging 3.6 runs per game over their first 27 contests...have the second fewest runs scored in the American League (200) and the fourth most strikeouts (434)...have the third lowest batting average (.236) and on-base percentage (.307)...however, are third in extra base hits (159) and slugging (.424)...are batting .139 (5-for-36) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest mark in the majors...are batting .219 (73-for-334) with runners in scoring position, which is third lowest in the AL.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters have hit four home runs in the last nine games after belting just two home runs over the first 40 contests...have 16 RBI, which is the fewest in the AL, and are batting .196 (36-for-184), which is second lowest (KC, .191).

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting .159 (32-for-201) with 20 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .238 on-base percentage)...the batting

average is lowest in the majors while on-base percentage is second lowest in the majors (KC, .199)...leadoff hitters are 7-for-45 (.156) with four walks (.224 on-base percentage) to start the game.

IN MAY: The A's are 11-13 in the month of May and the 11 wins match their May win totals from each of the previous two seasons (11-17 last year, 11-19 in 2015)...have a 4.62 ERA (108 er in 210.1 ip), which is second highest in the American League (SEA, 4.77)...have hit 40 home runs, which are the most by an A's team in the month of May since they hit a franchise record 46 in 2000...this marks only the second time in franchise history the A's have hit 40 or more home runs in May...are slugging .448, which is currently the third best slugging month of May in Oakland history (.456 in 2000; .454 in 1987)...rank third in the AL in May slugging percentage (HOU, .474) and are tied for third in home runs.

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 11-9 (.550) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 11-18 (.379) in games decided by three runs or more...have the worst record in the American League in games decided by three runs or more...are 5-6 in one-run games, including 1-5 on the road...the 11 one-run games are tied for second fewest in the AL...have a season run differential of -44, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -50).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have used a different lineup in each of their last 44 games...have used 47 different lineups overall in 49 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...are 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAA, PIT)...it also matches Oakland's season total from last year...however, have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most in the majors (DET, 4; WASH, 3)...are 2-7 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 7-6 against Oakland...the A's average time of game is 3:06, which is second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Doolittle, Dull, Graveman, Hahn, Semien, Smolinski, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is currently on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 16 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...seven of the 16 DL stints have been by starting pitchers (Bassitt, Graveman (2), Gray, Hahn, Manaëa, Mengden)...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's lost the season series last season, 4-2...lost the first four games to the Tribe but won the final two...went 2-1 in Oakland after getting swept in a three-game series at Cleveland at the end of July...over the last six years, the A's have lost three season series (2011, '13, '16) and won three (2012, '14, '15)...are 22-21 against the Indians over that span...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 270-236 against the Indians...that breaks down to 143-104 in Oakland and 127-132 in Cleveland...including 42-63 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 905-1029 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Daniel Coulombe has not allowed a hit to a first batter faced in his last 12 appearances (0-for-10, bb, hbp) after starting the season allowing four hits his first seven outings...**Jed Lowrie** is batting .457 (16-for-35, 2 bb, hbp) with a .500 on base percentage over his last nine games...had a seven-game hitting streak snapped Saturday and was ejected for the first time in his career...**Yonder Alonso** is tied for first in the majors with nine home runs in the month of May...had never hit more than nine home runs in a season before this year (9 in 2012).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1909** Frank Baker hits the first home run at Shibe Park...in **1990** Rickey Henderson breaks Ty Cobb's American League stolen base record with his 893rd career steal...in **2000** Randy Velarde turns the 10th regular season unassisted triple play in major league history but the A's lose at New York, 4-1.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (0-0, — ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today and will be making his 2017 debut...started the season on the 10-day disabled list following right foot surgery on Feb. 8...began a rehab assignment with Nashville on May 8 and made three starts before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 20.

MENGDEN vs. CLEVELAND: Is making his first career appearance.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 2-1 with a 2.21 ERA in four starts...went 0-1 with a 4.91 ERA and five walks in 7.1 innings over his first two starts and was 2-0 with a 0.69 ERA and no walks in 13.0 innings over his final two...allowed a .189 opponents batting average, including .167 (8-for-48) against left-handed hitters compared to .231 (6-for-26) against right-handers...held opponents to a .150 batting average and no walks when leading off an inning and surrendered his only two home runs in that situation.

START-BY-START WITH NASHVILLE: Began his rehab assignment on **May 8** against El Paso and took the loss in a 5-4 decision...allowed two runs in the third inning on a Carlos Asuaje RBI double and a Nick Buss sacrifice fly...left with two outs in the fourth inning and the Sounds trailing 2-1...had a no decision in a 7-3 Sounds win over Albuquerque on **May 13**...faced one batter over the minimum over the first three innings, issuing a one-out walk to Tony Wolters in the first...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the fourth inning on a Wolters leadoff home run and a Domonic Brown RBI single...left with a 4-2 lead and two outs in the fourth after throwing 76 pitches...picked up his first win in Nashville's 13-3 win at Fresno **May 18**...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings...had a 4-0 lead when he surrendered a leadoff home run to Max Stassi in the bottom of the third

LAST START: He combined with Chris Smith on a three-hit shutout in Nashville's 10-0 win over Omaha last Tuesday in Nashville...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits...did not walk a batter...retired each of the first nine batters before hitting Billy Burns with a pitch to start the fourth...Raul Mondesi followed with a double but he retired the next 11 batters before allowing a two-out double to Ryan O'Hearn and a single to Terrance Gore...then retired the final batter and left with a 9-0 lead.

SURGERY: Had surgery on his right foot Feb. 8 at Houston Methodist Hospital...he fractured his medial tibial sesamoid bone while throwing a bullpen at home Jan. 31...the surgery, which involved a sesamoidectomy, was performed by Dr. Kevin Varner.

2016 RECAP: Made his Major League debut with Oakland in his third professional season after beginning the year with no experience above Single-A...went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts with Double-A Midland, 8-2 with a 1.67 ERA in 13 starts with Triple-A Nashville and 2-9 with a 6.50 ERA in 14 starts over two stints with Oakland...his ERA with the A's was second highest in the majors among pitchers with 70 or more innings pitched (Blair, ATL 7.59)...his .182 winning percentage was second lowest in the majors among pitchers with 10 or more decisions (Morgan, PHI .154) and sixth lowest in Oakland history...tied for fourth among American League rookies in games started and ranked 10th in innings pitched (72.0) and strikeouts (71).

HOME AND AWAY: Went 0-7 with a 6.86 ERA in eight starts at home compared to 2-2 with a 6.06 ERA in six starts on the road...is just the third Athletics pitcher since at least 1911 to go 0-7 or worse at home...joins Tom Sheehan (0-7 in 1916) and Rip Coleman (0-7 in 1959)...tied for fifth in the AL in home losses.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 0-6 with a 4.50 ERA in six starts during the day compared to 2-3 with an 8.29 ERA in eight starts at night...is the first A's pitcher to go 0-6 or worse during the day since Diego Segui went 0-9 for the Kansas City A's in 1965...tied for fourth in the AL in day losses.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .284 opponents batting average, which included a .283 (39-for-138) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .286 (44-for-154) against right-handers...yielded a .212 opponents batting average and one home run the first time through the lineup, .333 and eight home runs after that...opponents hit .300 with runners in scoring position but that mark dropped to .207 with RISP and two outs...

held the opponents number five hitter to a .143 batting average, but then seven through nine hitters in the order combined to bat .353.

THIS AND THAT: Combined for a 2.57 ERA and .225 opponents batting average in innings one and two...had a 9.00 ERA and .316 opponents average from the third inning on...was 1-4 with a 4.54 ERA in six starts before the All-Star Break, 1-5 with an 8.42 ERA in eight starts after the break...received 22 runs of support in his two wins (13.50 RSA) and just 18 runs of support in his other 12 starts (2.83 RSA)...the A's were 3-11 (.214) in his starting assignments.

MORE WITH OAKLAND: Was selected from Nashville June 11 and made his ML debut that day at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...at the age of 23 years, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011 (23 years, 110 days)...allowed two runs in 5.2 innings but took the loss in a 2-1 decision...struck out the first batter he faced (Zack Cozart)...fanned a career-high nine batters and tossed a career-high 108 pitches but fell to 0-3 in a 4-2 loss to Milwaukee June 22...joined Brad Rigby (1997) and Mike Morgan (1978) as the only three pitchers in Oakland history to lose each of the first three games of their career...is just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1913 to lose each of his first three career games while allowing three runs or fewer in each game...the others are Duane Pillette (1949 Yankees), Jim McAndrew (1968 Mets) and Kyle Drabek (2010 Blue Jays)...earned his first big league win in his fourth start on June 27 at San Francisco...tossed a career-high 7.2 innings and allowed just two runs in the A's 8-3 win...became the eighth pitcher in Oakland history to allow to allow three runs or fewer in each of his first four starts, the first since A.J. Griffin in 2012...was 1-3 with a 2.81 ERA in four starts in June...then went 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA in five starts in July...that was the second highest July ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 20 or more innings (Steve Karsay, 9.36 in 1997)...fell to 1-4 with a loss in his fifth start on July 3 against Pittsburgh...allowed four runs or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of his first five career starts...since 1913, the only other Major League pitcher to do that and lose at least four of those games is Tony Armas, who went 0-4 with a 2.97 ERA over his first five career starts with Montreal from Aug. 16, 1999-May 30, 2000...walked a career-high five batters in a 7-0 loss to Houston July 20...was optioned to Nashville July 26 but returned to Oakland Sept. 3...allowed seven runs on eight hits in a career-low 2.2 innings that day in an 11-2 loss to Boston...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings in a 14-5 win on Sept. 15 at Kansas City to snap his career-high four-game losing streak...logged a 9.39 ERA and .328 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned seven starts from July 3 to Sept. 9...fell to 0-7 at home in a 6-5 loss to Houston Sept. 21...his seven-game career-opening home losing streak is tied for second longest by an Athletic since 1913 with Wally Burnette (July 24-Sept. 9, 1956)...the longest is 11 by Bobby Hasty (Sept. 11, 1919-Aug. 11, 1921)...it is tied for third longest in Oakland history at any point in the season and is the longest since Mike Mohler also lost seven straight home games from Aug. 16, 1996-May 28, 1997...surrendered a career-high eight runs on a career-high nine hits in 3.0 innings in his final start of the season, an 8-1 A's loss at Los Angeles (AL) Sept. 27...went 1-4 with an 8.10 ERA in five starts in September...tied for second in the AL in September losses.

2016 MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Combined for a 10-2 record, a 1.46 ERA and .197 opponents batting average in 17 games, all starts, with Midland and Nashville...led the A's farm system in ERA and tied for second in wins...allowed just four home runs in 98.1 innings, an average of 0.37 per nine innings...struck out 95 and walked 29 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.28...his opponents batting average included a .190 (28-for-147) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .202 (41-for-203) against right-handers...surrendered all four of his home runs to righties...issued 19 of his 29 walks to lefties...three of the four home runs he allowed were solo shots...yielded a .134 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .165 with a .232 on-base percentage when leading off an inning...compiled a 0.53 ERA over innings one through four...had a 3.56 ERA from the fifth inning on...the RockHounds were 4-0 in his starting assignments and the Sounds were 10-3...his teams combined for a 14-3 (.824) record in his 17 starts...tossed at least five innings in each of his 17 starts, allowed six hits or fewer 16 times and surrendered two runs or fewer 15 times.

RHP Sonny Gray (2-1, 3.34 ERA):	Is scheduled to make his sixth start since being reinstated from the disabled list May 1...went 0-1 with a 4.22 ERA and .273 opponents batting average over his first two starts but is 2-0 with a 2.84 ERA and .179 opponents batting average in three starts since then...began the season on the 10-day DL with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)...made two rehab starts before he was reinstated...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's win over Miami last Wednesday in Oakland (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 11 so)...is 2-1 with a 2.59 ERA (31.0 ip, 21 h, 9 r, 9 er, 13 bb, 32 so, 2 hr) in five career starts against Cleveland...went 0-0 with a 15.75 ERA and .353 opponents batting average in two starts this spring...went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts last year in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list.

- Tossed a season-high seven innings and allowed a season-worst 12 hits on Tuesday.
- In the month of May, the bullpen is sporting a 4-0 record with a 3.06 ERA (17 er in 50.0 ip) in ten games at home.
- Bullpen had not allowed a run at home in 26 straight innings before the streak was snapped in the eighth inning on May 21...it was the longest home scoreless streak of the season.
- Relievers are 9-for-16 (56.3%) in save chances and have the third lowest save percentage in the American League...blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...the seven total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, Madson, 2 each; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each).
- Has allowed 21-of-59 (35.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the fourth highest percentage in the AL and sixth highest in the majors.
- Relievers rank third in the AL in unearned runs (11), second in stolen bases (16), third in wild pitches (12) and tied for second in runs (92).

- Allowed a season-high four hits and four runs on May 12 at Texas...it was his second blown save and second loss of the season.
- Was 3-for-3 in save chances with a 3.38 ERA over his first eight games but is 3-for-6 with a 6.10 ERA (7 er in 10.1 ip) over his last 11 contests.
- Has an 8.59 ERA (7 er in 7.1 ip) on the road this season and a 2.45 ERA (3 er in 11.0 ip) at home.
