OAKLAND ATHLETICS (23-30) VS. WASHINGTON NATIONALS (33-19)

FRIDAY, JUNE 2, 2017 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP ANDREW TRIGGS (5-4, 2.64) VS. RHP STEPHEN STRASBURG (6-1, 2.94) NBCSCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of the last six games and are a season-high tying seven games under .500 for the second time this year (22-29 on June 2)...are 23-30 (.434), which is the second worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West for the third consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 14½ games...the only other time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 14½ or more games this early in the season was in 2001 when they were 15 games out after 53 games (were 16 out after 54)...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 11 days in fifth.

ONE-THIRD OF THE SEASON: The A's are playing their 54th game of the season tonight, which is the one-third mark of the season...the offense is on pace to set Athletics record for most strikeouts (1507) and fewest triples (12)...the .234 batting average would be the lowest in Oakland history (.236 in 1982) and the .302 on-base percentage would tie for the lowest (1979)...are on pace for 642 runs, which would be the fewest in a non-strike season since 1979 (573), and 232 home runs, which would be fourth most in Oakland history and the most since 2000 (239)...the pitching staff is on pace for 92 wild pitches, which would set an Athletics record, and 70 hit batters, which would set an Oakland record ...are on pace for 122 unearned runs, which would set an Oakland record and be the most by an A's team since 1942 (122)...are on pace for 168 errors, which would rank fourth in Oakland history and be the most since 1979 (174).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 1-1 in interleague play after splitting a two-game series with Miami to close out the last homestand...the two interleague games are tied for second fewest in the majors (Dodgers, 0)...will also host Atlanta (June 30-July 2) and San Francisco (July 31-Aug. 1) and travel to Miami (June 13-14), New York (July 21-23), San Francisco (Aug. 2-3) and Philadelphia (Sept. 15-17)...went 7-13 (.350) in

interleague play last year, which was the fifth worst record in the majors and the worst mark by an American League team...it was the second worst interleague mark in Oakland history (5-13 in 2009)...finished with a losing record against the National League for the first time since 2011 and just the sixth time in 20 years of interleague play...are 199-167 (.544) all-time in interleague games, which is sixth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game homestand against Washington (three games) and Toronto (three games) tonight...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (1-1) and have won 13 of the last 18 home games...are 15-10 (.600) at home compared to 8-20 (.286) on the road...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 7-21)...went 2-5 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and have lost 18 of the last 23 road games...have not lost a series over their last six home series (5-0-1)...have lost each of the last seven road series, which is their longest such streak since April 22-June 9, 2005 when they dropped seven in a row...are 5-1-2 in home series comapred to 1-8-0 in road series.

THE LONG BALL...: The A's have hit 76 home runs, which ranks fourth in the American League and is second most in Athletics history after 53 games...the 2000 A's had 77 (hit two in game 54)...Khris Davis leads the A's with 16 home runs and Yonder Alonso has 14...the 30 combined home runs match the most by a Major League duo (Schebler/Duvall, CIN; Harper/Zimmerman, WASH)...113 of the A's 210 runs (53.8%) have come on home runs...are 22-20 when homering, 1-10 when going homerless... the mark when going homerless is second worst in the AL (DET, 1-14)... the pitching staff has allowed 52 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors...are 18-9 when out-homering the opponent, 5-21 when they don't.

...AND THE STRIKEOUT: The A's struck out 17 times yesterday against the Indians after tying the Athletics franchise record for strikeouts in a nine-inning game on Tuesday with 19...fanned 59 times in the four-game series at Cleveland to set an Oakland record for strikeouts over a four-game span...had 93 strikeouts on the road trip, which is an Oakland record for a seven-game stretch...have 493 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League but 84 fewer than Tampa Bay (577).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors yesterday (fifth time, third time in last 10 games) and now have 55 errors for the season, which is 15 more than any other team (ATL, 40)...had five unearned runs yesterday for the second time in the last five games and now have a Major League leading 40 for the season, which is five more than any other team (ATL)...have allowed a ML leading 47 stolen bases.

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the fourth time yesterday, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...have the second fewest runs scored (210), the second lowest batting average (.234) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.302)...have the third most extra base hits (169)...rank last in the majors in batting with the bases loaded (.139) and second to last in the AL in batting with runners in scoring position (.211)... leadoff hitters rank last in the AL in batting average (.157) and second to last in on-base percentage (.233)...designated hitters rank last in the AL in RBI (18) and slugging (.352), have the second lowest on-base percentage (.269) and third lowest batting average (.206).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.19 ERA (49 er in 85.0 ip) over the last 10 games and now have a 4.41 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...are tied for the AL lead in wild pitches (30) and hit batters (23)...have the second lowest opponents slugging percentage (.387).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-18 with a 4.56 ERA (97 er in 191.1 ip) over the last 35 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 17-23 with a 4.31 ERA for the season...the losses are second most in the American League...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.385) and have the second lowest opponents batting average (.240)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (32).

IN MAY: The A's went 12-15 (.444) in the month of May, which was the third worst record in the American League...the 12 wins were one more than their total from each of the previous two Mays...have now posted a losing record in seven consecutive months, which is their longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had seven straight months with a losing record (excludes October)...the offense set a franchise record for strikeouts in May (255) after setting a franchise record for strikeouts in April (221)...however, were sixth in the AL in most strikeouts in May...were fourth in the AL with 45 home runs in May, which fell one short of the franchise record for May (46 in 2000)...it was the sixth best total for any month and the most since Sept., 2000 (47)...pitchers had 221 strikeouts, which was the second best May total in franchise history (230 in 2015) but sixth lowest in the AL in May.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 2-8 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 10-6...the A's success ratio of 20.0% is second worst in the majors (MIL, 1-6)...have used a different lineup in each of their last 48 games...have used 51 different lineups overall in 53 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5).

A's vs. NATIONALS: This will be just the third series between the A's and Nationals...last met in 2014 when the A's swept a three-game series in Oakland, May 9-11...the A's were swept in the first meeting in 2005 at RFK Stadium, June 7-9...Oakland is the only team that has never played a game ar Nationals Park...the A's also swept a three-game series from the Expos in 2003 and are 6-3 all-time against the Nationals/Expos.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso ranks sixth in the American League with a career-high 14 home runs...tied for the AL lead with 10 home runs in May...had not reached double figures in home runs in a season prior to this year... **Khris Davis** has homered six times in his last 16 games and is tied for second in the AL in home runs (16)...**Chad Pinder** has six home runs in his last 14 games and seven for the season, which is tied for third among AL rookies.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1967**, reliever Lew Krausse has the game-winning two-run single and picks up the win in the A's 6-4, 13-inning win at Chicago...in **1977** Mike Norris tosses a four-hit shutout as the A's defeat the Mariners in Seattle, 1-0...Jim Tyrone's double in the fourth inning drives in the only run of the game...in **1982** Mike Norris tosses a four-hit shutout as the A's defeat Boston 5-0.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (5-4, 2.64 ERA)

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 1-3 with a 3.45 ERA and .269 opponents batting average in five starts in the month of May after going 4-1 with a 1.84 ERA and .194 opponents average in five starts in April...tied for fifth in the American League in May losses (3)...his four wins in April match the most by an Oakland pitcher in the month of April over the last 27 years (eighth time, last: Gray and Kazmir in 2014)...his April ERA was second lowest by an A's pitcher over the last 10 years (Kazmir, 0.99 in 2015).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks fourth in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.319), sixth in ERA (2.64), seventh in opponents OPS (.612) and tied for 10th in wins (5)...has surrendered just four home runs in 58.0 innings and his average of 0.62 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the AL...two of the home runs have been grand slams, which is tied for the most in the majors (Chacin, SD)...opponents have stolen 10 bases with him on the mound, which is the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...opponents have been caught stealing with him on the mound four times, which is tied for second most in the AL...is also tied for fourth in hit batters (4).

UNEARNED RUNS: Was charged with five unearned runs in his last start, which match the most by an A's pitcher in one game over the last eight seasons (last: Milone on June 30, 2012 vs. Texas)...now has 11 unearned runs for the season, which is tied for the most in the majors (Holland, CWS) and tied for the most by an A's pitcher over the last eight years...the last A's pitcher to allow more than 11 unearned runs in a season is Vin Mazzaro in 2010 (12)...opponents have reached on an error six times, which is tied for the most in the American League (Holland, CWS) and tied for second most in the majors (Gsellman, NYM 7).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-1 with a 1.19 ERA (4 er in 30.1 ip) in five starts at night compared to 2-3 with a 4.23 ERA (13 er in 27.2 ip) in five starts during the day.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is making his first interleague appearance of 2017...went 1-0 with a 3.09 ERA in five games, including one start, last year (11.2 ip, 9 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 16 so).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .157 (14-for-89) opponents batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .283 (36-for-127) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is third lowest in the American League among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...also ranks seventh with a .173 (9-for-52) mark with runners in scoring position and 10th with a .179 (5-for-28) average against the clean-up hitter.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 0.72 ERA (2 r in 25.0 ip) in four starts on the road compared to 3-3 with a 4.09 ERA (15 er in 33.0 ip) in six starts at home...last year, he was 1-0 with a 5.58 ERA in 12 games on the road and 0-1 with a 2.81 ERA in 12 games at home.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-2 with a 6.75 ERA (12 er in 16.0 ip) in two starts on four days rest, 4-2 with a 1.07 ERA (5 er in 42.0 ip) in seven starts with five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his team-leading 11th start of the season...made six starts in his Major League debut last year...has allowed one run or fewer in five of his 10 starts and walked one batter or fewer five times...has walked one batter or fewer 12 of his 16 career starts...has issued six of his 16 walks in the first inning...has 14 runs of support in his last seven starts after receiving 16 runs of support in his first three...took the loss April 23 against Seattle to snap a career-best four-game winning streak dating back to last year...won each of his first three starts this year to become the first A's pitcher to go 3-0 over his first three starts since Tommy Milone in 2013.

EARNED RUNS: Has allowed one earned run or fewer in seven of his 10 starts, including no earned runs four times...began the season with a 17.2-inning streak without allowing an earned run...that was the longest season-opening streak in Oakland history by a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster...it was third longest by any Oakland pitcher...since the earned run became an official stat in the American League in 1913, he is just the third A's pitcher to start the season with three games of five or more innings and no earned runs...joins Eddie Rommel (1924) and Vean Gregg (1918).

2017 START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win over Los Angeles (AL) *April* 6 in Oakland...issued a career-high three walks...surrendered his only run in the third inning and it was unearned... Escobar led off with a single, went to second on a R.Davis error, third on a ground out and scored on a Pujols ground out...the A's scored four times in the bottom of the third for the win...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Kansas City *April* 12...tossed 6.0 innings and did not allow a run...surrendered four hits and walked one and allowed just three

over that Span...Triggs then allowed two unearned runs in the sixth when an Alonso error preceded an Andrus RBI single and a Mazara RBI ground out...the A's then scored four times in the bottom of the sixth for the win... was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 11-1 loss to Seattle April 23 in Oakland...yielded a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and then surrendered five runs in the third inning on a bases loaded walk to Cruz and a Motter grand slam...was relieved by Coulombe after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0...picked up his fourth win of the season in the A's 2-1 victory at Houston April 29...struck out a career-high nine batters and logged a career-high 7.0 scoreless innings... allowed five runners to advance into scoring position, but set down each of the final 10 batters that he faced...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-2 loss to Detroit on *May 5* in Oakland...allowed a career-high eight hits in 5.1 innings of work...was charged with two unearned runs in the third inning when Martinez had a two-run, two-out single after a Rosales error started the inning...then allowed a base loaded three-run triple to Adduci in the sixth inning and left trailing 5-0...picked up his fifth win of the season in the A's 3-1 victory over Los Angeles (AL) May 10 in Oakland...walked the first three batters he faced to match his career high in walks...tossed a careerhigh 105 pitches...those were his only three walks of the game...the first walk (Escobar) scored on a Marte fielders choice and Triggs blanked the Angels on three hits over his final five innings...had his first no decision in the A's 9-6 win at Seattle on May 16...allowed a two-out solo home run to Cruz in the first inning but that was the only run he would allow in six innings...blanked the Mariners on two hits and three walks over his final five innings and left with a 4-1 lead...the bullpen allowed three runs in the seventh inning for the blown save...was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-3 loss to Boston *May 21* in Oakland...matched his career highs in hits (8), runs (6) and walks (3)...allowed two runs in the first inning on an error and a Benintendi sacrifice fly...Oakland scored once in the second and twice in the fourth to take a 3-2 lead but he allowed a pair of RBI singles to Betts and Pedroia in the fifth and a two-run home run to Moreland in the sixth. 2016 RECAP: Was claimed off waivers from Baltimore during the spring and went 1-1 with a 4.31 ERA and .255 opponents batting average in 24 games (six starts) over eight stints in his Major League debut with the A's... the eight stints are believed to be the most in one season in Oakland history...struck out 55 and walked just 13 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.23... compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...then went 1-1 with a 2.58 ERA and .224 opponents batting average in 14 games (six starts), over his final four stints...his opponents batting average included a .235 mark against right-handed hitters compared to .277 against left-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Mengden (0-1, 13.50 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville Monday and was the losing pitcher in his 2017 debut that day at Cleveland (3.1 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...is 0-7 in eight career starts in the Coliseum and 0-7 in seven career starts during the day...has never faced the Nationals in his career...started the season on the 10-day disabled list following right foot surgery on Feb. 8...began a rehab assignment with Nashville on May 8 and made three starts before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 20...was 2-1 with a 2.21 ERA and .189 opponents batting average in four starts with Nashville...went 0-1 with a 4.91 ERA over his first two starts and was 2-0 with a 0.69 ERA over his final two...made his Major League debut with Oakland last year in his third professional season after beginning the year with no experience above Single-A...went 2-9 with a 6.50 ERA in 14 starts.

HLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

6-7, 4.58 ERA (88 er in 173.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 10-for-17 (58.8%)

- The bullpen has allowed six earned runs over its last seven games (18.1 ip, 2.94 ERA) after surrendering 12 earned runs over its previous two
- Has recorded just two saves in its last six chances dating back to May 12, a span of 18 games...overall, are 10-for-17 (58.8%) in save chances and has the seventh lowest save percentage in the American League... blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...the seven total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, Madson, 2 each; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each).
- Six wins by relievers are tied for the fewest in the American League.
- In the month of May at home, the bullpen sported a 4-0 record with a 3.06 ERA (17 er in 50.0 ip) in ten games...had not allowed a run at home in 26 straight innings before the streak was snapped in the eighth inning on May 21...road ERA in May is 6.35 (28 er in 39.2 ip).
- Has allowed 21-of-65 (32.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the seventh highest percentage in the AL.
- Relievers rank first in the majors in stolen bases allowed (19).
- Tied for second in the AL in unearned runs (12), and tied for fourth in wild pitches (12) and fourth in runs (100).
