AND THE SUN SHINES ON THE BAY

After enjoying an off-day on Thursday, the Washington Nationals will return to action on the other side of the bay on Friday night as they open a three-game set with the Oakland Athletics...Coming off a sweep of the San Francisco Giants, sealed by RHP Max Scherzer's complete game on Wednesday night, the Nationals are 3-0 on their current nine-game road trip, have won eight of their last 10 games and three consecutive series (SEA, SDP, SFG).

- The 2017 Nationals are the first in club history (2005-pres.) to reach 30 wins in just 48 games, and at 33-19 (.635), they also possess the best record in franchise history (Nationals/Expos) through 52 games.
- That record is also the best mark in the National League, behind only the Houston Astros (38-16, .704) for the best in MLB.
- The Nationals are 3-3 in Interleague play thus far this season, going 1-2 against Baltimore and 2-1 vs. Seattle.

ONE MORE FOR A MILESTONE

The Nationals' next win will be career victory No. 1,800 for manager Dusty Baker...Baker, who is currently 1,799-1,590, will become the 16th manager in Major League history to cross the 1,800-win mark -- and 12 of the first 15 managers to do it are already in the Hall of Fame... Baker, who ranks No. 16 on the all-time managerial wins list, is the second-winningest active manager, just 12 victories behind Giants manager Bruce Bochy (1,811).

MAD MAX. DISTANCE.

Nationals RHP Max Scherzer threw the Nationals' first complete game of the season on Wednesday night, going all 9.0 innings in Washington's 3-1 victory over the San Francisco Giants...Scherzer allowed one run on five hits (though the run scored after a misplay on a fly ball in the outfield) and struck out 11 -- and finished his evening with 100 pitches, even...It was the fewest pitches Scherzer has thrown in a complete game in his career...Including Wednesday, in five of his seven career complete games, Scherzer has not issued a single walk.

- With his 11 strikeouts, Scherzer turned in his fifth double-digit strikeout game of the season and the 54th of his career...The 54 10-plus strikeout games are the most among all active pitchers (Clayton Kershaw, 2nd, 53).

STARTING STRONG

To be fair, RHP Max Scherzer was just the latest starting pitcher to turn in a stellar outing, though perhaps none quite as dominant as Scherzer's...In the last 10 games, the Nationals' starters have averaged 7.0 IP per start and allowed just 16 earned runs in 70.0 innings of work -- a 2.06 ERA -- while striking out 88 and walking just 13 (6.77 SO/BB)...In eight of those 10 starts, Washington's starting pitcher has allowed no more than two earned runs.

BULLISH ON THE 'PEN

In their last nine games, while the starters have been terrific, the Nationals' bullpen has also seemingly found its groove...Washington's relievers have a 0.90 ERA (2 ER/20.0 IP) since May 21 with three holds, five saves, and a 4.00 strikeout-to-walk ratio in that span.

JUNE BOON

The Nationals' offense enters June leading the National League in almost every category, including: runs scored (286), batting average (.275), on-base percentage (.345), slugging percentage (.470), OPS (.815), home runs (77), and RBI (279), while ranking second in doubles (106), and extra-base hits (192), and third in hits (502).

- Nationals cleanup man 1B Ryan Zimmerman ranks in MLB in batting average (1st, .368), extra-base hits (T1st, 32), slugging percentage (3rd, .709), hits (3rd, 67), total bases (3rd, 129), OPS (3rd, 1.118), RBI (5th, 44), and home runs (T6th, 15)...In his last eight games alone, Zimmerman is hitting .400 (12-for-30) with a double, two home runs, two walks, six RBI and seven runs scored.
- Meanwhile, No. 3 hitter RF Bryce Harper, ranks among MLB hitters in runs scored (2nd, 44), home runs (T6th, 15), OPS (5th, 1.093), on-base percentage (5th, .438), walks (T7th, 33), slugging percentage (5th, .655), RBI (6th, 43), and batting average (11th, .328).
- Harper also leads the Major Leagues in two-strike home runs with eight (T1st).
- Via the *Elias Sports Bureau*, with 15 HR in 48 team games, Harper is the first player in franchise history (Nationals/Expos) to hit 15 HR in 50-or-fewer games twice (also 2015).
- Harper (1st, 4.05) and Zimmerman (3rd, 4.14) lead the National League in at-bats per RBI, while WSH is the only team with four players already over the 32-RBI threshold (Zimmerman, 44; Harper, 43; Daniel Murphy, 36; Anthony Rendon, 32).

MURPH MAKES HIS RETURN

After missing three games last weekend with an illness, Nationals 2B Daniel Murphy returned to the lineup on Monday and has showed no signs of rust...Murphy is 6-for-13 (.462) with two doubles and three RBI on the Nationals' current road trip (three games).

MICHAEL A. TATER

Since taking over for injured CF Adam Eaton (left leg injury) on April 29, Nationals CF Michael A. Taylor is hitting .299 (32-for-107) with six doubles, two triples, four homers, 14 RBI, seven walks, three stolen bases and 15 runs scored...He has posted a .342 on-base percentage and a .505 slugging percentage during that stretch.

- Taylor entered play on April 29 hitting .095 with a .130 on-base percentage and a .095 slugging percentage and has since raised those marks to .266/.307/.438.
- Taylor has hit safely in 14 of his last 18 games (.304), including multi-hit efforts in seven.

OPPONENT

OAKLAND ATHLETICS

The Washington Nationals and Oakland Athletics will meet for just the third-ever regular-season series between the two clubs since baseball returned to D.C. in 2005...The Nationals are 3-3 all-time in the six games between the two clubs, sweeping the A's at RFK Stadium in 2005, and getting swept by Oakland at the O.co Coliseum in 2014...While they share little on-field history, the two clubs have been frequent trade partners as Nationals President of Baseball Operations & GM Mike Rizzo and A's Executive VP of Baseball Operations Billy Beane have consummated 10 trades since December, 2010...Those trades have involved, among others: Marc Zepczynski, Yunel Escobar, Tyler Clippard, Jerry Blevins, Billy Burns, Fernando Abad, Kurt Suzuki (twice), A.J. Cole (twice), Blake Treinen, Gio Gonzalez, Derek Norris, Tommy Milone, Brad Peacock, Henry Rodriguez, and Josh Willingham.

THE SERIES

The Nationals and A's are tied in their lifetime series, 3-3, as Washington swept Oakland in D.C. in 2005 and Oakland swept Washington in Oakland in 2014.

DUSTY BAKER

Nationals manager Dusty Baker was named the sixth field manager in Nationals history on Nov. 3, 2015. A three-time N.L. Manager of the Year (1993, 1997, 2000), and a finalist in 2016, Baker's clubs have won 90 games or more on nine occasions. With a victory on April 10 vs. STL, Baker became the 16th winningest manager in baseball history, passing Jim Leyland to move into the No. 16 spot alone on the all-time list...His 1,799-1,590 career managerial record slots him second in the win column among active managers behind only SFG's Bruce Bochy (No. 15, 1,811). Lou Piniella is 14th on the all-time list with 1,835 victories. Baker is just the 17th manager in MLB history to win 1,700 games.

- The Nationals are the fourth club Baker has managed the dugout for, coming to Washington after stops in San Francisco (1993-2002), Chicago (2003-2006), and Cincinnati (2008-2013). Baker is one of just four managers in MLB history to produce at least 1,500 hits as a player and win at least 1,500 games as a manager.

2005: Trailing 6-3 heading to the bottom of the eighth inning, the Nationals plated five runs off Braves' relievers to take an 8-6 lead. Chad Cordero locked it down in the ninth inning for his 14th save of the season.

NATIONALS STARTING PITCHER

STRASBURG, Stephen (RHP) #37

Powerful right-handed pitcher, best known for his unique blend of velocity, power and control...Signed a seven-year contract extension on May 10, 2016 that will keep him with the Nationals through the 2023 season...Is Washington's all-time (2005-pres.) leader in strikeouts (1,158) and wins (75)...His 1,158 strikeouts are the second-most in Nationals/Expos history. (Steve Rogers-1,621)...Since June 23, 2015, the Nationals are 38-9 (.809) when Strasburg starts.

- **AGAINST THE ATHLETICS:** Has never faced the Oakland Athletics.
- **LAST START:** Struck out a career-high 15 batters in 7.0 shutout IP as WSH topped SDP, 3-0...The 15 SO are the most in a single game in MLB in 2017.
- Has allowed 2 ER in 14.2 IP (1.23 ERA) over his last two starts...Has recorded 26 strikeouts, 2 walks and opposing batters are hitting .148 (8-for-54).
- Ranks in the National League in HR per 9.0 innings (1st, 0.53), opp. SLG (2nd, .333), winning percentage (2nd, .857), wins (T4th, 6), opp. OBP (5th, .267), WHIP (5th, 1.05), quality starts (T5th, 8), ERA (6th, 2.94), opp. AVG (6th, .213), strikeouts per 9.0 innings (7th, 9.89), strikeouts (8th, 74), and SO/BB (8th, 4.11).
- Has made 7 starts of at least 7.0 IP, tied for third-most in Major League Baseball (LHP Chris Sale - 9; LHP Clayton Kershaw - 8).
- Left-handed batters have a .230 OBP (1st in NL among SP), a .185 AVG (4th in NL), and a .262 SLG (6th in NL) against him in 2017.
- With 1,158 in hand, is on pace to record the most strikeouts by a starting pitcher in his first 1000.0 IP, per Elias...RHP Kerry Wood recorded 1,166 SO in his first 1000.0 IP...Strasburg needs 8 SO in his next 8.1 IP to tie Wood...LHP Billy Wagner holds the record for most SO in his first 1000.0 IP (1196 SO in 903.0 career IP).
- Made his fourth Opening Day start as Washington opened the 2017 season against the visiting Miami Marlins on April 3...Earned the win...With that victory, he is now 2-0 on Opening Day and the Nationals, as a team, are 4-0 when he starts on Opening Day.
- Had his 2016 season cut short by a flexor mass strain in his right elbow...At that time, he ranked among National League pitchers in wins (3rd, 15), strikeouts per nine innings (3rd, 11.2), strikeouts (6th, 183), hits per nine innings (8th, 7.25) and walks/hits per innings pitched (10th, 1.10).
- Recorded his 1,000th strikeout, June 4 at CIN (Straily) becoming the first player in Nationals history (2005-pres.) to record 1,000 strikeouts in a Nationals uniform.
- Since Aug. 8, 2015, is 27-7 with a 3.04 ERA in 44 starts...Has struck out 349 (11.16 SO/9.0 IP) and held opponents to a .208 average in that span.
- Since 2012, his 10.42 strikeouts per 9.0 ranks third among active starting pitchers...In that same span, his 1,042 strikeouts rank 8th.
- When Strasburg starts, Washington is 103-63 (.620) in his career...When he is provided three or more runs of offensive support while in the game, WSH is 76-8.
