### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (22-28) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (26-23)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost three straight after winning five of the previous seven games...are a season-high tying six games under .500 for the third time this year (last: 17-23 on May 17)...are 22-28 (.440), which is the second worst record in the American League...are tied for fourth in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high 13 games...this marks just the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by at least 13 games after 50 games or fewer (1979, 2001, 2015)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and eight days in fifth

**THE LONG BALL:** The A's have hit 74 home runs, which matches the 2000 club for the most in Athletics history after 50 games (hit one home run in game 51 in 2000)...have homered in each of their last 10 games (19 home runs total) and 20 of the last 21 (40 home runs total)...rank fourth in the majors in home runs hit and are second in fewest home runs allowed (49)...Khris Davis leads the A's with 16 home runs and Yonder Alonso has 14...the 30 combined home runs are the most by a Major League duo...13 of the A's last 22 home runs have come with runners on base...110 of the A's 203 runs (54.2%) have come on home runs...are 21-20 when homering, 1-8 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-13)...are 17-9 when out-homer the opponent, 5-17 when they don't.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-3 on this seven-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2) and Cleveland (0-1)...went 1-5 on the last road trip and have lost 16 of the last 20 road games...are 7-18 (.280) on the road, which is the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 7-19), compared to 15-10 (.600) at home...return home following the game Thursday for a six-game homestand against Washington (three games) and Toronto (three games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (1-1) and have won 13 of the last 18 home games...are 1-7-0 in road series compared to 5-1-2 in home series...have lost six straight road series for the first time since June 3-July 10, 2011.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed a Major League leading 51 errors, which is 13 more than any other team (TB)...also lead the majors in unearned runs (35), which is six more than any other team (ATL)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...the A's lead the majors in errors by catchers (10) and outfielders (10) and are tied for the lead in errors by pitchers (7)...the 10 errors by catchers match the most by Oakland catchers over the last five years (2014, 2015)...the A's have allowed 45 stolen bases, which is the most in the majors (CHL, 40).

**IN MAY:** Oakland has hit 43 home runs in the month of May, which is three short of the Athletics record for home runs in May (46 in 2000)...it is tied for the seventh best total in any month in Athletics history and is the most since August of 2001 when they also had 43...are tied for third in the majors in home runs this month (HOU and TB, 45)...the offense has struck out 225 times, which is five short of the Athletics record for strikeouts in May (230 in 2012)...last month, set a franchise record for strikeouts in April (221)...are slugging .450, which is the third best May in Oakland history (.456 in 2000, .454 in 1987, .448 in 1970)...are 11-14 (.440), which is the third worst record in the American League...however, have matched their May win total from each of the previous two seasons (11-17 last year, 11-19 in 2015)...pitchers have 207 strikeouts, which is the second best May total in franchise history (230 in 2015).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 3.00 ERA (14 er in 42.0 ip) and .200 (30-for-150) opponents batting average over the last five games...however, have a 4.40 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...lead the AL in hit batters (23), have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.387) and the third most wild pitches (27).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Yesterday, Daniel Mengden became the ninth pitcher to start a game for the A's this year, which is tied for second most in the majors (SEA, 12)...A's starting pitchers are 7-16 with a 4.55 ERA (88 er in 174.0 ip) over the last 32 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 16-21 with a 4.29 ERA for the season...

the losses are second most in the American League and the A's also rank third in fewest innings pitched (272.2)...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.385) and have the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.240) and on-base percentage (.312)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (30).

**OFFENSE:** The A's have the second fewest runs scored in the American League (203) and the fourth most strikeouts (446)...have the second lowest batting average (.236) and on-base percentage (.307) but the fourth best slugging percentage (.425)...have the third most extra base hits (162)...are batting .139 (5-for-36) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest mark in the majors...are batting .217 (73-for-337) with runners in scoring position, which is third lowest in the AL.

**DESIGNATED HITTERS:** A's designated hitters have hit five home runs in the last 10 games after belting just two home runs over the first 40 contests...are batting .207 (39-for-188) with seven home runs and 17 RBI overall...the RBI are the fewest in the American League and the batting average is third lowest.

**LEADOFF HITTERS:** A's leadoff hitters are batting .161 (33-for-205) with 20 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .254 on-base percentage)...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the on-base percentage is second lowest (KC, .168/.204)...leadoff hitters are 7-for-46 (.152) with four walks (.239 on-base percentage) to start the game.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have used a different lineup in each of their last 45 games...have used 48 different lineups overall in 50 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...are 5-6 (.455) in one-run games, including 1-5 on the road...the 11 one-run games are second fewest in the American League (MIN, 9) and the record is fourth worst...have a season run differential of -46, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -53)...are 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL...have three wins when trailing after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAA, PIT)...it also matches Oakland's season total from last year...however, have two losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for third most in the majors (DET, 4; WASH, 3).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Doolittle, Dull, Graveman, Hahn, Semien, Smolinski, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...Bassitt is currently on a rehab assignment...have used the DL 16 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...seven of the 16 DL stints have been by starting pitchers (Bassitt, Graveman (2), Gray, Hahn, Manaea, Mengden)...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016 and the players missed a combined 1810 games (67.0 games per stint), which also set an Oakland record.

**A's vs. INDIANS:** The A's lost the first meeting of 2017 last night after losing the season series last year, 4-2...went 2-1 in Oakland and 0-3 in Cleveland...now have a four-game losing streak at Progressive Field...over the previous six years, the A's have lost three season series (2011, 13, 16) and won three (2012, 14, 15)...are 22-22 against the Indians dating back to the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 270-237 against the Indians...that breaks down to 143-104 in Oakland and 127-133 in Cleveland...including 42-64 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 905-1030 against the Indians.

**TODAY'S TIDBITS**  
**Yonder Alonso** leads the majors with 10 home runs in the month of May...is the seventh player in Oakland history to hit 10 home runs in May, the second in the last two years (Davis, 11 in 2016)...**Daniel Coulombe** has not allowed a hit to a first batter faced in his last 13 appearances (0-for-11, bb, hbp).

**THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY**  
In 1932 Al Simmons and Jimmy Dykes hit two home runs each and Lefty Grove tosses a six-hitter in a 13-2 win over Washington...in 1982 Rickey Henderson has three hits, three RBI and four stolen bases in the second game of a doubleheader as the A's defeat Detroit, 10-3...in 1988 Dave Henderson homers to lead off the bottom of the 14th inning as the A's defeat the New York Yankees, 3-2.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (2-1, 3.34 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his sixth start since being reinstated from the disabled list May 1...went 0-1 with a 4.22 ERA and .273 opponents batting average over his first two starts but is 2-0 with a 2.84 ERA (6 er in 19.0 ip) and .179 (12-for-67) opponents batting average in three starts since then...began the season on the 10-day DL with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)...made two rehab starts before he was reinstated.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .163 (8-for-49) batting average to left-handed hitters compared to .258 (16-for-62) against right-handers...opponents are hitting .167 (5-for-30) with runners in scoring position...three of the four home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has a .154 (6-for-39) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .302 (13-for-43) with all four of his home runs the second time through and .172 (5-for-29) after that...has not allowed a hit to the opponents number seven hitter (0-for-11).

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss at Minnesota May 2...allowed a career-high tying three home runs...surrendered a solo home run to Dozier and a two-run home run to Sano in the third and a solo home run to Castro in the fourth...left after six innings trailing 4-0.

**SECOND START:** He had a no decision in his 100th career appearance, an 8-6 A's win over Detroit May 7 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Castellanos in the third inning but the A's scored twice in the bottom of the third and two more in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...he was then charged with three unearned runs in the fifth inning after an Alonso error...yielded RBI singles to Cabrera and Martinez and was relieved by Dull who allowed a third run to score on a wild pitch.

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Texas May 13...allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the third but the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth...gave that run back in the bottom of the fourth on a Gomez RBI ground out but Oakland scored twice in the fifth and once in the seventh...was relieved by Dull to start the bottom of the seventh with the A's leading 4-2 but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh for the blown save and loss.

**FOURTH START:** He was the winning pitcher in his 100th career start, an 8-3 A's win over Boston May 18 in Oakland...became the 22nd pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI single by Ramirez and a sacrifice fly by Young but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the first...allowed the tying run to score on a Moreland leadoff home run in the fourth but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the fourth for the win.

**LAST START:** He won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 win over Miami last Wednesday in Oakland...struck out 11 batters, his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...retired each of the first nine batters he faced (six by strikeout) and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff single to Gordon in the fourth...Stanton singled Gordon over to third and Gordon scored on a wild pitch...retired nine straight following that before allowing a double and a walk in his seventh and final inning.

**GRAY vs. CLEVELAND:** Is 2-1 with a 2.59 ERA (31.0 ip, 21 h, 9 r, 9 er, 13 bb, 32 so, 2 hr) in five career starts...is 2-1 with a 3.93 ERA (8 er in 18.1 ip) in three starts at Progressive Field and 0-0 with a 0.69 ERA (1 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, an 8-0 A's loss at Cleveland on July 31...allowed a career-high tying seven runs...retired the side in order in the first two innings but then allowed five runs in the third on a Kipnis two-run single, a Lindor sacrifice fly and a Napoli two-run home run...allowed a RBI single to Perez in the fourth and was relieved by Coulombe with one out...Coulombe allowed

**2016 RECAP:** Went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than 2½ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons...also had career highs in losses (11), home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475) and matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his average of 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings was a career low and his 3.23 walks per nine innings were a career high...had the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (.313) and the second most wild pitches...the wild pitches tied for sixth most in Oakland history and matched the most by an Athletic over the last 24 years...now has 47 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53)...the winning percentage tied for 10th lowest in Oakland history...among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched, he had the fourth highest ERA in the AL and the highest by an A's pitcher since 2000 (Olivares, 6.75)

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average included a mark of .286 (66-for-231) against right-handed hitters and .286 (67-for-234) against left-handers...surrendered 12 of his 18 home runs to righties...11 of the home runs were solo shots...the eight and nine hitters in the order batted a combined .467 with seven home runs and 21 RBI...however, held the five hitter to a .176 average, no home runs and four RBI...based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, his .468 average against the number eight hitter was the highest by a Major Leaguer since at least 1974...his .465 average against the nine hitter was third highest over that span and the highest since 1999 (Loaiza, TEX, .500)...his mark against the five hitter tied for fourth lowest in the AL in 2016...using the 100 inning minimum, he had the fourth highest average with runners in scoring position in the AL (.330), tied for the fifth highest average when opponents put the first pitch in play (.467) and had the seventh highest average against batters leading off an inning (.321)...had a .233 opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .318 after that.

**THE BIG INNING:** Yielded six runs in an inning once, five runs three times and four runs twice...he allowed 58 of his 80 runs in the single biggest inning of his 22 starts (25.13 ERA)...had a 1.84 ERA in all other innings.

<b>LHP Sean Manaea (3-3, 4.35 ERA):</b> Has won each of his last two starts and has a 1.50 ERA and a .205 opponents batting average over that stretch...has a streak of 14 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more dating back to last year...that matches the second longest such streak by an American League pitcher since at least 1913...has held left-handed hitters to a .065 batting average compared to .218 by right-handers...the mark against lefties is the lowest in the majors among pitchers with 40 or more innings...has allowed a .187 opponents batting average overall, which is fourth lowest in the AL using the 40 inning minimum...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-1 A's win at New York (AL) last Friday (7.0 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 8 so)...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against Cleveland, a start in the A's 9-1 win in Oakland last year on Aug. 23 (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 8 so).

**Saves/Opportunities:** 9-for-16 (56.3%)

- The bullpen has allowed four earned runs over its last five games (13.0 ip, 2.77 ERA) after surrendering 12 earned runs over its previous two outings.
- Has recorded just one save in its last five chances dating back to May 12, a span of 16 games...overall, are 9-for-16 (56.3%) in save chances and have the third lowest save percentage in the American League...blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...the seven total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, Madson, 2 each; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each).
- Six wins by relievers are tied for the fewest in the American League.
- In the month of May at home, the bullpen is sporting a 4-0 record with a 3.06 ERA (17 er in 50.0 ip) in ten games...had not allowed a run at home in 26 straight innings before the streak was snapped in the eighth inning on May 21.
- Has allowed 21-of-60 (35.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL.
- Relievers rank first in the majors in stolen bases allowed (19).
- Rank third in the AL in unearned runs (11), fourth in wild pitches (12) and tied for fourth in runs (95).
