OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-29) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (27-24)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won last night to snap a four-game losing streak, which was one short of their season high...are now 23-29, which is the second worst record in the American League and the seventh worst in the majors... are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Houston by a season-high-tying 14 games...this marks just the second time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 14 or more games before the start of June...the other time was in 2001 when they trailed by 14 games as early as May 29...have never trailed by more than 14 games in the month of May...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 10 days in fifth.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-4 on this seven-game road trip to New York-AL (1-2) and Cleveland (1-2)...went 1-5 on the last road trip and have lost 17 of the last 22 road games...have lost each of the last six road series, which is their longest such streak since June 3-July 10, 2011 when they also lost six straight...have not lost more than six straight road series since April 22-June 9, 2005 when they dropped seven in a row...are 8-19 (.296) on the road, which is the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 7-21), compared to 15-10 (.600) at home...return home following the game today for a six-game homestand against Washington (three games) and Toronto (three games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (1-1) and have won 13 of the last 18 home games...are 1-7-0 in road series compared to 5-1-2 in home series.

IN MAY: The A's offense set a franchise record for strikeouts in the month of May with 255...last month, set a franchise record for strikeouts in April (221)... hit 45 home runs in May, which was one short of the Athletics record for home runs in May (46 in 2000)...it is the sixth best total in any month in Athletics history and is the most since May of 2000 when they had 45... ranked fourth in the American League in home runs in May...went 12-15 (.444), which was the third worst record in the AL...however, they eclipsed their May win total from each of the previous two seasons (11-17 last year, 11-19 in 2015)...pitchers had 221 strikeouts, which is the second best May total in franchise history (230 in 2015).

OFFENSE: The A's struck out 19 times Tuesday to tie the Athletics franchise record for strikeouts in a nine-inning game (June 24, 1997 at Seattle)...have struck out 76 times in the last six games, which is the most in Oakland history over a six-game stretch (72, July 26-31, 2012)...have 476 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League but 101 fewer than Tampa Bay (577)...have the second fewest runs scored (210), and the second lowest on-base percentage (.305) and batting average (.236)...have the third most extra base hits (169) and the fourth best slugging percentage (.424)...are batting .139 (5-for-36) with the bases loaded, which is the lowest mark in the majors by 47 points (Baltimore, .186)...are batting .214 (75-for-351) with runners in scoring position, which is second lowest in the AL.

THE LONG BALL: The A's had their streak of consecutive games with a home run snapped at a season-high tying 10 Tuesday night...with Pinder's two home runs last night, they have now homered in 21 of their last 23 games (42 home runs total) and have 76 home runs for the season... that is the most in Athletics history after 52 games (75 in 2000)...are tied for fourth in the majors in home runs hit and tied for second in fewest home runs allowed (52)...Khris Davis leads the A's with 16 home runs and Yonder Alonso has 14...the 30 combined home runs are tied for the most by a Major League duo (WAS: Harper and Zimmerman; CIN: Schebler and Duvall)...14 of the A's last 24 home runs have come with runners on base...113 of the A's 210 runs (53.8%) have come on home runs...are 22-20 when homering, 1-9 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-14)...are 18-9 when out-homering the opponent, 5-20 when they don't.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed a Major League leading 52 errors, which is 11 more than any other team (ATL, 41)...have 35 unearned runs, which is second most in the majors (ATL, 37)...last year the A's tied for the second most errors in the American League (97) but they led to just 43 unearned runs, which was fourth fewest...the A's lead the majors in errors by catchers (10) and outfielders (11)...the 10 errors by catch-

ers match the most by Oakland catchers over the last five years (2014, 2015)...the A's have allowed 47 stolen bases, which is six more than any other team (CHI-NL, 41).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.52 ERA (46 er in 75.0 ip) and .264 (78-for-296) opponents batting average over the last nine games...now have a 4.43 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in hit batters (23), have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.388) and are tied for the second most wild pitches (29).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-17 with a 4.65 ERA (96 er in 185.2 ip) over the last 34 games after going 9-5 with a 3.83 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 17-22 with a 4.37 ERA for the season...the losses are second most in the American League and the A's 284.1 innings pitched are third fewest...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.387) and have the fourth lowest opponents batting average (.241)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (32)...have used nine different starting pitchers, which is tied for second most in the AL (SEA, 12).

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters have hit five home runs in the last 12 games after belting just two home runs over the first 40 contests...are batting .209 (41-for-196) with seven home runs and 18 RBI overall...the RBI are the fewest in the American League and the batting average is third lowest.

LEADOFF HITTERS: A's leadoff hitters are batting .159 (34-for-214) with 20 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .233 on-base percentage)...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the on-base percentage is second lowest (KC, .175/.209)...leadoff hitters are 8-for-48 (.167) with four walks (.231 on-base percentage) to start the game.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 2-7 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 8-6...have used a different lineup in each of their last 47 games...have used 50 different lineups overall in 52 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...are 5-6 (.455) in one-run games, including 1-5 on the road...the 11 one-run games are second fewest in the American League (MIN, 9) and the record is fourth worst...have a run differential of -49, which is second lowest in the AL (KC, -53)...are 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the AL.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's are 1-2 in their first three meetings of 2017 after losing the season series last year, 4-2...went 2-1 in Oakland and 0-3 in Cleveland...last night's win snapped a five-game losing streak at Progressive Field, which was the A's third longest in this ballpark (9, May 27, 1994-June 11, 1996; 6, April 13, 2008-July 4, 2009)...over the previous six years, the A's have lost three season series (2011, 13, 16) and won three (2012, 14, 15)...are 23-23 against the Indians dating back to the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 271-238 against the Indians...that breaks down to 143-104 in Oakland and 128-134 in Cleveland...including 43-65 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 906-1031 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Chad Pinder recorded his first career two-homer game and his first career three-hit game yesterday...is tied for third in home runs among American League rookies (7)...**Yonder Alonso** tied for the second most home runs in the majors with 10 home runs in the month of May...is the seventh player in Oakland history to hit 10 home runs in May, the second in the last two years (Davis, 11 in 2016)...**Daniel Coulombe** has not allowed a hit to a first batter faced in his last 13 appearances (0-for-11, bb, hbp)...**Jed Lowrie** is batting .383 (18-for-47) with six doubles and two home runs over his last 12 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** Reggie Jackson homers in the third inning of the A's 5-2 win at New York to give the A's a home run in 13 consecutive games, what was then a club record...the A's hit 25 round trippers during the streak, including six by Jackson...in **2006** Barry Zito strikes out Lew Ford in the sixth inning to become the fourth pitcher in Oakland history and the eighth in Athletics history with 1000 career strikeouts.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jharel Cotton (3-5, 5.56 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start since being recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Saturday for his second stint with Oakland this year...was on the A's Opening Day roster and went 3-4 with a 5.68 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in seven starts when he was optioned to Nashville May 11.

TWO-GAME LOSING STREAK: Has taken the loss in each of his last two starts for the first losing streak of his career...has an 8.44 ERA (10 er in 10.2 ip) in the two starts after going 3-3 with a 4.64 ERA over his first six starts...has five losses for the season, which is tied for seventh most in the American League.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is second among American League rookies in wins (3) innings pitched (43.2) and strikeouts (40), and tied for second in games started (8).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-2 with a 3.13 ERA (8 er in 23.0 ip) and .207 (17-for-82) opponents batting average in four starts on the road compared to 1-3 with an 8.27 ERA (19 er in 20.2 ip) and .321 (27-for-84) opponents average in four starts in Oakland...last year, he had no decisions and a 3.60 ERA in two starts on the road compared to 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA in three starts at home.

NIGHT AND DAY: Suffered his first career loss in a day game in his last start last Saturday at New York...is 3-1 with a 2.55 ERA (7 er in 24.2 ip) and .159 (13-for-82) opponents batting average in four starts during the day this year compared to 0-4 with an 9.47 ERA (20 er in 19.0 ip) and .369 (31-for-84) opponents average in four starts at night...is now 5-1 with a 2.13 ERA (9 er in 38.0 ip) in six career starts during the day compared to 0-4 with a 6.43 ERA (25 er in 35.0 ip) in seven starts at night.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 2-0 with a 1.38 ERA (2 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts against American League Central teams compared to 1-5 with a 7.34 ERA (25 er in 30.2 ip) in six starts against everyone else...is now 2-0 with a 1.44 ERA (4 er in 25.0 ip) in three career starts against the Central, 3-5 with a 5.63 ERA (30 er in 48.0 ip) in 10 starts against all other teams.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .167 (7-for-42) batting average to hitters leading off an inning with four walks (.239 on-base percentage)...opponents are batting .210 (21-for-100) with the bases empty. .348 (23-for-66) with runners on base...however, five of his seven home runs allowed have been solo shots as have eight of his 11 career home runs...opponents are 16-for-45 (.356) with runners in scoring position...the opponents number five hitter is 2-for-21 (.095).

BY INNING: Has an 8.44 ERA (15 er in 16.0 ip), a .328 (22-for-67) opponents batting average and has yielded six of his seven home runs in the first and second inning...has a 3.90 ERA (12 er in 27.2 ip) and .222 (22-for-99) opponents average from the third inning on...has allowed seven runs in the first inning and nine in the second...last year he did not allow a run in the first inning and yielded just three in the second.

THIS AND THAT: Has allowed six home runs in his last three starts (16.2 ip) after surrendering just one over his first five starts (27.0 ip)...has walked 19 batters in 43.2 innings this year (3.92 per nine innings) after issuing just four free passes in 29.1 innings last year (1.23 per nine innings)...has received seven runs of support in his five losses (24.2 ip, 2.55 RSA) and 12 runs of support in his three wins (19.0 ip, 5.68 RSA)...has a decision in each of his eight starts...opponents have been caught stealing four times with him on the mound, which is tied for second most in the American League.

FIRST START: He was charged with the first loss of his career in the A's 5-0 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 5 in Oakland...yielded five runs on eight hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...retired the first four batters before allowing three runs in the second inning on a RBI double by Simmons and a two-run single by Espinosa...also allowed RBI singles to Trout and Pujols in the fifth.

SECOND START: He combined with Casilla and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win at Kansas City April 10...tossed a career-high tying 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...walked three...allowed just three baserunners to advance into scoring position.

THIRD START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-0 loss to Texas on April 17 in Oakland...allowed five runs in 5.1 innings and issued a career-high four walks...allowed a RBI double to Mazara in the first inning and then retired each of the next 12 batters before walking the first two batters in the fifth inning...allowed two-run doubles to Gomez and Napoli in the fifth and left after 5.1 innings trailing 5-0.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 4-3 victory over Seattle April 22 in Oakland...allowed a solo home run to Cano in the first

inning but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the first...yielded a sacrifice fly to Cruz in the third but the A's got that run back in the bottom of the third...was relieved by Montas to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 4-2.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Houston April 28...allowed six runs on a career-high 10 hits in a career-low tying 4.1 innings...Oakland scored three times in the first but he allowed three unearned runs in the bottom of the first on RBI singles by Beltran and Guriel and a RBI double by Gattis...the A's scored once in the third to take a 4-3 lead but he allowed a Springer RBI single in the fourth and two more runs in the fifth, including a Gattis RBI single.

SIXTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 8-5 win at Minnesota May 4...struck out a career-high nine batters and yielded two home runs in a game for the first time in his career...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a pair of solo home runs in the bottom of the second to Rosario and Santana...also yielded an unearned run in the fourth inning when Rosario scored on a Gimenez single and Jaff Decker error...left after six innings with a 6-3 lead.

SEVENTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on May 9 in Oakland...allowed a career-high seven runs in 5.0 innings...allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the first and the A's scored twice in the bottom of the first to take a 2-1 lead...then allowed a two-out solo home run to Revere and a three-run home run to Escobar in the second...yielded two more runs in the fourth inning on a Pennington RBI single and a Escobar RBI ground out.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-2 loss at New York (AL) last Saturday...tossed a career-high 107 pitches...did not allow a hit over the first five innings, but surrendered a run in the first when Sanchez walked, went to second on a Holliday hit by pitch, third on a wild pitch and scored on a Castro sacrifice fly...the A's tied the game with a run in the sixth but he allowed a two-run home run to Holliday in the bottom of the sixth for the loss.

2017 WITH NASHVILLE: Went 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA and .200 opponents batting average in two starts with Nashville...walked just one batter in 12.0 innings while striking out 13...surrendered two home runs...his first start came in an 11-6 win at Fresno May 16 (5.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 2 hr, 72 pitches)...also picked up the win in his last start when he combined with Michael Brady on a three-hit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win at Sacramento May 21...tossed seven innings and allowed all three of the hits (1 bb, 9 so, 90 pitches).

2016 RECAP: Was one of three players acquired from the Los Angeles Dodgers for Rich Hill and Josh Reddick at the trading deadline and made his Major League debut with Oakland in September...went 2-0 with a 2.15 ERA and .185 opponents batting average in five starts with the A's...walked just four batters in 29.1 innings, an average of 1.23 per nine innings, and had a .214 opponents on-base percentage...struck out 23 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.75...his opponents batting average included a .146 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .217 against right-handers...yielded a .167 average with runners in scoring position and .132 with two strikes...began the season at Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization and was assigned to Triple-A Nashville following the trade...combined with both clubs for an 11-6 record, a 4.31 ERA and .214 opponents batting average in 28 games, 22 starts...led the Pacific Coast League, ranked second in Triple-A and tied for 12th in all of minor league baseball with a career-high 155 strikeouts...also led the PCL in opponents batting average (.214) and tied for 10th in wins (11).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Andrew Triggs (5-4, 2.64 ERA): Went 1-3 with a 3.45 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in five starts in the month of May after going 4-1 with a 1.84 ERA and .194 opponents average in five starts in April...ranks fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.319), sixth in ERA (2.64), seventh in opponents OPS (.612) and tied for ninth in wins (5)...was charged with five unearned runs in his last start and now has 11 unearned runs for the season, which is tied for the most in the majors and tied for the most by an A's pitcher over the last eight years...is 3-1 with a 1.19 ERA in five starts at night compared to 2-3 with a 4.23 ERA in five starts during the day...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 9-5 A's loss at New York (AL) last Sunday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...has never faced the Nationals in his career...is 1-0 with a 3.09 ERA in five career interleague games, including one start.

- The bullpen has allowed six earned runs over its last seven games (18.1 ip, 2.94 ERA) after surrendering 12 earned runs over its previous two outings.
- Has recorded just two saves in its last six chances dating back to May 12, a span of 18 games...overall, are 10-for-17 (58.8%) in save chances and has the sixth lowest save percentage in the American League...blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...the seven total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, Madson, 2 each; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each).
- Six wins by relievers are tied for the fewest in the American League.
- In the month of May at home, the bullpen sported a 4-0 record with a 3.06 ERA (17 er in 50.0 ip) in ten games...had not allowed a run at home in 26 straight innings before the streak was snapped in the eighth inning on May 21...road ERA in May is 6.35 (28 er in 39.2 ip).
- Has allowed 21-of-62 (33.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the fifth highest percentage in the AL.
- Relievers rank first in the majors in stolen bases allowed (19).
- Rank third in the AL in unearned runs (11), and tied for fourth in wild pitches (12) and fifth in runs (97).
