OAKLAND ATHLETICS (24-31) VS. WASHINGTON NATIONALS (34-20)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have split the last four games and have lost five of the last seven contests...are 24-31 (.436), which is the worst record in the American League and sixth worst in the majors...the seven games under .500 are one short of the season high of eight (23-31) on June 2...are in fifth place in the AL West for the fifth consecutive day and trail first place Houston by a season-high 15½ games for the second consecutive day...the only other time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 15½ or more games this early in the season was in 2001 when they were 16 games out after 54 games...have spent one day tied for first this year, seven days in second, six days tied for second, 13 days in third, four days tied for third, 14 days in fourth, four days tied for fourth and 13 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 2-2 in interleague play (1-1 vs. Miami, 1-1 vs. Washington)...will also host Atlanta (June 30-July 2) and San Francisco (July 31-Aug. 1) and travel to Miami (June 13-14), New York (July 21-23), San Francisco (Aug. 2-3) and Philadelphia (Sept. 15-17)...went 7-13 (.350) in interleague play last year, which was the fifth worst record in the majors and the worst mark by an American League team...it was the second worst interleague mark in Oakland history (5-13 in 2009)...finished with a losing record against the National League for the first time since 2011 and just the sixth time in 20 years of interleague play...are 200-168 (.543) all-time in interleague games, which is sixth best in Major League history.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this six-game homestand against Washington (1-1) and Toronto (three games)...went 4-2 on the last homestand against Boston (3-1) and Miami (1-1) and have won 14 of the last 20 home games...are 16-11 (.593) at home compared to 8-20 (.286) on the road...have the second worst road record in the majors (PHI, 7-21)...went 2-5 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2) and Cleveland (1-3) and have lost 18 of the last 23 road games...have not lost a series over their last six home series (5-0-1)...have lost each of the last seven road series, which is their longest such streak since April 22-June 9, 2005 when they dropped seven in a row...are 5-1-2 in home series compared to 1-8-0 in road series.

THE LONG BALL...: The A's hit a season-high tying four home runs yesterday (May 20 vs. Boston) and now have 82 for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...the 82 home runs are the most in Athletics history after 55 games...the 2000 A's had 81 and hit one home run in game 56...49 of the A's 82 home runs have come in the Coliseum and the A's lead the majors in home runs at home...13 of the A's last 16 runs and 123 of their 223 runs for the season (55.2%) have come on home runs...are 23-21 when homering, 1-10 when going homerless...the mark when going homerless is second worst in the majors (DET, 1-14)...A's pitchers have allowed just 58 home runs, which is the fewest in the AL and fourth fewest in the majors...are 19-9 when out-homering the opponent, 5-22 when they don't.

...AND THE STRIKEOUT: The A's have struck out 108 times over the last nine games (12.0 strikeouts per game), which includes a franchise record for strikeouts in a nine-inning game on Tuesday (19) and 17 on Thursday...have 508 strikeouts for the season, which is second most in the American League (TB, 598).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors yesterday...it was their sixth three-error game of the season, their fourth in the last 12 games...last year, the A's had five games with three or more errors the entire season...have 58 errors this year, which is 41.5% more than the next closest team (LAD, 41)...the errors have led to a Major League leading 40 unearned runs (ATL, 35)...have allowed a ML leading 48 stolen bases (CHI-NL, 41).

OFFENSE: The A's scored a season-high 10 runs yesterday after tallying just 20 runs over the previous seven contests...are now batting .211 (55-for-261) with 30 runs scored over the last eight games (3.8 runs per game) and are 4-for-53 (.075) with runners in scoring position...for the season, rank second to last in the American League in runs scored (223), batting average (.235) and on-base percentage (.302) to Kansas City (194/.234/.292)...have the fourth most extra base hits in the AL (180)...rank last in the majors in batting with the bases loaded (.139) and bat-

ting with runners in scoring position (.203)...leadoff hitters rank last in the majors in batting average (.157) and second to last in on-base percentage (.241)...designated hitters rank last in the AL in RBI (19) and slugging (.343) and tied for third in fewest home runs (7).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 41 runs over the last five home games and opponents are batting .333 (66-for-198) over that stretch...have compiled a 5.77 ERA (66 er in 103.0 ip) over the last 12 games overall and now have a 4.57 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League...lead the AL in wild pitches (32) and hit batters (24)...have the third lowest opponents slugging percentage (.399).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-19 with a 4.82 ERA (107 er in 199.2 ip) over the last 37 games after going 9-5 with a 3.79 ERA over the first 18 contests...are 17-24 with a 4.49 ERA for the season...the losses are second most in the American League...lead the AL in opponents slugging percentage (.395) and have the third lowest opponents batting average (.245)...have allowed the fewest home runs in the majors (35).

SCORING MARGIN: The A's are 12-10 (.545) in games decided by two runs or fewer compared to 12-21 (.364) in games decided by three runs or more...have the worst record in American League and third worst in the majors in games decided by three runs or more...are 5-6 (.455) in one-run games, including 4-1 at home...the 11 one-run games are second fewest in the AL (MIN, 9) and the record is fourth worst...have a run differential of -61, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 1-6 on Sunday, which is the second worst Sunday record in the majors (Atlanta, 1-7)...are 3-8 in replay challenges while opposing managers are 10-6...through games of Thursday, the A's success ratio of 20.0% (2-8) was second worst in the majors (MIL, 1-6)...have used a different lineup in each of their last 50 games...have used 53 different lineups overall in 55 games...the only repeated lineup is the Opening Day lineup, which has been used three times (games 1, 2 and 5)...are 2-1 in extra inning games and the three extra inning games are tied for third fewest in the American League...the A's went 12-15 (.444) in the month of May, which was the third worst record in the AL...have now posted a losing record in seven consecutive months, which is their longest such streak since May 1997-May 1998 when they also had seven straight months with a losing record (excludes October).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have eight players on the disabled list (Bassitt, Doolittle, Dull, Graveman, Hahn, Semien, Smolinski, Wahl)...Bassitt, Semien and Smolinski are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL 16 times this year and have had at least five players on the DL all year...used the DL an Oakland record 27 times in 2016.

A's vs. NATIONALS: The A's have split the first two meetings of 2017 and are now 4-4 all-time against the Nationals...this is just the third series between the two clubs...last met in 2014 when the A's swept a three-game series in Oakland, May 9-11...the A's were swept in the first meeting in 2005 at RFK Stadium, June 7-9...Oakland is the only team that has never played a game at Nationals Park...the A's also swept a three-game series from the Expos in 2003 and are 7-4 all-time against the Nationals/Expos.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yonder Alonso is tied for second in the AL with a career-high 16 home runs...leads AL first baseman in on-base percentage (.398) and slugging percentage (.692), is tied for the lead in home runs (16), ranks second in batting (.301) and third in RBI (34)...**Khris Davis** has also homered 16 times and the two have combined for 32 home runs, which is the most by a Major League duo...**Ryon Healy** tied an Athletics record with four extra base hits yesterday...he homered twice for his first career two-homer game and is the fourth player in Oakland history to reach double figures in home runs in each of his first two seasons.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** the A's take a 3-0 lead into the bottom of the ninth at Washington before the Senators score three times to send the game into extra innings...the A's finally win with two runs in the top of the 21st inning to win the longest game (by innings) in Oakland history...in **1972** Catfish Hunter pitches a two-hit shutout in the first game of a doubleheader at Baltimore for his 100th career victory...the future Hall of Famer would go on to win 224 games with the A's and the Yankees.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (2-2, 4.72 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his seventh start since being reinstated from the disabled list May 1...began the season on the 10-day DL with a strained right shoulder...it was his third career stint on the DL (had two last year)...made two rehab starts before he was reinstated.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-0 with a 2.55 ERA (5 er in 17.2 ip) and .212 (14-for-66) opponents batting average in three starts at home compared to 0-2 with a 7.02 ERA (13 er in 16.2 ip) and .284 (19-for-67) opponents average in three starts on the road...has allowed four of his five home runs on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: is 1-0 with a 1.54 ERA (2 er in 11.2 ip) in two starts during the day compared to 1-2 with a 6.35 ERA (16 er in 22.2 ip) in four starts at night...has allowed all five of his home runs at night.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is scheduled to make his second interleague start of the season...picked up the win in his first start on May 24 against Miami (see fifth start below)...went 0-3 with a 4.38 ERA in four interleague starts last year and is now 4-5 with a 3.40 ERA (30 er in 79.1 ip) in 13 career interleague appearances, including 12 starts.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA (4 er in 10.2 ip) in two starts on four days rest, 1-2 with a 5.32 ERA (14 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) in the first and second inning, a 8.31 ERA (16 er in 17.1 ip) in innings three through five and a 0.00 ERA (5.0 ip) from the sixth inning on...has surrendered all five of his home runs in the third through fifth innings.

THIS AND THAT: Ranks fourth among American League pitchers in put-outs (8)...has allowed six stolen bases, which is tied for eighth most in the AL...is 4-12 with a 6.05 ERA (84 er in 125.0 ip) over his last 24 starts dating back to April 27, 2016...was 36-21 with a 2.87 ERA over the first 80 games (78 starts) of his career...has issued seven of his 10 walks to left-handed hitters...four of the five home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has a .167 (8-for-48) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .333 (17-for-51) with four of his five home runs the second time through and .235 (8-for-34) with one home run after that...opponents are 10-for-19 (.526) with two doubles, three home runs and seven RBI when putting the first pitch in play...last year, he allowed a .467 batting average when opponents put the first pitch in play, which was fifth highest in the AL among pitchers with 100 or more innings.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-1 loss at Minnesota May 2...allowed a career-high tying three home runs...surrendered a solo home run to Dozier and a two-run home run to Sano in the third and a solo home run to Castro in the fourth...left after six innings trailing 4-0.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in his 100th career appearance, an 8-6 A's win over Detroit May 7 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Castellanos in the third inning but the A's scored twice in the bottom of the third and two more in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...he was then charged with three unearned runs in the fifth inning after an Alonso error...yielded RBI singles to Cabrera and Martinez and was relieved by Dull who allowed a third run to score on a wild pitch.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Texas May 13...allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the third but the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth...gave that run back in the bottom of the fourth on a Gomez RBI ground out but Oakland scored twice in the fifth and once in the seventh...was relieved by Dull to start the bottom of the seventh with the A's leading 4-2 but the pen allowed four runs in the seventh for the blown save and loss.

FOURTH START: He was the winning pitcher in his 100th career start, an 8-3 A's win over Boston May 18 in Oakland...became the 22nd pitcher in Oakland history to make 100 starts...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI single by Ramirez and a sacrifice fly by Young but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the first...allowed the tying run to score on a Moreland leadoff home run in the fourth but the A's came back with three in the bottom of the fourth for the win.

FIFTH START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 win over Miami May 24 in Oakland...struck out 11 batters, his third career game of 10 or more strikeouts...retired each of the first nine batters he faced (six by strikeout) and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff single to Gordon in the fourth...Stanton singled Gordon over to third and Gordon scored on a

wild pitch...retired nine straight following that before allowing a double and a walk in his seventh and final inning.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Cleveland last Tuesday...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in 4.2 innings...it marks the sixth time in his last 23 starts he has allowed seven runs...blanked the Indians on two hits over the first three innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fourth inning and three more in the fifth...Encarnacion had a RBI single and Ramirez a RBI double before Zimmer had a two-run double to give the Indians the lead...Kipnis homered to start the fifth inning, Brantley had a RBI single and he later scored on a wild pitch.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Went 0-0 with a 15.75 ERA in two starts (4.0 ip, 6 h, 7 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 7 so, 1 hr)...opponents went 6-for-17 (.353).

2016 RECAP: Went 5-11 with a 5.69 ERA in 22 starts in a season shortened by two stints on the disabled list...his ERA was more than 2½ runs higher than his previous career high of 3.08 in 2014...his five wins follow back-to-back 14-win seasons...also had career highs in losses (11), home runs (18), extra base hits (50), opponents batting average (.286), on-base percentage (.343) and slugging percentage (.475) and matched his high in wild pitches (15)...his average of 7.23 strikeouts per nine innings was a career low and his 3.23 walks per nine innings were a career high...had the second lowest winning percentage in the American League (.313) and the second most wild pitches...the wild pitches tied for sixth most in Oakland history and matched the most by an Athletic over the last 24 years...now has 48 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53)...the winning percentage tied for 10th lowest in Oakland history...among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched, he had the fourth highest ERA in the AL and the highest by an A's pitcher since 2000 (Olivares, 6.75)

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a mark of .286 (66-for-231) against right-handed hitters and .286 (67-for-234) against left-handers...surrendered 12 of his 18 home runs to righties...the eight and nine hitters in the order batted a combined .467 with seven home runs and 21 RBI...however, held the five hitter to a .176 average, no home runs and four RBI...based on a minimum of 100 innings pitched, his .468 average against the number eight hitter was the highest by a Major Leaguer since at least 1974...his .465 average against the nine hitter was third highest over that span and the highest since 1999 (Loaiza, TEX .500).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Sean Manaea (4-3, 3.91 ERA): Has won each of his last three starts for the first three-game winning streak of his career...has a 1.42 ERA (3 er in 19.0 ip) and .179 (12-for-67) opponents batting average during the winning streak and has issued just two walks in 19.0 innings (0.95 walks per nine innings)...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts and issued 17 walks in 29.1 innings (5.22 per nine innings)...has a streak of 15 consecutive games with five hits or fewer and two innings pitched or more, which matches the longest such streak by an American League pitcher since at least 1913 (Tom Gordon, June 24-Sept. 2, 1992...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's win at Cleveland last Wednesday (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 9 so)...has faced the Blue Jays once in his career and in came in relief in the A's 5-3 loss on July 17, 2016 in Oakland (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 0 bb, 4 so, 1 hr).

- The bullpen has a 5.15 ERA (70 er in 122.1 ip) over its last 37 games after posting a 3.73 ERA (25 er in 60.1 ip) over its first 18 games.
- Has recorded just two saves in its last six chances dating back to May 12, a span of 20 games...overall, are 10-for-17 (58.8%) in save chances and has the sixth lowest save percentage in the American League...blew a save in three straight opportunities at Texas (May 12-14)...had not blown a save in three straight games since May 29-June 1, 2004 (Rhodes, Rhodes, Mecir)...the seven total blown saves have come from five different relievers (Casilla, Madson, 2 each; Doolittle, Dull, Hendriks, 1 each).
- Liam Hendriks earned the win yesterday, the first win by an A's reliever since May 19 (Dull)...seven total wins by relievers are tied for second fewest in the American League.
- In the month of May at home, the bullpen sported a 4-0 record with a 3.00 ERA (16 er in 48.0 ip) in 10 games...road ERA in May was 6.35 (28 er in 39.2 ip).
- Has allowed 22-of-70 (31.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the seventh best percentage in the AL.
- Relievers rank third in the majors in stolen bases allowed (19).
- Tied for second in the AL in unearned runs (12), tied for fourth in wild pitches (12), and fourth in runs allowed (107).
