HITTING THE ROAD

The Washington Nationals are 4-1 in the Bay Area this week, heading into the rubber match of this three-game set with the A's...Washington, who fell 10-4 on Saturday, looks to seal its 13th series victory of the season Sunday afternoon before departing from the Bay Area after a week-long stay...The Nationals will head south, to Los Angeles, to open a three-game set with the Dodgers on Monday and wrap up this nine-game, 10-day west coast trip.

- At 34-20 (.630) the Nationals own the best record in the National League, behind only the Houston Astros (40-16, .714) for the top mark in MLB.
- The 2017 Nationals were the first in club history (2005-pres.) to reach 30 wins in just 48 games, and they own the best record in franchise history (WSH/MON) through 54 games.
- The Nationals are 4-4 in Interleague play thus far this season, having split the first two games of this series, going 1-2 against Baltimore, and 2-1 vs. Seattle.

MURPHY THE MACHINE

After missing three games last weekend with an illness, Nationals **2B Daniel Murphy** returned to the lineup on Monday and has been a one-man hit machine this week...Murphy, who turned in another three-hit game on Saturday afternoon (after a four-hit game on Friday), is 13-for-23 (.565) with three doubles, a homer, a walk, five runs scored, and five RBI on the Nationals' current road trip (five games).

- Murphy leads all National League second basemen in the following categories: batting average (.343), on-base percentage (.397), slugging percentage (.582), doubles (16), home runs (10), RBI (38), hits (69), and OPS (.979).

LOOKIN' AT LIND

Nationals **1B/OF Adam Lind**, in the lineup for the second consecutive game, was 2-for-3 with a double, a home run, two walks, two runs scored and three RBI on Saturday...Lind, a free-agent addition this offseason, has produced at an outstanding rate...He is now hitting .344 on the season with a .423 on-base percentage and a .639 slugging percentage and has clubbed four home runs in 61 total at-bats, three of them as a pinch-hitter.

- Speaking of Lind coming off the bench, he has done just that in 20 of the 32 games he's played in this season, getting one at-bat or fewer in 19 of those 20 -- and hitting .500 (9-for-18) with a double, three home runs, and 10 RBI when called on as a substitute.

EVERYBODY HITS!

The Nationals pounded out 20 hits, five home runs (from five different players), and nine extra-base hits on Friday night, the sixth time this season they've scored 13 or more runs, matching their club record (2005-present) for most 13+ run games in a season (2015).

- According to the *Elias Sports Bureau*, Friday was the first time in franchise history (Nationals/Expos) that all nine players in the starting lineup notched a run and RBI...Via *Elias*, it was the third time in franchise history that nine or more players produced at least one RBI and scored one or more runs in a game: The 1979 Expos did it (10 players, 6/17/79 vs. HOU), as did the 1993 Expos (4/11/93 at COL)...But in both of those games, at least one starting player posted zeroes in both the runs and RBI columns, making Friday a first.

1,800

The Nationals' victory on Friday night marked career win No. 1,800 for manager **Dusty Baker**, making him the 16th manager in Major League history to cross the 1,800-win mark...Twelve of the first 15 managers who reached the milestone before Baker are already in the Hall of Fame...Baker, who ranks No. 16 on the all-time managerial wins list with an 1,800-1591 record, is the second-winningest active manager, just 12 victories behind Giants manager **Bruce Bochy** (1,812).

DAMAGE FROM THE DEPTHS

The Nationals' lineup had a big night all around on Friday, but their 7-8-9 hitters took on a particularly heavy lift...**C Matt Wieters** (1-for-5, 2B, R, RBI), **CF Michael A. Taylor** (2-for-5, 2B, HR, RBI, 2 R), and **RF Brian Goodwin** (4-for-5, 3B, HR, 2 RBI, R) were a combined 7-for-15 with two doubles, a triple, two home runs, four RBI and four runs scored.

- Since taking over for injured **CF Adam Eaton** (left leg injury) on April 29, Taylor is hitting .293 (34-for-116) with seven doubles, two triples, five HR, 15 RBI, eight walks, three stolen bases and 17 runs scored...He has posted a .339 on-base percentage and a .517 slugging percentage during that stretch.
- Goodwin set career highs on Friday night in hits (4), home runs (1), and extra-base hits (2).

LEAGUE LEADERS

The Nationals' offense leads the National League in almost every category, including: runs scored (303), batting average (.278), on-base percentage (.347), slugging percentage (.478), OPS (.825), hits (530), extra-base hits (204), home runs (83), and RBI (296), while ranking second in doubles (111).

- 1B Ryan Zimmerman** ranks in MLB in batting average (1st, .369), extra-base hits (T2nd, 32), slugging percentage (3rd, .695), hits (T3rd, 70), total bases (3rd, 132), OPS (4th, 1.111), RBI (T4th, 45), and HR (T9th, 15)...In his last 10 games, Zimmerman is hitting .395 (15-for-38) with a double, two home runs, five walks, seven RBI and nine runs scored.
- RF Bryce Harper**, ranks among MLB hitters in runs scored (2nd, 44), on-base percentage (T3rd, .438), home runs (T9th, 15), OPS (5th, 1.093), walks (9th, 33), slugging percentage (5th, .655), RBI (T7th, 43), and batting average (12th, .328).

OPPONENT

OAKLAND ATHLETICS

The Washington Nationals and Oakland Athletics will meet for just the third-ever regular-season series between the two clubs since baseball returned to D.C. in 2005...The Nationals are 4-4 all-time in the six games between the two clubs, sweeping the A's at RFK Stadium in 2005, and getting swept by Oakland at the O.co Coliseum in 2014...While they share little on-field history, the two clubs have been frequent trade partners as Nationals President of Baseball Operations & GM **Mike Rizzo** and A's Executive VP of Baseball Operations **Billy Beane** have consummated 10 trades since December, 2010...Those trades have involved, among others: **Marc Zrepczynski**, **Yunel Escobar**, **Tyler Clippard**, **Jerry Blevins**, **Billy Burns**, **Fernando Abad**, **Kurt Suzuki** (twice), **A.J. Cole** (twice), **Blake Treinen**, **Gio Gonzalez**, **Derek Norris**, **Tommy Milone**, **Brad Peacock**, **Henry Rodriguez**, and **Josh Willingham**.

THE SERIES

The Nationals have split the lifetime series against the A's, 4-4, as Washington swept Oakland in D.C. in 2005 and Oakland swept Washington in Oakland in 2014.

DUSTY BAKER

Nationals manager **Dusty Baker** was named the sixth field manager in Nationals history on Nov. 3, 2015. A three-time N.L. Manager of the Year (1993, 1997, 2000), and a finalist in 2016, Baker's clubs have won 90 games or more on nine occasions. With a victory on April 10 vs. STL, Baker became the 16th winningest manager in baseball history, passing **Jim Leyland** to move into the No. 16 spot alone on the all-time list...His 1,800-1,591 career managerial record slots him second in the win column among active managers behind only **SFG's Bruce Bochy** (No. 15, 1,812). **Lou Piniella** is 14th on the all-time list with 1,835 victories. Baker is just the 17th manager in MLB history to win 1,700 games.

- The Nationals are the fourth club Baker has managed the dugout for, coming to Washington after stops in San Francisco (1993-2002), Chicago (2003-2006), and Cincinnati (2008-2013). Baker is one of just four managers in MLB history to produce at least 1,500 hits as a player and win at least 1,500 games as a manager.

DATE IN NATIONALS HISTORY

June 4 (5-5 on this date)

2013: **Steve Lombardozzi's** sacrifice fly lifted the Nationals to a 3-2 home victory over the Mets. The Nationals trailed, 2-1, entering the ninth inning, but scored twice to win as **Ryan Zimmerman** doubled, **Adam LaRoche** singled, **Ian Desmond** doubled and **Roger Bernadina** was intentionally walked to set the stage for Lombardozzi's sac fly. The walk-off win was the first of the season for the Nationals, who had been 0-25 when trailing after eight innings at that point.

NATIONALS STARTING PITCHER

ROARK, Tanner (RHP) #57

Right-hander is one of MLB's top unheralded pitching performers...Is 42-27 with a 3.14 ERA in 92 starts...Efficiency has led to 2.41 walks per nine innings, a 1.17 WHIP and 8.1 hits per nine innings over his MLB career as a starter... Has eclipsed the 15-win mark in each season as a full-time starter (2014, 2016)... Since 2014, ranks third among MLB pitchers in hard-hit rate (24.5%), per *FanGraphs.com*.

- AGAINST THE ATHLETICS:** Faced Oakland on May 10, 2014 at OAK...Tossed 7.2 innings of two-hit, one-run ball...Struck out five and did not walk a batter...Exited the game in line for the win before the A's topped WSH, 4-3 in 10 inn.
- LAST START:** Turned in his second consecutive strong start...Tossed 7.0 shut-out innings as WSH topped SFG, 3-0...Struck out six and walked just one.
- Over his last two starts, has allowed just one earned run in 14.0 IP (0.64 ERA) while striking out 14 and walking one...Is 2-0 in those two starts.
- Has been tough on right-handed batters...Has allowed just two extra base hits to right-handed batters (4/5 vs. MIA, Tyler Moore, 5th inn. and 5/29 at SFG Christian Arroyo, 3rd inn.)...Ranks among NL starters in SLG vs. RHB (3rd, .252) and OPS vs. RHB (5th, .554).
- Has posted a 0.83 home runs per 9.0 innings, seventh-best in the National League.
- Helped Team USA bring home the Gold Medal in the 2017 World Baseball Classic...Tossed 4.0 innings of two-hit shutout ball as Team USA topped Team Japan in the semifinals at Dodger Stadium.
- In his return to the starting rotation in 2016, Roark ranked in the National League in wins (T5th, 16), HR/9.0 IP (6th, 0.73), H/9.0 IP (9th, 7.41), and ERA (6th, 2.83).
- Threw 7.0 or more shutout innings nine times, the most MLB...CHI RHP Jake Arrieta was second with eight...Roark started seven of Washington's 12 shutouts.
- He tossed 7.0 (or more) innings 18 times, third-most in the NL...Along with teammate RHP Max Scherzer, the two combined to throw at least 7.0 innings in 38 starts, and they also combined to pitch at least 7.0 innings while allowing two runs or fewer 33 times...Of the 22 pitchers who put together at least 10 outings of 7.0 (or more) innings with two runs allowed (or fewer), no team had a pair who compiled more such starts.
- Outpaced career marks in SO/9.0 (7.37 in 2016; 6.59 career), H/9.0 (7.41 in 2016; 7.97 career) & swing-and-miss % (21.9% in 2016; 19.7% career).
- Among RHP with at least 400 LHB faced (essentially, all right-handed starting pitchers), Roark's .302 opp. SLG led the NL, and his .214 opp. AVG was sixth.
- Allowed two earned runs or fewer in six of his last seven outings dating to Aug. 29...Posted a 2.16 ERA (10 ER/41.2 IP) and a .189 batting average against during this stretch...Posted a 1.13 ERA (4 ER/32.0 IP), 1.06 WHIP and a .187/.293/.252 opponent slash line from Aug. 29 - Sept. 20.
- Struck out a career-high 15 batters in 7.0 innings of two-hit, shutout ball vs. MIN on April 23... His 15 strikeouts were, at the time, the most in a game by a Nationals pitcher in 2016 (finished the season second behind RHP Max Scherzer's 20) and the third-most (now T4th) in a game in Nationals history (2005-pres.).
